TRIENNIAL GENERAL RENEWAL OF ELECTORS RIGHTS.-LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY.

IMPORTANT NOTICE TO ELECTORS.

It is hereby notified that all persons who are holders of electors' rights issued before or on the 1st November, 1907, must, not later than 2nd November next, obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names retained upon the new General Electoral Lists, which will be made up forthwith after that dete be made up forthwith after that date.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from such Lists.

The old right must in every case be delivered up to the Registrar or Deputy, but the renewed right will be equally available for any election that may take place before the coming into force of the new rolls in April, 1909.

Intending applicants for electors' rights are cautioned to apply early to the Registrar. If application be postponed until the last day allowed for the purpose, the Registrar or Deputy may be unable to issue rights to all applicants, and those to whom rights are not issued will not be enrolled, and will lose their title to vote.

No person whose name is already on the roll of rate-paying electors for any division of an electoral district may obtain an elector's right for such district.

Persons of foreign birth who desire to obtain electors' rights must, if not already haturalized, obtain letters of naturalization, without which they are not qualified.

Electors' rights for the Legislative Assembly can now be obtained free of charge, and "residential" rights for the Assembly may be applied for either in person or in writing through the post. Forms necessary for applications through the post are obtainable at the offices of the Registrars and Deputies, and at all Courts of Petty Sessions, Post Offices, and Police Stations.

TRIENNIAL GENERAL RENEWAL OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.-LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.

IMPORTANT NOTICE TO ELECTORS

I T is hereby notified that all persons who are holders of electors' rights issued before or on the 2nd December, 1907, must, not later than the 1st December next, obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names retained upon the new General Electoral Lists, which will be made up forthwith after that date.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from such Lists.

The old right must in every case be delivered up to the Registrar, but the renewed right will be equally available for any election that may take place before the coming into force of the new rolls in February, 1909.

Intending applicants for electors' rights are cautioned to apply early to the Registrar. If application be postponed until the last day allowed for the purpose, the Registrar may be unable to issue rights to all applicants, and those to whom rights are not issued will not be enrolled, and will lose their title to vote.

No person whose name is on, or entitled to be on, any roll of ratepaying electors for any division of a province may obtain an elector's right for such province.

Persons of foreign birth who desire to obtain electors' rights must, if not already naturalized, obtain letters of naturalization, without which they are not qualified.

WHEREAS by Division 3 of Part III. of the Water
Act 1905 the Governor in Council is empowered to
make regulations for the election of Commissioners of
Waterworks Trusts: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the
advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance
of the provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth for
the purposes aforesaid make the following regulations for
the election of Commissioners of the Pyramid Hill Waterworks Trust. works Trust.

- t. Interpretation of terms.—In these regulations "the Trust" or "the said Trust" shall mean the Pyramid Hill Waterworks Trust. "Minister" shall mean the Minister of Water Supply.
- 2. Period for which Commissioners shall hold office.— The period for which the Commissioners shall hold office shall be three years, and shall date on and from the date of election.
- 3. Extraordinary vacancies, how filled.—Should any vacancy in the office of Commissioner be occasioned by death, resignation, disqualification, or any other cause whatever, the same shall be filled up by election under these regulations within one month after the vacancy has occurred, and the person elected to fill such vacancy shall hold the office of Commissioner during the unexpired portion of the term of office of the Commissioner whose seat shall have become vacant become vacant.
- 4. Date of first and subsequent Election of Commis-4. Date of first and subsequent Election of Commissioners.—The first election of Commissioners under these regulations shall be held on the 16th day of December, 1908, and the ordinary election of Commissioners shall be held on the 16th day of December in each succeeding triennial year. Provided that whenever such date shall fall upon a Sunday or, any day set apart as a public holiday such election shall be held upon the day next following. following.
- 5. Voters' List to be prepared.—For the purposes of the first election of Commissioners a voters' list shall be prepared in like manner to that provided by section 96 of the Water Act 1905 in so far as circumstances will admit, on or before the 19th day of November, 1908, by the Sccreary to the Trust, certified by him as correct, and such list shall be the list of voters for the said election of Commissioners, and shall remain in force and shall be used at any subsequent election of Commissioners that may be held prior to a fresh voters' list being made out as hereinafter provided. 5. Voters' List to be prepared.-For the purposes of the hereinafter provided.
- 6. Voters' List to be prepared annually.—Before the last day of February in each year a voters' list shall be made out in the manner prescribed by section 96 of the Water Act 1905, which shall, upon approval of the Commissioners under the common scal of the Trust, be the list of voters for the election of Commissioners for the twelve months next ensuing next ensuing.
- 7. Form of Voters' List.—First Schedule.—Such voters' list shall be in the form in the First Schedule hereto, and shall contain, in regular numerical sequence and alphabetical order of surname, the christian name or names, surname, and address (so far as these may be known) of every ratepayer within that portion of the municipal district of the Shire of Gordon included within the district of the Waterworks Trust.
- In making out such list of voters, if the property in respect of which any ratepayer is entitled to vote is only in part within the Waterworks district, then the number of votes of such ratepayer in respect of such property shall be reduced in the proportion which such part bears to the whole property of such ratepayer rated in the municipal district.

Every such person shall then be responsible and liable to be charged for stock equivalent to the number of badges and chains from the time of receiving such badges and chains until they are returned to the herdsman. No person shall use any other than the authorized or registered badges and chains in connexion with stock legally depasturing on the Common. In addition to the fees for depasturing stock the sum of Fourpence shall be paid to the herdsman at the time of registration for the hire of each badge and chain; but should any person cease at any time to depasture stock on the Common the amount paid for each badge and chain shall be refunded to such person, provided the badge and chain he returned to the herdsman in good order and condition.
