THE following Proclamation bringing into force the New Hebrides Convention of 20th October, 1906, which has been received by His Excellency the Governor from His Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, is published for general information.

WESTERN PACIFIC HIGH COMMISSION. PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by a Convention made in London on the 20th day of October, 1906, by the Government of His Majesty the King of the one part and the Government of the French Republic of the other part, it was amongst other things provided that the islands known as the New Hebrides including the Banks and Torres Islands should form a region of joint influence in which the subjects and citizens of Great Britain and France respectively should enjoy equal rights of residence, personal protection, and trade, each of the two said Powers retaining jurisdiction over its subjects and citizens, and neither exercising a separate control over the Group, and that the subjects and citizens of other Powers should enjoy the same rights and should be subject to the same obligations as British subjects or French citizens.

And whereas by the terms of Article II. (1) of the Convention of the 20th October, 1906, aforesaid it was agreed that the signatory Powers shall be represented in the Group by two High Commissioners, one appointed by His Britannic Majesty's Government, the other by the Government of the French Republic.

Now therefore I, EVERARD FERDINAND IM THURN, Governor of Fiji and His Britannic Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, having been duly appointed High Commissioner for the New Hebrides, in virtue of the powers vested in me by His Britannic Majesty's Government, do hereby order and proclaim that the Convention of the 20th October, 1906, aforesaid between the Government of His Majesty the King and the Government of the French Republic as amended in accordance with the agreement to that effect of the twenty-ninth of August, 1907, and with the exception of Articles IX. (2), XI. to XIX. inclusive, XXI. to XXVII. inclusive, LVI. (3), LX. (3) and (4), and LXI. (2) which shall come into force on a date hereafter to be named, shall from this date have the force of law, and shall be binding upon all persons within the said islands over whom His Majesty shall at any time have jurisdiction.

Whereof let all people take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

A JOINT REGULATION

To Establish a Port of Entry in the New Hebrides.

WHEREAS by the provisions of the Convention regarding the affairs of the New Hebrides between His Britannic Majesty's Government and the Government of the French Republic signed at London on the twentieth day of October One thousand nine hundred and six the High Commissioners for the two Governments are empowered to issue joint Regulations for ensuring the peace, order and good government of the Group,

And whereas by proclamation dated the second day of December One thousand nine hundred and seven it was ordered by the respective High Commissioners that the Convention aforesaid with the exception of Articles IX. (2), XI. to XIX. inclusive, XXI. to XXVII. inclusive, LVI. (3), LX. (3) and (4), and LXI. (2) shall come into force and shall have the force of law from such date, that is to say from the second day of December One thousand nine hundred and seven,

And whereas it is expedient to establish a Port of Entry in the New Hebrides,

Now we do therefore jointly issue the following Regulation:—

Interpretation.

In this Regulation the words—

“The New Hebrides” shall mean the islands known as the New Hebrides and the Banks and Torres Groups;

“Resident Commissioner” shall mean His Britannic Majesty's Resident Commissioner or the Resident Commissioner of the French Republic as the case may be;

“Marine authorities” shall in cases in which British vessels are concerned mean the Board or any British Consular or other authority referred to in “The Merchant Shipping Act 1894.”

1. *Date of taking effect.*—This Regulation shall come into force on the date of publication.

2. *Vila to be a Port.*—The port of Vila in the island of Efate shall be the sole port of entry for the New Hebrides and all vessels entering the Group from foreign ports shall report first at such port of Vila and all vessels leaving the Group for foreign ports shall effect their final clearance from the port of Vila aforesaid.

3. *Disregard of Provisions of Section 2 owing to Stress of Weather.*—In the case of vessels which may through stress of weather or other circumstances be compelled to disregard the provisions of section two the onus of proof that such disregard was caused by circumstances over which the master of the vessel had no control shall rest on such master otherwise he shall be considered as having been guilty of a breach of this Regulation.

4. *Representatives of Marine Authorities.*—In all matters affecting vessels putting in at the port of Vila the two Resident Commissioners shall be considered as representing the Marine authorities of their respective nations.

5. *Master of Vessel to keep Log.*—The masters of all vessels navigating the Group shall keep a log which shall be regularly posted and such log shall be open to the inspection of the authorities of the nation to which such vessel belongs whenever such vessel shall put in at any locality in the Group where such authorities may be established.

6. *Penalties.*—Persons guilty of a breach of this Regulation shall on conviction be liable to a fine of from Two pounds to Twenty pounds or to imprisonment of from twenty-four hours to thirty days. Provided that in the case of a repetition of the offence the penalty of imprisonment shall always be inflicted.

A JOINT REGULATION
To Regulate the Importation and Manufacture of
Intoxicating Liquors in the New Hebrides.

WHEREAS by the provisions of the Convention regarding the affairs of the New Hebrides between His Britannic Majesty's Government and the Government of the French Republic signed at London on the twentieth day of October One thousand nine hundred and six the High Commissioners for the two Governments are empowered to issue joint Regulations for ensuring the peace, order and good government of the Group.

And whereas by proclamation dated the second day of December One thousand nine hundred and seven it was ordered by the respective High Commissioners that the Convention aforesaid with the exception of Articles IX. (2), XI. to XIX. inclusive, XXI. to XXVII. inclusive, LVI. (3), LX. (3) and (4), and LXI. (2) shall come into force and shall have the force of law from such date, that is to say from the second day of December One thousand nine hundred and seven.

And whereas it is expedient to regulate the Importation and Manufacture of Intoxicating Liquors in the New Hebrides.

Now we do therefore jointly issue the following Regulation:—

Interpretation.

In this Regulation the words—

- “The New Hebrides” shall mean the islands known as the New Hebrides and the Banks and Torres Groups;
- “Resident Commissioner” shall mean His Britannic Majesty's Resident Commissioner or the Resident Commissioner of the French Republic as the case may be;
- “Trade spirits” shall mean gin, whisky, brandy and any other liquor containing alcohol and used for trade;
- “Spirituous liquors” shall mean any liquor containing any proportion of alcohol the consumption of which may produce an intoxicating effect;
- “Intoxicating liquors” shall mean all spirituous compounds and all fermented liquors and any mixture whereof part is spirituous or which contains fermented liquors and any drug or mixture or preparation containing any drug capable of producing intoxication.

1. *Introduction of “trade spirits” prohibited—Manufacture of spirituous liquors prohibited—Importation of machinery, &c., prohibited—Declaration of existing stills, &c.*—From the date of this Regulation it shall be unlawful—

- (a) to import into the New Hebrides any “trade spirits” (“*alcool de traite*”) unless with the joint permission of the two Resident Commissioners. Every vessel shall be held responsible for any contravention of this section by the master, owner or any member of the ship's company, and such ship shall be attached pending any proceedings that may be instituted against such master, owner or member of the ship's company or shall provide surety in the sum of Two hundred pounds.
- (b) to manufacture any spirituous or intoxicating liquor by process of distillation or by any other means.
- (c) to import any machine or apparatus for the manufacture or distillation of spirituous or intoxicating liquors. Any person having in his possession any still or apparatus that might be employed for the distillation or manufacture of spirituous or intoxicating liquors shall within a period of two months from the date of this Regulation make declaration of such still or apparatus to the Resident Commissioner within whose jurisdiction he may be.

2. *General definitions and penalties.*—The Resident Commissioner within whose jurisdiction any vessel suspected of being concerned in a breach of this Regulation shall have the power to cause search to be made in such vessel for liquor or other contraband article.

3. *Penalties.*—Any person guilty of a breach of this Regulation shall on conviction be liable to the payment of a fine of from Four to Twenty pounds or to imprisonment of from twenty-four hours to thirty days, and any “trade spirits” (“*alcool de traite*”) imported, apparatus or machinery employed in the manufacture or distillation of spirits or intoxicating liquors, any spirits or intoxicating liquors so manufactured, and any machine or apparatus imported in contravention of this Regulation shall be confiscated and destroyed or disposed of in such manner as the Resident Commissioner may direct.

2. That every female so employed shall receive not less than eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Three-pence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE,
PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE
CHILDREN'S PLAY-GROUND IN LINCOLN-
SQUARE, IN THE CITY OF MELBOURNE.

WHEREAS by the Crown grant issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Citizens of the city of Melbourne and their successors, in respect of Lincoln-square, it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted and the buildings for the time being thereon shall be at all times thereafter maintained and used as and for a public square and offices and conveniences connected therewith under and in accordance with such regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Governor or other officer for the time being administering the Government of the colony (now State) of Victoria with the consent of the Executive Council thereof, and, in the meantime, under and in accordance with such Regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Citizens of the said city of Melbourne, and for no other purpose whatsoever. Now, therefore, the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Citizens of the said city of Melbourne do hereby make the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management of such portion of Lincoln-square as is set apart for and hereinafter designated Children's Play-ground, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, in addition to the existing Regulations in respect of the said Lincoln-square.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Children's Play-ground shall be open daily from Ten o'clock a.m. till sunset, except on Sundays and such other days as may from time to time be specially indicated by the trustees.

2. Any person found within the Children's Play-ground, except during the hours it is open to the public, shall be guilty of a breach of these Regulations.

3. Although the Children's Play-ground is provided for the use of children only, mothers and female attendants shall be at liberty to be present to watch over them.

4. No person above the age of twelve (12) years shall be allowed to use any of the swings or other appliances erected in the Children's Play-ground. Such swings or other appliances shall not be used by the same child or children for a longer period than five (5) minutes at any one time, if any other children are waiting to use them.

5. No children shall use any of the swings or other appliances in the Children's Play-ground except in the ordinary way.

6. No cricket or football shall be played in the Children's Play-ground.

7. All paper, fruit, peel or other litter shall be placed in the baskets provided by the Trustees for the purpose.

8. All persons in the Children's Play-ground shall obey the directions of the caretaker thereof.

9. The Trustees shall not be responsible for any accident arising from the use of any of the swings or other appliances in the Children's Play-ground.

10. Any duly appointed officer or servant of the Trustees shall have the right (in addition to any other penalty under these Regulations) to remove or exclude from the Children's Play-ground any person who commits a breach of any of the Regulations or who wilfully damages any of the swings or other appliances or any property in the Children's Play-ground.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 200 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any Justice, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who so offends and who after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or officer or servant of the Trustees or by any constable does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer, or servant or constable and taken before some Justice, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION,
AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR
BOTANIC GARDEN, AND FOR PURPOSES OF
PUBLIC RECREATION, IN THE TOWNSHIP OF
COLAC.

THE Council of the Shire of Colac, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the reserve for Botanic Garden and for purposes of public recreation in the Township of Colac, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance-fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the following Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge except as hereinafter provided.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve; nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw sticks, stones, or other missiles in the Reserve, nor remove therefrom any soil or sand.

5. No person shall bring into the Reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals, or any poultry without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. No person shall camp in the Reserve or erect thereon any dwelling or both or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and such consent shall be produced if required.

8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots or enclosures therein which may be enclosed or set apart for plantations of young trees or shrubs or flowers or plants.

9. Any person, being drunk or disorderly, or assaulting any other person, shall be liable to be removed from the Reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased or be in possession of a ticket of admission thereto.

10. No religious, political, or other meetings shall be held, or addresses on religious, political, or other subjects given or delivered in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

11. No fêtes, sports, concerts, entertainments, or holiday amusements shall be held in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

12. The Committee of Management shall be at liberty to allow any individual or individuals, person or persons, body or bodies, the use of the Reserve for any fêtes, sports, concerts, entertainments, or holiday amusements on such terms and conditions as the Committee of Management may impose.

Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure for the occasion of any fêtes, sports, concerts, entertainments, or holiday amusements shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management in reference to the Reserves, buildings, erections, or enclosures for the time being thereon.

13. No person shall enter the Reserve on any day set apart for fêtes, sports, concerts, entertainments, or holiday amusements, or bring therein any carriage or other vehicle or any horse except on production of a ticket issued by the Committee of Management duly authorizing the admission of such person, horse, or carriage, or other vehicle; but, no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the date printed thereon, nor shall it authorize the holder thereof to enter any building, erection, enclosure, or cultivated spot within the Reserve, and every such ticket shall be surrendered on demand to the gatekeeper or other person authorized by the Committee of Management to collect tickets.

14. The maximum scale of fees for admission to the Reserve on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one

year) as the Reserve may be set apart for fêtes, sports, concerts, entertainments, or holiday amusements shall be follows:—

- (a) For the admission of every adult to any inner enclosure of the Reserve, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding 2 6
 - (b) For the admission of every adult to the remainder of the Reserve, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding 1 0
 - (c) Children under 14 years of age, half above fees.
 - (d) For the admission to the Reserve of every carriage, cart, or other vehicle drawn by one horse, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding 1 0
 - (e) For the admission to the Reserve of every carriage, cart, or other vehicle drawn by more than one horse, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding 5 0

Provided nevertheless that no charge shall be made for admission to the Reserve on Christmas Day or Good Friday in any year.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

The Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Land Act* 1901, section 199, doth hereby make the foregoing Regulations in respect of the Reserve for Botanic Garden and for purposes of Public Recreation in the Township of Colac.

In the interpretation of this By-law words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word person shall include corporation, and the word cattle shall include horses, mares, fillies, foals, geldings, colts, bulls, bullocks, cows, heifers, steers, calves, asses, mules, sheep, ewes, wethers, rams, lambs, goats, and swine.

This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of St. Kilda.
