### REGULATION OF NETTING, WESTERN PORT.

T is hereby notified, for general information, that it 1. is intended, at the expiration of one month from the date hereof, to issue a Proclamation for the regula-tion of netting in Western Port, as under:—

- (1) Prohibiting the use of seine nets within half a mile from the eastern shore of Western Port, between Lyall's Point (Pelican Point) and Queensferry.
- (2) Providing that garfish nets are not to be used unless they have the following dimensions:—

Length of bunt not more than ten fathoms; Mesh of bunt not less than one inch; Depth of bunt not more than twelve feet; Total length of net not more than eighty

fathoms;
Mesh of wings not less than one and a quarter inches;
Depth of wings not more than seven feet.

- (3) Providing that seine nets are not to be used unless they have the following dimensions:—
  - Length of bunt not more than five fathoms; Mesh of bunt not less than one inch; Total length of net not more than one hun-dred and twenty fathoms; Mesh of wings not less than one and three-quarter inches.

- (4) Providing that the mesh of nets is to be measured between knots when tanned and while stretched by a half-pound weight, after having been wet for five minutes.
- (5) Providing that the use of existing nets which are not in accordance with these regulations, and which cannot be altered to accord therewith, will be allowed for three years from the date of the proclamation of these regulations.

IV. For every steam boiler supplied with water, a charge of Five pounds will be made for the vear 1909.

V. Water troughs will be supplied at charges as follows:—For each trough or tub in an allotment of five acres or under, a charge of Fifteen shillings shall be made for the year; and for each acre above five acres, a charge of One shilling per acre shall be made, in addition to the payment of Fifteen shillings for the first five acres. But this charge shall not be enforced on tubs or receptacles of any kind in a house-yard unless used to water stock. The maximum amount to be paid for a supply of water to any trough shall be Five pounds per annum. For the supply of water to each hotel trough, a charge of One pound ten shillings shall be paid for the year.

VI. Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of Three shillings per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum amount so charged for any half-year shall be 12,000 gallons.

VII. Gardens or orchards using water will be supplied by meter at the following charges:—Three shillings per 1,000 gallons; the minimum amount to be charged for any half-year, 12,000 gallons.

VIII. The above-mentioned rates and charges are made

The charges for water shall be payable quarterly, or at such time as payment may be demanded by the Trust. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Avenel Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rates and charges.

(a) On every house or tenement of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, Twenty shil-

(b) On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Twenty pounds, at rate of One shilling for every One pound per annum of such valuation.

  (c) On all vacant allotments of land, a rate of One shilling for every One pound per annum of the municipal valuation thereof.

  (d) For water supplied from the wharf at Bairnsdale for shipping and other purposes, a minimum charge of Sixpence per 100 gallons, or Sixpence for any fractional part thereof; and a minimum charge of Three shillings per 1,000 gallons, or Three shillings for any fractional part thereof exceeding 500 gallons, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust.

  (c) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or water supplied under terms of sub-section (g) of section (t) of this By-law, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

  (f) Water supplied to manufactories, aerated water and cordial makers, brewers, bakers, butchers, livery and coach-horse stables, hotel premises, and for any other than domestic purposes, may be charged for by measurement at the discretion of the Trust.

  (g) Water supplied to Government Departments, mechanics' institutes, churches, cricket clubs, and bowling greens shall be charged by agreement at the discretion of the Trust.

  (h) Private water troughs will be charged for at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum, where the valuation of the property on which such trough is situated does not exceed £20. Such trough charge of 20s. will mean to include the rate at valuation. Where the valuation of the property exceeds £20, the trough to be exempt from rating purposes, except when, in the opinion of the Trust a meter shall be necessary.

  (i) The charge for water supplied to gradens, or for any other than domestic purposes, shall be at the rate of 'Seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.) per annum, the quantity so used not to exceed 12,000 gallons per annum; a meter to be fixed at the expense of the ratepayer, when, in the opinion of the Trust, the same shall be necessary.

  (j) For water supplied for new buildings b
- in the opinion of the Trust, the same shall be necessary.

  (j) For water supplied for new buildings being erected, at the rate of One pound (£1) per cent, on the contract for labour and material of all stone, brick, concrete, and plastering work, or any other work where water is used, and to be arranged for before the work is commenced.

- es service-pipe for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of the consumers shall in no case exceed the follow-

(1) For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding Forty pounds annual municipal value, half (1) inch diameter.

For the domestic supply of premises with an annual municipal valuation of Forty pounds or over, a three-quarter (1) of an inch service may be allowed, at the discretion of the Trust.

(2) For the supply of water for other than domestic purposes, and for supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.

(l) Each house or tenement must be provided with a separate service from the main.

(m) Water supplied to market gardens, nurseries, or for any irrigation purposes shall be charged for by meter, at the rate of is. per 1,000 gallons in addition to the usual rate for a domestic supply on the basis of valuation.

2. The rates and charges for water, and all sums due to the Trust under this By-law, shall be paid by and recoverable from the occupier of the premises, or the owner, or the person requiring, receiving, or using the supply of water.

3. The said rates and all charges for water supplied, otherwise than by meter or by special arrangement, shall be payable, in advance, by equal instalments, on the first day of January, 1909, and on the first day of July,

All charges for water supplied by meter or by special agreement shall be payable half-yearly, or at such time or times as may be determined by the Trust. The first payment shall, in respect of rates, be made at the time when the occupier or owner shall become liable to pay the rates for the supply of water as hereinbefore mentioned.

In the construction of this Bv-law the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the Bairnsdale Waterworks Trust.

- (f) For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or otherwise provided for in this Regulation, the rate shall be Fifteenpence per 1,000 college. gallons.
- (g) The rate to be charged to non-ratepayers for water supplied from stand-pipes shall be Three-pence per 100 gallons; and ratepayers shall be charged for the quantity of water which, at Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons, exceeds the amount of the assessed rate payable for lands, or tenements according to their distance from such stand-nipe. such stand-pipe.
- (h) Water for gas-engines shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each engine, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (i) For steam boilers the rate shall be Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horse-power of each boiler, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.

  (j) On buildings in course of erection where water is required for building purposes, the charge shall be Five shillings per 1,000 gallons, and the owner or occupier of such premises shall provide and fix the water meter and all necessary fittings for same, otherwise the owners or occupiers of such premises may, by special agreement with the Trust, pay a minimum charge of Ten shillings per centum on the total cost of the work for stone buildings, or 2s. 6d. per cent. for wooden buildings, when a meter will not be required to be provided, or they may, by special agreement with the Trust, pay the cost of the labour of laying and removing the necessary pipes, fittings, and a meter, and the hire of a meter at the rate of Ten shillings per anum, with a minimum charge of Five shillings, and for the water at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons. 3. On each vacant alloument or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust district before-mentioned, separately from any building, the annual rate of Ten pounds sterling per centum on the annual valuation of the same shall be pavable.

4. Water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings and sispence per 1,000 gallons, up to an amount equal to that which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any premises, and at the rate of Two shillings and sispence per 1,000 gallons for any quantity of water used beyond such an amount aforesaid. Nevertheless, it shall be competent for the Trust to make special arrangements from time to time for the supply of water by meter or otherwise.

5. For any public water-trough supplied with water by the Trust, the sum of Forty shillings per annum shall be charged, unless supplied by measurement.

6. For any steam boiler supplied with water by the Trust (except in cases of special arrangement with the

Trust) the sum of Thirty shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In case the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power, a charge by measure ment shall be made.

7. Water supplied to Government Departments, cricket grounds, show grounds, cattle yards, and similar properties, shall be charged for by measure, provided the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than Thirty shillings per annum, or the charge may be made by special arrangement with the Trust.

8. For water supplied from stand-pipe or hydrant, for each load of 200 gallons or under, the sum of Sixpence, and for each additional load pro rada on the above scale.

9. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, repairs, or additions, Twenty shillings per centum on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or in the absence of a contract, of the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or the Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement. shall be by measurement.

shall be by measurement.

10. A minimum rate of Five shillings and a maximum rate of Forty shillings per annum shall be chargeable to persons using water for ornamental gardens, or other like purposes; and any owner or occupier using more water than (in the opinion of the Trust or its officer) they are entitled to, the Trust may compel such owner or occupier to put on a meter, or may cut off the water supply from such premises. No water shall be used for any purpose whatsoever other than purely domestic use, except between the hours of Seven o'clock a.m. and Eight o'clock p.m.

11. For each spray supplied with water by the Trust for the purpose of cooling houses, the sum of Ten shillings per annum shall be chargeable in addition to the charges under any previous clause of this regulation, provided that such spray shall only be used between the hours of Seven o'clock a.m. and Eight o'clock p.m.

12. Such rates are hereby made for the year 1909, and are made payable in equal moieties, half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in the year, excepting those by measure, which shall be paid quarterly, or as the Trust may direct.

13. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC BATHS IN THE TOWNSHIP OF MIRBOO NORTH.

MIRBOO NORTH.

WE, Robert Henry Alford, John Bray, Herbert Doherty, Matthew Gargan, and James George Abbott, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Baths in the Township of Mirboo North, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection of tolks, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the Land Act 1901:—

RECULATIONS.

#### REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language,

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones or other missiles in the reserve.

5. The maximum scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the reserve and the use of the bath shall be as follows:—

For the admission of every person to the reserve and for the use of the bath such annual fee as the Committee of Management may determine

not exceeding ... ... 5 0 6. No person shall put in the reserve any horses, cattle,

goats, or pigs.

7. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

8. No person shall erect any building in the reserve-nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

#### THE BATH.

o. Every person over eight years of age using the bath shall be clad in a costume covering the body from the neck to the knees.

10. The bath may be set apart at stated hours for the

to the nath may be set apart at stated hours for the use of mules or of females respectively. During the time the bath is set apart for the use of males a red flag shall be flown on the flowstaff and no females shall be admitted to the reserve. Puring the time the bath is set apart for the use of the females a white flag shall be flown on the flagstaff and no males shall be admitted to the reserve. the reserve.

11. No person while using the bath shall use any soap

11. No person while using the bath shall use any soap or other substance or preparation whereby the water may be rendered turbid or unfit for the use of bathers.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 100 of the Land Act 1001, on conviction before any justice forfeit and pay a benalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
