PUPIL SURVEYORS AND DRAUGHTSMEN,
SURVEY BRANCH.

APPLICATIONS will be received, addressed to the Secretary for Lands, up to 31st December next, from candidates desirous of being appointed as Pupil Surveyors and Draughtsmen in connexion with this Department.

CONDITIONS.

An applicant for appointment must not be more than twenty years or less than sixteen years of age. He will be required to produce a medical certificate to the effect that he is of sound constitution, and not affected with any physical infirmity which would interfere with the proper exercise of his profession.

QUALIFICATIONS.

He must have passed the Matriculation Examination (including Algebra, Euclid, and Arithmetic) in the Melbourne or other recognised University, or—

Passed such other recognised examination, or produce such certificates from the Education Department, or other authority, as will satisfy the Surveyor-General as to his competency in the three subjects named, and as to his general educational proficiency.

He shall also with such certificates submit a specimen of his plan drawing.

COMPETITIVE EXAMINATION.

Having duly complied with the foregoing requirements, he will undergo a competitive examination in trigonometrical computation, plotting and plan drawing, when the competitors to whom shall be awarded a sufficient number of points by the Examiners will be recommended for appointment, subject to the regulations of the Department as to probation.

PROBATION.

Accepted candidates (not exceeding two) approved by the Minister shall enter the office as probationers for a period of one month without pay; and at the end of that time, if reported by the Surveyor-General to have displayed aptitude for the work, may be appointed as pupils, and will be subject to the General Regulations for the Public Service as far as they are applicable.

TERM OF SERVICE.

The pupil's service in the Department shall be for a term of four years, the first two of which will be served in the office, where he will be engaged in drawing and computing. He will then (if thought necessary) be examined in trigonometry, including computation of areas and reduction or traverse surveys, also plotting from field book and plan drawing. If his progress up to this

time be not deemed satisfactory, he will be liable to be dispensed with; but, if satisfactory, he will be placed under a departmental surveyor for two years for field practice.

Afterwards he will have the privilege of attending for two months at the Melbourne Observatory, where he will be instructed in such branches of practical astronomy as are necessary for the duties he may be called on to perform as a qualified surveyor.

He will be allowed to present himself at the next ensuing or subsequent examination for land surveyors for the purpose of obtaining the certificate of the Surveyors' Board as to his qualifications.

REMUNERATION.

He will receive the following remuneration during the term of his pupilage:—1st year, £40; 2nd year, £52; 3rd year, £65; 4th year, £80.

SUBJECT TO REGULATIONS.

During the whole term of his pupilage and service in the Department he shall be subject to the Regulations for the Public Service of Victoria as far as they are applicable.

BONDS REQUIRED.

Each successful candidate for appointment as pupil surveyor and draughtsman will be required to find two approved sureties, who shall enter into bonds for £150 each for the faithful performance of his duties, and to provide for his remaining in the service of the Department for a further term of two years, if required, at a salary of not less than £160 per annum.

CAVENDISH NEW PUBLIC CEMETERY.—RULES AND REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the Trustees for Cavendish New Public Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations, that is to say:—

1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*.
2. All fees must be paid to the Secretary before the ground is opened.
3. The name, age, late place of residence, and denomination must be stated when the order for burial is given.
4. No interment shall be permitted until a certificate from a Registrar of Deaths, Justice of the Peace, or Coroner has been delivered to the Secretary.
5. Application for permission to make a vault, erect a stone or monument or fence in the Cemetery, must be made to the Trustees, who, if the application is approved, will grant a certificate of permission on payment of the charges set forth in the scale of fees.
6. No coffin shall be buried within four feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under 12 years, when it shall not be less than three feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least one foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.
7. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the Registrar of Deaths, Justice of the Peace, or Coroner, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.
8. The friends of deceased must erect all monuments, tombs, or fences under the direction of the Trustees or those whom they may appoint.
9. No new grave can be made without paying for the ground or satisfying the Trustees that it has already been paid for.
10. No vehicles will be allowed to enter the Cemetery grounds without permission from the Trustees.
11. The hours for interments shall be from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. from 1st September to 30th April, and from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. during the other months.
12. All persons found destroying the fences or in any way injuring the Cemetery will be prosecuted as the law directs.
13. The Trustees reserve the right of making any alterations from time to time in their Regulations, subject to the approval of the Governor in Council.
14. Sunday burials are not desirable if they can be avoided.

WODONGA WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1909, No. 1.

THE Commissioners of the Wodonga Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, make the following By-law, viz. :—

1. *General Rate.*—A rate of One shilling and ninepence in the pound sterling is hereby made for the year 1909 upon all property liable to be rated within the Waterworks District of the Trust, and such rate shall be based on the municipal valuation of such property by the Shire of Wodonga in existence on the first day of January, 1909.

2. *Minimum Rate.*—The minimum rate payable on any property on which is erected any dwelling, house, shop, office, factory, stable, or other building shall be Twenty shillings. The minimum rate on any other rateable property whatsoever shall be Ten shillings.

3. *When Payable.*—The foregoing rates shall be due and payable in half-yearly moieties, in advance, that is to say, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1909. Such person or persons as may from time to time be employed by the Trust for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the rates hereby made.

WODONGA WATERWORKS TRUST.—
BY-LAW No. 2.

THE Commissioners of the Wodonga Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, make the following By-law :—

The following are the charges which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by this Trust within the Wodonga Waterworks District, that is to say :—

1. In all cases where a meter has to be used the charge shall be at the rate of One shilling and threepence for every 1,000 gallons, except where otherwise provided.

2. For buildings in course of erection to which water is supplied the charge shall be One pound per centum on the amount of the contract for such building, except the iron and wood work.

3. That for all stand-pipes used for the purpose of watering gardens and other purposes other than purely household purposes by ratepayers the charge shall be Ten shillings per annum per pipe. Provided that water for any garden exceeding the limit of 66 feet by 50 feet, or 3,300 square feet, must be supplied by meter, in which case the charge shall be at the rate of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons.

4. A special charge of Two pounds per annum shall be made for water supplied to St. Joseph's Convent and school in connexion therewith.

5. All Government buildings not connected with the Victorian Railway Department, and supplied with water by the Trust, shall be charged a fixed sum of Three pounds each per annum.

6. All steam engines using water must be supplied through a meter.

7. Rateable consumers may, at their option, be supplied by meter, in which case they may have as many pipes as they may see fit, provided that all water used by each such consumer shall pass through the meter, and

each such consumer shall be charged at the rate of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons, until a sum has been reached equal to the amount of his rates, and at the rate of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons for all water used over and above that sum. Provided that no such consumer shall pay less than the amount of his rates, although he may not use sufficient water at One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons to equal the amount of his rates.

8. A special charge of Thirty shillings per annum be made for St. Luke's Vicarage, Wodonga.

That the foregoing charges be paid in half-yearly payments on the 30th day of June and the 31st day of December in each and every year.

8. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by measurement (other than hydrant or stand-pipe water) shall be—

(1) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, a quantity for which the charge of One shilling per Thousand gallons would be equal to the assessed rate which would be payable for the house or tenement so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2) If solely for other than domestic purposes, Thirty thousand gallons per half year.

9. The above-mentioned rates and charges (except for stand-pipe or hydrant water) shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1909.

REGULATION.

Whenever a coffin is buried otherwise than in a vault, there shall be at least six inches of closely-packed earth between every part of it and every part of any other coffin below or alongside it, and it shall be so buried that no part of it shall be within four feet of the ordinary level of the ground, unless it contain the body of a child under 12 years of age, when it shall be so buried that no part of it shall be within three feet of that level. Any workman digging or filling in a grave, or any foreman or person in charge of such work, who shall disobey this regulation or give a direction contravening it shall be guilty of a breach of this regulation, and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Five pounds.

Any trustee, manager, secretary, or person having the care of a cemetery or burial ground who shall in any way sanction or permit or order a contravention of this regulation shall be guilty of a breach of this regulation, and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Five pounds.

The regulations relative to interments in cemeteries and burial grounds made on the twenty-first day of January, 1897, under the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, are hereby revoked.

Fire Brigades Act 1890.
METROPOLITAN FIRE BRIGADES BOARD.
 REGULATIONS.

*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the
 sixteenth day of December, 1908.*

WHEREAS by the *Fire Brigades Act 1890*, 54 Victoria No. 1200 (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Act), it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor-in-Council may, as to the whole or any part of Victoria, make regulations for all or any of the purposes set forth in the said Act. And whereas by section 40 of the said Act it is further enacted that, after the first meeting of the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board, all regulations as to the Metropolitan District shall be prepared by such Board and submitted to the Minister for approval prior to being made by the Governor-in-Council: And whereas these regulations have been so prepared and submitted: Now therefore the Governor-in-Council, that is to say His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the regulations following, that is to say:—

1. Save and except the regulations made on the 21st September, 1891, and the regulations made on the 21st November, 1893, which said regulations are hereby confirmed, all regulations made by the Board prior to the date of these regulations duly coming into operation shall be and the same are on and as from the date of these regulations so coming into operation as aforesaid rescinded and at an end.

2. These regulations shall apply to that part of the State of Victoria known as the Metropolitan Fire District, set forth or described in the second column opposite to the words "Metropolitan Fire District" in the first schedule of the said Principal Act, or any extension thereof.

3. The Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board (hereinafter called "the Board") may from time to time appoint all or any of the following officers and servants, that is to say:—A chief officer, a deputy chief officer, one or more assistant officers, a secretary, assistant secretary, a solicitor, a medical officer, a veterinary surgeon, members of the permanent Fire Brigade, and also such clerks, messengers, and other persons as it shall think proper for the due and efficient conduct of the business of the Board and the working of the permanent Fire Brigade at such remuneration, salaries, or wages, as to the Board shall seem fit, and the Board shall have power from time to time to suspend and remove all or any of the persons so appointed.

AS TO CONDUCT OF BUSINESS AND PROCEEDINGS AT THE MEETINGS OF THE BOARD AND OF COMMITTEES APPOINTED BY IT (PRINCIPAL ACT, SECTION 39, SUB-SECTION 1).

4. In the regulations following under the above heading the word "President" or "Chairman," as the case may be, shall be taken to include the member elected to preside at the meeting in the absence of such President or Chairman.

Offices of the Board.

5. The offices of the Board shall be at the Head Station, situate in the city of Melbourne, or at such other place as may be from time to time determined by the Board.

Board to Meet when it Thinks Fit.

6. Subject to the provisions of the Principal Act, the Board may meet for the despatch of business, adjourn, and otherwise regulate its meetings as it thinks fit. The Board shall meet at any time when duly summoned by the President.

Commencement of Business.

7. The Board shall commence business so soon after the time stated in the summons as there is a sufficient number of members in attendance to form a quorum, but if at the expiry of fifteen minutes from the time specified in the summons there is not a quorum present no business shall be transacted by the Board at that meeting, and such circumstance, together with the names of the members present, shall be recorded in the minute-book.

Committees, Appointment of.

8. The Board may appoint any committee for any purpose in accordance with section 26 of the Principal Act, and any committee may appoint one of its number as chairman. The President shall be *ex-officio* a member of all committees.

Finance Committee.

9. A committee shall be appointed from time to time by the Board which shall exercise supervision in all matters relating to the finances of the Board. This committee shall be known as the Finance Committee.

Report of Proceedings of Committees.

10. Minutes of all proceedings of committees shall be entered in a minute-book (and being signed by the chairman of the committee shall be presented to the Board) and a report of the proceedings and of the acts of any committee shall be submitted to the Board at the first meeting of the Board subsequent to the meeting of such committee for approval or otherwise.

Consideration of Reports.

11. If in the report of a committee there are distinct recommendations contained, such a report shall not be adopted until the same has been printed on the business paper or notice has been given of the several recommendations, and the sense of the Board has been taken separately on each.

Meetings of Committees.

12. All committees appointed by the Board shall meet within fourteen days of their first appointment, or any time thereafter by order of the Board, or on the written order of the chairman of any committee or of any two members of any committee.

Secretary.

13. The secretary or other officer acting in his stead shall attend all meetings of the Board or committees of the same and shall enter the minutes of acts, resolutions, and proceedings in a minute-book to be kept for that purpose. He shall keep a book showing all receipts of money on account of the Board, and all disbursements made, and shall at the first meeting in every month present to the Board the report of the Finance Committee and a statement showing the balance at bank verified by banker's certificate that the balance represented in the pass-book is correct. He shall, subject to the control of the Board, have charge of all books and papers and other property of the Board, and shall give receipts for all moneys payable to and disburse all amounts payable by the Board. He shall lay all correspondence before the Board.

Bankers.

14. The Board shall have the sole appointment and removal of the bankers. The first bankers shall be the Commercial Bank of Australia, Limited, and all moneys shall be banked on the day of receipt of same, or, in the event of the bank being closed, on the opening of the bank on the next banking day.

Payment of Accounts.

15. All payments of £1 or upwards shall be made by cheques upon the bankers of the Board, signed by any two members of the Finance Committee, and countersigned by the secretary.

Financial Year.

16. The financial year of the Board shall expire on the 31st day of December in each year, and all accounts shall be made up to and including that day for audit. A statement showing the receipts and disbursements of the Board for each financial year shall be presented to the Board duly audited in the month of February in each year.

Auditor.

17. The books, accounts, and vouchers of the Board shall be examined each month by a Licensed Auditor to be appointed by the Board, who shall be required to certify to the Board as to their correctness.

Common Seal.

18. The common seal of the Board shall be in the joint custody of the President and Secretary, or other officer authorized by the Board, but shall not be affixed to any document except by order of the Board as recorded in the minute-book, and shall only be affixed in the presence of the President, and in his absence any other member appointed by the Board, and Secretary or other officer authorized by the Board.

Confirmation of Minutes of Preceding Meeting of Board.

19. The minutes of any preceding meeting of the Board not previously confirmed shall be read as the first business at all meetings of the Board in order to their confirmation, and no discussion shall be permitted thereupon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings. The minutes, if confirmed, shall then be signed by the President.

Order of Business at Meetings of the Board.

20. The order of business of an ordinary meeting of the Board, after the minutes of the preceding meeting have been read and signed, shall be as follows, or as near thereto as practicable:—

- I. Reading of copies of letters sent by authority of the Board, if called for.
- II. Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- III. Presentation of reports of committees and officers.
- IV. Payments.
- V. Ordinary business.
- VI. Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- VII. Extraordinary business and new rules and regulations.
- VIII. Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- IX. Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof only.

Vote, how taken.

21. The President or Chairman (as the case may be) shall in taking the vote on any motion or amendment put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative, and shall declare his opinion from the show of hands as to which party has the majority.

Manner of Voting.

22. The Board or any Committee shall vote by show of hands. Any member may however call for a division upon any question, in which case the members voting in the affirmative shall stand up, and those in the negative shall retain their seats until the result is declared by the President or Chairman (as the case may be).

Notices of Motion.

23. Any member of the Board may bring forward such business as he may consider advisable in the form of a notice of motion, such notice to be dated and numbered and given in writing to the Secretary at least seven clear days previous to the meeting at which same is to be considered, or to be given by the intending mover to the Secretary at the close of the meeting of the Board, and the Secretary shall enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which it may be received.

Notice of Motion to be given.

24. No member shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion but in pursuance of notice given as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

Mover of Motion.

25. No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with unless the member who has given such notice or some one authorized by him in writing shall be present when the business is called in order, and motions must be moved in the order in which they have been received, and if not so moved or postponed shall be struck out.

Motions and Amendments Must be Seconded, &c.

26. No motion or amendment shall be entertained or discussed unless it be seconded, and no motion or amendment may be withdrawn except by leave of the Board.

Order of Debate.

27. Any member desirous of proposing a motion or amendment, or of discussing any matter under consideration, must rise and address the President or Chairman (as the case may be), and no member when speaking shall be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down, in which case the member calling to order shall be heard thereon in preference to any other speaker, and the question of order shall be disposed of before the subject is resumed or any other subject entered upon.

As to Speaking in Moving or Seconding Motions.

28. Any member moving or seconding any motion or amendment shall be held to have spoken on that question.

Pre-audience.

29. If two or more members rise to speak at the same time, the President or Chairman (as the case may be) shall decide which is entitled to pre-audience.

Speaking Twice.

30. No member at any meeting of the Board shall speak twice on the same question except by way of explanation or in reply upon any original motion of which he may be the mover or as the mover of the amendment last carried, and after the reply the amendment or the original motion (as the case may be) shall be immediately put to the vote.

Decision of Points of Order.

31. The President or Chairman (as the case may be) when called upon to decide a point of order or practice shall state the rule or precedent applicable to the case without argument or comment, and his decision as to what is order or explanation shall be final.

Amendments.

32. One amendment only shall be received or discussed at one time, but if lost another may be moved before the original question is put to the vote, but upon any amendment being carried it shall be competent for any one member to move one other amendment thereon but not more.

Amendment, if carried, to quash Original Motion.

33. Upon the adoption of any amendment by the Board such amendment shall be held to have quashed the original motion, and for all purposes of subsequent discussion the motion as so amended shall be acted upon as an original motion.

Adjournment.

34. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the Board, but, if on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice-paper shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence before any subsequent motion for adjournment be entertained, but if the motion for adjournment be carried the business then undisposed of shall have precedence at the next meeting of the Board.

Motions to be in Writing.

35. At every meeting of the Board all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall be reduced into writing signed by the mover and delivered to the President immediately on their being moved and seconded.

General Conduct of Business.

36. In all cases not hereinbefore provided for resort shall be made to the rules, forms, and usages of the State Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Board.

Press.

37. All meetings of the Board shall be open to the press unless otherwise determined, but strangers will not be permitted to be present at meetings of committees unless at the request of such committees.

*AS TO CONDUCT OF ELECTIONS OF THE BOARD
(PRINCIPAL ACT, SECTION 13).*

38. "Minister" shall mean the Honorable the Chief Secretary for the State of Victoria, or other the Minister for the time being administering the Principal Act and all amendments thereof.

Election of the City of Melbourne Representative.

39. The name of the person duly elected to be the member of the Board for the city of Melbourne shall be notified to the Minister from time to time by the Secretary to the Board as soon as conveniently may be after such election, and the Minister shall thereupon notify the same in the *Government Gazette*.

Election of Representative for North Yarra Group.

40. The Minister shall fix a day and notify the same in the *Government Gazette* on or before which each of the municipal councils of the North Yarra group shall nominate a person to be a member of the Board. Immediately after fixing and publishing the day aforesaid the Minister shall notify to the Mayor or President, as the case may be, of the several councils of the North Yarra group the day so fixed, and request the several municipal councils to nominate a member to represent such group. The name of the person so nominated shall be forthwith sent by the council to the Minister.

41. The following municipalities shall be known as the North Yarra group, subject to such alteration as may from time to time be made pursuant to the Board's Acts:—The municipal councils of Collingwood, Fitzroy, Richmond, Brunswick, Essendon, Footscray, Northcote, Williamstown, Braybrook, Bardon, Coburg, Heidelberg, Keilor, Preston, and Wymburnham.

Election of Representative for South Yarra Group.

42. The Minister shall fix a day and notify the same in the *Government Gazette* on or before which each of the municipal councils of the South Yarra group shall nominate a person to be a member of the Board. Immediately after fixing and publishing the day aforesaid the Minister shall notify to the Mayor or President, as the case may be, of the several councils of the South Yarra group the day so fixed, and request the several municipal councils to nominate a member to represent such group. The name of the person so nominated shall be forthwith sent by the council to the Minister.

43. The following municipalities shall be known as the South Yarra group, subject to such alteration as may from time to time be made pursuant to the Board's Acts:—The municipal councils of South Melbourne, Prahran, St. Kilda, Hawthorn, Brighton, Caulfield, Kew, Port Melbourne, Doncaster, Malvern, Moorabbin, Nunawading, Oakleigh, Camberwell, Templestowe, and Mulgrave.

Election of Representatives by Both Groups.

44. If on the day so fixed and notified more than the required number of candidates for the Board are nominated by the councils of any group entitled to elect, the Minister shall prepare a list of all persons nominated by such councils, and shall forward a copy of the same to the council of each municipality forming such group, and such council shall, before a day to be specified at the time of forwarding such list, strike out on such list all the names, except that of the candidate for whom such council desires to vote, and return such list within the prescribed time so altered to the Minister.

45. The Minister shall, on the date specified for the return of such lists, count all the votes received by him as indicated on the lists so returned, and declare the candidate who has received the largest number of votes to be the member of the Board for such group of municipalities.

46. In cases of equal voting, the Minister shall have a casting vote.

47. If on the day so fixed and notified only one person is nominated by the councils within the group entitled to elect, the Minister shall declare the person so nominated to be the member of the Board for such group of municipalities, and he shall thereupon notify such election in the *Government Gazette*.

48. In the nomination of candidates by councils other than that of the city of Melbourne, the procedure followed in connexion with the election of the chairman of a municipality shall be followed as nearly as may be, or such proceedings may be conducted in accordance with any by-laws to be hereafter made by any city or other municipality for that purpose.

Election of Representatives for the Fire Insurance Companies.

49. On or before a day to be specified by the Minister, and notified in the *Government Gazette*, and by circular so far as is reasonably practicable addressed to each insurance company carrying on business and insuring property within Victoria, the insurance companies may elect persons to be members of the Board.

50. The principal officer or agent in Victoria for the time being of an insurance company carrying on business in Victoria, and whose name has been previously notified to the secretary of the Fire Underwriters' Association as hereunder provided, shall be qualified to vote at any election for and on behalf of such insurance company.

51. Ten days before any election every insurance company shall, by its chairman of directors, manager, secretary, or other officer, notify to the secretary of the Fire Underwriters' Association of Victoria the name of its principal officer or agent authorized to vote on behalf of such company.

52. Candidates for the Board shall be nominated, in writing, by two voters, and such nomination paper shall be lodged at the office of the Fire Underwriters' Association of Victoria not less than five days prior to the date of the election, addressed to the secretary of such association, and the secretary of such association for the time being shall be the returning officer for the purpose of holding and declaring the result of such election, with power to appoint, in writing, a deputy for that purpose should he be unable to act or preside thereat.

53. Should the number of persons so nominated not exceed the number to be elected, the secretary of such association, or his deputy, shall declare such persons duly elected as members of the Board, and report to the Minister the names of the persons so elected, and the Minister shall thereupon notify such election in the *Government Gazette*.

54. Should the number of persons nominated exceed the number to be elected, the secretary of such association, or his deputy, shall, by advertisement in at least two newspapers published daily in Melbourne, and, as far as reasonably practicable, by circular addressed to each insurance company, fix and notify the day at which a poll will be taken.

55. Such poll shall be taken by such secretary, or his deputy, and each candidate may appoint a scrutineer to be present at the taking of such poll and the counting of the votes. The poll shall be taken at the office of the Fire Underwriters' Association of Victoria, or at such other place as the Minister may from time to time, by notification in the *Government Gazette*, direct, and shall be open from Eleven a.m. to Four p.m.

Scale of Votes.

56. The person voting on behalf of any company at any election for the Metropolitan Board shall be entitled to vote in accordance with the following scale:—

If the company on behalf of which he is voting has, under the 45th section of the *Fire Brigades Act 1890*, returned for the year previous to the election a premium revenue of less than £3,000, one vote for each member to be elected.

If £3,000 but less than £6,000, two votes for each member to be elected.

If £6,000 but less than £9,000, three votes for each member to be elected.

If £9,000 but less than £12,000, four votes for each member to be elected.

If £12,000 and upwards, five votes for each member to be elected.

57. The secretary of the aforesaid The Fire Underwriters' Association of Victoria shall prepare a list of the insurance companies entitled to vote, with the number of votes to which each company is entitled marked opposite to the name of such company. On the day of polling such secretary, or his deputy, shall hand to the company's principal officer or agent applying for the same one ballot paper, with the names of the candidates written or printed thereon, for each vote to which such company is entitled. The principal officer or agent entitled to vote for the company shall strike out the names of the candidates for whom he does not vote, leaving on the ballot paper the full number of candidates to be elected. He shall then fold up the ballot paper and deposit it in a box to be provided for the purpose by the secretary of the association.

58. The secretary, or his deputy, shall forthwith, after the conclusion of the polling, and in the presence of the scrutineers, if any, open and count the voting papers, and such secretary, or deputy, shall declare the candidate or candidates having received the largest number of votes to be the member or members on the Board for the insurance companies. Such secretary shall thereupon report the same to the Minister, who shall notify the same in the *Government Gazette*.

59. A list of all insurance companies shall be published by the Minister in the *Government Gazette*.

Any insurance company omitted from such list may be inserted therein by applying to the Minister within seven days from the publication thereof.

Such list, with the name or names of any insurance company so added, shall be taken to be the roll of insurance companies entitled to vote at the election of insurance companies' representatives on the Board.

FOR PERMITTING, WHEN OCCASION REQUIRES, ANY PORTIONS OF THE BRIGADE, OR ANY OF ITS OFFICERS OR MEN, OR ENGINES, OR ESCAPES, OR OTHER PROPERTY, TO PROCEED OR BE TAKEN BEYOND THE LIMITS OF THE METROPOLITAN OR ANY FIRE DISTRICT FOR THE PURPOSE OF ATTENDING FIRES (SECTION 39, SUB-SECTION 8).

60. The Board, through its chief officer, may, should occasion require, permit a portion of the brigade, or any of its officers or men, or any of its engines, escapes, or other property, to proceed or to be taken outside the limits of the Metropolitan Fire District for the purpose of extinguishing fires, and upon such occasions the following maximum scale of charges may be made:—

61. The Board, through its chief officer, may permit a portion of the brigade or plant to render services other than at fires under special circumstances, and in such cases charges may be made in such manner and under same schedule as for services of brigade and use of plant for attending fires outside Metropolitan Fire District.

FOR ESTABLISHING A SALVAGE FORCE (SECTION 39,
SUB-SECTION 14).

62. The chief officer may select from the permanent or partially-paid forces a sufficient number of men to act as a salvage corps at fires. The duties of this corps will be to save property from destruction by fire or water, and take any measures that may be deemed expedient for that purpose.

CHARGES TO BE MADE FOR USE OF PLANT AND SERVICES OF
SALVAGE FORCE AFTER EXTINGUISHMENT OF FIRES (SECTION 39,
SUB-SECTION 15).

63. Maximum scale of charges for services of salvage corps and hire of tarpaulins after extinction of fires:—

FOR INSURING DISCIPLINE AND GOOD CONDUCT AMONGST
MEMBERS OF BRIGADE (SECTION 39, SUB-SECTION 10).

64. Every member of the brigade must promptly obey the lawful orders of his superior officers, and must conform to all directions which may be from time to time in the brigade order book, and which shall have been previously approved by the Board, and must conform to these and all other regulations of the Board from time to time made.

65. If, in the opinion of the chief officer, or, in his absence, of the officer then in command, any member has been guilty of disobedience of orders or of any breach of the regulations or of any such direction, or otherwise guilty of any breach of duty or discipline, such chief or other officer in command may suspend such member from duty, and shall report the same to the Board. The Board may further suspend such offending member or remove such suspension, or may impose a penalty or reduce him in position or wages, or both, or may otherwise punish or deal with him, or dismiss him from the service, as it thinks proper. The Board shall decide as to whether any or what wages shall be paid to the offending member during the period of suspension.

66. The chief officer is empowered—

- To deal with all cases of breaches of regulations, orders, directions, duty, or discipline committed by members of the brigade in manner set forth in these regulations.
- To recommend to the Board the imposition of penalties in such sums as he may think necessary.
- In case of a member of the brigade having been suspended, he may reinstate such offending member temporarily until his case can be dealt with by the Board.

67. The maximum penalty which may be imposed by the Board for each or any of the offences set forth under this heading (viz.: For Insuring Discipline and Good Conduct amongst Members of the Brigade [Section 39, Sub-section 10]), and also for each and any other breach of the Board's regulations, is hereby fixed at the sum of Five pounds.

And subject thereto such penalty shall be imposed by the Board before or after the recommendation aforesaid or otherwise, without reference thereto, in the discretion of the Board.

68. Any member, including 4th class firemen, not being satisfied with the award of the chief officer may appeal to the Board, and the Board may, if necessary, re-open the case.

The chief officer shall report all offences and awards for same to the Board at its next meeting after the offence has been dealt with by him.

FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF PERMANENT FIRE BRIGADES
AND FOR THE PAYMENT OF SALARIES OR WAGES TO
MEMBERS THEREOF (SECTION 39, SUB-SECTION 3).

Permanent Fire Brigade.

69. Applications for appointment as members of the Metropolitan Fire Brigade must be in candidates' own handwriting, addressed to the chief officer.

70. Candidates must be physically strong men, free from any defect in limb, hearing, or sight, and will be required to undergo a medical examination by such legally qualified practitioners as the Board may appoint.

71. Candidates must not be less than twenty-one years of age (unless under special circumstances as to physique or qualification) nor more than thirty-two years, unless they have been previously and recently engaged as active and efficient firemen, or are otherwise thoroughly competent. In such cases the limit may be extended to forty years. They must not be less than five feet six inches (5 ft. 6 in.) in height, nor less than 37 inches in natural measurement of chest.

72. Candidates will be required to produce testimonials as to character and ability. They will also be required to produce certificate of birth or other satisfactory proof of age.

73. Candidates must be British subjects, born or naturalized.

74. Eligible candidates, when finally approved, will be accepted as members of the brigade as 4th class firemen on probation, the term of which must not be less than twelve months. At the end of such probation the 4th class fireman, if he has given satisfaction to the chief officer and has proved himself suitable, may be promoted by the Board to the rank of 3rd class fireman, and in the event of his being so appointed his seniority shall count from the date of joining as a 4th class fireman. During his probationary term of service the chief officer may dispense with the services of such probationer for any cause which such chief officer shall deem sufficient.

75. The engagement of all members above the rank of 4th class firemen will be for one month, and continue at a monthly hiring until discharged.

76. All engagements or appointments made by the Board may be cancelled or annulled without any reason being assigned.

77. If the chief officer deem it necessary, he may engage partially-paid firemen or other men to act temporarily in the place of permanent firemen. And he may from time to time dispense with the services of all or any such men.

78. No member of the permanent fire brigade will be allowed to engage in any business outside the brigade unless with the special permission of the Board. Every member will be required to devote his whole time to the services of the Board.

Auxiliaries.

79. Applications for appointment as auxiliaries must be in candidates' own writing, addressed to the chief officer of the Metropolitan Fire Brigade. The number of these auxiliaries will be limited to twelve, and their age on appointment must be about eighteen years. On reaching the age of twenty-one years, and if complying with the regulations governing the appointment of 4th class firemen, they may be so appointed.

80. From the date of joining the brigade as auxiliaries the services of these youths may be dispensed with at any time by the chief officer.

UNIFORMS.—FOR PRESCRIBING THE UNIFORMS TO BE WORN
BY THE VARIOUS GRADES AND CLASSES OF FIREMEN WHEN
ON DUTY (SECTION 39, SUB-SECTION 16).

81. The uniforms of firemen of all ranks below that of station officer shall consist of the following articles, viz.:—Cloth tunic and trousers, serge jacket and vest, serge trousers, dungaree jacket, caps, boots, belt, axe, and pouch, hose wrench, pouch and helmet.

Tunic.

82. To be made of stout blue cloth, double-breasted, with a stand-up collar about 1½ inches high; the ends of the collar to be rounded off and faced on the outside with a piece of scarlet cloth the same height as the collar and 2½ inches in length. On each side of the tunic to be sewn six brass buttons about 3 inches apart, and the letters M.F.B. to be marked on each button in old English characters, and a small, round badge 3 inches in diameter, with edging worked in red, sewn on left breast, and brass roll numbers, with brass hook on left side to support belt.

Station officers' tunics to be similar to those worn by firemen, but to have a single scale brass epaulette on each shoulder, and without breast badge.

District officers' tunics to be of somewhat finer cloth, and to be single-breasted.

Third and fourth officers' tunics to be similar to those worn by district officers, but to be distinguished from them by the buttons being of silver.

Fourth officers' tunic to have a silver lace band on each cuff.

Third officers' tunic to have a silver lace band on each cuff, surmounted by a diamond-shaped knot.

Chief officer's and deputy chief officer's tunics in most points to be similar to those of district officers, but to be distinguished from them by the buttons being of silver, and the chief officer's round instead of flat.

The chief officer's tunic to have three silver lace bands surmounted by a diamond-shaped knot on each cuff, and silver lace on collar. The deputy chief officer's tunic to have two silver lace bands surmounted by a diamond-shaped knot on each cuff.

District officers will wear a pair of scale epaulettes of brass, one on each shoulder.

Chief officer, deputy chief officer, third and fourth officers will wear a pair of scale epaulettes precisely the same as the district officers, except that they shall be, like their helmets and buttons, of silver.

Trousers.

83. Those worn by all ranks under station officer to be made of blue cloth and blue serge. Those worn by all ranks above senior firemen to be of somewhat finer material.

Jackets.

84. To be made of blue serge, double-breasted, with four brass buttons on either side. Those worn by all ranks above station officer and below fourth officer to be of similar pattern, but the buttons to be of bone.

Vests.

85. To be made of blue serge similar to that of the jackets.

Dungaree Jackets.

86. All ranks below that of station officer will be supplied with a dungaree jacket.

Peak Caps.

87. The caps worn by all ranks under station officer to be made of blue cloth, and M.F.B. in brass letters in front. Those worn by station and district officers to be made of blue cloth, with oakleaf band and gold lace badge, M.F.B. in monogram in front. Fourth and third officers' to be similar in every respect to the district officers', with the exceptions that the badges will be of silver lace and to have cloth oakleaf peaks. Deputy chief officers' cap to be similar to the third officers' cap, but to have a silver badge in front; also a full dress cap similar to the above, but with silver oakleaf worked on peak and two narrow silver lace bands. Chief officer's cap to be similar to that of deputy chief officers', but with full silver lace band.

Flat Caps.

88. Naval pattern with red piping round seams will be worn by all ranks under station officer.

Firemen's Boots.

89. To be of best grained leather, and to be made of sufficient length so as to reach above the calf but below the knee.

Officers' Boots.

90. All ranks above that of senior firemen to be supplied with boots of approved pattern.

Helmets.

91. All ranks below that of fourth officer, with the exception of the auxiliaries, shall wear helmets of brass or other metal, with the letters M.F.B. on a plate in front in plain characters.

The chief officer, deputy chief officer, third and fourth officers shall wear similar helmets to the above, but of silver.

Officers' Undress Uniform.

92. The undress uniform suits of the third, fourth, and deputy chief officers to be made of superfine serge. The jacket to be of a pattern to be approved by the Board, with the rank denoted on the shoulder straps.

The chief officer's undress suit to be similar to the above, but of extra superfine serge.

White Drill Jackets.

93. All officers to be supplied with white drill jackets, single-breasted, metal buttons, and rank denoted on blue cloth shoulder strap. Station officers' white drill jackets to have plain blue shoulder straps.

Uniform for Partially-paid Firemen.

94. The partially-paid firemen's uniform shall consist of cloth tunic and trousers, boots, flat caps and helmets, belt, axe, and hose wrench, similar to those supplied to the permanent firemen, with the following exceptions, viz.:—Tunic to have a red cloth collar; trousers to have the outer seams piped with scarlet piping.

Salaries of Permanent Staff.

95. Auxiliaries will receive salaries at the following rates:—

For the first year, 3s. per day.

For the second year, 4s. per day.

For the third year, 5s. per day.

96. Fourth class firemen will be paid a salary at the rate of Six shillings per day.

97. Third class firemen will be paid a salary at the rate of Six shillings and threepence per day.

98. Second class firemen will be paid a salary at the rate of Six shillings and sixpence per day.

99. First class firemen will be paid a salary at the rate of Seven shillings per day.

100. Senior firemen will be paid a salary at the rate of Seven shillings and threepence per day, and upon completion of one year's service to the satisfaction of the chief officer shall receive an increment of Threepence per day.

101. Station officers will be paid a salary at the rate of Seven shillings and ninepence per day, and upon the completion of one year's service in that rank to the satisfaction of the chief officer will be paid an increment of Threepence per day, and upon the completion of two years' service in that rank to the satisfaction of the chief officer will be paid an increment of Sixpence per day.

102. District officers will be paid a salary at the rate of Nine shillings per day, with annual increments of Sixpence per day until the maximum salary of Eleven shillings and sixpence per day is reached, and after service to the satisfaction of the chief officer for a further period of three years from the date of reaching and being paid the maximum of Eleven shillings and sixpence per day, such district officer may by one or more instalments have his pay increased on the recommendation of the chief officer to the Board up to a maximum of Fourteen shillings per day.

103. The chief electrician will be paid a maximum salary at the rate of Three hundred pounds per annum.

104. The inspector and officer in charge of special service firemen will rank with the district officers, and be paid a salary which, together with an allowance to be fixed by the Board in lieu of quarters, light and fuel, shall equal the salary of a district officer.

105. The fourth officer will be paid a salary at the rate of Two hundred and fifty pounds per annum, with increments at the pleasure of the Board until the maximum salary of Two hundred and seventy-five pounds per annum is reached.

106. The third officer will be paid a salary at the rate of Two hundred and seventy-five pounds per annum, with increments at the pleasure of the Board until the maximum salary of Three hundred pounds per annum is reached.

107. The deputy chief officer will be paid a salary of Three hundred and fifty pounds, with increments at the pleasure of the Board until the maximum salary of Five hundred pounds per annum is reached.

108. The chief officer will be paid such salary as the Board may from time to time determine, but such salary shall not exceed the sum of One thousand pounds per annum.

109. Special pay may be made to members of the brigade for special work, such pay not to exceed in any individual instance Twenty-six pounds per annum.

110. Married firemen who have completed five years' service to the satisfaction of the chief officer shall be entitled to quarters, or to an allowance of One shilling per day in lieu thereof.

111. All ranks above that of senior firemen shall have quarters, light, and fuel free.

112. The granting of all increments will be subject to the recommendation of the chief officer.

Promotions.

113. In all ranks below that of senior fireman the promotion to a higher class will be automatic, provided conduct and services have been to the satisfaction of the chief officer.

114. All promotions to ranks above that of first class firemen shall not necessarily be by seniority.

115. As vacancies occur in the rank of district and station officers, applications will be invited by the chief officer from men in the class immediately below. If, in the opinion of the chief officer, none of the applicants from that particular class are suitable or qualified for the position, he shall report the same to the Board, and applications for the vacant position shall be invited from the rank of first class firemen, subject to the provisions of clause 113. Candidates for promotion to the rank of station officer must have at least five years' service and have passed an educational and practical test, one month's notice of which must be given setting out the date and nature of the examination after approval by the Board has been obtained. Such educational test shall be in reading, writing, arithmetic, composition, and spelling, and a practical test in fire brigade work to be prescribed by the chief officer, and the applicant shall pass the same to the satisfaction of a board of examiners to be nominated by the chief officer and approved by the Board, and shall not be eligible for promotion as district officer for at least 12 months from date of appointment as station officer.

Brigade Educational Course.

116. The Board will appoint teachers and provide salaries for same. All auxiliaries must attend the course, and shall be exempt from the payment of fees. The course will be open to all members of the brigade above the rank of auxiliaries on payment of the fees as may be prescribed by the Board from time to time. Salaries of teachers not to exceed the aggregate of One hundred pounds per annum.

Good Service Badges.

117. At the expiration of five years' good service, firemen, on the recommendation of the chief officer, shall be entitled to a good service badge, and One penny per day additional pay.

118. A second badge, after 10 years' good service to the satisfaction of the chief officer, shall be awarded, with an additional Penny per day.

119. A third badge, after 15 years' good service to the satisfaction of the chief officer, shall be awarded, with a further Penny per day.

Long Service and Good Conduct Medals.

120. At the expiration of 15 years' good service to the satisfaction of the chief officer, all ranks of the brigade shall be awarded a long service and good conduct medal of bronze.

Leave.

121. All members of the permanent force may be allowed 30 hours' leave in each week, and an annual leave as under:—

122. After the completion of one year's service all ranks—

- Below senior firemen, 7 days.
- Senior firemen, 8 days.
- Station officers, 10 days.
- District officers, 14 days.
- Fourth and third officers, 21 days.

Provided always that the chief officer may, for sufficient reason, either from stress of work or other cause, cancel any or all leave at any time.

123. The deputy chief officer to be entitled to three weeks' annual leave.

124. The chief officer will be granted leave at the pleasure of the Board.

Special Service Firemen.

125. The chief officer shall be empowered to engage firemen for performing special duties at theatres and other public buildings, and for such other duties and at such other places as may from time to time become necessary.

126. These men, to be called special service firemen, shall not belong to the permanent staff of the brigade, but shall form a class by themselves.

127. The foregoing regulations, detailing the rates of salary to be paid, the uniforms to be issued, and the weekly and annual leave to be granted to the permanent staff, shall not be applicable to the special service firemen.

128. The uniform to be issued to these men shall consist of a blue cloth tunic and trousers and peak cap, similar to those issued to permanent firemen.

129. The salary of these men shall be at the rate of Six shillings and sixpence per day.

130. Special service firemen shall be allowed twenty-four hours' leave in each week, and an annual leave of seven days.

131. Although these men are employed at places not under the control of the officers of the brigade, they shall be amenable to all the regulations and orders and directions now in existence or hereafter to be made or issued for the purpose of insuring discipline; and they shall be subject to the control and under the orders of the chief officer or any other officer acting under his authority, and the chief officer may dispense with their services for sufficient cause.

Partially-paid Force.

132. Applications for appointments as firemen in the partially-paid force must be made in candidate's own handwriting to the chief officer of the Metropolitan Fire Brigade.

133. Candidates must be physically strong men, free from any defect in limb, hearing or sight, and not subject to fits or nervousness.

134. Candidates must be of suitable age and of good physique, and must be approved by the chief officer.

135. Candidates will be required to give the names of at least two reliable and respectable persons, who must be able to testify as to the habits and character of applicants, and, if necessary, they will be required to produce satisfactory proof of age.

136. Candidates must belong to such trade or occupation as will fit them for the duties of a fireman, and for the work of fire extinction.

137. Partially-paid firemen will receive pay in accordance with the following scale, viz. :—

- Senior partially-paid firemen, a retaining fee of 15s. per month.
- Partially-paid firemen, a retaining fee of 10s. per month.

138. In addition to the retaining fees, pay will be allowed for attendance at fires in accordance with the following schedule :—

Senior partially-paid firemen—			
For the first hour	£0 6 0
For the second hour	0 3 0
For each succeeding hour	0 1 6
Firemen—			
For the first hour	0 5 0
For the second hour	0 2 6
For each subsequent hour	0 1 0

139. No pay will be granted for attendance at drills, false alarms, fires with but trifling damage, or chimney

fires, unless under special circumstances, and no fireman will be entitled to receive pay under this schedule for services at any fire unless he shall have received orders to attend such fire from his superior.

140. Subject to good conduct and efficient service, the engagement of every member will be for three months, and so continued until discharged by one week's notice from the chief officer.

COMPENSATION IN CASE OF ACCIDENT OR DEATH FROM ACCIDENT.

141. For the purpose of providing a fund for the payment of compensation in cases of accidents to members of the permanent fire brigade, or where death ensues therefrom to their wives and families, the Board may from time to time set aside out of its revenue such sum or sums as it shall think necessary not exceeding Five hundred pounds in any one year, and such fund shall be invested in such manner as the Board may from time to time direct, and the Board may from time to time at its discretion expend any portion of the said fund in payment of such compensation either in one sum or by periodical payments as the Board shall think just.

PUBLICATION ALTERATION IN DATE, INSURANCE COMPANIES' RETURN (SECTION 45).

142. Upon the said Board in any year directing any alteration in the date before which each insurance company within the Metropolitan District shall during that year transmit to the said Board the return directed by Section 45 of the said Act, the said Board shall publish notice of such direction in the *Government Gazette* not less than seven days before the day to which such date shall be so altered.

PROVISIONS OF VOTING BY POST ACT APPLIED TO MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the sixteenth day of December, 1908.

PRESENT :

- His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.
- Mr. McBryde
- Mr. Payne
- Mr. McDonald.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, has, by an Order made on the 16th day of December, 1908, under the provisions of section 148 of the *Local Government Act 1903* (3 Edw. VII. No. 1893), and pursuant to the petitions of the Councils of the Municipalities of the respective Cities, Towns, Boroughs, and Shires whose names appear on the attached List marked "A" in that behalf, directed that the provisions of the *Voting by Post Act 1900*, applicable and severally referred to in the underwritten Schedules, shall apply to the elections of Councillors for the said Municipalities, with the alterations of such provisions as shown or indicated in the said Schedules, the same being alterations deemed necessary for the purpose of carrying into effect such provisions as so applied, and to give effect to the requirements of sub-section (1) of section 2 of the said Act.

His Excellency has also directed that the official to give the public notices required by the said section as altered shall be the Municipal Clerks of the said Municipalities.

And His Excellency, by the Order hereinbefore mentioned, has further directed that the Regulations following shall have effect :—

1. The following persons are hereby appointed officers within the meaning of section 21 of the *Voting by Post Act 1900* as applied to Municipal Elections, viz. :—

- All Justices of the Peace,
- All Councillors of any City, Town, Borough, or Shire,
- All Municipal Clerks,
- All Clerks of Courts,
- All Head-masters of State Schools,
- And every member of the Police Force,

throughout the State of Victoria.

2. Every letter or envelope transmitted through the post-office, pursuant to the *Voting by Post Act* as applied to Municipal Elections, either by or to a Returning Officer, shall have the necessary postage upon same prepaid.

SCHEDULE.

PROVISIONS OF THE VOTING BY POST ACT 1900 APPLICABLE TO THE ELECTION OF COUNCILLORS FOR THE MUNICIPALITIES WHOSE NAMES APPEAR ON THE ATTACHED LIST MARKED "A," AND ALTERATIONS TO BE READ AS MADE THEREIN FOR THE PURPOSES OF SUCH APPLICATION.

The following provisions, with the necessary alterations thereof, as shown or indicated, of the Voting by Post Act shall apply to the election of Municipal Councillors for the said Municipalities.

Section 3 shall apply, omitting the word "elector" in the first line, and substituting therefor the word "ratepayer"; omitting the words "province or district" in the second line, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality"; omitting the word "who" in the second line, and substituting therefor the words "whose name"; omitting the word "from" in the third line, and substituting therefor the word "upon"; omitting all the words after the word "the" where it first appears in the third line down to the word "and" in the fourth line, and substituting therefor the words "Voters' Roll for such Municipality"; omitting the words "province or district" in the twelfth line, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality."

Section 5 shall apply, omitting the words "any electoral" in the third line, and substituting therefor the words "the Voters"; and omitting the words "province or district" in the third and fourth lines, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality."

Section 6 shall apply unaltered.

Section 7 shall apply, omitting the words "initial letter" in the third line, and substituting therefor the words "special mark"; omitting all the words after the word "section" in the third line down to the word "and" in the fourth line, and substituting therefor the words "one hundred and forty-one of the *Local Government Act 1903*"; omitting all the words after the word "the" where it appears the second time in the eighth line down to the word "in" in the ninth line, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality"; omitting the word "electoral" in the twelfth line, and substituting therefor the word "Voters'."

Section 8 shall apply, omitting the word "electoral" in the first line, and substituting therefor the word "Voters"; omitting the words "province or district" wherever they appear, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality."

Section 9 shall apply, omitting the words "electors electoral province or district" in the second and third lines, and "province or district" in the third line, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality" in both places; omitting the words "electoral provinces or districts" in the twentieth and twenty-first lines, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality," and in line three after the word "Postmaster" insert the words "or Officer."

Section 10 shall apply unaltered.

Section 11 shall apply unaltered.

Section 12 shall apply, omitting the words "province or district" in the third and fourth lines, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality."

Section 13 shall apply, omitting all the words from the beginning of the section down to the word "the" where it appears the second time in the second line; omitting the words "province or district" in the fourth line, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality"; omitting the word "any" in the eighth line, and substituting therefor the word "the"; omitting all the words after the word "for" in the eighth line down to the word "to-day" in the ninth line, and substituting therefor the words "Councillor or Councillors for the Municipalities whose names appear on the attached List."

Section 14 shall apply, omitting the words "pursuant to the Constitution Act Amendment Acts" in the second line, and substituting therefor the words "in pursuance of the *Local Government Act 1903*"; omitting all the words after the word "together" in the twenty-sixth line down to the word "such" in the twenty-ninth line; omitting the

words "said sections" in the thirtieth line, substituting therefor the words "*Local Government Act 1903*"; omitting all the words after the word "the" where it appears the second time in the thirty-ninth line down to the end of the section, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality."

Section 16 shall apply, omitting the word "posted" in the first line, and substituting therefor the words "sent through the post"; omitting all the words after the word "shall" in the second line down to the word "every" in the seventh line, and substituting therefor the words "have the necessary postage thereon prepaid."

Section 17 shall apply, omitting the words "within the provisions of section two hundred and seventy-five of *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1890*."

Section 18 shall apply unaltered.

Section 19 shall apply unaltered.

Section 20 shall apply unaltered.

Section 21 shall apply, omitting the words "each electoral province or district" where they appear in the second and third lines, and the words "province or district" in the fourth line, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality."

Section 22 shall apply unaltered.

Section 23 shall apply unaltered.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir Thomas David Gibson Carmichael, Baronet, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of section 14 of the *Game Act 1896* (60 Vict. No. 1463), do by this my Proclamation direct that the area hereunder described shall be a locality in which from the first day of January to the thirty-first day of December (both days inclusive) in each year it shall be unlawful for any person to kill or destroy any native game set forth in the Third Schedule to the *Game Act 1890*.

Area above referred to: Comprising two hundred and thirty acres two roods, or thereabouts, and being Crown allotment 60, in the parish of Mooroolbark, county of Mornington.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this sixteenth day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and eight, and in the eighth year of His Majesty's reign.

1. 4. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

5. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

6. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.

7. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue to either party by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, but he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 4.

8. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the State for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.

9. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

10. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, and in the event of his failing to carry on his contract he will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure. In the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

11. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as broken, infringed, or vitiated by the purchase by any Department of forage grown at any Government establishment.
