Population.—The estimated population on the 30th September, 1907, was 1,250,796—626,931 males, 623,865 females; on the 31st December, 1907, it was 1,258,140—631,140 males, 627,000 females—thus showing an increase of 7,341 persons. The natural increase during the quarter was 4,126, and the excess of immigration was 3,218. Tasmania gained from this State 2,181 persons, and New Zealand 853. New South Wales lost 1,278 persons, Queensland 407, South Australia 732, Western Australia 1,776, South Africa 461, and United Kingdom 1,176 to this State.

Vital Statistics of the State.—Compared with the previous quarter, the marriages increased by 123 in the quarter under review; the deaths decreased by 156, and the births by 69, which gave an increase in the excess of births over deaths of 87. Of the total number of deaths (3,855), 338 were due to phthisis and 65 to other tubercular diseases; 252 to cancer; 17 to typhoid fever; and 27 to diphtheria.

Vital Statistics of Melbourne, &c.—The births during the quarter numbered 3,371. This includes 28 cases of twins, 2 cases of triplets, and 305 illegitimate births. The deaths numbered 1,801, and the excess of births over deaths was 1,570. The deaths from diphtheria numbered 14, from typhoid fever 10, and from tubercular diseases 210, as against 6, 4, and 219 respectively in the corresponding quarter of the previous year. The total deaths in Melbourne were 1,801, of whom 323 were under twelve months of age. In Ballarat, of 188 deaths, 12 were of infants; in Bendigo, 219 and 42; and in Geelong, 93 and 18 respectively. In Melbourne and Suburbs the deaths of infants under 1 year of age were 9.6 per cent. of the births—a rate higher than that of the whole State for the same period, viz., 7.7. In the four towns mentioned there were 772 deaths of people aged 65 years and upwards—or 34 per cent. of the total.

State Revenue and Expenditure.—The total revenue for the quarter was £2,124,834, an increase of £259,641 on the corresponding quarter of the previous year—the principal sources being Railways £1,080,187, Probate Duty £87,075, Stamp Duty £56,352, and Balance of Commonwealth Revenue £610,952. The total expenditure was £1,687,504, a decrease of £119,134 on that of the corresponding quarter of 1906.

Commonwealth Revenue and Expenditure in Account with the State of Victoria.—The total Commonwealth Revenue credited to this State (from returns of later date than those published for Victoria) was £1,021,511, as against £798,859 in the corresponding period of 1906, being an increase of £222,652 for the quarter under review. The principal sources were import duties on Stimulants and Narcotics, £160,688; Sugar, £2,028; Apparel and Textiles, £120,266; Agricultural Products and Groceries, £57,177; Metals and Machinery, £67,658. From Excise, Spirits vielded £60,782; Beer, £55,992; Tobacco, £32,429. The total expenditure on transferred services was £262,634 (Defence, £66,411; Postmaster-General, £180,211; and Trade and Customs, £16,012), and "new" expenditure, £163,297—a total of £425,931, as against £364,740 in the corresponding quarter of 1906—an increase of £61,191.

Victorian Banking Returns.—On the 31st December the total liabilities of the banks were £39,616,692, and the assets £43,732,080, as against £38,877,692 and £40,949,484 on the 31st December, 1906. The reserves amounted to £5,234,983; paid-up capital to £13,441,231. The ratio of coin and bullion to liabilities was 20.30 per cent.

Savings Banks.—On the 31st December the amount at credit of the 501,393 depositors was £12,951,779. During the quarter 19,152 accounts were opened, and 15,837 were closed; the deposits made were £2,498,295, and the withdrawals £2,374,368.

Gold Yield. - The total yield of gold up to the end of December, 1907, is 69,956,447 ounces.

Imports and Exports.—The total value of imports into Victoria during the quarter under review was £9,020,791, of which £4,312,242 was Australian produce. The total exports during the same period were valued at £10,382,518, of which £3,281,383 were exported to Australian States, and the exports of Australian produce were £9,530,808. In addition to the usual quarterly return, details of the principal articles of Australian and other production imported and exported during 1907 are also published. Of the total trade last year imports were valued at £28,197,448 (£11,096,734 Inter-State, and £17,100,714 Oversea), and exports at £28,735,672 (£11,623,576 Inter-State and £17,112,096 Oversea).

Exports of Frozen. Preserved, and Perishable Products.—For the fourth quarter in 1907, the total value of these exports through Cool Stores was £1,359,238, of which £145,152 went to other States, £1,122,386 to the United Kingdom, £69,693 to South Africa, and £22,007 to Eastern and other ports. The principal exports were—Butter, valued at £963,596; Frozen Meat, £316,817; Milk and Cream, £38,514; Bacon and Hams, £19,922; Frozen Rabbits and Hares, £4,796; and Fruit, £2,152.


