E., John Thornton, Edward Manifold, and James Budge Tait, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for a Cricket Ground and other purposes of Public Recreation at Camperdown, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the Land Act 1901.

Regulations.

- 1. The reserve, which is parcelled out into the following divisions, shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except as hereinaster provided:—
 - (1) The pavilion enclosure.
 - (2) The tennis court enclosure.
 - (3) The bowling green enclosure.
 - (4) The remainder of the reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in any part of the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the buildings, fences, tennis courts, bowling greens, cricket pitches, trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climbor jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the huildings, fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.

6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

7. No person shall erect any building in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

9. The maximum scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 4th

divisions of the reserve on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for cricket, football, tennis, or bowling matches, sports, fetes, or lightday amusements, or concerts, shall be as follows :-

For the admission of every person not under the age of sixteen years to the 1st division, such sum as the Committee of Management shall determine, not exceeding Four shillings.

For the admission of every child under the age of sixteen years to the 1st division, such sum as the Committee of Management shall determine, not exceeding Two shillings.

For the admission of every person not under the age of sixteen years to the 2nd, 3rd, and 4th divisions, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Two shillings.

For the admission of every child under the age of sixteen years to the 2nd, 3rd; and 4th divisions, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding One shilling.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall,

may determine, not exceeding One shilling.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the Land Act 1901, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any balliff of Crown lands, or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a genalty not exceeding £19.
