BOROUGH ECHUCA WATER TRUST.—RATING
BY-LAW FOR 1908.

THE Commissioners of the Borough Echuca Water Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, make the following By-law, viz. :—

1. That the rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of land and tenements liable to be rated within the Waterworks District of the Borough Echuca Water Trust shall pay for the year 1908. Such rates and charges shall be due and payable in advance, in four equal instalments, on the 1st January, 1st April, 1st July, and 1st October in such year.
2. On every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile, a sum of Five pounds per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Twenty-five shillings.
3. On every shop or place of business not used either wholly or partly as a domicile, a sum of Three pounds per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Twenty-five shillings.
4. On every livery stable, saw-mill, cordial or aerated water factory or other factory, a sum of Seven pounds ten shillings; and on every flour-mill, a sum of Fifteen pounds.
5. On every steam-engine (not including any steam-engine in a factory or mill rated under clause 4), a sum of One pound.
6. On every horse trough, a sum of Ten shillings.
7. The area of land allowed for each house or tenement shall be one rood. Should any larger area of land be attached to a house or tenement, an extra sum of Fifteen shillings for cultivated land, and Four shillings for uncultivated land, shall be paid for every rood or part of a rood.
8. For a temporary supply of water during the erection of new buildings, a sum of Ten shillings per centum on the amount of contract for stone-work, brick-work, and plastering shall be made, or if there be no contract then upon the value of or amount charged or paid for stone-work, brick-work, and plastering. All persons about to build must notify the Trust.

Cases where Water is not laid on.

9. On every house, tenement, factory, &c., not supplied through a service-pipe with water by the Trust, a sum of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Twelve shillings and sixpence.
10. On every rood or part of a rood of land rated separately from any tenement, a sum of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Three shillings.
11. Any owner or occupier of property supplied through a service-pipe with water by the Trust who wishes to be charged at the minimum rate as provided in clause 9, must give notice in writing to the Trust's Secretary; the water will then be turned off, and the minimum rate will take effect after the expiration of the current quarterly period. No allowance in the rate will be made unless the water is turned off for a full quarter, nor in any case where the water is supplied to two or more premises through one service-pipe.

Water Supplied by Measure.

12. The charge for water supplied to market gardens and nurseries from which produce is sold shall be One shilling per thousand (1,000) gallons, such supply to be in every case by or through a meter, which may either be provided and affixed by the consumer, after being approved by the Trust, or the Trust may provide and affix same, for which a rental of One shilling and sixpence

per quarter shall be charged. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for under this clause shall be Twenty thousand (20,000) gallons; a one-inch service-pipe may be allowed.

13. The Trust may require a meter to be used in any case where it is deemed necessary. In such case the provisions of clause 12 shall apply.

14. The Trust will not in any case be held liable to supply water under the provisions of clauses 12 and 13 until all consumers are supplied for domestic purposes.

15. The charge for water supplied from the Trust's stand-pipes shall be Threepence for each One hundred (100) gallons.

16. In any case where rates, meter charges, or other charges are not paid when due, the water may be cut off until such amounts are paid.

17. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose is, or are, hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

18. In the construction of this By-law the words "annual value" shall mean the municipal annual valuation in force in the Borough of Echuca on the 1st January, 1908, and the word "Trust" shall mean the Borough Echuca Water Trust.

By-law for determining the rates and charges which shall be made for water supplied within the boundaries of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust District :—

1. A rate of One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) in the pound sterling on the municipal value of all rateable property valued at Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence (£13 6s. 8d.) and upwards situated within the Waterworks District of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust is hereby made for the year 1908.

2. The minimum rate for such properties valued at less than Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence (£13 6s. 8d.) sterling on the municipal value shall be Twenty shillings (20s.).

3. On each unoccupied allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District before mentioned separately from any building, the annual rate of Five pounds sterling per cent. on the amount of the annual valuation of same shall be charged, provided that no allotment or piece of land shall pay less than Seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.) per annum.

4. Water supplied by measure to be used in private domiciles or other premises for domestic use, or for the watering of private gardens or distribution otherwise on or about such premises, shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons up to an amount equal to that the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons for any quantity of water used for the before-mentioned purposes beyond such an amount aforesaid.

5. For every steam boiler supplied with water by the Trust the charge shall be the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence (12s. 6d.) per annum for each horse-power (actual) of such steam boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In cases where the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power, a charge by measurement shall be made at the same rate as provided in clause four (4) hereof.

6. For water supplied for manufacturing purposes (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), the charge will be One shilling (1s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than equal to One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) in the pound on the municipal valuation of the Shire of Shepparton for the year 1908 of the property so supplied.

7. Water supplied to Government Departments, cricket grounds, bowling greens, show-yards, cattle-yards, and similar properties shall be charged for by measurement, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.) per annum.

8. For water supplied from stand-pipes or hydrants, for each load of Two hundred and fifty (250) gallons or under, Sixpence (6d.) shall be charged.

9. For a temporary supply during the erection of a new building, repairs, or additions, the charge shall be Twenty shillings (20s.) per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering, or in the absence of a contract, of the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, and plastering, or the said Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement, at the rate provided in clause four (4) hereof. All persons about to build must, if they require a supply of water for building purposes, notify the Trust, and shall not use any water for such purposes until authorized in writing by the Trust so to do.

10. Such rates are hereby made payable half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July in the said year 1908. The charges for the sale of water by measure shall be payable monthly, or at such other time or period as the Trust may in any case determine.

11. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

For every occupied or unoccupied allotment or vacant lot situated in any street or road where pipes have been laid, the rate to be paid shall be One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling, according to the municipal valuation of each allotment, provided that in no case shall a less rate than Ten shillings each be payable, except where the municipal valuation is less than Three pounds each, in which case the said rate shall not be less than Seven shillings and sixpence.

(III.) For all lands and tenements situated otherwise than in the streets or roads in which pipes are laid down, and which are within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe of the Trust, there shall be paid one-half of the above rates; and for all such lands and tenements being over a quarter of a mile but within half a mile from such stand-pipe, one-quarter of the full rate shall be paid.

The rates herein made are for the year 1908, and shall be due and payable on the 21st day of January, 1908.

Such person as the Commissioners shall appoint from time to time for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover such rates.

CITY OF HAWTHORN.

BY-LAW No. 60.

A By-law of the City of Hawthorn, made under sub-section 29 of section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, for prohibiting or regulating the use on any public highway of traction engines or other vehicles having projections on their wheels and under section 594 of the said Act for regulating the conditions on which traction engines may proceed over any public highway.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Hawthorn order as follows:—

Bars, Spikes, Grips, or other Projections on Wheels.

1. No person shall use or cause or procure any other person to use on any public highway any traction engine or other vehicle having on its wheels any bars, spikes, grips, or other projections.

This prohibition, however, shall not apply to

(a) Any traction engine, used only for hauling agricultural machinery, or hauling a vehicle containing such machinery only, if the projections on the driving wheels of such engine consist only of bars at least two and three-quarter inches in width and not more than one and one-sixteenth of an inch in thickness, and the space intervening between such bars does not exceed five inches; or,

(b) Any traction engine the driving wheels of which are cylindrical and smooth soled, and having no projections thereon other than diagonal bars of not less than three inches in width nor more than three-quarters of an inch in thickness, and extending the full width of the tire, and the space intervening between such cross bars, not exceeding three inches; provided in such last mentioned case—

(I.) That the owner of such engine has previously obtained from the Council or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf a permit in writing specifying the public highways on which it may be used, and that the engine is being used on one of the public highways so specified.

(II.) That the owner has agreed in writing to pay to the Council the cost of making good any damage done to any roadway, bridge, or culvert by such engine or any vehicle drawn by it.

(III.) That such engine is not being used (unless with the written consent of the Council or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf) to haul more than two vehicles, exclusive of any vehicle solely used for carrying water for such engine.

(IV.) That the loading of any vehicle drawn by such engine does not exceed nine tons in weight, including the weight of such vehicle.

(V.) That the weight carried by any vehicle drawn by such engine (including the weight of such vehicle) does not exceed three hundredweight for each half-inch of bearing surface of the tire or felloe of each wheel of such vehicle.

Weight of Engine, &c., to be Painted thereon.

2. Every owner of a traction engine shall cause to be painted in legible letters not less than one inch long on a plate attached to the engine, or on a conspicuous

place on the engine the exact and true weight thereof, and the maximum weight of water and fuel necessary for its propulsion.

Person to be in Attendance whilst Engine contains in itself sufficient Motive Power to move it.

3. So long as the fires of a traction engine are alight, or the traction engine contains in itself sufficient motive power to move it, one person shall remain in attendance whilst it is on any public highway, although it is stationary.

Taking Engine across or along Bridges, Embankments, &c.

4. No person shall take any traction engine across or along any bridge, culvert, or embankment so as to meet or pass thereon any other traction engine or any person with a horse or a vehicle drawn by a horse.

Engines not to Halt in certain parts of Highway.

5. No person shall halt (unless through unforeseen circumstances, or unless actually engaged in loading or unloading) in any part of a road where the traffic way is narrowed by fences, excavations, embankments, dangerous depressions, or such like, but shall draw off at least twenty feet from the middle of the formation in the case of a made road, or the middle of the surveyed road if unmade.

Engine not to Halt on Bridges or Culverts.

6. No person shall permit any traction engine or any vehicle attached to or drawn thereby to stop on any bridge or culvert for the purpose of drawing water, or for any other purpose whatever.

Driving Engine between Sunset and Sunrise.

7. No person shall drive any traction engine between sunset and sunrise, unless by written permission of the Council or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf, defining the route to be travelled and the extended hours during which such travelling is permissible, such permission to be withdrawable at any time upon written notice to that effect being served on the owner or driver of the engine or being forwarded to him by registered letter. No person who has received such written permission shall drive any traction engine between sunset and sunrise, unless there shall be exhibited on such engine proper and sufficient carriage or other approved lights, one at each side on the front and one in the rear, or when a vehicle or vehicles are being drawn by such engine, then in the rear of the last vehicle.

Wooden Planks to be carried on Engine, &c.

8. No person shall use or cause to be used on any public highway any traction engine unless there is carried on such engine or some vehicle drawn by the same at least fourteen wooden planks twelve inches in width, four inches in thickness, and at least twelve feet in length, and when crossing any bridge or culvert the driver or the person in charge of such engine shall lay down such planks, and no engine shall be permitted to cross over any bridge or culvert except on such planks.

Skidding of Wheels of Engine.

9. The driver of a traction engine shall shut off steam immediately the driving wheels of the engine commence to skid, and he shall not start the engine again until he has taken all necessary and proper means to prevent damage being done to the highway by the skidding of the wheels.

Penalties.

10. Any person shall for any wilful act or default contrary to this By-law be liable to the following penalty:—

- (a) For the first offence, a fine not exceeding Three pounds.
- (b) For a second offence, a fine not exceeding Five pounds.
- (c) For any subsequent offence, a fine not exceeding Ten pounds.

Extent of Operation of By-law.

11. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of Hawthorn.
