HEAD MASTER, WANGARATTA AGRICULTURAL HIGH SCHOOL.

NOTICE UNDER VOTING BY POST ACT 1900.

SOUTHERN PROVINCE.

Any Elector who intends to vote through the post must apply at once, as no Postal Ballot-paper will be supplied unless the Returning Officer receives application therefor sufficiently early to admit of Postal Ballot-paper being sent to and returned by such Elector so as to reach the Returning Officer before closing of Poll.

**Caution.**—Any person wilfully making a false statement in an application is liable on conviction to two years' imprisonment.

GULF ST. VICENT.—ENTRANCE TO THE PORT ADELAIDE RIVER.

Occulting Light Buoy.

MASTERS of vessels, pilots, and others are hereby notified that on and after the 18th instant the following alterations will be made at the entrance to the Port Adelaide River:—

The red buoy with occulting white light will be moved nine hundred (900) feet W. by N.  $\frac{1}{2}$  N. from its present position, and three of the temporary buoys referred to in Notice to Mariners No. 18 (2 red and 1 black) will be removed. The light on the old Port Lighthouse will then bear E. by N. two thousand six hundred feet distant. The occulting light buoy will be moored in about 25 feet of water O.L.W.S. The temporary black buoy on the North Bank will, for the present, be retained.

Vessels bound inward should, before passing the occulting light buoy, bring the beacons or lights of No. 0 lead in line (N. 74 deg. E.), and keep them in line until No. 1 lead comes on, then proceed as directed in previous notices. The sailing directions for the Outer Harbor remain unchanged.

Free ticket areas exist in most of the outer suburbs.

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

BY-LAW NO. 52.—RATE.—WATERWORKS DISTRICT OF THE LODDON UNITED WATERWORKS TRUST.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, and in accordance with the provisions of an Order in Council bearing date the 24th June, 1908, and published in the *Government Gazette* of 1st July, 1908, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following Rate is hereby made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of all lands within the Waterworks District of the Loddon United Waterworks Trust, except within any Urban District thereof:—

- (1) Of all lands in the First Division, as shown coloured red on a plan signed and sealed by the Commission and lodged at the office of such Commission at Melbourne; and authenticated copies of which are also lodged at the office of the Commission at Pyramid Hill; at the office of the Municipality of East Loddon, at Serpentine; at the Post Office at Mitiamo; at the Post Office at Tandara; at the Post Office at Marmal; at the Post Office at Boort; and at the Post Office at Bridgewater—a rate of One shilling in the pound of the rateable value of such lands.
- (2) Of all lands in the Second Division, as shown coloured green on the aforesaid plan—a rate of Sixpence in the pound of the rateable value of such lands.
- (3) Of all lands in the Third Division, as shown coloured brown on the aforesaid plan—a rate of Threepence in the pound of the rateable value of such lands.

2. Such rate is made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of January, 1908, and ending with the thirty-first day of December, 1908, and shall be payable on the twenty-fourth day of August, 1908, at the office of the said Commission at Pyramid Hill.

3. Such person or persons as the said Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate.

4. For making and levying such rate the net annual value of the lands set out in the valuation made by A. E. Smith, valuer, returned on the tenth day of April, 1908, and adopted by the said Commission on the twenty-seventh day of July, 1908, shall be deemed and taken to be the rateable value of such lands, unless altered or amended as provided by the *Water Act 1905*, and if so altered or amended then the net annual value of such lands set out in such altered or amended valuation.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, has, by Order made on the 4th day of August, 1908, under the provisions of section 148 of the *Local Government Act 1903* (3 Edw. VII. No. 1893), and pursuant to the petition of the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Howqua, directed that the provisions of the *Voting by Post Act 1900*, applicable and severally referred to in the underwritten Schedules, shall apply to the elections of Councillors for the Municipality

of the said shire, with the alterations of such provisions as shown or indicated in the said Schedules, the same being alterations deemed necessary for the purpose of carrying into effect such provisions as so applied, and to give effect to the requirements of sub-section (1) of section 2 of the said Act.

2. Every letter or envelope transmitted through the post-office, pursuant to the *Voting by Post Act* as applied to Municipal Elections, either by or to a Returning Officer, shall have the necessary postage upon same prepaid.

Section 3 shall apply, omitting the word "elector" in the first line, and substituting therefor the word "ratepayer"; omitting the words "province or district" in the second line, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality"; omitting the word "who" in the second line, and substituting therefor the words "whose name"; omitting the word "from" in the third line, and substituting therefor the word "upon"; omitting all the words after the word "the" where it first appears in the third line down to the word "and" in the fourth line, and substituting therefor the words "Voters' Roll for such Municipality"; omitting the words "province or district" in the twelfth line, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality."

Section 5 shall apply, omitting the words "any electoral" in the third line, and substituting therefor the words "the Voters"; and omitting the words "province or district" in the third and fourth lines, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality."

Section 6 shall apply unaltered.

Section 7 shall apply, omitting the words "initial letter" in the third line, and substituting therefor the words "special mark"; omitting all the words after the word "section" in the third line down to the word "and" in the fourth line, and substituting therefor the words "one hundred and forty-one of the *Local Government Act 1903*"; omitting all the words after the word "the" where it appears the second time in the eighth line down to the word "in" in the ninth line, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality"; omitting the word "electoral" in the twelfth line, and substituting therefor the word "Voters."

Section 8 shall apply, omitting the word "electoral" in the first line, and substituting therefor the words "Voters"; omitting the words "province or district" wherever they appear, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality."

Section 9 shall apply, omitting the words "electors electoral province or district" in the second and third lines, and "province or district" in the third line, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality" in both

places; omitting the words "electoral provinces or districts" in the twentieth and twenty-first lines, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality," and omitting the words "Postmaster or" wherever they occur, and in line three omitting "Postmaster" and inserting "Officer" in lieu thereof.

Section 10 shall apply, omitting the words "Postmaster or" wherever they occur.

Section 11 shall apply unaltered.

Section 12 shall apply, omitting the words "province or district" in the third and fourth lines, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality."

Section 13 shall apply, omitting all the words from the beginning of the section down to the word "the" where it appears the second time in the second line; omitting the words "province or district" in the fourth line, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality"; omitting the word "any" in the eighth line, and substituting therefor the word "the"; omitting all the words after the word "for" in the eighth line down to the word "to-day" in the ninth line, and substituting therefor the words "Councillor or Councillors for the Shire of Howqua."

Section 14 shall apply, omitting the words "pursuant to the Constitution Acts Amendment Acts" in the second line, and substituting therefor the words "in pursuance of the *Local Government Act 1903*"; omitting all the words after the word "together" in the twenty-sixth line down to the word "such" in the twenty-ninth line; omitting the words "said sections" in the thirtieth line, substituting therefor the words "*Local Government Act 1903*"; omitting all the words after the word "the" where it appears the second time in the thirty-ninth line down to the end of the section, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality."

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per ton of 40 cubic feet for firewood, including delivery at the offices and all charges. Prices should only be quoted for requirements where estimates are shown above.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either one or more of the above-mentioned places, and tenders for such places may be accepted or rejected separately; but if all lengths of firewood be included in one tender it may be accepted for one length only, if advisable.

Where the kind or kinds of wood is not mentioned in the tender form, tenderers must specify the kind or kinds of firewood they offer to supply.

Telegrams, or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement, will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for £10, with two approved sureties for the due performance of the contract, within ten days after the acceptance is notified.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Firewood at ..." as the case may be, and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by Gazette notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of firewood which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must be split out of large timber, and must be perfectly sound, dry, and of the kind or kinds specified in the tender: neither burnt wood, heartwood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. The billets must be not less than 4 inches nor more than 6 inches in diameter. The long wood to be not less than 9 inches nor more than 18 inches in diameter. Delivery to be made on the written order of the chief officer of the Department requiring the supply. The ton of firewood consists of 40 cubic feet. If the firewood is obtained from a State forest timber reserve, or ordinary Crown lands, persons cutting and removing same must be provided with proper Crown licences for the particular areas concerned.

3. Orders will be issued half-yearly (except in cases where the storage is small, when they will be issued quarterly); but the contractor must have 24 hours' notice before purchases are made at his risk.

4. The contractor will be bound to place it in stacks for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. The stacks are to be 2 feet wide (or 4 feet 6 inches for long wood) by 5 feet high, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets (or lengths) are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. In the event of any inconvenience being felt, either through delay in delivery or of stacking the wood, the Department concerned will purchase the same or re-stack that delivered, at the contractor's risk, from whose account any expense incurred thereby will be deducted.

5. The officer receiving the supply shall have full power to reject any wood which he may consider not in accordance with the contract, notice of which will be given to the contractor in writing, stating the reason. The contractor may, however, claim a survey; but in that case he must, within 48 hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the wood.

6. The board of survey will be composed of persons appointed by the Honorable the Treasurer, and the decision of the board of survey is to be considered as final.

7. If the board of survey shall decide that the supply is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.

8. Accounts for firewood to be rendered to the Department receiving the supply immediately upon completion of the order, which must be attached to the accounts. Payment will be made at the receipt and pay office of the district, or at the Treasury, Melbourne, as the contractor may require.

9. In the event of any irregularity on the part of the contractor being repeated, it will be competent for the Government, in case such irregularity should be established to the satisfaction of the Tender Board, to cancel the contract forthwith.

10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

11. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract.

12. No subletting will be allowed; all work must be carried out by the contractor, and the hours of employment of any person engaged in cutting or supplying the firewood tendered for in this schedule are not to exceed 48 per week, and every such person shall be paid at a minimum wage of not less than 6s. a day; and a copy of these conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, on the premises of the contractor. Any infringement of these conditions, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from any accounts which are or may be due to the contractor, and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement and in all other respects.

7. No tree of less than 5 inches diameter at a height of 2 feet from the ground shall be stripped when of the black or feather-leaved variety, or less than 2½ inches in diameter at a height of 2 feet from the ground, when of the broad-leaved species, unless otherwise stated herein, and wherever a size limit is mentioned it shall be at a height of 2 feet from the ground. ## BOROUGH OF ST. ARNAUD.

## BY-LAW NO. 56.

A By-law of the Borough of St. Arnaud, made under section 107 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered fifty-six (56), for regulating the traffic of motor cars, motor cycles, automobiles, and similar machines.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of St. Arnaud order as follows:—

1. The expression "machine" in this By-law shall mean and include any motor bicycle, motor tricycle, motor car, motor cycle, motor vehicle, automobile, or other vehicle driven or worked by steam, electricity, or other mechanical power.

2. No person shall drive, ride, or impel a machine upon or along any footway made or set apart for the use of pedestrians.

3. Every person who drives, rides, or impels a machine during the hours between sunset and sunrise shall carry a lamp, which shall be attached to the machine, and so constructed and placed so as to exhibit a light in the direction in which he or she is proceeding, and such lamp shall be kept so lighted as to afford adequate means of signalling the approach and position of such machine.

4. Every person who drives, rides, or impels a machine shall keep the same upon the near or left-hand side of the carriage-way, and whenever he shall overtake with such machine any vehicle or any horse or other beast of burden or foot passenger proceeding or standing on the street or carriage-way, he shall, within a reasonable distance from and before passing such vehicle, horse, or other beast of burden or foot passenger, give audible and sufficient warning of the approach of his or her machine by sounding a bell, whistle, or horn.

5. Every person driving, riding, or impelling a machine who overtakes and passes any vehicle, horse, or any beast of burden or foot passenger shall keep such machine to the right or off-side of such vehicle, animal, or foot passenger, and shall give warning of his or her approach, as in the last section preceding.

6. In every case where a person driving, riding, or impelling a machine meets or overtakes any vehicle drawn by a horse or other beast of burden, and where such horse or other beast of burden may, on such meeting or overtaking, become restive or alarmed, or may cease to be under the due control of the person in charge of same, the person driving, riding, or impelling such machine shall stop as speedily as possible, and shall so remain stopped as long as may be reasonably necessary.

7. No person riding, driving, or impelling a machine shall proceed at a greater speed than ten (10) miles per hour or part thereof upon or along any of the streets or public places, and five (5) miles per hour when going round corners of streets or public places within the Borough of St. Arnaud.

8. No person shall drive, ride, or impel a machine on a public highway recklessly or negligently, or at a speed or in a manner which is dangerous to the public, having regard to all the circumstances of the case, including the nature, condition, and use of the highway, and to the amount of traffic which usually is at the time or which might reasonably be expected to be on the highway.

9. Any police constable may apprehend without warrant the driver or person in charge of any machine who commits an offence under the last preceding section number eight (8) within his view, if such driver or person refuses to give his name and address.

10. A person driving, riding, or impelling a machine, or in charge thereof, shall in any case if an accident occurs to any person; whether on foot or horseback; or in

a vehicle, or to any horse or vehicle in charge of any person, owing to the presence of a machine on the road, stop, and, if required, give his name and address, and also the name and address of the owner of the machine.

11. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Borough of St. Arnaud.

## BY-LAW NO. 11.

A By-law of the Shire of Bright, made under section 228 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 11, for the purpose of repealing all former By-laws.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and ratepayers of the Shire of Bright order as follows:—

## SHIRE OF BRIGHT.

## BY-LAW NO. 13.

A By-law of the Shire of Bright, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 13, for the regulation and government of motor cars, motor cycles, bicycles, and other velocipedes.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Bright order as follows:—

1. Throughout this By-law the expression "machine" shall mean a motor car, motor cycle, bicycle, tricycle, or velocipede.

2. A person shall not ride, drive, or impel a machine upon any footway set apart for the use of foot passengers.

3. Every person who rides, drives, or impels a machine during the hours between sunset and sunrise shall carry a lamp, which shall be attached to the machine, and shall be so constructed and placed as to exhibit a light in the direction in which he is proceeding, and such lamp shall be so lighted and kept lighted as to afford adequate means of signalling the approach and position of such machine.

4. Every person who rides, drives, or impels a machine shall keep the same upon the near or left-hand side of the carriage-way, and whenever he shall overtake with such machine any waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden, or any foot passenger proceeding along the carriage-way, he shall, within a reasonable distance from and before passing such waggon, cart, or carriage, horse or other beast of burden, or such foot passenger, by sounding a bell or whistle, give audible and sufficient warning of the approach of his machine.

5. Every person riding, driving, or impelling a machine, who overtakes and passes any vehicle or any horse or other beast of burden, shall keep to the right or off-side of such vehicle or animal.

6. In every case where a person riding, driving, or impelling a machine meets or overtakes any waggon, cart, or carriage, or any horse or other beast of burden, and where any animal drawing such waggon, cart, or carriage, or such horse or other beast of burden, may, on such meeting or overtaking, become restive or alarmed, or may cease to be under the due control of the person for the time being in charge of such waggon, cart, or carriage, or such horse or other beast of burden, the person riding such machine shall dismount as speedily as possible, and shall continue dismounted so long as may be reasonably necessary.

7. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable, on conviction thereof, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

8. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District.
