SPENCER GULF.-LOWLY POINT LIGHT.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Act 1905, and after due inquiry, I, being the responsible Minister for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of sub-section (1) of section 40 of the said Act in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF MESSES. ROBERTSON AND MOFFAT, DEPARTMENT OF CARPETS AND FURNISHINGS, BOURKE-STREET, MRIBOURNE,

for a period of one week from the 5th August, 1908, upon the following express conditions, that is to say :--

- 1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than twelve females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said twelve females shall not be employed for more than fifty-four hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours beyond the ordinary working hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
- articles for trade or sale.

 2. That every female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wageworker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
- 3. That every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
- That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
- That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

Every person who rides, drives, or impels a machine shall keep the same upon the near or left-hand side of the carriage-way, and whenever he shall overtake with such machine any waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden, or any foot passenger proceeding along the carriage-way, he shall, within a reasonable distance from and before passing such waggon, cart, or carriage, horse or other beast of burden, or such foot passenger, by sounding a bell or whistle, give audible and sufficient warning of the approach of his machine.
- 5. Every person riding, driving, or impelling a machine, who overtakes and passes any vehicle or any horse or other beast of burden, shall keep to the right or off-side of such vehicle or animal.
