 - (b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

- 3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate or licence will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.
- 4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to

W HEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, 1890, No. 1098, intituled "An Act to consolidate the law relating to Public Health," power is given to the council for the time being of any city, town, borough, or shire from time to time to make by-laws for certain purposes therein specified, and to repeal, alter, or amend the same, as any such council may see fit: And whereas in pursuance of the powers enabling it in that behalf, the council of the Shire of South Barwon did, on the 3rd day of February, 1905, pass a By-law, numbered 6, intituled "A By-law for regulating pan-closets and the emptying and cleansing of cess-pools in the townships of Belmont and Torquay within the said shire," which said By-law was confirmed by the said council on the 3rd day of March, 1905, and was allowed and confirmed by the Board of Public Health in and for the State of Victoria, on the 25th day of May, 1905: And whereas it is expedient to alter and amend the provisions of the said By-law, numbered 6, be it therefore, and it is hereby, enacted by the said council in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of South Barwon, that from and after the date of this By-law coming into operation:—

1. This By-law shall apply to and have operation within

1. This By-law shall apply to and have operation within the undermentioned areas, the boundaries of which are described as follows, namely:—

Township of Belmont.—Commencing at a point at the intersection of the Colac and the Germantown roads; thence south-easterly and southerly along the Germantown-road to the south-east angle of the Belmont Closer Settlement properties; thence along the southern boundary of the said Belmont Closer Settlement properties to the Colacroad; thence north-easterly along that road to the commencing point mencing point.

2. This By-law shall be read and construed as one with By-law number 6 hereinbefore mentioned.

LIGHT ON TUAHINE POINT, POVERTY BAY.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners No. 49 of 1909, issued by this Department on the 3rd July last, notice is hereby given that on and after Monday, the 16th August, 1909, a light will be exhibited from the lighthouse which has been erected on Tuahine Point, Poverty Bay, on the east coast of the North Island.

The light, which is shown from an iron lighthouse painted white, at an elevation of 138 feet above high water, will be a white occulting light, flash 2 seconds, eclipse 6 seconds, burning acetylene gas, and will be unwatched, and will burn continuously without attention for about forty days.

It should be seen from seaward (except when obscured by the land) over an arc of 250 deg. between the bearings of about S. 37 deg. W. and S. 73 deg. E. round by north, and should be visible for a distance of eighteen miles.

For ships with Explosives on board exceeding One hundred and fifty (150) tons in weight:—Within a radius of haif-a-mile from a point distant three-and-a-half miles southward of Point Cook Buoy on an imaginary line bearing north 39 degrees 30 minutes east to the Point Gellibrand Pile Lighthouse.

At the Port of Eastward of an imaginary line bearing Geelong south-south-east to Limeburner's Point, and exceeding a distance of one-half a mile from the shore.

At the Port of Portland Eastward of an imaginary line bearing south to Observatory Point, and exceeding a distance of three-quarters of a mile from the shore.

At the Port of Eastward of an imaginary line bearing Port Fairy south-east to the eastern end of Griffith Island.

At the Port of Warrnambool

Outside of an imaginary line bearing south to the seaward end of the Warr-nambool Breakwater.

43. No powder lighter having explosives on board shall go alongside any wharf in the Port of Port Phillip without permission, in writing, from the Port Officer, or anchor otherwise than as follows:—

Westward of an imaginary line bearing north-east to the Point Gellibrand Pile Lighthouse, and southward of an imaginary line bearing north-east to the Explosives Anchorage Buoy and Altona Jetty, and exceeding a distance of one mile from the shore, provided that powder lighters attending on ships with explosives on board exceeding One lundred and lifty (150) tons in weight may be or anchor within a radius of half-a-mile from a

point distant three-and-a-half miles southward of Point Cook Buoy on an imaginary line bearing 39 degrees 30 minutes east to the Point Gelli-brand Pile Lighthouse. Provided further that this Rule shall not apply to the loading, unloading, or conveyance of—

(a) Explosives belonging to the 1st Division of the 6th Class (ammunition), viz.:—

Safety cartridges for small arms. Percussion caps. Railway fog signals. Safety fuse for blasting.

- (b) The following explosives belonging to the and Division of the 7th Class (fireworks), vir., squibs, crackers, serpents, rockets (other than war rockets or signal rockets), margons, stars, lances, wheels, and roman
- (c) Explosives on His Majesty's ships.
- (d) Other explosives, and in such quantities as may from time to time be approved of by the Minister.
