A By-law of the Borough of Portland, made under the provisions of section 35 of the Health Act 1890, and numbered 49, for defining the mode of carriage and precautions to be observed in carrying meat to or from abattoirs, butchers' shops, or premises.

N pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act* 1890, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Portland order as follows:—

No person shall bring or cause to be brought into the said borough, or carry or cause to be carried through any street in the said borough in any cart or vehicle, any butcher's meat or carcass of meat unless such cart or other vehicle be so constructed or covered as that the rays of the sun and the rain and the dust are not allowed to fall upon or be capable of reaching such meat or carcass of meat, and that proper sitting accommodation be provided for the driver thereof.

Any person offending against the provisions of this by-law shall, upon conviction thereof, forfeit a sum of not less than Five shillings or more than Ten pounds.

Erection of Closets.

4. Every occupier of any house in connexion with which 4. Every occupier of any nouse in connexion with which there is no properly-constructed closet must have one such erected, with a door or opening sufficiently large to admit of the removal of pans and the space under the seat suitably prepared, and shall permit such closet to be used for the pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause the same to be kept in a fit state for such service.

Supply of Pans.

5. Every occupier of any house within the limits of the township of Omec shall supply the pans necessary to effectively carry out the pan service at his or her own

Deodorization of Night-soil.

becommended of Night-soil.

6. Every occupier aforesaid or other person having the control or management of any house, shall cause to be kept in every closet belonging thereto a sufficient supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil to be covered immediately on deposit thereof in the pan with a sufficient quantity of such material to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

Removal of Contents of Pans.

7. The council shall, at least once a week or so much more frequently as it may from time to time direct, cause the contents of the pans to be removed in the night-time.

Persons authorized to remove Night-soil.

8. The occupier of any house shall not contract for the removal of night-soil from such premises except in accordance with this by-law.

o. If any person or the Council commits a breach of this by-law, he or it shall, for every such breach, be liable to a penalty not exceeding (£5) Five pounds, and not less than (5s.) Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.-VICTORIA.

EASBY WRECK-GABO HARBOR.

R EFERRING to Notice to Mariners, No. 2, dated 21st August: 1007, and previous REFERRING to Notice to Mariners, No. 2, dated 21st August, 1907, and previous notices relating to the wrecked steamer Easby an Gabo Harbor, mariners are hereby notified that most of the remains of such wreck are now under water, forming an obstruction to the entrance for small craft to the inner anchorage of the harbor, which may be approached by channels on either side of the wreck. The position of the wreck is marked at the stern, to seaward of the obstruction, by a buoy, and at the stem by visible wreckage, the intervening space being closed against navigation. The stem of the wreck is 144 feet from the jetty.

When entering to the inner anchorage by night, mariners should steer on a South 57 deg. 20 min. East bearing towards the red light on the outer end of the jetty until within about 100 feet thereof, then round up to an anchorage in line with the jetty.

It is also hereby notified that on or about the 1st December next, the red light on the outer end of the jetty will be discontinued, and there will be established a red light and a white light at a higher elevation beyond on lamp-posts on the shore at the head of the Bay, at positions such that the Channel on the southern side of the wreck may be navigated by keeping the said two lights in line bearing S. 75 deg. E. until in line with the pier, where an anchorage may be found in about 9 feet of water.

AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE EXAMINATION OF ENGINEERS.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the Marine Act 1890, the Marine Board of Victoria, with the consent of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say :-

1. These Regulations shall form portion of "The Regulations for the Examination of Engineers" made by the Board on the 11th day of July, 1902, and published in the Government Gazette of the 29th day of July, 1902, and shall be read in connexion therewith, and shall take effect from the date of publication hereof in the Government Gazette, on which date paragraphs numbered 37 and 38, and clause (l) of paragraph 23 of the aforesaid Regulations shall be repealed.

2. For paragraph 38 of the aforesaid Regulations there shall be substituted the following, namely:—

38. Service in steam sea-going dredgers, fishing boats, or tug boats, and in steam sea-going pilot vessels when on their station, or when going to or returning from the same, may be accepted under the following conditions:—Two months

of such service is only equivalent to one month's qualifying service. Candidates for Second Class Certificates may perform all their sea service in steam sea-going dredgers, fishing boats, tug boats, or pilot vessels, but they must have been on regular watch on the main engines or boilers, and the vessels must not be less than 66 nominal horse-power. Candidates for First Class Certificates must have served in vessels of at least 99 nominal horse-power, and have been in charge of a watch on the main engines or boilers. They must, in addition, have served in a qualifying capacity for at least six months in a foreign-going steam-ship, or nine months in a steam-ship trading between ports on the coast of Victoria. ports on the coast of Victoria.

3. For clause (1) of paragraph 23 of the aforesaid Regulations there shall be substituted the following,

(1) He must write a legible hand and have a good knowledge of arithmetic up to and including yulgar and decimal fractions and square root. He must also understand the application of these rules to questions about safety-valves, coal consumption, consumption of stores, capacities of tanks, bunkers, &c.

4. Candidates who have neglected to join their vessels after having signed Articles, or who have deserted their vessels after having joined, or who have been found by a competent Court guilty of gross misconduct on board, will be required to produce satisfactory proofs of two years' subsequent service and good conduct at sea, unless the Board, after having investigated the matter, should see fit to reduce the time.

The foregoing amended Regulations and additional Regulation were made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria held this third day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and nine.

AMENDED REGULATION IN SUBSTITUTION OF SECTION 12 OF "THE PILOT REGULATIONS 1004.

THE Marine Board of Victoria, under the powers conferred upon it by the Marine Act 1890, to make, alter, or repeal regulations for the granting of licences to competent persons to act as pilots, doth hereby, with the consent of the Governor in Council, make the regulation following (that is to say):—

1. From and after the date of the publication hereof in the Government Gasette, paragraph 12 of "The Pilot Regulations, 1904," made by the Marine Board on the eighth day of November, 1904, shall be repealed, and from and after such date there shall be substituted the following Regulation, which shall be read and construed as paragraph 12 of "The Pilot Regulations, 1904":—

12. Issuing Licence.—Subject to such nominee having swing Licence.—Subject to such nominee having observed the requirements and passed the examinations aforesaid, the Marine Board may thereupon grant to him a licence, to be held subject to the rules and regulations which may for the time being be in force, to act as pilot of vessels having a draught of water not exceeding 22 feet, and at the expiration of a period of not less than twelve calendar months from the date of such licence, the same being then unrevoked or unsuspended, a licence to act as pilot of any vessel without restriction.

The foregoing Regulation was made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria held this twentieth day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and nine.

MURTOA WATERWORKS TRUST. BY-LAW NO. 2.

HE Commissioners of the Murtoa Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 306 of the Water Act 1905, do make the following By-law:

1. General Conduct of Business.—In all cases not herein

provided for, resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Trust.

- 2. Minutes of Meeting.—At every meeting of the Trust the first business thereof shall be the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and the minutes of the proceedings of any committee presented at such preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; and the said minutes of the proceedings to the proceedings meeting, shall then be signed by the the preceding meeting shall then be signed by the chairman.
- 3. Order of Business at Meetings.—After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but, for the greater convenience of the Trust at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—
 - (I.) Reading copies of letters sent by the authority of the Trust.
 - (II.) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
 - (III.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
 - (IV.) Presentation of reports of committees.

 - (VI.) Presentation of reports of community.

 (v.) Payments.

 (vI.) Ordinary business.

 (vII.) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.

 (vIII.) Extraordinary business, and new rules and
 - regulations.
 (Ix.) Other motions, of which previous notice has
 - been given.
 (x.) Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

- 4. Divisions.—Whenever a division shall be demanded by any commissioner, the commissioners voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result be declared by the chairman.
- Address to Governor .- All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the chairman and the secretary of the Trust, unless otherwise ordered by the Trust.
- 6. Motions.-All notices of motion shall be dated and 6. Motions.—All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered, and given by the intending mover to the secretary at the close of the meeting of the Trust, or if not required by law to be given at a meeting, then three clear days prior to the next meeting of the Trust; and such secretary shall enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be received.
- 7. Notice of Motion to be Given.—No commissioner shall make any motion in initiating a subject for discussion but in pursuance of notice given, as prescribed in the last preceding clause.
- 8. Petitions.—No motion, except that for receiving the same, shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of the Trust after that at which it has been presented.
- 9. Motions to be Moved in Order in Notice Book.— Except by leave of the Trust, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the secretary in the notice of motion book, and if not so moved or postponed shall be struck out.
- ro. Motion by Commissioner giving Notice.—No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the commissioner who gave notice of the same, unless by some other commissioner producing written authority from him to that effect.
- 11. Draft of Address or Petition.—No motion for an address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall at some previous meeting have submitted a draft of the same.
- 12. Order, &c., of Debate. Any commissioner desirous 12. Order, &c., of Debate.—Any commissioner desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the commissioner (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the commissioner in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.
- 13. Nature of Motion to be Stated .-- Any commissioner desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Trust thereon.

14. Motion Not to be Withdrawn without Leave.-No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the Trust.

Motion to be Seconded.—No motion or amendment 15. Motion to be Seconded.—No motion of amendments shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Trust unless shall be discussed or p it be seconded, but a commissioner may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the Trust by directing the chairman's attention to the infraction

Mover of Motion -- A commissioner moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a commissioner merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

spoken upon it.

17. Designation of Commissioners.—The commissioners in meeting of Trust shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of chairman or commissioner, as the case may require.

18. Priority of Commissioners.—If two or more commissioners rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

19. Chairman to Rise when Addressing Trust.—The chairman shall rise in addressing the Trust to discuss any question, and shall not leave the chair on such occasions.

occasions,
20. Commissioner Not to Speak a Second Time on Same
Question.—No commissioner shall speak a second time on
same question, unless entitled to reply, or in explanation
when he has been raisrepresented or misunderstood.
21. Points of Order.—The chairman, when called upon
to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the
provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable
to the case, without discussing or commenting on the
same; and his decision as to order or explanation in each
case shall be final. case shall be final.

22. Commissioners not to Digress, &c .- No commissioner shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other commissioner in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives and all personal reflections on commissioners shall be deemed highly dis-

tions on commissioners shall be deemed highly disorderly.

23. Commissioners to Apologize for Disorderly, &c., Expressions.—Whenever any commissioner shall make use of any expression disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other commissioner, the commissioner so offending shall be required by the chairman to withdraw the expression, and to make a satisfactory apology to the Trust.

24. Commissioner Called to Order to Sit Down.—A commissioner called to order shall sit down unless permitted to explain.

mitted to explain.

25. Commissioners Twice Offending Guilty of an Offence.—Any commissioner using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order or to withdraw and to apologize for such conduct, and refusing

withdraw and to apologize for such conduct, and refusing so to do, shall be guilty of an offence.

26. Strangers.—Any person, not being a commissioner, who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the Trust, be guilty thereat of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when lawfully requested by the chairman so to do, may be forthwith removed by him, and shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

- 5. No tree shall be felled or stripped on any beauty spot, picnic ground, or on any portion of any area which the officer in charge points out as not to be operated upon,

spot, picinic ground, or on any portion of any area which the officer in charge points out as not to be operated upon, and no particular tree, specially marked by him to remain standing, shall be felled or stripped, wherever situated.

6. No tree shall be felled so us to fall into any water-course, or so as to obstruct any road or track.

7. No tree of less than 5 inches diameter at a height of 2 feet from the ground shall be stripped when of the black or feather-leaved variety, or less than 2½ inches in diameter at a height of 2 feet from the ground, when of the broad-leaved species, unless otherwise stated herein, and wherever a size limit is mentioned it shall be at a height of 2 feet from the ground. Notwithstanding this, trees of any diameter may be stripped with the express permission of the officer in charge, if diseased, or for other, in his opinion, valid reason.

8. The whole work to be done under the supervision of the officer in charge, and in accordance with his instructions.

tions.

9. Bark must be properly bundled, securely tied, and stacked in heaps of not less than 10 cwt., in clear places only, and the licensee must take every reasonable precaution against fire. A space of at least 40 feet round each stack must be cleared of grass and rubbish.

10. No bark must be removed without the express permission of the officer in charge.

11. Camps must be pitched and fires lighted only in such places as shall be pointed out by the officer in charge, and the licensee shall, on demand of that officer, instantly dismiss from his employ any person or persons who shall

dismiss from his employ any person or persons who shall carelessly use, leave, or light any fire, whether by smoking, cooking, or other operations, or who shall otherwise act in contravention of these conditions.

12. No live tree, other than wattle, must be cut or broken, or firewood used, without the express permission

broken, or hrewood used, without the express permission of the officer in charge.

13. The violation of any of the above or following conditions will render the licence null and void, and the Honorable the Minister of Forests shall have power to confiscate to the Crown all bark stripped to date of voidance. The officer in charge, in his discretion, shall have power to instantly suspend operations pending the decision of the Honorable the Minister of Forests being made
