BY-LAW No. 49.

A By-law of the Borough of Portland, made under the provisions of section 35 of the *Health Act 1890*, and numbered 49, for defining the mode of carriage and precautions to be observed in carrying meat to or from abattoirs, butchers' shops, or premises.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Portland order as follows:—

No person shall bring or cause to be brought into the said borough, or carry or cause to be carried through any street in the said borough in any cart or vehicle, any butcher's meat or carcass of meat unless such cart or other vehicle be so constructed or covered as that the rays of the sun and the rain and the dust are not allowed to fall upon or be capable of reaching such meat or carcass of meat, and that proper sitting accommodation be provided for the driver thereof.

Any person offending against the provisions of this by-law shall, upon conviction thereof, forfeit a sum of not less than Five shillings or more than Ten pounds.

SHIRE OF OMEO.

BY-LAW NO. 7.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, and of any other power thereunto enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Omeo, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within its jurisdiction, makes the following by-law, that is to say:—

Repeal of former By-laws.

1. All former by-laws, so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this by-law, are hereby repealed.

Date of Operation.

2. This by-law shall come into operation and full force immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

Area Affected.

3. This by-law shall apply to and have operation within the limits of the township of Omeo.

Erection of Closets.

4. Every occupier of any house in connexion with which there is no properly-constructed closet must have one such erected, with a door or opening sufficiently large to admit of the removal of pans and the space under the seat suitably prepared, and shall permit such closet to be used for the pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause the same to be kept in a fit state for such service.

Supply of Pans.

5. Every occupier of any house within the limits of the township of Omeo shall supply the pans necessary to effectually carry out the pan service at his or her own expense.

Deodorization of Night-soil.

6. Every occupier aforesaid or other person having the control or management of any house, shall cause to be kept in every closet belonging thereto a sufficient supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil to be covered immediately on deposit thereof in the pan with a sufficient quantity of such material to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

Removal of Contents of Pans.

7. The council shall, at least once a week or so much more frequently as it may from time to time direct, cause the contents of the pans to be removed in the night-time.

Persons authorized to remove Night-soil.

8. The occupier of any house shall not contract for the removal of night-soil from such premises except in accordance with this by-law.

Penalties.

9. If any person or the Council commits a breach of this by-law, he or it shall, for every such breach, be liable to a penalty not exceeding (£5) Five pounds, and not less than (5s.) Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.—VICTORIA.

[No. 51.]

EASBY WRECK—GABO HARBOR.

REFERRING to Notice to Mariners, No. 2, dated 21st August, 1907, and previous notices relating to the wrecked steamer *Easby* in Gabo Harbor, mariners are hereby notified that most of the remains of such wreck are now under water, forming an obstruction to the entrance for small craft to the inner anchorage of the harbor, which may be approached by channels on either side of the wreck. The position of the wreck is marked at the stern, to seaward of the obstruction, by a buoy, and at the stem by visible wreckage, the intervening space being closed against navigation. The stem of the wreck is 144 feet from the jetty.

When entering to the inner anchorage by night, mariners should steer on a South 57 deg. 20 min. East bearing towards the red light on the outer end of the jetty until within about 100 feet thereof, then round up to an anchorage in line with the jetty.

It is also hereby notified that on or about the 1st December next, the red light on the outer end of the jetty will be discontinued, and there will be established a red light and a white light at a higher elevation beyond on lamp-posts on the shore at the head of the Bay, at positions such that the Channel on the southern side of the wreck may be navigated by keeping the said two lights in line bearing S. 75 deg. E. until in line with the pier, where an anchorage may be found in about 9 feet of water.

AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE EXAMINATION OF ENGINEERS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the *Marine Act 1890*, the Marine Board of Victoria, with the consent of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

1. These Regulations shall form portion of "The Regulations for the Examination of Engineers" made by the Board on the 11th day of July, 1902, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 29th day of July, 1902, and shall be read in connexion therewith, and shall take effect from the date of publication hereof in the *Government Gazette*, on which date paragraphs numbered 37 and 38, and clause (1) of paragraph 23 of the aforesaid Regulations shall be repealed.

2. For paragraph 38 of the aforesaid Regulations there shall be substituted the following, namely:—

38. Service in steam sea-going dredgers, fishing boats, or tug boats, and in steam sea-going pilot vessels when on their station, or when going to or returning from the same, may be accepted under the following conditions:—Two months

of such service is only equivalent to one month's qualifying service. Candidates for Second Class Certificates may perform all their sea service in steam sea-going dredgers, fishing boats, tug boats, or pilot vessels, but they must have been on regular watch on the main engines or boilers, and the vessels must not be less than 66 nominal horse-power. Candidates for First Class Certificates must have served in vessels of at least 99 nominal horse-power, and have been in charge of a watch on the main engines or boilers. They must, in addition, have served in a qualifying capacity for at least six months in a foreign-going steam-ship, or nine months in a steam-ship trading between ports on the coast of Victoria.

3. For clause (1) of paragraph 23 of the aforesaid Regulations there shall be substituted the following, namely:—

(1) He must write a legible hand and have a good knowledge of arithmetic up to and including vulgar and decimal fractions and square root. He must also understand the application of these rules to questions about safety-valves, coal consumption, consumption of stores, capacities of tanks, bunkers, &c.

4. Candidates who have neglected to join their vessels after having signed Articles, or who have deserted their vessels after having joined, or who have been found by a competent Court guilty of gross misconduct on board, will be required to produce satisfactory proofs of two years' subsequent service and good conduct at sea, unless the Board, after having investigated the matter, should see fit to reduce the time.

The foregoing amended Regulations and additional Regulation were made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria held this third day of September, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and nine.

AMENDED REGULATION IN SUBSTITUTION OF SECTION 12 OF "THE PILOT REGULATIONS 1904."

THE Marine Board of Victoria, under the powers conferred upon it by the *Marine Act 1890*, to make, alter, or repeal regulations for the granting of licences to competent persons to act as pilots, doth hereby, with the consent of the Governor in Council, make the regulation following (that is to say):—

1. From and after the date of the publication hereof in the *Government Gazette*, paragraph 12 of "The Pilot Regulations, 1904," made by the Marine Board on the eighth day of November, 1904, shall be repealed, and from and after such date there shall be substituted the following Regulation, which shall be read and construed as paragraph 12 of "The Pilot Regulations, 1904":—

12. *Issuing Licence*.—Subject to such nominee having observed the requirements and passed the examinations aforesaid, the Marine Board may thereupon grant to him a licence, to be held subject to the rules and regulations which may for the time being be in force, to act as pilot of vessels having a draught of water not exceeding 22 feet, and at the expiration of a period of not less than twelve calendar months from the date of such licence, the same being then unrevoked or unsuspended, a licence to act as pilot of any vessel without restriction.

The foregoing Regulation was made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria held this twentieth day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and nine.

CARRUM WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING BY-LAW BY THE AUDITOR-GENERAL FOR THE YEAR 1909.

WHEREAS default having been made by the Carrum Waterworks Trust, formerly the Carrum Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in payment of the interest owing by it in respect of a certain loan granted by the Governor in Council to such Trust: And whereas the Auditor-General of the State of Victoria, having done all things necessary under the powers in that behalf him enabling has entered upon and taken possession of the property of such Trust: And whereas, subject to the provisions of the *Water Act* 1905, the Waterworks District of the said Carrum Waterworks Trust was, by Order in Council dated the 18th day of January, 1909, divided into divisions for rating purposes: And whereas by an Order in Council dated the 24th day of August, 1909, it was directed:—

- (a) That the rates necessary for the year 1909 for paying interest on all money borrowed by the Carrum Waterworks Trust, for the construction and maintenance of its works, or to meet any other expenses in connexion therewith, shall be levied in Divisions Nos. 1, 2, 3, and 4 of the said Trust District, as described in the said Order in Council dated the 18th day of January, 1909.
- (b) That the rates for the said year 1909 shall be levied differentially as between the said Divisions Nos. 1, 2, 3, and 4, and doth hereby determine that the proportion in which such several divisions shall be rated respectively one to another shall be as follows, that is to say:—

That the respective ratings in the pound sterling on the annual value of the rateable property rated for municipal purposes in the said Divisions Nos. 1, 2, 3, and 4, shall be:—

- Division No. 1.—Six shillings.
- Division No. 2.—Three shillings.
- Division No. 3.—Sixpence.
- Division No. 4.—Two shillings, with a minimum amount of Five shillings (5s.).

Now therefore the Auditor-General of the State of Victoria, being in possession of the property of the said Carrum Waterworks Trust, doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act* 1905, for the purpose of discharging the obligations of the said Trust to the Governor in Council in respect of unpaid interest upon the said loan, and to provide for the other payments required to be made by the said Trust for the maintenance and management of its works, and for other purposes under the said Act, make the following By-law for the year 1909:—

That the respective ratings in the pound sterling on the annual value of rateable property for municipal purposes in the said Divisions Nos. 1, 2, 3, and 4, as defined and limited in the aforesaid Order in Council bearing date the 18th day of January, 1909, shall be:—

- Division No. 1.—Six shillings.
- Division No. 2.—Three shillings.
- Division No. 3.—Sixpence.
- Division No. 4.—Two shillings, with a minimum amount of Five shillings (5s.).

The above rates are hereby made payable on the 21st day of October, 1909.

Such person or persons as the Auditor-General of Victoria may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates.

MURTOA WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 2.

THE Commissioners of the Murtoa Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 306 of the *Water Act 1905*, do make the following By-law:—

1. General Conduct of Business.—In all cases not herein provided for, resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Trust.

2. Minutes of Meeting.—At every meeting of the Trust the first business thereof shall be the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and the minutes of the proceedings of any committee presented at such preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed by the chairman.

3. Order of Business at Meetings.—After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but, for the greater convenience of the Trust at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (I.) Reading copies of letters sent by the authority of the Trust.
- (II.) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- (III.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (IV.) Presentation of reports of committees.
- (V.) Payments.
- (VI.) Ordinary business.
- (VII.) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- (VIII.) Extraordinary business, and new rules and regulations.
- (IX.) Other motions, of which previous notice has been given.
- (X.) Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

4. Divisions.—Whenever a division shall be demanded by any commissioner, the commissioners voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result be declared by the chairman.

5. Address to Governor.—All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the chairman and the secretary of the Trust, unless otherwise ordered by the Trust.

6. Motions.—All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered, and given by the intending mover to the secretary at the close of the meeting of the Trust, or if not required by law to be given at a meeting, then three clear days prior to the next meeting of the Trust; and such secretary shall enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be received.

7. Notice of Motion to be Given.—No commissioner shall make any motion in initiating a subject for discussion but in pursuance of notice given, as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

8. Petitions.—No motion, except that for receiving the same, shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of the Trust after that at which it has been presented.

9. Motions to be Moved in Order in Notice Book.—Except by leave of the Trust, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the secretary in the notice of motion book, and if not so moved or postponed shall be struck out.

10. Motion by Commissioner giving Notice.—No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the commissioner who gave notice of the same, unless by some other commissioner producing written authority from him to that effect.

11. Draft of Address or Petition.—No motion for an address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall at some previous meeting have submitted a draft of the same.

12. Order, &c., of Debate.—Any commissioner desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the commissioner (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the commissioner in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

13. Nature of Motion to be Stated.—Any commissioner desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Trust thereon.

14. Motion Not to be Withdrawn without Leave.—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the Trust.

15. Motion to be Seconded.—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Trust unless it be seconded, but a commissioner may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the Trust by directing the chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

16. Mover of Motion.—A commissioner moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a commissioner merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

17. Designation of Commissioners.—The commissioners in meeting of Trust shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of chairman or commissioner, as the case may require.

18. Priority of Commissioners.—If two or more commissioners rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

19. Chairman to Rise when Addressing Trust.—The chairman shall rise in addressing the Trust to discuss any question, and shall not leave the chair on such occasions.

20. Commissioner Not to Speak a Second Time on Same Question.—No commissioner shall speak a second time on same question, unless entitled to reply, or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

21. Points of Order.—The chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussing or commenting on the same; and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

22. Commissioners not to Digress, &c.—No commissioner shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other commissioner in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives and all personal reflections on commissioners shall be deemed highly disorderly.

23. Commissioners to Apologize for Disorderly, &c., Expressions.—Whenever any commissioner shall make use of any expression disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other commissioner, the commissioner so offending shall be required by the chairman to withdraw the expression, and to make a satisfactory apology to the Trust.

24. Commissioner Called to Order to Sit Down.—A commissioner called to order shall sit down unless permitted to explain.

25. Commissioners Twice Offending Guilty of an Offence.—Any commissioner using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order or to withdraw and to apologize for such conduct, and refusing so to do, shall be guilty of an offence.

26. Strangers.—Any person, not being a commissioner, who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the Trust, be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when lawfully requested by the chairman so to do, may be forthwith removed by him, and shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

27. Commissioners Not Attending Order for Call.—Any commissioner not attending in compliance with an order for a call of the whole Trust, without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof, shall be guilty of an offence.

28. Commissioners may Demand Documents.—Any commissioner may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the Trust applying to the question under discussion.

29. Voting.—The Trust shall vote by show of hands; and any commissioner present and not voting, not being disabled by law from so doing, shall be guilty of an offence.

30. Question, how Declared.—The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the Trust, put the question first in the affirmative then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

31. Motions, &c., to be in Writing.—At every meeting of the Trust all motions whether original motions or amendments, shall be reduced into writing, signed by the mover, and delivered to the chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.

32. No Second Amendment until Previous one Disposed of.—No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

33. Effect of Rejection of Original Motion.—If any words of an original question be rejected, the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next question, whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.

34. If Amendment be Negatived, a Second may be Moved.—If an amendment be negatived, then a second may be moved to the question to which the first-named amendment was moved; but only one amendment shall be submitted to the Trust for discussion at a time.

35. Mover of Motion to have Right of Reply.—The mover of any original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no commissioner shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question, unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

36. Motion for Adjournment.—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the Trust; but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice-paper shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

37. Protests.—Any commissioner may protest against any resolution of the Trust; the notice of intention to protest shall, in every case, be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Trust by the protesting commissioner in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the secretary, and signed by such commissioner, and shall be also entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Trust to be not in accordance with truth, or in its terms disrespectful to the Trust.

38. Lapsed Questions.—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of the commissioners present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted on motion upon notice.

39. Lapsed Order of the Day may be Restored.—If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice book for a future day on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

40. Committees.—Minutes of all proceedings of committees, as well as of their reports, numbered in consecutive order, shall be entered in the committee's minute book, and being signed by the chairman of the committee, shall be presented to the Trust; and the secretary, when practicable, shall attend all meetings of committees.

41. Meetings of the Committee.—The secretary shall convene every committee within ten days of its first appointment, or at any other time thereafter, by order of the Trust, or on the written order of the chairman of the committee, or of any two members of the committee.

42. Petitions.—No petition shall be presented after the Trust shall have proceeded to the orders of the day.

43. Petitions to be Respectful.—It shall be incumbent on every commissioner presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Trust, and that the contents do not violate any by-law or any provision hereof.

44. Commissioners to Affix their Names.—Every Commissioner presenting a petition to the Trust shall write his name at the beginning thereof.

45. Petitions to be in Writing.—Every petition shall be in writing and not printed or lithographed, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioners at the end thereof, and shall be signed by at least one person on every skin or sheet on which it is written.

46. To be Signed by Petitioners.—Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto by their names or marks, and by no one else except in cases of incapacity by sickness.

47. No Letters, &c., to be attached.—No letters, affidavits, or other documents shall be attached to any petition.

48. Commissioners confined to Statement of certain Facts.—Every commissioner presenting a petition to the Trust shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.

49. Appointment of Officers, &c.—No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the Trust shall take place until seven clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the Waterworks District, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same.

50. Salaries of Officers, &c.—The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the Trust shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same, before the advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement.

51. No Commissioner, &c., to be Surety for Officer.—No commissioner or officer of the Trust, and no assessor or auditor of the Trust, shall be received as a surety for any officer appointed by the Trust or for any work to be done by the Trust.

52. Suspension of Rules.—Any one or more of the rules or regulations contained in this subdivision may be suspended for a special purpose, on motion upon notice duly given, and shall not otherwise be suspended except by a unanimous vote of the Trust.

53. Penalty.—If any person shall be guilty of any breach of this by-law, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds for every such offence.

54. Banking Account and Signing Cheques.—All moneys of the Trust shall, within seven days, or such shorter period as the Trust may direct, after they have come to the hands of the proper officer of the Trust, be paid into such bank, and in such manner as the Trust shall from time to time appoint and direct for that purpose; and no such money shall be drawn out of such bank save by cheque signed by any three commissioners authorized from time to time by the Trust in that behalf, and counter-signed by the secretary.

55. Ordinary Meetings.—The ordinary meetings of the commissioners shall be held at Murtoa on the Wednesday after full moon, at the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, in the months of July, September, November, January, March, and May in each year.

56. Special Meetings.—The commissioners may hold special meetings, and the chairman or any three or more commissioners may call a special meeting, but no such special meeting shall be held unless four clear days' notice thereof at least be given to each commissioner, and no business shall be transacted at any special meeting except such as is stated in the notice thereof.

57. Resolutions, how Revoked.—No resolution at any meeting of the Trust shall be revoked or altered at any subsequent meeting, unless notice of the intention to propose such revocation or alteration be given to each of the commissioners seven days at least before holding the meeting, nor unless such revocation or alteration be determined upon by a majority consisting of two-thirds of the commissioners present at such subsequent meeting, if the number of commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be not greater than the number present when such resolution was come to, or by a majority if the number of commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be greater than the number present at such former meeting.

7. No tree of less than 5 inches diameter at a height of 2 feet from the ground shall be stripped when of the black or feather-leaved variety, or less than 2½ inches in diameter at a height of 2 feet from the ground, when of the broad-leaved species, unless otherwise stated herein, and wherever a size limit is mentioned it shall be at a height of 2 feet from the ground.
