AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE EXAMINATION OF ENGINEERS.

I N pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the Marine Act 1890, the Marine Board of Victoria, with the consent of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say :-

These Regulations shall form portion of "The Regulations for the Examination of Engineers," made by the Board on the 11th day of July, 1902, and published in the Government Gazette on the 20th day of July, 1902, and shall be read in connexion therewith, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1910, on which date the last clause of subdivision (a) of paragraph 23 of the aforesaid regulations shall be repealed, and in lieu thereof there shall be substituted the following clauses, namely: clauses, namely :-

 If the Candidate has served as an apprentice Engineer or as Journeyman, under the conditions above prescribed, for less than four years, he will be required to make up the deficiency or to complete this period of four years by service as Engineer at sea on regular watch on the main engines or boilers (1) of a foreign-going steam-ship of not less than 66 nominal horse-power, or (2) of a steam-ship trading between ports on the coast of Victoria of not less than 66 nominal horse-power, such service to be counted as equivalent in the case of (1) to two-thirds, and in the case of (2) to four-ninths, of service as apprentice Engineer or as Journeyman.

 If the Candidate has not served at all as apprentice
- If the Candidate has not served at all as apprentice Engineer or as Journeyman, he will be required to have served at sea, in lieu thereof, as Engineer on regular watch on the main engines or boilers, six years in a foreign-going steam-ship of not less than 66 nominal horse-power, or nine years in a coast-trade steam-ship of not less than 66 nominal horse-power.

The foregoing amended Regulations were made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria, held this seventeenth day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and nine.

PLEASANT CREEK CEMETERY TRUST. RULES AND REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers vested in them, the trustees of the Pleasant Creat Communication of the Pleasant Creek Cemetery rescind the Rules Regulations published in the Government Gazette on

the 1st September, 1876, and make the following Rules and Regulations, that is to say:—

1. Before any interment shall take place, application for permission shall be made to the sexton a reasonable time previously, when an order, in the form or to the effect set out in the annexed Schedule B, will be given to the applicant, upon the payment of the charges set out in the scale of fees.

2. That all fees and charges payable shall be paid when the applications are made or orders given.

3. Any trustee of the cemetery may, by written order addressed to the secretary, direct the burial of any poor person in such cemetery free of any charges whatsoever, provided after due inquiry he is satisfied such person, his person in such tenderely free of any charges winstoever, provided after due inquiry he is satisfied such person, his relatives, or friends are unable to pay such charges, and if such person shall be known or believed to have belonged to any particular religious denomination he shall be buried in the part (if any) of the cemetery set apart for that denomination. All orders for free burial given under these Regulations or by Justices under section 49, Act 1890, shall be recorded by the secretary.

4. That all applications for interment shall be made to the sexton at least eight working hours prior to the time fixed for the burial, otherwise an extra charge shall be made. No free interment shall be allowed unless application therefor be made at least eight working hours prior to the time fixed for same.

5. The usual hours of interment for week days shall be from Eight a.m. to Five p.m. throughout the year, unless by special permission of the trustees.

6. That the trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person wanting a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same under directions of the sexton on payment of the required fees, and every

of the sexton on payment of the required fees, and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, and be air and water tight.

7. That every coffin shall have on the lid a lead or copper plate with the name of the deceased stamped

thereon.

8. That every grave shall be at least 6 feet deep for one interment and at least 7 feet for two interments, and no coffin shall be interred within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years of age, when it shall not be less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in same grave, and in the case of a tomb or vault a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left above and around the uppermost coffin.

9. That no burial shall be permitted to take place in the said cemetery without a certificate from the Deput Registrar of Deaths, or Coroner. Such certificate shall, be delivered to the secretary or to gatekeeper before the funeral enters the cemetery. No interment shall be permitted in a private grave or vault without the production of the certificate of right of burial, or other satisfactory evidence, and, if required, a statutory declaration shall be made that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so.

titled to do so.

To. That the time fixed for any burial shall be the time

when the funeral is to be at the cemetery, and the same shall be punctually observed.

shail be punctually observed.

11. That every funeral shall enter by the principal entrance, and no vehicle except the hearse and mourning coaches shall be permitted to enter the cemetery or to stand opposite the entrance gates except by authority of the trustees first had and obtained. Horses shall not be obtained a proceed fortit them. proceed faster than at a walking pace within the cemetery.

allowed to proceed faster than at a walking pace within the cemetery.

12. That every grave, vault, tomb, monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection, shall be maintained and kept in thorough repair and proper condition by or at the expense of owner. Should the owner's residence not be known or be out of the State, the trustees to have power to do the work and keep an account against the owner.

13. That any person desiring to construct, add to, alter, or amend a brick grave, vault, or tomb, or to erect, add to, or amend a monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other construction or erection in any part of the cemetery, shall apply in writing to the trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit in writing a statement, plan, desigh, or drawing of the same, with full particulars, and shall obtain such permission in writing before proceeding with the work.

14. That all materials required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the cemetery, and shall be admitted only at the side entrances, and no vehicle conveying any such materials or soil shall be permitted to enter the cemetery during wet or unfavorable weather.

15. That every person prior to placing any inscription, epitaph, or other writing or drawing in any part of the

cemetery shall apply in writing to the trustees and submit a copy thereof to the trustees, and shall obtain their

a copy thereof to the trustees, and shall obtain their written permission for the same.

16. That every erection shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations (extending to the bottom of the grave when ordered). All stones, refuse, and rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be removed from the cemetery at once at the expense of the person remains the same.

from the cemetery at once at the expense of the reasons the same.

17. That unless otherwise ordered the principal entrance shall be open daily from Eight a.m. to Six p.m. from 1st October to 31st March, and from Eight a.m. to Five p.m. from 1st April to 30th September.

18. That no child under ten years shall be admitted into the cemetery, except in charge of a responsible

19. That no smoking shall be allowed within the cemetery, nor shall any hreworks be discharged therein.
20. That no dogs shall be admitted into the cemetery.

21. That no person employed under the trustees shall, without their consent, be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever in discharge of his duty, nor shall he be-allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment from the

22. That any workman not employed by the trustees shall be under the supervision and control of the trustees or person authorized by them, who shall have power to regulate his hours of labour, to see that his work is completed satisfactorily and with despatch, and to remove him summarily from the cemetery upon any cause of offence.

him summarily from the cemetery or its approaches offence.

23. That no person in the cemetery or its approaches shall commit any nuisance, or trespass, or be guilty of any breach of decorum, or cut, pluck, gather, or take out of the cemetery any flower, plant, shrub, or tree, or any part thereof, or do any injury whatsoever thereto, or to any grass plot, border, railing, fence, or any other erection or road therein, or remove or interfere in any way with anything laid, built, or placed on or in any grave or burying place.

or burying place.

24. That no person shall promote, or advertise, or carry on within the cemetery or its approaches, any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars or cards, or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever.

of advertisement whatsoever.

25. That the secretary shall, subject to the trustees, exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the cemetery, and to the carrying out and enforcement of these Rules, and subject to the provisions of the Cemeteries Act the direction of such person shall in all such matters and for all purposes be presumed to

in all such matters and for all purposes be presumed to be and to have been the direction of the trustees.

26. That any person committing any breach of any of these Rules or Regulations, or of any other Rules, Regulations, or By-laws, lawfully made under the authority of any Act relating to cemeteries, shall be trustees, secretary, seaton, and shall be treated as a trespasser, and may be proceeded against accordingly in addition to any other proceedings or penalties to which such person may be subject.

27. The trustees reserve to themselves the power to decorate graves from time to time when desired by the owners so to do, and when the owners do not desire the trustees to carry out such work, they may either do it themselves or employ any person licensed by the trustees to do such necessary work, but no trees or shrubs shall be planted on any grave without the permission of the trustees.

be planted on any grave without the permission of the trustees.

28. That no person except relatives of the deceased, the trustees, and those licensed by the trustees, shall be permitted to decorate any grave.

29. That licences to grave dressers or grave decorators may be issued by the trustees in the form set out in Schedule D.

30. A plan of the grounds and a register, also a register of all certificates of rights of burial which are issued, will be kept by the secretary, which may be examined upon payment of the charges according to the scale of

rees.

31. The trustees reserve to themselves the right of determining the extent of land to be purchased by any one applicant over and above four allotments.

32. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and Regulations, subject to the approval of His Excellency the Governor.

WOODEND WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1910.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Woodend Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1905, hereby make the following By-law:—

- r. The following rates and charges are those respectively which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the boundaries of the Trust District, that is to say:—
 - (1) For every house or tenement used wholly or partly as a domicile, a rate of One shilling in the pound on the shire assessment. Minimum, as fixed by the Governor in Council, Twenty shillings lings.

 (2) For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Twenty shillings per boiler per annum.

 (3) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons.
 - 1,000 gattons.

 (4) Any person who shall obtain water, or may be supplied with water from the public standpipes, or any or either of them, in the said district, shall pay the sum of Ten shillings per anum annum.
- 2. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water shall be supplied by measurement shall be:—
 - (a) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons will be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

 (b) If for other than domestic purposes only, 30,000 gallons per half-year.
- gallons per half-year.

 3. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1910, commencing on 1st January, 1910, as also the charges for every steam boiler and for water supplied from public stand-pipes, and shall be payable on 1st July, 1910.

 4. All other charges by measurement shall be paid half-yearly, on 1st January, 1910, and 1st July, 1910.

 5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rate and charges.

TATURA WATERWORKS TRUST.—BY-LAW No. 1 FOR 1910.

THE Tatura Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Act. 1305, do hereby make the By-law following:—

2. Such rate is made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of January, 1910, and ending with the 31st day of December, 1910, and shall be payable in equial half-yearly moieties, in advance, on the 1st day of Innuary and July in the year 1010.

3. The valuation for the time being of the lands and tenements within the said district for the municipal rate in the municipal district of the Shire of Rodney in which such lands and tenements are situated shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively for the purpose of making and levying such rate.

4. Water will also be supplied by measurement, and in each case the party desiring to be supplied must provide the meter and maintain the same in good working order, and pay for the water according to measurement thereby at the rates following:

1. On addition

(a) For steam boilers, at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

(b) For Shire water troughs, at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

(c) Supplies of water for any purposes not specified herein, and otherwise than by measure, must be paid for at such rate as the Trust shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken.

(d) In all other cases water supplied by the Trust by measurement will be charged for at the rate of One shilling and tenpence per 1,000 gallons, and in cases where the supply is solely for purposes other than domestic, the minimum charge will in each case be fixed by the Trust.

- 3. No person shall kindle or maintain any fire within the reserves, or any of them without it 3. No person shall kindle or maintain any fire within the reserves, or any of them, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management, and then only in such place or places as the Committee of Management shall indicate, and no person shall cut or in any way injure or interfere with the timber (dead or alive), trees, shrubs, flowers, wells, rockeries, or vegetation of any kind in the reserves, or any of them.
- 4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or 4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, or cut names on the fences, gates, pavilions, bowers, or seats in the reserves, or any of them, or damage in any way any of the buildings, bowers, seats, or other erections or improvements therein, or roll or throw stones or other missiles, in the reserves, or any of them, or discharge firearms therein, or leave any bottles, glass, orange peel, paper, cast-off clothing, litter, or rubbish of any kind in the reserves, or any of them. No person shall stick bills or advertisements on any fence, gate, building, or other erection around or in the reserves, or any of them. or other erection around or in the reserves, or any of them.
- 5. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserves, or any of them, or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 6. No person shall hawk or sell, or offer for sale, any article of any description, in the reserves, or any of them, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 7. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the reserves, or any of them, shall enter any of the plots therein, which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees, shrubs, or flowers.
- 8. No person shall behave in a disorderly or noisy manner in the reserves, or any of them, or create or take part in any disturbance, or commit an act of indecency, or otherwise offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- 9. No person shall bring into the reserves, or any of them, or allow to stray therein any cattle, horses, sheep, pigs, or poultry, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
