SHIRE OF HEIDELBERG.—BY-LAW No. 55.—
DOUBLE-PAN CLOSET SYSTEM.

A By-law of the Shire of Heidelberg, made under the provisions of the *Health Act 1890*, and numbered 55, regulating the cleansing, &c., of closet pans under the double-pan system.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, the Council of the Shire of Heidelberg, in the name and on the behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, hereby order as follows:—

1. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the Ivanhoe and Heidelberg Ridings of the Shire.

4. The occupier of any premises in which there is a closet or privy shall cause the space under each seat of each closet or privy on such premises to be prepared, and shall permit the same to be used, for the double-pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause the closet or privy to be kept in a fit state for such service.

5. The Council shall cause every closet or privy to be supplied and kept supplied with two pans for the reception of night-soil, and a lid to closely fit the same, and shall cause one or other of such pans to be kept under the seat aforesaid.

6. The occupier aforesaid or other persons having the control or management of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan in such closet or privy to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

7. The Council shall at least once a week cause the pan to be closed with a lid and removed with its contents from the premises during the day or night, and the other pan to be left in its place.

8. Before leaving any pan in a closet or privy the Council shall cause the same to be cleansed with superheated steam and tar-painted inside or by some equally efficient means.

9. The occupier aforesaid or other person shall not contract for the removal of night-soil from such premises except in accordance with this By-law.

10. The Council shall have the power in lieu of making a rate to make a charge on such occupier for the pans supplied and for the removal of night-soil and the other work herein directed, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

11. If any person or the Council commit a breach of this By-law he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

TOWN OF CAMBERWELL.—BY-LAW No. 30.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Acts the Council of the Municipality of the Town of Camberwell doth hereby order and direct as follows, that is to say:—

1. *Repeal*.—By-laws numbers 4, 8, and 13 of the Shire of Boroondara are hereby repealed.

2. *Operation*.—Clauses 1 to 6, both inclusive, and clauses 8 to 18, both inclusive, of this By-law shall apply to and have operation within the whole of the Town of Camberwell. Clause 7 shall apply to and have operation only in that portion of the Town of Camberwell described and set out in the Schedule hereto.

3. *Removal of Refuse from Yards, &c.*—The occupier of every house, building, tenement, or premises shall cause the yard or ground belonging thereto or occupied in connexion therewith to be kept in a cleanly condition, and so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all rubbish, filth, and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard, ground, or premises, and if at any time the occupier fails or neglects to have such rubbish, filth, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid the Council may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

4. *Removal of House Refuse.*—(a) The occupier of every house, building, tenement, or premises shall provide and keep, or cause to be provided and kept thereon, a covered receptacle or receptacles made of non-absorbent material not exceeding 4 cubic feet in content, so that the same may, with the contents thereof when full, be readily and conveniently removable by the public scavenger or such person or persons as the Council may appoint for that purpose, and shall cause all dust, ashes, rubbish, or other house refuse produced, collected, or accumulated on such premises to be from time to time placed in such receptacle, which receptacle shall be kept constantly covered, except at such times as the same may be or shall be opened for the deposit therein of dust, ashes, rubbish, or house refuse as aforesaid, and such receptacle shall be kept in a clean and inoffensive condition, and shall be placed in the yard of such tenement or premises, close to the entrance thereof from the street, lane, or right-of-way on such day in each week as may be specified in any notice to that effect given by the Council, in order that the contents of such receptacle may be readily and conveniently discharged and removed by the public scavengers or other person or persons authorized or appointed to collect and remove the same by the Council.

(b) No dust-box or receptacle shall be placed in or on any street, lane, or right-of-way, but will be removed from inside the yards or premises.

5. *Refuse from Cow Sheds, Stables, &c.*—(a) The occupier of any land on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-yard, shed, or pig-sty shall cause such premises to be kept in such state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all dung, manure, or other refuse material produced or accumulated therein to be collected in one place in the yard of such premises at a distance of not less than 10 feet from any street, or less than 20 feet from any dwelling-house, and to be there kept in an inoffensive condition, and so as not to be a nuisance, and for the temporary deposit of such dung, manure, or other refuse material the said occupier shall provide a watertight receptacle built of impervious material, such receptacle shall, however, not be placed or built nearer to any street exceeding 16 feet in width than 10 feet, nor closer to any dwelling-house than 20 feet, and the said occupier shall cause such dung, manure, or other refuse material to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so collected or accumulated shall amount in the case of horse or cow manure to 5 cubic yards, and in all other cases when the same amounts to 1 cubic yard, and if at any time the occupier shall neglect or fail to have such dung, manure, or other refuse material removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same may be removed by the Council at the expense of such occupier.

(b) Nothing herein contained shall be taken to prevent the occupier from causing any dung, manure, or other refuse material (not being night-soil) to be at any time used as manure upon any land, field, farm, garden, or cultivation so long as the same be not used in contravention of any By-law of the Council or so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

6. *Night-soil, &c.*—No person shall place or deposit or cause to be placed or deposited in or upon any street, right-of-way, lane, or passage, or in any water channel, gully, creek, river, reservoir, or water-course, or in any

place, any night-soil, offal, blood manure, dung, rubbish, filth, or other offensive refuse or matter, nor discharge therein any offensive liquid or drainage.

7. *Removal of Pans, &c.*—(a) The pan or pans in use in each tenement (except where such tenement is connected to the sewers of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works) in that part of the Town of Camberwell set out and described in the Schedule hereto, shall be closed with a tight-fitting or air-tight lid, and removed once a week from the premises between the hours of Eleven o'clock post meridian and Six o'clock ante-meridian, and a pan or pans cleaned by superheated steam or some equally efficient means approved by the Council shall be left in the place of the pan or pans so removed as aforesaid.

(b) Every closet pan or vessel shall be constructed of galvanized iron properly riveted and soldered, so as to be watertight, and with handles thereto, and of such a shape as will admit of its being fitted with an airtight lid, and of a capacity not exceeding 3 cubic feet.

(c) The Schedule above referred to:—All that portion of the town bounded on the north by Belmore-road, on the west by Burke-road, from Belmore-road to Toorak-road. On the south by Toorak-road, Norwood-road, Alfred-road, and Bath-road. On the east by the eastern boundary of the Town of Camberwell, from Bath-road to Belmore-road.

8. *Removal of Night-soil.*—No night-soil, offal, or blood, or other offensive matter shall be removed, carted, carried, or transported through or along any road, street, or way, except in a cart or other means of conveyance having a proper covering for preventing the escape of the contents of such carts or other means of conveyance, or any portion thereof, or of the effluvia therefrom, and between the hours of Eleven o'clock post meridian and Six o'clock ante-meridian.

9. *Noxious Trades.*—The occupier of any premises used for the purpose of any noxious trade, business, process, or manufacture whatsoever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, filth, offal, bones, water, liquids, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be removed therefrom at least once in every 24 hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance, or injurious to health, or to exhale any effluvia, and if the occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any such offensive matter as aforesaid, such offensive matter may be removed by the Council or its officers at the expense of such occupier.

10. *Privies, &c.*—Every privy, earth closet, and urinal, whether already built or hereafter to be built in the yard or area of any building, must have a door, and be properly screened, enclosed, and fenced from public view.

No privy, earth closet, or urinal shall be erected or remain in front of any dwelling or building facing a public highway, or at a less distance than 10 feet from any street or from the door or window of any dwelling, or at a less distance than 2 feet from the boundary of land not in the same occupation, unless the wall on the boundary be built of brick or stone, but such privies, earth closets, and urinals may be built abutting on any lane of a less width than 16 feet.

Nothing in this section, however, shall apply to any closet or urinal forming part of a main building, and connected to an underground sewerage system.

11. *Fruit Cases on Manure Carts.*—No person shall place or have in or upon any vehicle containing manure or offensive matter any fruit, vegetables, or other food, or any case or other receptacle customarily used for the reception and carriage of fruit, vegetables, or other food in such manner that such fruit, vegetables, or other food, or such case or receptacle shall be in contact with such manure or offensive matter, or be liable to be contaminated by moisture or effluvia therefrom.

12. *Carriage of Meat.*—No person shall convey in or through the town any meat intended for consumption as human food, except in a covered cart or waggon with closed sides or curtains in a cleanly condition, and so arranged and kept that such cart or waggon sides and curtains shall be in a cleanly condition, and shall protect such meat from sunshine, dust, mud, or filth. No person and no dog or other animal shall sit or lie upon any such meat.

13. *Fowl Yards, &c.*—(a) No person shall within 25 feet of a dwelling-house establish or construct a fowl-yard or duck-yard, or geese-yard, or cause one to be constructed or established, or within such distance permit any land or place to be used afresh, or for the first time as a fowl-yard or duck-yard, or geese-yard, and if in the opinion of the Council the removal of any such yard, any part of which is within 25 feet of a dwelling-house, is possible and is necessary for the health of any of the residents in its vicinity, the Council may order the owner or occupier of it, or of the premises of which it forms a part, to remove or alter it so that no part of it shall be within 25 feet of any dwelling-house, and such owner or occupier shall comply with such order within 14 days.

(b) The occupier of premises on which any yard or enclosure is used for the purpose of keeping fowls, ducks, geese, or other poultry, shall cause the same to be properly swept and cleansed, and all fowl houses and sheds used therewith to be lime-washed from time to time, as may be necessary, and shall at all times keep the same in such a state as not to be a nuisance.

14. *Animals.*—No person shall keep an animal or bird of any kind so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

15. *Rags, &c.*—(a) All rags, flock, cotton, or woollen waste or other like material used or intended to be used in the manufacture of bedding or furniture, shall (before the same be so used) be disinfected by placing the same in a chamber filled with superheated steam so as to prevent injury to health.

(b) No person shall sell or use any such material as aforesaid until the same be so disinfected in the manner hereby directed.

16. *Drains.*—(a) All covered or underground drains conveying household drainage or sewerage shall be efficiently trapped, or air disconnected from the discharge pipes from the house. Such drains shall be constructed of wrought or cast-iron pipes, or glazed stoneware pipes, or cement pipes of an internal diameter of not less than 4 inches, laid with a sufficient fall to the best outlet obtainable. Every such drain, if of iron, shall have the joints made with lead, and if of stoneware or cement, the joints shall be made with Portland cement mortar in such a manner as to make the drains airtight.

(b) Open drains for conveying household drainage or sewerage shall be of hard burnt bricks, semi-circular stoneware pipes, or drainage tiles bedded in and jointed with mortar (composed of Portland cement and sand), so that all joints shall be watertight.

(c) All drains shall be of a sufficient capacity to carry all the drainage from the premises, and shall be laid to a regular fall or inclination, and shall be kept clean and free from all accumulation of filth.

(d) No open drain shall be laid under the floor of any house, shop, or other premises, but this shall not apply to agricultural drains for the drainage of the soil.

(e) In no case shall the soil under the floor of any building be left undrained, or so that stagnant water shall remain on any portion thereof.

(f) The owner or occupier of any premises shall comply with the foregoing provisions.

17. *Spouting, &c.*—Whenever, in the opinion of the Council, it is necessary that any building or buildings shall be provided with spouting down-pipes and drains sufficient to carry off storm or rain water, the Council, by notice in writing, may require the owner of such building or buildings to provide forthwith and fix such spouting and down-pipes, and to lay down such drains as shall be specified in such notice, and the owner shall, on receipt of such notice, provide and fix such spouting and down-pipes, and construct and lay down such drains, and shall maintain the same in good order and condition.

18. *Penalties.*—Any person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or if such breach be a continuing act or default, of Five pounds for every day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the Justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties, such portion not being less than Five shillings, to be paid.

4. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based on the municipal valuation.

5. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1910, commencing on the 1st day of January, and terminating on the 31st day of December, 1910, and shall be payable in equal moieties, in advance, on the 1st January and the 1st July of such year.

ELMORE WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1910.

THE Commissioners of the Elmore Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1905*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the By-law following:—

5. Any water supplied to troughs, other than public troughs, must be paid for by meter, or by special agreement, at such rates, upon such terms, and subject to such conditions as the Trust and the person requiring such supply may agree to adopt.

6. For water supplied by meter, a charge of One shilling (1s.) per One thousand (1,000) gallons shall be made, provided that no person shall pay a less amount than that based on One shilling and threepence (1s. 3d.) in the £1 on the municipal valuation, or less than the minimum rate; any quantity used over the foregoing amounts will be charged as excess.

7. The foregoing rates are made payable in equal moieties on the 1st January and the 1st July, 1910.

Such person or persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

MURCHISON WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING BY-LAW FOR 1910, No. 25.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Murchison Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, make the following By-law :—

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1910 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District :—

1. A rate of One shilling and ninepence in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all rateable property in the Waterworks Trust District, according to the municipal valuation of such properties. The minimum rate to be paid shall be Twenty shillings.

All water supplied by the Trust by measure in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

3. For water supplied by measurement for other than domestic purposes solely, a charge of One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be made (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust). Provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than Twenty shillings.

4. For all water supplied by the Trust outside the Trust District shall (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons up to the minimum charge by the Trust; such minimum shall be computed at a charge of Two shillings in the pound sterling, according to the municipal valuation of the properties outside the Trust area; and for all water used in excess of such quantity the charge shall be at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons. Provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than Twenty shillings.

5. Such rates and charges, other than charges for water supplied by measurement in excess, are hereby made payable half-yearly, in advance, one moiety on the first day of January, 1910, and one moiety on the first day of July, 1910.

6. Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates and charges.

SEYMOUR WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING BY-LAW FOR 1910, No. 20.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Seymour Waterworks Trust, a portion of the Waterworks District of which Trust has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1905*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the By-law following:—

The following are the rates for 1910 which the occupiers or owners of lands, tenements, and vacant or unoccupied allotments within the aforesaid Urban District, and liable to be rated, shall pay to the Trust in respect of such property:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Twenty-six pounds (£26) annual municipal value and under, a rate of One pound sterling shall be paid.

2. For every house or tenement of more than Twenty-six pounds annual municipal valuation, a rate of Ninepence in the pound shall be paid.

3. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied allotments of land, if not more than Five shillings annual municipal valuation, a rate of Five shillings for each and every separate allotment by which a main passes.

4. For every allotment of land exceeding Five shillings annual municipal valuation fronting a street wherein a main pipe of the Trust is laid, a rate of One shilling in the pound shall be paid.

5. For all lands and tenements, situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are not supplied with water, and being within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe, one-half of the before-mentioned rate, and where lands and tenements are over a quarter of a mile and under half-a-mile from a stand-pipe, one-quarter of the before-mentioned rate.

6. Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly, where the water is used for domestic and other than domestic purposes, shall be the quantity which at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the assessed rate for the half-year which would be payable in respect of the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. In cases where water

is sold by measure for other than domestic use solely, the charge shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, or such price as may be specially agreed upon, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly shall be 27,000 gallons.

7. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable in equal moieties on the 1st of January and 1st of July, 1910.

8. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

THE Commissioners of the Warracknabeal Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, make the following By-law for the year 1910:—

The following are the rates which the occupiers or owners of land and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes by the Warracknabeal Waterworks Trust, that is to say, in regard to houses or tenements fronting any street in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which houses or tenements, if not on such street, are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes:—

1. For every allotment of land, whether occupied or otherwise, where water is not being used, and of less than Ten pounds sterling annual municipal value, the sum of Two shillings in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation.

2. For every house or tenement of Sixteen pounds or under municipal value, a rate of One pound shall be paid.

3. For every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Sixteen pounds per annum, the sum of One shilling and threepence in the pound shall be paid on the annual value of such property.

4. For all tenements in the said district situate otherwise than on streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within one-quarter of a mile from any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the above-mentioned rate; and where such tenements are more than one-quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half-a-mile, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rate.

5. Such owners of tenements as are supplied with water by meter shall pay at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons up to the quantity they would be entitled to receive according to their assessment, and at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons for anything over that quantity.

6. Such occupiers or owners of tenements not within the Trust area, and who have agreed with the Trust to be supplied with water by meter, shall pay at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

7. Such occupiers or owners of gardens, steam-engines, or stock who are supplied from the Trust reservoir with water shall, if the Commissioners of the Trust think fit, pay an extra rate beyond that which they are already paying (if any), if, in the opinion of the Trust, such occupiers or owners are not paying a just proportionate rate for the water they are using. Such occupiers or owners to be notified in writing of such charge.

8. Such rates are hereby made payable half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1910. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

VII. No. 1893), and pursuant to the petition of the Council of the Municipality of the Borough of Castlemaine, directed that the provisions of the *Voting by Post Act 1900*, applicable and severally referred to in the underwritten Schedules, shall apply to the elections of Councillors for the Municipality of the said Borough, with the alterations of such provisions as shown or indicated in the said schedules, the same being alterations deemed necessary for the purpose of carrying into effect such provisions as so applied, and to give effect to the requirements of sub-section (1) of section 2 of the said Act.

His Excellency has also directed that the official to give the public notices required by the said section as altered shall be the Municipal Clerk of the said Borough.

And His Excellency, by the Order hereinbefore mentioned, has further directed that the Regulations following shall have effect:—

And every member of the Police Force.	

2. Every letter or envelope transmitted through the post-office, pursuant to the *Voting by Post Act* as applied to Municipal Elections, either by or to a Returning Officer, shall have the necessary postage upon same prepaid.

Section 5 shall apply, omitting the words "any electoral" in the third line, and substituting therefor the words "the Voters"; and omitting the words "province or district" in the third and fourth lines, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality."

Section 6 shall apply unaltered.

Section 7 shall apply, omitting the words "initial letter" in the third line, and substituting therefor the words "special mark"; omitting all the words after the word "section" in the third line down to the word "and" in the fourth line, and substituting therefor the words "one hundred and forty-one of the *Local Government Act 1903*"; omitting all the words after the word "the" where it appears the second time in the eighth line down to the word "in" in the ninth line, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality"; omitting the word "electoral" in the twelfth line, and substituting therefor the word "Voters."

Section 8 shall apply, omitting the word "electoral" in the first line, and substituting therefor the word "Voters"; omitting the words "province or district" wherever they appear, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality."
