PAYABLE BY PARENTS, ETC.

WHEREAS by section 51 of the *Neglected Children's
Act 1890* it is enacted as follows, that is to say:—

payment of the same, may be made by or on
behalf of any person authorized by any general
or special order of the Minister."

THE Council of the Borough of Wangaratta, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the twenty-seventh day of December, One thousand nine hundred and one, in the Municipal District of Wangaratta, as a site for Municipal Gardens, known as the "Merriwa Gardens," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance-fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901:—

REGULATIONS.

- (1) The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except as hereinafter provided.
- (2) No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- (3) No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve; nor shall fires be lighted therein without the permission of the Committee of Management.
- (4) No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon or on any building in the Reserve, or cut names or otherwise injure or deface the fences, trees, buildings, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the Reserve.
- (5) No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
- (6) No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management.
- (7) No person shall take or drive any carriage, cart, or other vehicle drawn by a horse or other animal into the Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management, and no horse or other animal drawing any such carriage, cart, or other vehicle shall, whilst in the Reserve, be detached or unharnessed therefrom, or left without a person being in charge thereof.
- (8) No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve, nor any booth, or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and no person shall enter any building in the Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management, and any person, having entered such building, shall leave the same on being requested so to do by any member of the Committee of Management, or by a police constable or Crown lands bailiff.
- (9) No person except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
- (10) The maximum scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the Reserve on such days, not exceeding twelve in any one year, as the Reserve may be set apart for sports, fêtes, entertainments, or holiday amusements, shall be as follows:—For admission of every person over the age of thirteen years such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding One shilling, and for the admission of every person not

over the age of thirteen years, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Sixpence. Provided that the net amount so received, after providing for any necessary prizes and disbursements in connexion therewith, shall be used and appropriated towards the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and an account thereof shall be made annually to the Board of Land and Works.

THE Council of the Shire of Tungamah, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Recreation and Show Yards in the Town of Tungamah, known as "Jubilee Park," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance-fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be divided as follows, and shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except as hereinafter provided:—

1st Division—The Grand Stand.

2nd Division—The Running and Playing Ground.

3rd Division—The remainder of the Reserve.

2. Every person paying for admission to the Reserve, or any part thereof, shall be supplied with a ticket of admission, which he shall on demand produce, and (if required) surrender to any gatekeeper or other person having authority from the Committee of Management to demand the production or surrender of tickets.

3. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

4. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, flowers, fences, gates, or erections, or put offensive matter in the Reserve; nor shall fires be lighted therein without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

5. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut or damage the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the Reserve.

6. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.

7. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

8. No person shall engage in any game or sport in the Reserve on Sunday.

9. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and any person who may have obtained the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management to the erection

within the Reserve of any booth or other structure for special purposes, shall be bound by any order made by the Committee of Management in regard thereto.

10. Any person committing in the Reserve or in any part of the buildings or erections for the time being therein any of the following offences shall be liable to be forthwith removed from the Reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased or may be in possession of a ticket of admission to the Reserve, or any part thereof:—

(a) Assaulting any person.

(b) Being drunk.

(c) Crossing or trespassing on the playing ground during a cricket match, or sports, or during the practice of cricket, or crossing or trespassing on the running ground during the time any race is being run, or crossing or trespassing on such cricket or sports ground when doing so would be injurious thereto as a cricket or sports ground.

(d) Using profane, indecent, or abusive language.

(e) Using any obscene or insulting words.

(f) Behaving improperly or riotously.

(g) Not surrendering (if required) to any gatekeeper or other person duly authorized to demand the production or surrender of tickets, a ticket duly authorizing the admission of such person to that part of the Reserve where he may be found.

11. The maximum scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the Reserve on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, sports, shows, fêtes, or holiday amusements shall be as follows:—

For admission of every person to the First Division, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Five shillings (5s.).

For admission to the Second Division of every carriage, cart, or other vehicle drawn by one horse or other animal, or of every truck or wheelbarrow, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Two shillings (2s.).

For admission of every vehicle drawn by more than one horse or other animal, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) for each horse or other animal.

12. Every person renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure for the occasion of any cricket or football match, sports, show, fête, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Five pounds (£5) by way of guarantee that due care will be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and the Committee of Management may make such repairs to or make good any damage or loss sustained by such stand, buildings, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such renting or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such repairs, damage, or loss from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown Lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

REGULATIONS.

- (1) The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset.
- (2) No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- (3) No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein without the permission of the Committee of Management.
- (4) No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, or stick bills on the fences, gates, seats, or buildings in the Reserve, or cut names or otherwise injure or deface the fences, gates, trees, or seats, buildings, or other property in the Reserve, or roll or throw stones therein.
- (5) No person shall put on the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
- (6) No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
- (7) No person shall erect any building in the Reserve, or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and no person shall enter any building in the Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management, and any person having entered such building shall leave the same on being requested so to do by any police constable or Crown lands bailiff.
- (8) No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any Justice forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

MALLEE LANDS AVAILABLE FOR SELECTION AS AGRICULTURAL ALLOTMENTS.

The land is situated near Ouyen, on the Mildura railway line, about midway between Woomelang and Mildura. Applications (with uncanceled Victorian duty stamp of 5s., or postal note for same amount, affixed) must be made on the usual form, and delivered or forwarded by post to any Local Land Office, or to the Secretary for Lands, Melbourne, on or before Wednesday, the 17th February, 1909.

The licence will be subject to the following conditions:—

That substantial and permanent improvements shall be made on the land, if in the first class, to the value of 3s. 4d. per acre before the end of the second year from the date of the licence, another 3s. 4d. per acre before the end of each year of the third and fourth years, and the balance of 10s. per acre before the end of the sixth year of the licence. If in the second class, improvements to the value of 2s. 6d. per acre must be made during the like periods, and the balance of 7s. 6d. per acre before the end of the sixth year of the licence.

The first half-year's rent and licence fee must be paid prior to issue of licence, and, provided improvements equivalent in value to the amount of rent due for each year be expended on the land during each of such years, in addition to the value required by the ordinary improvement condition, as set forth above, further payment of rent may be suspended until the end of the third year, and such suspended payments, without interest, will be collected in instalments during the remaining term of the licence.

That the licensee shall go into residence on the land within twelve months after the date of the licence, and shall reside on the land during the continuance of such licence.

That the licensee shall not transfer, assign, mortgage, or sublet, or part with the possession, or grant the use of the whole, or any part of the allotment, during the currency of the licence.

That a special condition shall be inserted in the Lease and the Crown Grant, providing that the land referred to therein shall at all times be maintained and used for the purpose of agriculture, grazing, and residence, and that no person will be permitted to subsequently acquire or hold, or have an interest in, more than one allotment in this or any future mallee subdivision.

That the licensee shall preserve the timber on an area, or otherwise plant an area, of not less than 3 per cent. of the total area of his holding, preferably along the exposed boundary lines, viz., the western and southern.

No person, unless specially authorized, will be permitted to clear timber from any portion of areas retained for the purposes of roads and wind breaks.

Plans may be obtained at the Inquiry Office, Lands Department, Melbourne, and at Land Offices, Alexandra, Ararat, Bairnsdale, Ballarat, Beechworth, Benalla, Bendigo, Geelong, Hamilton, Horsham, Omeo, St. Arnaud, Stawell, Seymour, Sale, and Warracknabeal, and may be inspected at the principal railway stations throughout the State.

Applicants may obtain from a Local Land Officer, or the Inquiry Office, Lands Department, Melbourne, a certificate authorizing the issue, by the Railway Department, of a ticket at excursion fares to enable them to inspect the land, or to attend the Local Land Board.
