# REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS, VICTORIA.

- 1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed
  - 2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board-
  - (a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having compiled with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the Government Gazette.
  - (b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

### PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

- 3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate or licence will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.
- 4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to
- 5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.
- (b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, including English, geography, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Roard, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.
- (c) Or shall have taken a degree in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.
- 6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys.

# Form of Certificate for presentation to the Board of Examiners.

- Note.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, or the United States of America, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Rules.

A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature or an irregular road, and of an area having buildings thereon in illustration of a town survey. The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

- 8. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plandrawing, except paper.
- 9. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

### SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

### Mathematics.

(a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

### Computation.

(b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved houndaries

### Principles and Practices of Surveying.

(c) Details of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, subdivisional, and other surveys, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting from field notes and from co-ordinates, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Acts, writing descriptions of boundaries.

(Candidates may be required to make actual surveys.)

### Engineering Surveys.

(d) Levelling; grading; measurement of earthworks.
(Including practical tests.)

### Use of instruments.

(e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, telemeter, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer, tacheometer, and steel band.

### Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

(f) Determination of time, latitude, and azimuth, reduction of star places; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.

(With practical tests.)

Drawing.

(g) General plan-drawing, compilation of plans, drawing of sections and contours, projection of maps and charts.

### ' Miscellaneous.

- (h) Physics and geology (elementary); names and description of Australasian timbers of economic value (vivd vocc).
- 11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having matriculated, or of having passed the senior examination at a University, or the Senior Civil Service examination of New Zealand, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 66 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those paners. those papers.

Candidates producing evidence of having taken a degree in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University may be further exempted from working out papers in physics and geology.

### CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

- 12. A candidate passing the examination held under these Rules shall be entitled to a certificate of competency.
- Rules shall be entitled to a certificate of competency.

  13. Any surveyor qualified in Victoria prior to 1st January, 1896, or any surveyor licensed prior to 1st January, 1896, in any other Australasian State or Colony who, by reason of his absence from that State or Colony, is prevented from obtaining the certificate of competency from the Board of that State or Colony, may make application to this Board, and on his satisfying the Board that he is competent, either without examination or on such examination as the Board may require, shall be entitled to a certificate of competency; such application shall be accompanied by the fee (£2 2s.).

### LICENCES TO SURVEY.

14. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to lat January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor General prior to lat January, 1896. THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Alexandra Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Act 1905, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following By-law:--

A. By-law of the Town of Port Melbourne, made under section 197 of the Local Government Act 1903, and numbered 88, for the purpose of regulating and controlling blasting operations within the town.

IN pursuance of powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1903, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses order as follows:—

1. No person shall commence or carry on within the Town of Port Melbourne any blasting operations whatsoever without the consent, in writing, of the Council of the Town of Port Melbourne.

4. That the person so authorized as aforesaid shall only use such explosives as the said Council may consider

proper.
5. That the person so authorized as aforesaid shall, at his own expense, properly and securely fence the site 5. That the person so authorized as aforesaid shall, at his own expense, properly and securely fence the site fixed to prevent any member of the public having access thereto, and such blasting operations shall be carried on not less than 100 yards from any part of such fence.

6. That the person so authorized as aforesaid shall, prior to commencing such blasting operations, deposit with the said Council the sum of £100 as an indemnity against accident or damage to life or property.

7. That the person so authorized shall, at the conclusion of the blasting operations, properly and efficiently put the site granted in good order and condition and repair any damage done thereto.

8. A penalty of £20 is hereby imposed upon any person guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to this Bylaw.

9. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of Port

#### BY-LAW No. 7.

A By-law of the Shire of Rosedale, numbered 7, and made under the provisions of the Local Government Act 1903, for prohibiting and regulating the depasturage of stock within certain boundaries in the Shire of Rosedale for the suppression of nuisances and for maintaining the good rule and government of the municipality.

I N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1903, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Rosedale order as follows,

That the provisions regarding the impounding of stock contained in section 408 of the Local Government Act 1903 be enforced, and that all stock found depasturing or wandering at large upon any road in the Denison and Toongabbie Ridings of the Shire of Rosedale be im-

That the above order be carried out under the following rules and regulations, that is to say :

That all resident ratepayers of the said Ridings and occupiers of lands fronting the said roads shall be exempt from such impounding up to a limit of ten head of either cattle or horses, and that in the case of public carriers the number so exempted shall be a team of horses or bullocks in actual use.

That a condition precedent to such exemption be a payment to the Council of the Shire of Rosedale (half-yearly in advance) at the rate of (6s.) Six shillings per annum for every head of such cattle and Eight shillings (8s.) for every horse so exempted.

Such payments to be a remuneration for the officers appointed by this Council as persons in charge of such cattle and horses and hereinafter called the herdsman.

cattle and horses and hereinafter called the herdsman.

When the above fee is paid to the herdsman he shall register each head of cattle and horse in a book to be kept for the purpose as exempt from the operation of this By-law, and in the case of cattle shall place a pitch brand on the same in token of such exemption, and shall give to the person so registering a receipt for the money paid, which shall be entered in a book to be kept for that purpose, and for the information and use of the Council.

All calcuse or feels under the age of sight (9) meether

All calves or foals under the age of eight (8) months the progeny of cattle so exempted shall likewise be exempted. No entire or bull shall be liable to be exempted without the special consent of the Council.

without the special consent of the Council.

A muster of all stock so registered and exempted shall take place on a day of which due notice shall be given by advertisement, at the close of every half-yearly period, and owners requiring exemption for the ensuing half-year are required to present their stock for registration at such musterings; and after three (3) months shall have run of any half-yearly period; the exemption fee shall be 2s. in the case of cattle and 2s. 6d. in the case of horses for the balance of the half-yearly period.

The berdsman shall keen an entry of all cattle im-

The herdsman shall keep an entry of all cattle impounded by him, and present a return of the same to the Council every six months on a day preceding the half-yearly muster and registration, together with the books in which such entries are made. The Council or the herdsman will not be responsible for any damage arising from the impounding of such exempted stock by any person owning lands adjoining or abutting on such roads, or owning land in any situation whatsoever.

No pies, mosts or sheep are to be allowed to words.

No pigs, goats, or sheep are to be allowed to wander or depasture on such roads, and all travelling stock must move thereover at the rate of two miles in each hour, and in the case of sheep at the rate of not less than six miles in each day, between sunrise and sunset.

No person shall be allowed to remove from the herdsman's charge any stock registered as above without due notice of same beforehand; upon receipt of which the owner so removing will be entitled, without further charge, to substitute for each head so removed one other head of stock for the unexpired portion of registration period.

The Council shall have exclusive right to cause all stock suspected of contagious diseases to be removed from such streets or roads, and in the event of any registered cattle or horses dying, the owner thereof shall cause the same to be destroyed on receiving notice—failing which the Inspector of Nuisances shall cause the same to be destroyed at the owner's risk and cost.

Violation of the provisions of this By-law shall render the person so offending liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
