Any person affixing any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust shall connect such by a lead pipe three (3) feet in length, with proper brass connexions, and before any person in any manner interferes with any service-pipe, cook, or fitting up to the building line connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall give a clear twenty-four hours' written notice of his intention to do so, to the Secretary of the Trust, and shall before doing such work obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works, and any person offending against this By-law in any way shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

2. No person shall lay down any pipe at a less depth than two (2) feet from the surface of the earth.

3. Such licence shall be at and during the pleasure of the Trust, and the Trust may at any time cancel such licence in the event of the holder thereof being judged by the Trust to be incompetent, or by himself or his employes committing any breach of the Water Act 1905 or of this By-law or any other By-law of the Trust.

4. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust the person applying for same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber, and shall pay in advance a licence-fee of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum; but the Trust may if it so see fit refuse to grant such licence.

No person shall use any water, or allow any water to run for the purpose of watering any garden, plantation, or vegetation wherever growing, or watering any land by means of any pipe, hose, or other conduit, or otherwise in any manner whatsoever at any time other than between the hours of Seven (7) o'clock a.m. and Nine (9) o'clock p.m., or unless such pipe, hose, or other conduit or other means of watering shall, whilst such water shall be so used, be personally attended by some adult constantly present; and any person committing a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

If any person does, or causes, or permits, allows, or suffers to be done anything in contravention of this Ry-law ought to be done for the prevention of the water, he shall be liable (where no penalty is otherwise herein provided for such offence) to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5), and a further penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for every day such misfeasance or non-feasance shall continue after notice of the offence from the Waterworks Trust; and the Trust may cut off the water supply from the premises of such person or persons by cutting the pipes by or through which the water is supplied or otherwise, and may discontinue the supply

No person being the owner or keeper or having the care or custody of any cattle shall drive or allow to be driven on, along, or upon any street or road in the city, whether a public highway or not, any cattle in such quantity or number as to prevent such person having proper control thereof. Provided always that this clause shall not apply to any person in charge of cattle being driven to an abattoirs or slaughter-house, nor to any person or drover in charge of cattle being driven through and beyond the boundaries of the city.

3. No person being the owner or keeper or having the care or custody of any cattle shall allow such cattle to wander upon, along, or across any footway or water channel.

wander upon, along, or across any footway or water channel.

4. No person shall keep any bull upon the same land or in the same yard, paddock, shed, or other enclosure with cows or heifers between punrise and sunset of the same day, unless such yard, paddock, shed, or other enclosure be enclosed with a close fence at least six feet in height, measured from the level of the adjoining roadway or footway, and so constructed or erected as to completely hide such cattle from the view of any person walking along such roadway or footway.

5. No person shall drive nor allow to be driven any bull on, along, or upon any street or road, whether any public highway or not, nor permit or allow any bull to graze or wander upon any land not enclosed by a substantial fence. Provided that this clause shall not apply to any person loading a bull nor to any person in charge of cattle being driven to an abattoirs or slaughter-house, nor to any person or drover in charge of cattle being driven through and beyond the boundaries of the city.

6. No person being the owner or having the care, custody, control, or management of any merry-go-round, swing-boat, or shooting gallery within the city shall allow the same to be used until he shall have satisfied the City Surveyor of Richmond, or other officer appointed by the Council, that in his opinion such merry-go-round, swingboat, or shooting gallery has been constructed, erected, set up, or put up of such materials and in such manner and position as to be untilkely to cause injury to any person.
