SHEPPARTON URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.—
BY-LAW RELATING TO WATER SUPPLY.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1905* and all powers enabling them on this behalf, do make the following By-law:—

1. Any person affixing any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust shall connect such by a lead pipe three (3) feet in length, with proper brass connexions, and before any person in any manner interferes with any service-pipe, cock, or fitting up to the building line connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall give a clear twenty-four hours' written notice of his intention to do so, to the Secretary of the Trust, and shall before doing such work obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works, and any person offending against this By-law in any way shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

2. No person shall lay down any pipe at a less depth than two (2) feet from the surface of the earth.

3. Such licence shall be at and during the pleasure of the Trust, and the Trust may at any time cancel such licence in the event of the holder thereof being judged by the Trust to be incompetent, or by himself or his employes committing any breach of the *Water Act 1905* or of this By-law or any other By-law of the Trust.

4. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust the person applying for same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber, and shall pay in advance a licence-fee of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum; but the Trust may if it so see fit refuse to grant such licence.

5. The Trust may require a meter to be used in any case where it is deemed necessary.

6. The bore of any service-pipe for the supply of water from the pipes of the Trust shall not exceed—

(a) One-half of an inch in diameter where such service is to any premises valued at the municipal valuation for rating purposes of Twenty-five pounds (£25) or under; and

(b) Three-quarters of an inch in diameter where such service is to any premises valued as aforesaid, at a sum exceeding Twenty-five pounds (£25); and

(c) One inch in diameter where such service is to any premises valued as aforesaid, at a sum of Seventy pounds (£70) or over;

and this By-law shall be taken as a consent of the Trust to any such service. Before any service-pipe, with a bore the dimensions of which are contrary to this clause, is laid down in any premises, the consent of the Trust shall first be obtained.

7. No person shall use, or permit to be used or allowed to run on any premises, any water for other than domestic, manufacturing, or fire extinguishing purposes between the hours of Nine (9) o'clock p.m. and Seven (7) o'clock a.m. Any person committing or permitting a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

8. Any person who shall allow water to run to waste, or who shall use the same in any manner for irrigation purposes (except where the supply is by meter), shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

9. Any person not having agreed to be supplied with water by the Trust who shall, or who having so agreed shall, contrary to such agreement, use, take, or carry away, or wilfully permit to be used, taken, or carried away water from any drinking tap, water-trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

10. No person shall use any water, or allow any water to run for the purpose of watering any garden, plantation, or vegetation wherever growing, or watering any land by means of any pipe, hose, or other conduit, or otherwise in any manner whatsoever at any time other than between the hours of Seven (7) o'clock a.m. and Nine (9) o'clock p.m., or unless such pipe, hose, or other conduit or other means of watering shall, whilst such water shall be so used, be personally attended by some adult constantly present; and any person committing a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

11. If any person does, or causes, or permits, allows, or suffers to be done anything in contravention of this By-law, or fails to do anything which under this By-law ought to be done for the prevention of the waste, misuse, undue consumption, or contamination of the water, he shall be liable (where no penalty is otherwise herein provided for such offence) to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5), and a further penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for every day such misfeasance or non-feasance shall continue after notice of the offence from the Waterworks Trust; and the Trust may cut off the water supply from the premises of such person or persons by cutting the pipes by or through which the water is supplied or otherwise, and may discontinue the supply

so long as the cause or injury remains or is not remedied to the satisfaction of the Trust. Provided that neither this By-law or any thing done hereunder shall in any way lessen or extinguish the rights of the Trust under section 345 of *Water Act 1905*.

12. The officer or officers of the Trust appointed for that purpose may at all lawful times enter any house, tenement, or land to, through, or into which water is supplied by the Trust in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for measuring, conveying, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, or examining if there be any waste or misuse of such water, and if any person hinders or prevents examination he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5). The Trust may turn off the water supplied by it from such house or other premises and cease to supply the same with water until such inspection shall have been permitted and effected.

13. The word "person" in this By-law shall include corporation.

14. The By-law made by the Trust on the eighth day of January, 1907, relating to water supply, is hereby repealed.

The foregoing By-law was made by the Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of the powers contained in the *Water Act 1905*, on the evening of Tuesday, the ninth day of February, 1909.

1. Where samples are provided for, the supplies are to be equal in quality, finish, and in all other respects to, and of the same colour as, the contract sample, but as to weight and otherwise are to conform to the specification. In cases where supplies of a particular maker or of a particular brand or trade mark or of a particular distinguishing mark of such maker, brand, or trade mark are required, the supplies shall conform in all respects with the specified requirements. All supplies are to be delivered as directed by the Government Printer, either at the Government Printing Office or at a store situate in the city of Melbourne, but delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of.

2. The quantity mentioned in the schedules will be required from the contractor, who will be bound, however, to supply any further quantities, at the scheduled price, that may be ordered by the Government Printer during the currency of the contract. Four (4) months' notice of the ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS will be given to the contractor by the Government Printer.

3. In the event of the supplies not being delivered by the time specified in the schedule or order as the case may be, it will be competent for the Government Printer to purchase the same, or such articles as may be suitable for the service, at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense that may be incurred over and above the contract price will be deducted.

4. The supplies on delivery will be surveyed by a board appointed by the Government for that purpose, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. Payment will be made on the board's certificate that the goods are of contract quality and in good order and condition.

5. If the board of survey shall decide that the goods are not of contract quality, the contractor must in that case remove the goods objected to and supply others in their stead, failing which the supplies may be purchased as in condition 3.

6. All rejected goods must be removed by the contractor within forty-eight hours after notice has been given to him by the Government Printer of such rejection, and if not so removed the Government Printer is hereby empowered to send same to any store in Melbourne, there to be stored at the contractor's risk and expense.

7. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding One hundred pounds, as the Government may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in condition 3, or from the contractor's security. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith and forfeit the security.

12. CITY OF RICHMOND.

BY-LAW No. 64.

A By-law of the City of Richmond, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, for regulating or prohibiting the use in or on any fence or other erection on land adjoining any street or road, of any wire with spikes or jagged projections; for prohibiting or regulating cattle being allowed to graze or wander upon any land not enclosed by a substantial fence; for regulating the use of merry-go-rounds, swing-boats, or shooting galleries, and for maintaining the good rule and government of the municipality.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Richmond hereby order as follows :—

1. No person shall erect, affix, use, maintain, or continue, or permit to be maintained, erected, affixed, used, or continued on any fence or other erection on land adjoining any street or road, any wire with spikes or jagged projections within four inches of any such street or road, unless such wire be at a height of not less than six feet from the level of the footway or carriage-way of such street or road.

2. No person being the owner or keeper or having the care or custody of any cattle shall drive or allow to be driven on, along, or upon any street or road in the city, whether a public highway or not, any cattle in such quantity or number as to prevent such person having proper control thereof. Provided always that this clause shall not apply to any person in charge of cattle being driven to an abattoirs or slaughter-house, nor to any person or drover in charge of cattle being driven through and beyond the boundaries of the city.

3. No person being the owner or keeper or having the care or custody of any cattle shall allow such cattle to wander upon, along, or across any footway or water channel.

4. No person shall keep any bull upon the same land or in the same yard, paddock, shed, or other enclosure with cows or heifers between sunrise and sunset of the same day, unless such yard, paddock, shed, or other enclosure be enclosed with a close fence at least six feet in height, measured from the level of the adjoining roadway or footway, and so constructed or erected as to completely hide such cattle from the view of any person walking along such roadway or footway.

5. No person shall drive nor allow to be driven any bull on, along, or upon any street or road, whether a public highway or not, nor permit or allow any bull to graze or wander upon any land not enclosed by a substantial fence. Provided that this clause shall not apply to any person leading a bull nor to any person in charge of cattle being driven to an abattoirs or slaughter-house, nor to any person or drover in charge of cattle being driven through and beyond the boundaries of the city.

6. No person being the owner or having the care, custody, control, or management of any merry-go-round, swing-boat, or shooting gallery within the city shall allow the same to be used until he shall have satisfied the City Surveyor of Richmond, or other officer appointed by the Council, that in his opinion such merry-go-round, swing-boat, or shooting gallery has been constructed, erected, set up, or put up of such materials and in such manner and position as to be unlikely to cause injury to any person.

Every person guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to any clause of this By-law shall upon conviction thereof, for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds and not less than Five shillings.
