SHEPPARTON URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST—
RATING BY-LAW FOR 1909.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1905* and of all powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following By-law:

By-law for determining the rates and charges which shall be made for water supplied within the boundaries of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust District:—
1. A rate of One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) in the pound sterling on the municipal value of all rateable property valued at Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence (£13 6s. 8d.) and upwards, situated within the Waterworks District of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, is hereby made for the year 1909.

2. The minimum rate for such properties valued at less than Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence (£13 6s. 8d.) sterling on the municipal value shall be Twenty shillings (20s.).

3. On each unoccupied allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District before mentioned separately from any building, the annual rate of Five pounds sterling per cent. on the amount of the annual valuation of same shall be charged, provided that no allotment or piece of land shall pay less than Seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.) per annum.

4. Water supplied by measure to be used in private domiciles or other premises for domestic use or for the watering of private gardens or distribution otherwise on or about such premises, shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per thousand, (1,000) gallons up to an amount equal to that the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons for any quantity of water used for the before-mentioned purposes beyond such an amount aforesaid.

5. For every steam boiler supplied with water by the Trust, the charge shall be the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence (12s. 6d.) per annum for each horse-power (actual) of such steam boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In cases where the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power, a charge by measurement shall be made at the same rate as provided in clause four (4) hereof.

6. For water supplied for manufacturing purposes (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), the charge will be One shilling (1s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than equal to One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) in the pound on the municipal valuation of the Shire of Shepparton for the year 1909 of the property so supplied.

7. Water supplied to Government Departments, cricket grounds, bowling greens, show-yards, cattle-yards, sheep-dips, and similar properties shall be charged for by measurement, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.) per annum.

8. For water supplied from stand-pipes or hydrants, for each load of two hundred and fifty (250) gallons or under, Sixpence (6d.) shall be charged.

9. For a temporary supply during the erection of a new building, repairs, or additions, the charge shall be Twenty shillings (20s.) per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering, or in the absence of a contract, of the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, and plastering, or the said Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement at the rate provided in clause four (4) hereof.

All persons about to build must, if they require a supply of water for building purposes, notify the Trust, and shall not use any water for such purposes until authorized in writing by the Trust so to do.

10. Such rates are hereby made payable half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, in the said year 1909. The charges for the sale of water by measure shall be payable monthly or at such other time or period as the Trust may in any case determine.

11. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

The foregoing By-law was made by the Chairman and the Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of the powers contained in the *Water Act 1905*, on the evening of Tuesday, ninth day of February, 1909.

**TRARALGON WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
BY-LAW FOR 1909.**

BY-LAW for making a rate for the year 1909 on the rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Traralgon Waterworks Trust, which district has for the purposes of the *Water Act 1905* been proclaimed an Urban District; also for dealing with the charges for the sale of water by measure from the works of the Trust:—

1. A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound shall be paid on the annual value of all rateable property in the Waterworks District, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Shire of Traralgon, but no such rate for tenements shall be less than One pound two shillings and sixpence (£1 2s. 6d.).
2. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land, the municipal value of which does not exceed Three pounds (£3) per annum, the sum of Seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.). When such value is over Three pounds and less than Seven pounds, the sum of Ten shillings and sixpence (10s. 6d.). When such value is Seven pounds or over, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound.
3. For gardens and lawns to which water is supplied, and the area of which does not exceed one-quarter of an acre, the sum of Ten shillings per annum; and for every additional quarter of an acre or portion thereof, the sum of Ten shillings.
4. For every public water trough, the sum of One pound (£1).
5. When water is supplied by measure for domestic and other than domestic purposes, a charge of One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at the price named, would be equal to the rate payable in respect of such property if the water were supplied otherwise than by measure.
6. When water is supplied solely for other than domestic purposes, the charge shall be One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons, and the minimum quantity to be supplied during each half-year ending on the 30th of June and the 31st of December shall be Five thousand gallons. The charge hereby made shall be payable on demand by the Trust.
7. In all cases not herein provided for the Trust shall make such special provision as may be deemed necessary.
8. The foregoing rates are made payable on the first day of March, 1909.
9. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

PYRAMID HILL WATERWORKS TRUST.

THE Commissioners of the Pyramid Hill Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, make the following By-law:—

BY-LAW No. 4.

1. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case (except in case of a special agreement with the Trust) where water is supplied by measure for domestic and other than domestic purposes, shall be the quantity for which the charge at 3s. per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed water rate payable in respect of the premises so supplied otherwise than by measure.
2. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.
3. The Trust may cause a meter or meters to be affixed in any case where they may consider it necessary. Such meter or meters to be provided and fixed at the expense of the consumer, and the water supplied to be charged for by measurement at the aforesaid rate. No meter shall be fixed unless the dial of same is capable of registering 1,000,000 gallons.
4. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without first obtaining the permission of the Trust and giving two days' notice of the day and the hour to the Secretary or officer of the Trust when such pipe is intended to be laid, to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make any such

communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose, and any person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such breach.

5. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow same to run to waste, and any person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such breach.

6. The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of consumers shall in no case exceed three-quarters of an inch, and shall be supplied with a suitable high pressure stop-cock of hard brass at the expense of the consumer.

7. Plumbers and other persons employed to lay on service-pipes and fix meters or to re-fix or re-lay same must satisfy the proper officer of the Trust that they are competent to perform same in a workmanlike manner.

8. Meters affixed to services shall not be removed or interfered with except upon written application to, and with the approval of the Trust. Any person offending against this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such breach.

9. If any person shall waste water of the Trust, by neglecting to repair any service-pipe, tap, &c., conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from the officer of the Trust that such pipes, taps, &c., require repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises either by cutting off the service-pipes or otherwise as the Trust may see fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. Any person offending against this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such breach.

10. No person shall water streets or thoroughfares by means of hydrant and hose attached to fire plugs or to any other outlet without the written permission of the Trust. Any person offending against this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

11. The fire plugs shall not be used except for the purpose of extinguishing fires, unless any other use of them be allowed in writing by the Trust, and they shall at all times be under the control of the officers of the Trust.

12. The officers of the Trust shall have power at all times between the hours of Ten in the forenoon and Four in the afternoon to enter any house, building, or lands, to, through, or into which water is supplied by the Trust, by measure or otherwise, in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for the measuring, conveyance, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, or preventing waste, and to inspect and examine if there be any waste or misuse of such meter, and may from time to time enter any house, building, or land for the purpose of removing any meter, instrument, pipe, or apparatus the property of the Trust, and if any person hinder such officer from entering or making such inspection or effecting such removal, he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

13. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, causes, or permits to be done, anything in contravention of these Regulations, or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charges imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these Regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied, or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

14. Water may be sold to non-ratepayers at the rate of 3s. per 1,000 gallons, with a minimum of 6d. per 100 gallon tank or under. Application in all cases must be made to the Secretary.

15. Each trough supplied with water by the Trust and used by the public shall be charged at the rate of £1 per annum for every 12 feet or portion thereof.

Collectors of £1 or over will be entitled to receive one patient's ticket for each £1 collected.

£40 donation by society, association, or company shall entitle same to nominate life governor.

£50, first-named executor under will life governor.

£1 yearly subscription, contributor.

5. Any person who has conferred some signal benefit upon the Hospital irrespective of contribution, may be elected by the Board of Management a life governor, with all the privileges attached thereto.

6. Annual subscriptions must be paid in advance for the current year, such year to be computed from the day on which such subscription be paid, and no contributor will be entitled to any privilege until his or her subscription be paid.

7. Life governors and other contributors of £1 and upwards per annum shall be entitled to one vote at all meetings of governors and contributors to the Hospital. No person shall vote as a governor or contributor while he is a salaried officer or pupil of the Hospital.
