When water is supplied by measure for domestic and other than domestic purposes, a charge of One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at the price named, would be equal to the rate payable in respect of such property if the water were supplied otherwise than by measure.

6. When water is supplied solely for other than domestic purposes, the charge shall be One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons, and the minimum quantity to be supplied during each half-year ending on the 30th of June and the 11st of December shall be Five thousand gallons. The charge hereby made shall be payable on demand by the Trust.

7. In all cases not herein provided for the Trust shall make such special provision as may be deemed necessary.

8. The foregoing rates are made payable on the first day of March, 1909.

O. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said, rates and charges.

Such meter or meters to be provided and fixed at the expense of the consumer, and the water supplied to be charged for by measurement at the aforesaid rate. No meter shall be fixed unless the dial of same is capable of registering 1,000,000 gallons.

4. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without first obtaining the permission of the Trust and giving two days' notice of the day and the hour to the Secretary or officer of the Trust when such pipe is intended to be laid, to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make any such

communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose, and any person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such breach.

- 5. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow same to run to waste, and any person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such
- 6. The service pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of consumers shall in no case exceed three-quarters of an inch, and shall be supplied with a suitable high pressure stop-cock of hard brass of the expense of the consumer. at the expense of the consumer.
- 7. Plumbers and other persons employed to lay on service-pipes and fix meters or to re-fix or re-lay same must satisfy the proper officer of the Trust that they are competent to perform same in a workmanlike manner.
- 8. Meters affixed to services shall not be removed or interfered with except upon written application to, and with the approval of the Trust. Any person offending against this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such breach.
- exceeding £5 for every such breach.

 9. If any person shall waste water of the Trust, by neglecting to repair any service-pipe, tap, &c., conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from the officer of the Trust that such pipes, taps, &c., require repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises either by cutting off the service-pipes or otherwise as the Trust may see fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. Any person offending against this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such breach. for every such breach.
- 10. No person shall water streets or thoroughfares by means of hydrant and hose attached to fire plugs or to any other outlet without the written permission of the Trust. Any person offending against this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.
- 11. The fire plugs shall not be used except for the purpose of extinguishing fires, unless any other use of them be allowed in writing by the Trust, and they shall times be under the control of the officers of the Trust.

The officers of the Trust shall have power at all times between the hours of Ten in the forenoon and Four in the afternoon to enter any house, building, or lands, to, through, or into which water is supplied by the Trust, by measure or otherwise, in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for the measuring, conveyance, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, or preventing waste, and to inspect and examine if there be any waste or misuse of such meter, and may from time to time enter any house, building, or land for the purpose of removing any meter, instrument, pipe, or apparatus the property of the Trust, and if any person hinder such officer from entering or making such inspection or effecting such removal, he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5. exceeding £5.

If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, causes, or permits to be done, anything in contravention of these; Regulations, or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charges imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these Regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied, or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

- 14. Water may be sold to non-ratepayers at the rate of 3s. per 1,000 gallons, with a minimum of 6d. per 100 gallon tank or under. Application in all cases must be made to the Secretary.
