In connexion with periodical exercises or manœuvres, or in the event of relations becoming strained between Great Britain and any Naval Power, an Examination Service may come into force at the ports or localities mentioned at the end of this notice.

Masters are warned that before attempting to enter any of these ports they must, in their own interests, strictly-obey all instructions given to them by the vessels which will be charged with the duty of examining ships desiring to enter the ports, and allotting positions in which the ships shall anchor. In case of fog they should on no account attempt to enter before receiving permission from the Examination Officer.

The institution of an Examination Service at any port will never be publicly advertised, but at all times when the relations of Great Britain with foreign powers are known to be in a state of tension, especial care should be taken in approaching the ports, by day or by night, to keep a sharp look-out for the Examination steamer, and to be ready to "bring to" at once when hailed by her or warned by the firing of a gun.

If the entrance to a port is closed three red vertical lights by night, or three red balls by day, will be exhibited in some conspicuous position, in or near to its approach, and as far as possible notice of this fact will be given by look-out vessels in the offing.

If the Examination Service is in force the Examination steamer will be distinguished at night—

- (a) When the port is closed, by three red vertical lights.
- (b) When the port is open, by three white vertical lights.

The pilots attached to the ports will be acquainted with the regulations to be followed.

- 1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than seven females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said seven females shall not be employed for more than fifty-one hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours beyond the ordinary working hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
- 2. SHIRE OF MEREDITH.-BY-LAW No. 9.

THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Meredith, by virtue of the provisions of the Health Act 1890 and every other power enabling them in this behalf, hereby make the following By-law, being By-law No. 9 of the said Shire:—

- 1. This By-law may be cited as a By-law for regulating earth-closets and the emptying and cleansing of cess-pans in the Townships of Meredith and Steiglitz, and for fixing a charge for same.
- 2. This By-law shall come into force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the Government
- 3. The ordinary system of pans for night-soil is hereby abolished, and instead thereof every closet shall be furnished with a double-pan service, to be provided by the Council at cost price.
- 4. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than three inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and shall have the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan and emptying and cleansing the same.
- 5. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any house or premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in a pan placed in such earth-closet to be immediately, on the deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.
- 6. No closet door or trap shall abut or open on any street or lane.
- 7. Once at least in every week, or so much more frequently as the Council of the said Shire may from time to time direct, the pan in use in every such closet shall be closed with a tightly-fitting lid and removed in the day-time to such place as the said Council may have appointed. appointed.

No one except the person authorized by the said Council shall be employed to remove the same.

8. The charge for emptying and cleansing the cess-pans to be paid by the occupier of any tenement, under the provisions of section 259 of the *Health Act* 1890, shall be as follows:—Once a week for each pan per annum, £1; twice a week for each pan, £2; thrice a week for each pan, £3. Such charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance.

Failure to pay the said annual charge shall be a breach of this By-law.

- 9. Every person who fails to comply with, or is guilty of any breach of the provisions of this Bv-law, shall be liable for every such offence to pay a penalty not exceed-
- 10. All former By-laws on the matter and things herein provided for are hereby repealed.

The resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council the 9th day of December, 1908, and confirmed on the 10th day of February, 1909.
