ROYAL COMMISSION TO INQUIRE INTO AND REPORT ON THE CIRCUMSTANCES CONNECTED WITH THE ACQUISITION OF CERTAIN LANDS AT MARIBYRNONG, ETC.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has, by an Order made on the 8th day of April, 1909, been pleased to appoint

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

BY-LAW No. 76.—RATE.—WATERWORKS DISTRICT OF THE LODDON UNITED WATERWORKS TRUST.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act* 1905, and in accordance with the provisions of an Order in Council bearing date the 2nd March, 1909, and published in the *Government Gazette* of 10th March, 1909, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following Rate is hereby made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of all lands within the Waterworks District of the Loddon United Waterworks Trust, except within any Urban District thereof:—

- (1) Of all lands in the First Division, as shown coloured red on a plan signed and sealed by the Commission and lodged at the office of such Commission at Melbourne; and authenticated copies of which are also lodged at the office of the Commission at Pyramid Hill; at the office of the Municipality of East Loddon, at Serpentine; at the Post Office at Mitiamo; at the Post Office at Tandara; at the Post Office at Marmal; at the Post Office at Boort; and at the Post Office at Bridgewater—a rate of One shilling in the pound of the rateable value of such lands.

- (2) Of all lands in the Second Division, as shown coloured green on the aforesaid plan—a rate of Sixpence in the pound of the rateable value of such lands.

- (3) Of all lands in the Third Division, as shown coloured brown on the aforesaid plan—a rate of Threepence in the pound of the rateable value of such lands.

2 Such rate is made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of January, 1909, and ending with the thirty-first day of December, 1909, and shall be payable on the twenty-second day of April, 1909, at the office of the said Commission at Pyramid Hill.

3 Such person or persons as the said Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate.

4 For making and levying such rate the net annual value of the lands set out in the valuation made by A. E. Smith, valuer, returned on the tenth day of April, 1908, and adopted by the said Commission on the twenty-seventh day of July, 1908, shall be deemed and taken to be the rateable value of such lands, unless altered or amended as provided by the *Water Act* 1905, and if so altered or amended then the net annual value of such lands set out in such altered or amended valuation.

BLACKWOOD PUBLIC CEMETERY.

ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS.

NO coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground, unless it contains the body of a child under 12 years of age, when it shall be so buried that no part of it shall be within three feet of that level.

No private grave shall be re-opened or any interment permitted therein, without the consent, in writing, of the person entitled to give he same.

No old graves shall be permitted to be re-opened or any interment therein unless with the previous authority of the Trustees.

No re-interment or removal from another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

That any person taking any part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules, viz.:—

First. That no rubbish, clay, or other material, required in dressing a grave, shall be placed on any other grave or any adjoining grave or footpath, but shall be removed immediately after the completion of the work.

Second. That no loam shall be taken from any portion of the Cemetery ground for the purpose of dressing any grave.

Third. That no person shall be permitted to pluck any flower from any grave, or to take any tree, shrub, or plant from the Cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the Trustees.

1st. The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1909 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Trust District, and such rates shall be payable in one moiety, and become due on the 1st April, 1909.

No. 51.—APRIL 16, 1909.—4391.—2.

2nd. On every house or tenement of an annual municipal value of under Eight pounds sterling (£8), the minimum sum of Ten shillings (10s.).

3rd. On every house or tenement of an annual municipal value of Eight pounds sterling (£8) or upwards, the sum of One shilling and sixpence in the pound (£1) on the amount of said valuation.

4th. On warehouses and wholesale stores, not being dwellings or used in retail business, the sum of One shilling and sixpence in the pound (£1) on the amount of municipal valuation, provided that in no case shall a less rate than One pound sterling be paid.

5th. A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound (£1) on the municipal valuation shall be levied on all vacant land fronting such streets as are reticulated.

6th. Water supplied by measure to be used in private dwellings or other premises for domestic or other than domestic use shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gals. The minimum quantity to be charged for yearly shall be that which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the current rating upon the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons in addition to a supply for domestic or other purposes, beyond such an amount as aforesaid.

7th. The charge for water supplied for manufacturing and other purposes, and to buildings, lands, and institutions not rated, to be subject to special agreement with the Trust.

8th. For water supplied to charitable institutions for gardens or irrigation purposes, Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

9th. For water supplied for cricket or bowling clubs, the charge shall be subject to arrangement with the Trust.

10th. For water supplied to gardens or nurseries cultivated for trade purposes, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

11th. For water supplied to private fountains, Twenty shillings each, or as may be decided upon by the Trust, in addition to a charge for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

12th. For water supplied and used solely as a motive power for hydraulic lifts, water blasts, turbines, water wheels, electric and other motors (subject to the supply being refused or discontinued at any time), One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or as may be agreed upon, in addition to the rating upon the assessment of the premises for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

13th. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stone, brick-work, or plastering.

TALBOT BOROUGH WATER SUPPLY.—RATING
BY-LAW FOR 1909.

THE Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Talbot, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, do hereby make the following By-law for the purpose of levying a water rate for the year 1909 upon all lands and tenements liable to be rated within that portion of the municipality of the Borough of Talbot which has been proclaimed a Water Supply District; also for the purpose of determining the charges to be made for the sale of water within such district:—

The following are the rates which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1909 in respect of water supplied within the aforesaid district:—

1. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds municipal value and under, the sum of One pound (£1).

2. For every house or tenement of above Twenty pounds (£20) annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling in the pound.

3. For every hotel, a rate of Six pounds per cent. upon the annual municipal value of such property.

4. Government Departments, railways, and other properties supplied by meter, a charge of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons shall be made.

5. Government offices supplied with water by special arrangement with the Trust, the following charges shall be made:—

Post Office, Two shillings (2s.) per 1,000 gallons; minimum 20,000 gallons per annum.
Police Station, Two shillings (2s.) per 1,000 gallons; minimum 30,000 gallons per annum.
State School, Two shillings per 1,000 gallons; minimum 15,000 gallons per annum.

6. The charge to be made for loads of water from stand-pipes shall be One shilling for each load of 400 gallons or less.

7. For every water trough connected with hotels, Ten shillings (10s.) per annum; the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons.

8. For every factory, mill, or other tenement where machinery is attached and working, the rate shall be Two shillings in the pound on the annual municipal value of such property, or the water may be supplied and charged for my measure at Sixpence (6d.) per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the engine cylinder.

9. For market gardens where water is supplied by meter, the charge shall be Twopence (2d.) per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 100,000 gallons per half acre and 200,000 gallons per acre.

10. For water supplied to market gardens and orchards, a charge of Twopence (2d.) per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 150,000 gallons per acre when supplied from the open race.

11. For water supplied to syphon pumps, a charge of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum shall be made.

12. For water supplied to mining companies, dredges, &c., a charge of One penny per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for 120,000 gallons per week.

The before-mentioned rates shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1909, and the 1st day of July, 1909, and the charges for water shall be payable half-yearly or as may be demanded.

Such person or persons as may from time to time be appointed for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

Security will be required, either in Victorian Government Debentures, Savings Bank Deposit Book, or Bank Deposit Receipt in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed and contract signed within five days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contracts for Government supplies for a period of twelve months, such disqualification to date from the notification of acceptance of tender. It is also stipulated that if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, then his tender is to be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual; and that for breach of this condition the preliminary deposit will be forfeited and the tender declared informal.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedule, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. Substantial and effective preference will, however, be given to goods of Commonwealth manufacture, provided the quality is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

3. The value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne and Williamstown districts are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of 6 miles from the General Post Office; and Williamstown district will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officers ordering the goods.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in Condition 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

8. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form at the time of the delivery of the goods, and the account shall be accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

10. All goods forwarded under these contracts shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor or contractors by whom consigned.

11. When the contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail for any department except the Defence Department, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carrier to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. (In the case of the Defence Department, however, the consignment note only which accompanies the order must be used.) Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 14 of these conditions.

12. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in Condition 7.
