Candidates must state at which place they desire to present themselves for examination—which must be that nearest to their residence—and must forward (either with their application on or before Tuesday, the 1st June, 1909), a crossed postal note, payable to the Secretary to the Commissioner, Melbourne, for Ten shillings in the case of candidates for the Clerical Division Examination, and Five shillings in the case of the General Division Examination—being the fees for such examinations.

Forms of application and copies of regulations may be obtained at the office of the Commissioner, Treasury Buildings, Melbourne.

At the Clerical Examination fifty (50) candidates will be selected for registration for appointment as Clerk, and three (3) for Assistant in the Public Library, Melbourne. Candidates must be between the ages of sixteen and thirty years. For the position of Assistant, Public Library, applicants must produce evidence of having passed the Junior Public Examination of the University of Melbourne (or some equivalent examination which the Commissioner may judge equivalent) in Greek, in Latin, and in either French or German.

For the position of Penal Warder, applicants must be between the ages of twenty-five and thirty-five years, and must furnish a certificate of fitness from the Inspector-General of Penal Establishments, Melbourne. No applicant shall be registered as a candidate for such position if he be less than five feet eight inches in height, or measure round his chest less than thirty-six inches, or weigh less than eleven stone.

Officers of the General Division of the Public Service of Victoria may compete at the Clerical Division Examination—or may present themselves at the General Division Examination in order to qualify for promotion—on making application to the Commissioner and furnishing evidence of good conduct and health from the Head of their Department. ## LONGITUDE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN NEW AND OLD SURVEY CHARTS.

As the attention of the Marine Department has been drawn to the fact of a difference of longitude existing in the published Admiralty Charts Nos. 2527 and 2528, the Department would take the opportunity of explaining that Charts Nos. 2527 (July, 1906), 2543 (February, 1908), and 3565 (vii., 1908) are due to the surveys lately made by H.M.S. *Penguin*, and on these charts the official longitude of the Dominion has been adopted, whereas the other charts still keep to the longitude based on determination of a few years back. In transferring positions or courses from one chart to another, therefore, it is advisable to plot the bearing and distance from some point of land rather than to use the actual latitude and longitude given on the chart.

## BY-LAW No. 18.

A By-law of the Shire of Seymour made under the Health Act 1890.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Act 1890 and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Seymour, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the Township of Seymour, as defined in the *Government Gazette* of the 14th December, 1855, page 3248, and the 25th March, 1908, page 1720.

4. The occupier of any premises in which there is a closet or privy shall cause the space under the seat of each closet or privy on such premises to be prepared, and shall permit the same to be used for the double-pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause the closet or privy to be kept in a fit state for such service.

5. At least once a week, or so much more frequently as the Council may from time to time direct, the Council shall cause the pan in use to be closed with a tight-fitting lid and removed in the day-time in a suitable cart, and the Council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate for the removal of night-soil and rubbish, to make a charge on each occupier for such service and for pans supplied, the amount, in default of payment, to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

6. The occupier aforesaid or other person having control or management of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, saw-dust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan in such closet or privy to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of the pan.

7. The Council shall forthwith leave or cause to be left in the place of every pan so removed a pan cleansed by super-heated steam or some equally efficient means approved by the Council.

8. Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered so as to be water-tight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet.

9. No occupier or any other person shall deposit, or permit to be deposited, in any closet-pan in use at the tenement occupied by him any substance whatever other than night-soil or disinfectant or deodorizing material.

10. The occupier aforesaid or other person shall not contract for the removal of night-soil or any other refuse except in accordance with the by-laws and regulations of the Council.

11. All privies, earth-closets, and urinals shall be constructed of stone, brick, iron, or wood, and in such a manner as may be approved of by the said Council.

12. The occupier of every house and premises shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto or occupied in connexion therewith to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground, and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid the Council may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

13. The occupier of any land on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-yard, cattle-shed, or pig-sty shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard; and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid the same shall be removed by the Council at the expense of such occupier.

14. All night-soil, blood, offal, or other refuse or offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and buried, as hereinafter provided, in the manure dépôt appointed by the Council from time to time for the final reception of the same, and in no other place.

15. No person shall place, deposit, spread, or bury, or cause or suffer to be placed or deposited or spread or buried, or assist in placing, depositing, spreading, or burying in any place except the manure dépôt, to be from time to time appointed by the said Council, any night-soil, blood, offal, or other refuse or offensive matter or thing, whether by way of manure or otherwise, except as to manure, with the consent and approval of the Council or its health officer.

16. Any person or persons removing night-soil, blood, offal, or other refuse or offensive matter or thing to the manure dépôt to be appointed by the Council from time to time as aforesaid, shall bury the same in a trench, to be dug out or excavated by such person or persons in such place in said manure dépôt as shall be appointed by the inspector of the said Council, which trench shall not be less in measurement than 3 feet deep by 1 ft. 6 in. in width by 6 feet in length, and such person or persons shall cover the night-soil, blood, offal, or other refuse or offensive matter or thing buried in such trench with at least 18 inches of soil at the same time as such burial takes place. Any surplus earth from such excavation, after the burying of such night-soil, blood, offal, or other refuse or offensive matter or thing, and covering the same with 18 inches of soil, shall be spread evenly and regularly on the surface of such trench.

17. No person shall remove any part of the contents of any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of night-soil except by the means of a cart, carriage, or other conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents, or any portion thereof, or of any effluvia therefrom.

18. The occupier of any premises used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abattoir, or otherwise shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be removed therefrom once in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health or to exhale any offensive effluvia. And if any such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever it may be removed by the said Council at the expense of such occupier.

19. Every occupier of a house or premises shall provide and keep thereon a box or some other covered receptacle for the temporary deposit of house refuse, which box or receptacle shall be of such dimensions as the same may with the contents thereof, when full, be readily and conveniently movable by one man, or so many such boxes or receptacles as may be necessary to contain all the house refuse produced or accumulated on such premises during one week, and shall cause all house refuse produced or accumulated on such premises during one week to be deposited, as soon as conveniently may be, in some such box or receptacle, and shall place, or cause to be placed, such receptacle in the street channel nearest such house or premises, on such days and at such hours as the Council shall from time to time by regulation prescribe.

20. No person shall place, assist in placing, or cause or permit to be placed in or so that the same may or may be likely to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy any matter or thing likely to endanger the health of any person using such water or drink or milk or other produce of such dairy.

21. No occupier or any other person shall by any means place or cause to be placed upon any footpath, street, or street channel any house or yard refuse or sweepings.

22. Every accumulation or deposit of offensive matter so situated as to find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking purposes or domestic purposes, or likely to be used in any dairy, shall be deodorized and removed by the occupier of the property upon which such accumulation or deposit is situated within one day of notice given by the Council or by one of its officers.

23. No person shall keep any animal of any kind so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

24. No person shall keep any animal in such a manner as to pollute any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy so as to endanger the health of any person using such water or drink or milk or other produce of such dairy.

25. Every occupier or licensee or person having the management or control of a slaughter-house or abattoir shall cause the same to be supplied with a quantity of water sufficient in the opinion of the Council's health officer for all purposes.

26. All occupiers of premises are required to see to the performance and observance of the above provisions.

27. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of Five pounds for every such breach, or of Two pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the Justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties, such portion not being less than Five shillings, to be paid. And any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty notwithstanding that the Council may be empowered by this By-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such Council has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the Council of the Shire of Seymour on the eighth day of February, 1909, and confirmed on the eighth day of March, 1909.

**PROTECTION OF NATIVE GAME OF ALL KINDS IN A CERTAIN AREA AT FISHERMEN'S BEND, PORT MELBOURNE.**

**PROCLAMATION**

By His Excellency Sir Thomas David Gibson Carmichael, Baronet, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

**I** THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of section 14 of the *Game Act 1896* (60 Vict. No. 1463), do by this my Proclamation direct that the area hereunder described shall be a locality in which from the first day of January to the thirty-first day of December (both days inclusive) in each year it shall be unlawful for any person to kill or destroy any native game set forth in the Third Schedule to the *Game Act 1890*.

Area above referred to:—Comprising one hundred and thirty-two acres three roods seven perches, county of Bourke, parish of South Melbourne, town of Port Melbourne: Commencing at the intersection of the south side of Lorimer-street and the south-western side of Inglis-street; bounded thence by the last-named street bearing S. 51 deg. 52 min. E. three chains sixty-eight links; thence by lines bearing respectively S. 48 deg. 26 min. W. nine chains sixty-six links, S. 68 deg. 46 min. W. twenty-two chains eight links, N. 83 deg. 22 min. W. twenty chains ninety-five links, S. 83 deg. 58 min. W. ten chains ninety links, S. 72 deg. 29 min. W. sixteen chains eighty-six links, and N. 83 deg. 0 min. W. ten chains fifty links; thence by the boundary of the land vested in the Melbourne Harbor Trust bearing N. 21 deg. 33 min. 1. 3. The value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. 4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. 5. 7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in Condition 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

8. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form at the time of the delivery of the goods, and the account shall be accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

10. All goods forwarded under these contracts shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor or contractors by whom consigned.

11. When the contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail for any department except the Defence Department, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carrier to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Department. He shall, as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. ## SHIRE OF MCLIVOR.

## BY-LAW NO. 7.

A By-law of the Shire of McIvor made under Division 2, Part VII., of the *Local Government Act* No. 1893, and numbered 7, for prohibiting cattle wandering on the streets of the Township of Heathcote during certain hours.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1903, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of McIvor order as follows :—

If any cattle are found between sunset and sunrise without any person having charge of them in any street or upon any land (not being a common) which is not enclosed or fenced with some sufficient fence within the meaning of the *Fences Act* 1890, or any amendment thereof and the openings (if any), in which fence are not secured and barred with gates or other fastenings of equivalent closeness and strength with the fence, any officer of the Council may seize such cattle and impound them, or place them at some neighbouring place of safe custody.

The owner of such cattle shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings for every head of such cattle, and any Justice, if such owner be not known, upon proof of the issue of a summons in the usual form, addressed to such owner as "owner" only without otherwise naming or describing him, such cattle and the place of seizure being duly described therein, and of the publication of such summons in some newspaper circulating in the neighbourhood, may, after the expiration of twenty-four hours from such publication, proceed with respect to such owner not appearing as if personal service of a summons stating his name had been effected, or if such owner appear then as in other cases, and the Justice may order the cattle to be sold, and the money arising from the sale after deducting the said penalty and the costs awarded, and the reasonable expenses to be assessed by the Justice of seizing, keeping, and selling the said cattle, shall be paid, if demanded within one month, to the owner of the cattle, and if not so demanded then to the municipal fund, and if the said money is not sufficient for all the purposes aforesaid, the amount whereby the same falls short, or if no such sale be ordered the whole of the said amount may be recovered from the said owner, if and when known, in like manner as other penalties and sums adjudged or ordered to be paid by Justices are to be recovered.

If such cattle by reason of having been so found at large have been impounded by the Council the amount of

such penalty and costs, if adjudged respectively before the release or sale of such cattle, shall be added to the pound fees and charges payable in respect of such cattle, and the amount thereof, or such lesser amount (if any) as after the sale of the cattle may remain in the hands of the poundkeeper, shall be paid over by him accordingly, and if the proceeds of the sale of any such cattle are not sufficient after paying the lawful fee and charges aforesaid to satisfy such penalty and costs, or if such penalty and costs have been adjudged after the release or sale of the cattle, the same, or so much thereof as remains unpaid, shall and may be recovered from the owner of the cattle in the manner as other penalties and costs adjudged by Justices are by law to be recovered; and if in the case of any information under this section the owner be not known, then the provisions of the last preceding section so far as necessary to give the adjudicating Justice jurisdiction shall apply.

This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the Central Riding of the Shire of McIvor.

Resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council on the 11th day of February, 1909, and confirmed on the 11th day of March, 1909, and ordered to come into force on the day following its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
