for a period of eight weeks from the 24th May, 1909, upon the following express conditions, that is to say :—

- 1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than four females for more than four, regist hours in any one week, and that the said four females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
- That every female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Three-pence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
- 3. That every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
- That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION. AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWNSHIP OF WOOLAMAI.

WOLAMAI.

W7 E, Samuel Sloss, John Joseph Nowlan, Heber Baker Williams, James Caughey, and Richard Trew, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the reserve for Public Recreation in the Township of Woolamai, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the Land Act 1901:—

REGULATIONS

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one vear) as the reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, sports, entertainments, fêtes, or holiday amusements, on any of which

occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling (18.) may charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats,

trees, or seats, or rou or throw stones in the reserve.

5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.

6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 109 of the Land Act 1901, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wildly offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10. and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a Benalty not exceeding £10.

1. As the exact quantity of any article of provisions which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same as ordered.

2. All the articles are to be of the best quality of the several kinds, in the best condition, and to be delivered in sound packages, free from all charges for cartage, freight, &c. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.
