PUPIL SURVEYORS AND DRAUGHTSMEN,
SURVEY BRANCH.

APPLICATIONS will be received, addressed to the Secretary for Lands, up to 1st July next, from candidates desirous of being appointed as Pupil Surveyors and Draughtsmen in connexion with this Department.

CONDITIONS.

An applicant for appointment must not be more than twenty years or less than sixteen years of age. He will be required to produce a medical certificate to the effect that he is of sound constitution, and not affected with any physical infirmity which would interfere with the proper exercise of his profession.

QUALIFICATIONS.

He must have passed the Matriculation Examination (including Algebra, Euclid, and Arithmetic) in the Melbourne or other recognised University, or—

Passed such other recognised examination, or produce such certificates from the Education Department, or other authority, as will satisfy the Surveyor-General as to his competency in the three subjects named, and as to his general educational proficiency.

He shall also with such certificates submit a specimen of his plan drawing.

COMPETITIVE EXAMINATION.

Having duly complied with the foregoing requirements, he will undergo a competitive examination in trigonometrical computation, plotting and plan drawing, when the competitors to whom shall be awarded a sufficient number of points by the Examiners will be recommended for appointment, subject to the regulations of the department as to probation.

PROBATION.

Accepted candidates approved by the Minister shall enter the office as probationers for a period of one month without pay; and at the end of that time, if reported by the Surveyor-General to have displayed aptitude for the work, may be appointed as pupils, and will be subject to the General Regulations for the Public Service as far as they are applicable.

TERM OF SERVICE.

The pupil's service in the Department shall be for a term of four years, the first two of which will be served in the office, where he will be engaged in drawing and computing. He will then (if thought necessary) be examined in trigonometry, including computation of areas and reduction of traverse surveys, also plotting from field book and plan drawing. If his progress up to this time be not deemed satisfactory, he will be liable to be dispensed with; but, if satisfactory, he will be placed under a departmental surveyor for two years for field practice.

Afterwards he will have the privilege of attending for two months at the Melbourne Observatory, where he will be instructed in such branches of practical astronomy as are necessary for the duties he may be called on to perform as a qualified surveyor.

He will be allowed to present himself at the next ensuing or subsequent examination for land surveyors for the purpose of obtaining the certificate of the Surveyors Board as to his qualifications.

REMUNERATION.

He will receive the following remuneration during the term of his pupilage:—1st year, £40; 2nd year, £52; 3rd year, £65; 4th year, £80.

SUBJECT TO REGULATIONS.

During the whole term of his pupilage and service in the Department he shall be subject to the Regulations for the Public Service of Victoria as far as they are applicable.

BONDS REQUIRED.

Each successful candidate for appointment as pupil surveyor and draughtsman will be required to find two approved sureties, who shall enter into bonds for £150 each for the faithful performance of his duties, and to provide for his remaining in the service of the Department for a further term of two years, if required, at a salary not less than £160 per annum.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR CRICKET GROUND AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES OF PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE CITY OF SOUTH MELBOURNE.

WE, the Honorable John Emanuel Mackey, M.P., James Macgregor Gillespie, Henry Colden Antill Harrison, Frederick Williams Heath, and Joseph Martin Reed, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land permanently reserved by Order in Council of the 26th November, 1888, as a site for Cricket Ground and for other purposes of public recreation in the City of South Melbourne, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit

the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act 1901* :—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be known as the Albert Reserve.

2. The Reserve shall be divided as follows :—

Division A.—The portion which is set apart for Cricket.

Division B.—The remaining portion which is set apart for Tennis.

Division A shall be subdivided as follows :—

1st Subdivision.—The Pavilion, Press Box, Scorers' Box and other buildings, and Members' and Ladies' Reserve.

2nd Subdivision.—The Grand Stand and enclosures.

3rd Subdivision.—The Playing Ground.

4th Subdivision.—The remainder of Division A.

Division B shall be subdivided as follows :—

1st Subdivision.—The Pavilion and enclosure.

2nd Subdivision.—The Grand Stands.

3rd Subdivision.—The Playing Grounds.

4th Subdivision.—The remainder of Division B.

3. Subject to the direction of the Committee of Management, Division A of the Reserve shall (except as hereinafter provided) be managed in accordance with these Regulations by the Committee for the time being of the Melbourne Cricket Club, and Division B of the Reserve by the Committee for the time being of the Lawn Tennis Association of Victoria. Provided nevertheless that Division A of the Reserve shall during the period in every year for which the Lawn Tennis Association of Victoria is entitled to or allowed the use thereof be controlled and managed by the Committee for the time being of the Lawn Tennis Association of Victoria.

4. Every person shall be admitted to the 4th Subdivisions of Divisions A and B respectively of the Reserve from sunrise to sunset free of charge except as hereinafter provided, but no person shall be entitled to be admitted thereto on Sundays.

5. Admission to any part of the 1st and 3rd Subdivisions of Division A during the period in every year for which the Lawn Tennis Association of Victoria is allowed the use thereof and to any part of the 1st and 3rd Subdivisions of Division B shall be restricted to the Committee of Management and to Members of the Lawn Tennis Association of Victoria and to such other persons as the Committee for the time being thereof may authorize.

6. Admission to any part of the 1st and 3rd Subdivisions of Division A of the Reserve shall be restricted to the Committee of Management and during the period in every year for which the Lawn Tennis Association of Victoria is not allowed the use of Division A to the Members of the Melbourne Cricket Club and to such other persons as the Committee for the time being thereof may authorize.

7. The Reserve shall not at any time be used for or applied to any purpose other than to practise and play cricket, football, tennis, and such other outdoor games as may be approved by the Committee of Management.

8. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

9. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve.

10. No fires shall be lighted in the Reserve without the permission in writing of the Committee for the time being of the Melbourne Cricket Club or of the Committee for the time being of the Lawn Tennis Association of Victoria in the divisions managed by them respectively.

11. No person shall climb or jump over the fences, structures abutting thereon, or gates, or stick bills thereon, or cut names on or in any way damage any of the buildings or other structures, gates, turnstiles, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, or leave or deposit any glass or rubbish or roll or throw stones therein.

12. No person shall put in the Reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or other animals except with the approval of the Committee of Management or as provided in Clause 13.

13. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord.

14. No person shall erect any dwelling, booth, or other structure in the Reserve without the consent in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.

15. No scheme of improvement or the erection, construction, or alteration of any buildings shall proceed until the plans thereof or such scheme (as the case may be) have been approved by the Committee of Management, which may at any time authorize any person to enter and inspect or to protect the buildings and improvements.

16. No person shall sell or offer for sale in Division A of the Reserve any article without the consent in writing of the Committee for the time being of the Melbourne Cricket Club or the Committee for the time being of the Lawn Tennis Association of Victoria (as the case may require) or in Division B of such Reserve without the like consent of the Committee for the time being of the Lawn Tennis Association of Victoria.

17. No person except workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for the plantation of young trees or shrubs.

18. Any person committing in the Reserve or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon any of the following offences shall be liable to be forthwith removed from the Reserve notwithstanding such person may have paid for or be in possession of a ticket of admission to the Reserve or any part thereof :—

(a) Being drunk, or using any profane, indecent, or abusive language.

(b) Assaulting any person, making use of any abusive, threatening, or insulting expressions, or behaving in an improper or riotous manner.

(c) Crossing or trespassing on the playing grounds during a cricket, football, or tennis match or other outdoor games, or during practice at cricket or tennis, or when crossing or trespassing upon the playing grounds would be injurious to them as a cricket ground or a tennis court.

(d) Being found in any part of the 1st Subdivision of Division A or the 1st Subdivision of Division B of the Reserve, and not producing on demand, or surrendering if required, to any gatekeeper or other person duly authorized to demand the production or surrender of tickets, a ticket duly authorizing the admission of such person to the place wherein he or she may be found.

(e) Obtaining admission to any part of the Reserve when not entitled to such admission under these Regulations.

19. Applications by other clubs or associations or individuals for the use of Division A of the Reserve shall be made to the Committee for the time being of the Melbourne Cricket Club, and no application for the use of Division A of the Reserve for any International, Interstate, or other cricket match or football match of public importance shall be refused without the approval, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and every such application shall be deemed to have been refused by the Committee of the club unless it be finally dealt with not later than one month after the receipt thereof by such Committee. Any club, association, or individuals that may be allowed as in this clause provided the use of Division A of the Reserve shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee for the time being of the Melbourne Cricket Club in reference to such Division, or by the Committee of Management in reference to the Reserve, or any portion thereof, and the buildings, erections, and enclosures for the time being thereon, and such use shall be subject to such terms and conditions as the Committee for the time being of the Melbourne Cricket Club or the Committee of Management may think fit to impose.

20. The maximum scale of fees which may be charged and collected for admission to the 2nd and 4th Subdivisions of Divisions A and B respectively of the Reserve shall be as follows :—

(a) For admission of every person to the 2nd Subdivision of Division A, such sum as the Committee of Management of the Reserve may from time to time determine, not exceeding s. d. 7 6

- (b) For admission of every person to the 4th Subdivision of Division A, such sum as the Committee of Management of the Reserve may from time to time determine, not exceeding ... 2 6
- (c) For admission of every person to the 2nd Subdivision of Division B, such sum as the Committee of Management of the Reserve may from time to time determine, not exceeding ... 7 6
- (d) For admission of every person to the 4th Subdivision of Division B, such sum as the Committee of Management of the Reserve may from time to time determine, not exceeding ... 2 6

21. Public betting in any part of the Reserve (including enclosures) shall not be permitted, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosure and the Reserve.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown Lands or any constable, does not desist from

s. d. so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.
