GIPPSLAND LAKES ENTRANCE.

WITH reference to General Notice to Mariners, dated 1st August, 1907, pages 116 and 117, regarding the Gippsland Lakes Entrance, mariners and others are hereby notified that owing to recent weather conditions the bar outside the entrance has shoaled to 9 feet depth at low water on the track usually adopted by steamers crossing the bar, viz., the Flagstaff in line with the Eastern Pier end. It is therefore now recommended that inward-bound vessels having over 9 feet draught cross the bar with the Flagstaff and Red Beacon on the Eastern Pier in line and then proceed as usual.

PUPIL SURVEYORS AND DRAUGHTSMEN,  
SURVEY BRANCH.

APPLICATIONS will be received, addressed to the Secretary for Lands, up to 1st July next, from candidates desirous of being appointed as Pupil Surveyors and Draughtsmen in connexion with this Department.

CONDITIONS.

An applicant for appointment must not be more than twenty years or less than sixteen years of age. He will be required to produce a medical certificate to the effect that he is of sound constitution, and not affected with any physical infirmity which would interfere with the proper exercise of his profession.

## QUALIFICATIONS.

He must have passed the Matriculation Examination (including Algebra, Euclid, and Arithmetic) in the Melbourne or other recognised University, or—

Passed such other recognised examination, or produce such certificates from the Education Department, or other authority, as will satisfy the Surveyor-General as to his competency in the three subjects named, and as to his general educational proficiency.

He shall also with such certificates submit a specimen of his plan drawing.

## COMPETITIVE EXAMINATION.

Having duly complied with the foregoing requirements, he will undergo a competitive examination in trigonometrical computation, plotting and plan drawing, when the competitors to whom shall be awarded a sufficient number of points by the Examiners will be recommended for appointment, subject to the regulations of the department as to probation.

## PROBATION.

Accepted candidates approved by the Minister shall enter the office as probationers for a period of one month without pay; and at the end of that time, if reported by the Surveyor-General to have displayed aptitude for the work, may be appointed as pupils, and will be subject to the General Regulations for the Public Service as far as they are applicable.

## TERM OF SERVICE.

The pupil's service in the Department shall be for a term of four years, the first two of which will be served in the office, where he will be engaged in drawing and computing. He will then (if thought necessary) be examined in trigonometry, including computation of areas and reduction of traverse surveys, also plotting from field book and plan drawing. If his progress up to this time be not deemed satisfactory, he will be liable to be dispensed with; but, if satisfactory, he will be placed under a departmental surveyor for two years for field practice.

Afterwards he will have the privilege of attending for two months at the Melbourne Observatory, where he will be instructed in such branches of practical astronomy as are necessary for the duties he may be called on to perform as a qualified surveyor.

He will be allowed to present himself at the next ensuing or subsequent examination for land surveyors for the purpose of obtaining the certificate of the Surveyors Board as to his qualifications.

## REMUNERATION.

He will receive the following remuneration during the term of his pupilage:—1st year, £40; 2nd year, £52; 3rd year, £65; 4th year, £80.

## SUBJECT TO REGULATIONS.

During the whole term of his pupilage and service in the Department he shall be subject to the Regulations for the Public Service of Victoria as far as they are applicable.

## BONDS REQUIRED.

Each successful candidate for appointment as pupil surveyor and draughtsman will be required to find two approved sureties, who shall enter into bonds for £150 each for the faithful performance of his duties, and to provide for his remaining in the service of the Department for a further term of two years, if required, at a salary not less than £160 per annum.

That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than one hundred females or more than one boy under the age of sixteen years for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said one hundred females and one boy under the age of sixteen years shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours beyond the ordinary working hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That every boy under the age of sixteen years and every female so employed shall receive not less than eight shillings per week for each week during which he or she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That every boy under the age of sixteen years and every female shall receive sixpence tea money each evening he or she works overtime.
4. That none of such females or boys shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

## THE BALLAARAT GENERAL CEMETERY.

**R**ULES and Regulations made by Trustees, 13th May, 1909, in pursuance of the *Cemeteries Act 1890*.

1. The Rules and Regulations numbered 1 to 32 shall be the Rules and Regulations of The Ballaarat General Cemetery, and after the publication hereof in the *Government Gazette* all rules and regulations and scales of fees heretofore made shall be rescinded.
2. The office of the Trust shall be open daily (Sundays, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted), from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.
3. No burial shall under any circumstances be permitted in the Cemetery until an application has been made, name, age, late place of residence, occupation, and probable cause of death of the deceased given at the office of the Trust, an order in the form Schedule A obtained, and the fees where not remitted paid.
4. The fees mentioned in the scale of fees shall be the fees payable under the Act, and shall be paid at time of making application for any order.
5. A burial right, Schedule C, shall give the holder and his representatives for ever the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right on obtaining the permission of the Trustees as hereafter mentioned to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.
6. A permit, Schedule D, will, on application of the holder of a burial right and deposit of a plan, design, or drawing of the proposed erection or a copy of the proposed inscription or epitaph thereon, be granted to construct a vault or grave, and to erect a monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection thereon if approved by the Trustees and subject to such terms and conditions as they may see fit to impose.
7. Any application for ground exceeding twelve feet in width shall be reserved for the special decision of the Trustees.
8. The Trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person having paid the fee for a private grave and requiring a grave or vault shall be permitted to construct same subject to the approval of the Trustees. Every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron securely cemented.
9. Any tomb, monument, or material requiring to be removed on re-opening a grave or vault must be removed and re-erected or replaced by the owner.

10. No person other than the owner or his agent duly authorized in writing shall be permitted to interfere in any way whatever with a grave or enclosure unless by special direction of the Trustees.

11. Every grave, vault, tombstone, or other erection shall be maintained and kept in repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owner.

12. Any grave may on approval of the Trustees be converted into a private grave on payment of the fees or balance of fees provided for herein.

13. Every grave shall be six feet six inches deep for an adult's body, and not more than two adults unless the grave be of greater depth or of extra width shall be interred in each; two infants being considered equal to an adult.

14. Notice of any burial shall be given at the Cemetery eight working hours prior to the time fixed for the burial.

15. Before a private grave shall be re-opened the consent in writing of the person entitled to give the same shall be given.

16. No order for burial shall be issued until there has been deposited at the Trust Office a certificate from a Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths, and, in case of re-interment on removal from another cemetery, verified copies of such certificate and of the licence of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf and on payment of the usual fees.

17. The hours for burial, unless by special permission of the Trustees, shall be on week days Ten a.m. to Five p.m.; on Sundays, from Eight to Ten a.m., or from Two to Five p.m.

No interment shall be allowed on Sunday except when it is certified in writing by the Officer of Health for the district, or by a Police Magistrate, that for sanitary reasons it is necessary that the burial take place on that day.

18. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time when the funeral is to be at the Cemetery, and the same shall be punctually observed.

19. Hearses and mourning carriages only are allowed within the Cemetery, and the drivers are to observe such directions of the Trustees, their officers and servants, as may be found necessary from time to time for the regulating of the traffic.

20. Every coffin shall have on the lid a lead plate with the distinguishing number of the *Order for burial* stamped thereon.

21. No catacomb or wooden erection shall be allowed within the Cemetery.

22. No tree or shrub shall be planted in any portion of the Cemetery except as approved by the Trustees.

23. Licensed exhumations shall be made between the hours of Six and Eight a.m., and in all cases of exhumation the Trustees may when necessary impose special conditions, any non-compliance therewith being a breach of these Rules.

24. An additional fee according to the circumstances of the case shall be paid for any exhumation or sinking involving extra labour.

25. No smoking shall be allowed, nor any firearms discharged within the Cemetery.

26. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the Cemetery unless by authority of the Trustees first had and obtained.

27. No dogs shall be allowed within the Cemetery.

28. The Cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from sunrise to sunset daily throughout the year; but the Trustees shall have the right by themselves, their officers and servants, to remove from the Cemetery all persons misconducting themselves or violating the rules of propriety or decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any erection or tree, shrub, flower, or border, or otherwise infringing the Act 201 or any Act made or to be made amending the same.

29. No person employed by the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the Cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or special authority from the Trustees.

30. Any workman employed in the Cemetery though not in the employment of the Trustees shall be required to comply with such general directions of the Trustees or their Secretary as may be necessary for the control and good order of the Cemetery.

31. Sculptors, stone masons, and others desirous of erecting tombstones, monuments, tablets, or railings, or of constructing vaults or of placing inscriptions and epitaphs shall obtain licences in the form of Schedule E from the Trustees.

32. All material required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the Cemetery. Stones, refuse, and rubbish remaining after the work is completed shall be removed at once by the person employed on the work.

REGULATIONS AUTHORIZING INSPECTORS TO CHARGE FEES AND EXPENSES FOR FUMIGATION OR TREATMENT OF NURSERY STOCK, TREES, PLANTS, VEGETABLES, AND PACKAGES OR CASES CONTAINING OR INTENDED TO CONTAIN SAME.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Vegetation Diseases Act 1906* to make Regulations authorizing and requiring Inspectors to charge fees and expenses in regard to certain matters, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth order as follows:—

1. The fees and expenses authorized and required to be charged by Inspectors under the provisions of section 8 of the *Vegetation Diseases Act 1906* shall be as follows:—

For fumigating fruit—

For each case or package not exceeding 1 Imperial bushel in capacity—1d.

For each case or package exceeding 1 Imperial bushel in capacity—2d.

For fumigating or otherwise treating nursery stock, trees, plants, cuttings, or bulbs—

For each package 1 cwt. or under—2s.

For each package over 1 cwt. and not exceeding 2 cwt.—3s.

For each package over 2 cwt. and not exceeding 3 cwt.—4s.

For each package exceeding 3 cwt.—4s., plus 1s. for each additional cwt. or part thereof over 3 cwt.

For fumigating grain, for packages not exceeding 1 Imperial bushel in capacity—

For quantities not exceeding 100 packages—3d. for every ten packages or part thereof.

For over 100 packages but not exceeding 500—2d. for every ten packages or part thereof.

For over 500 packages—1½d. for every ten packages or part thereof.

For packages exceeding 1 bushel in capacity—

For quantities not exceeding 100 packages—6d. for every ten packages or part thereof.

For over 100 packages but not exceeding 500—4d. for every ten packages or part thereof.

For over 500 packages—3d. for every ten packages or part thereof.

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in these Regulations, a minimum charge of 2s. shall be made for the fumigation of such packages.

For dipping or treating cases or other packages containing, or intended to contain, nursery stock, trees, plants, vegetables, or fruit—

For each case or package not exceeding 1 bushel in capacity—½d.

For each case or package exceeding 1 bushel in capacity—1d.

For each sack or bag of any capacity—½d.

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in these Regulations, a minimum charge of 2s. 6d. shall be made for the dipping or treatment of such sacks, bags, or other packages.

When such fruits, nursery stock, trees, plants, cuttings, bulbs, or grain, and such cases, sacks, bags, or other coverings have been fumigated or otherwise treated as aforesaid, the fees and expenses chargeable for same shall be paid by the owner, consignee, or agent, to the Inspector on demand.

And the Honorable George Graham, His Majesty's Minister of Agriculture for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATIONS PROVIDING FOR THE FUMIGATION AND TREATMENT OF NURSERY STOCK, TREES, PLANTS, AND VEGETABLES.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Vegetation Diseases Act 1896* to make Regulations among others for the purpose of regulating the importation, introduction, or bringing into Victoria of any tree, plant, or vegetable likely, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, to spread any disease or insect, and for prescribing penalties for the breach of any Regulations so made, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth order as follows :—

GENERAL.

1. The Regulations of the 20th day of June, 1905, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 28th day of June, 1905, shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

INTERPRETATION.

For the purpose of these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the subject-matter or context, "Fumigating Depot" means any place approved by the Inspector under the *Vegetation Diseases Act* for the fumigation or other treatment of nursery stock, trees, plants, and vegetables, and the wrappings, packages, or coverings containing the same.

REGULATIONS.

1. Upon arrival of any nursery stock, trees, plants, or vegetables, the Inspector under the *Vegetation Diseases Act*, after examination of such nursery stock, trees, plants, or vegetables may, if satisfied that the law has been otherwise complied with, and if he deem necessary, order that such nursery stock, trees, plants, or vegetables, and any wrappings, packages, or coverings containing the same be removed under his own supervision, or that of any other Inspector under the *Vegetation Diseases Act*, to the Fumigating Depot, and there treated in such manner as is hereinafter prescribed by and to the satisfaction of the Inspector.

2. All nursery stock, trees, plants, or vegetables upon arrival at the Fumigating Depot shall, together with all wrappings, packages, or coverings, be fumigated or otherwise treated or destroyed under the supervision of an Inspector under the *Vegetation Diseases Act* in such a manner as the Inspector may deem necessary for the effectual eradication of any insect or fungus disease which may be upon such nursery stock, trees, plants, or vegetables, or which may be contained in or upon such wrappings, packages, or coverings.

3. Prior to such fumigation or treatment as aforesaid, all wrappings, packages, or coverings, and all loose soil shall, if the Inspector deem necessary, be removed from all nursery stock, trees, plants, and vegetables, and shall be fumigated or otherwise treated in such manner and with such material of such formula as the Inspector may direct.

And the Honorable George Graham, His Majesty's Minister of Agriculture for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

For each package 1 cwt. or under—1s. 6d.

For each package over 1 cwt. and not exceeding 2 cwt.—2s. 6d.

For each package over 2 cwt. and not exceeding 3 cwt.—3s. 6d.

For each package exceeding 3 cwt.—3s. 6d., plus 1s.

For each additional cwt. or part thereof over 3 cwt.

4. Such fees and expenses shall be paid by the owner or the person in possession to the Inspector.

Where a Homestead allotment and a Mallee Farm allotment form one holding, improvements must be effected on the Homestead allotment, as follows:—

To the value of not less than £50 each year, before the end of the second and third years, from the date of the lease.

That substantial and permanent improvements shall be made on the land, if in the first class, to the value of 3s. 4d. per acre before the end of the second year from the date of the licence, another 3s. 4d. per acre before the end of each year of the third and fourth years, and the balance of 10s. per acre before the end of the sixth year of the licence.
