Pure Food Act 1905 .- Health Acts. FURTHER REGULATIONS AS TO BEVERAGES AND EXEMPTIONS.

THE Board of Public Health of the State of Victoria, by virtue of the powers conferred by the Health Acts and of every other power enabling the said Board in this behalf, doth, on the recommendation of the Food Standards Committee, hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

- (1) Notwithstanding anything contained in clause 13 of the Regulations made on the 12th October, 1906-

  - (a) It shall not be necessary for Ginger Cordial, Peppermint Cordial, Clove Cordial, or cordials of a like nature to contain sugar;
    (b) Fruit juice beverages (such as Lime Juice, Lemon Juice, Lemon Squash, Orange Juice) made without sugar or with less than 35 per cent. of sugar may contain salicylic acid or sulphurous acid (the latter calculated as sulphur dioxide (SO<sub>2</sub>)) in a proportion not exceeding 16 grains to the gallon.

(2) Exemption under section 15, Pure Food Act.—
Packages of Cod-bricks shall be exempt from such of the provisions of section 15 of the Pure Food Act 1905 as require information, by an accompanying or attached label, tag, or statement as to the weight or number or measure or volume of the contents.

Any person who is guilty of an offence against the Pure Food Act 1905 is liable, on conviction, to the penalty prescribed therein.

These Regulations shall take effect from the 31st day of December, 1908.

# HAMILTON PUBLIC CEMETERY.-RULES AND REGULATIONS.

In pursuance of the powers vested in them, the Trustees for Hamilton Public Cemetery rescind the Rules and Regulations published in the Government Gazette of the 18th day of December, 1861, and make the following Rules and Regulations, that is to say:—

Regulations published in the Government Gazette of the 18th day of December, 1861, and make the following Rules and Regulations, that is to say:—

1. Before any interment shall take place, application for permission shall be made to the Secretary, a reasonable time previously, when an order, in the form, or to the effect set out in the annexed Schedule B, will be given to the applicant, upon payment of the charges set out in the scale of fees.

2. That all fees and charges payable shall be paid when applications are made or orders given.

3. The charges may be remitted for the burial of any person, on a certificate of a minister of religion, or other sufficient evidence, that the relatives or friends of such person are unable to pay the costs and charges.

4. Permission to have a private burial-place may be granted at the office of the Secretary, in the form and to the effect set forth in Schedule C, and upon payment of the fees prescribed.

5. That all applications for interment shall be made at the Secretary's office, at least eight working hours prior to the time fixed for the burial, otherwise an extra charge shall be made. No free interment shall be allowed unless application therefor be made at least eight working hours prior to the time fixed for same.

6. The usual hours of interment for week days shall be from eight am. to five p.m., throughout the year, unless by special permission of the Trustees.

7. No interment shall be allowed on Sunday except when it is certified in writing by an Officer of Health or by a Police Magistrate, that for sanitary reasons it is necessary that the burial take place on that day.

8. That the Trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person wanting a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same under directions of the Secretary, on payment of the required fees, and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, and be air and water tight.

9. That every coffin shall have on the

That every grave shall be at least five feet six inches (5 ft. 6 in.) deep for one interment, and at least seven feet (7 feet) for two interments, and no coffin shall be interred within four feet (4 feet) of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve (12) years of age, when it shall not be less than three (3) feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least one foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in same grave, and in the case of a tomb or vault a layer of earth at least one foot thick shall be left above and around the uppermost coffin.

11. That no burial shall be permitted to take place in said Cemetery without a Certificate from the Deputy Registrar of Deaths, or Coroner. Such Certificate shall be delivered to the Secretary or to gatekeeper before the funeral enters the Cemetery. No interment shall be permitted in a private grave or vault without the production 10. That every grave shall be at least five feet six inches

of the Certificate of Right of Burial, or other satisfactory evidence, and, if required, a statutory declaration shall be made that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so.

is entitled to do so.

12. That the time fixed for any burial shall be the time when the funeral is to be at the Cemetery, and the same shall be punctually observed.

13. That every funeral shall enter by the principal entrance, and no vehicle except the hearse and mourning coaches shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery or to stand opposite the entrance gates except by authority of Trustees having been first obtained. Horses shall not be allowed to proceed faster than at a walking pace within the Cemetery. the Cemetery.

14. That every grave, vault, tomb, monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection shall be maintained and kept in thorough repair and proper condition by or at the expense of owner. Should the owner's residence not be known or be out of the State, the Trustees to have power to do the work and keep an account against the owner.

15. That any person desiring to construct, add to, alter, or amend a brick grave, vault, or tomb, or to erect, add to, or amend a monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other construction or erection in any part of the Cemetery, shall apply in writing to the Trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit in writing a statement, plan, design, or drawing of the same, with full particulars, and shall obtain such permission in writing before proceeding with the work.

16. That all materials required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the Cemetery, and shall be admitted only at the side entrances, and no vehicle conveying any such materials or soil shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery during wet or unfavorable weather.

17. That no wooden erection shall be allowed.

18. That every person prior to placing any inscription, epitaph, or other writing or drawing in any part of the Cemetery shall apply in writing to the Trustees and submit a copy thereof to the Trustees, and shall obtain their written permission for the same.

19. That every erection shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations (extending to the bottom of the grave when ordered). All stones, refuse, and rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be removed from the Cemetery at once at the expense of the person causing the same.

20. That, unless otherwise ordered, the principal 15. That any person desiring to construct, add to, alter

from the Cemetery at once at the expense of the principal 20. That, unless otherwise ordered, the principal 20. That, unless otherwise ordered, the principal entrance shall be open daily from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. from 1st October to 31st March, and from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. from 1st April to 30th September.

21. That no child under ten years shall be admitted into the Cemetery, except in charge of a responsible

into the Cemetery, except in charge of a responsible person.

22. That no smoking shall be allowed within the Cemetery, nor shall any fireworks be discharged therein.

23. That no dogs shall be admitted into the Cemetery.

24. That no person employed under the Trustees shall, without their consent, be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever in discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the Cemetery other than that for which he receives payment from the Trustees.

25. That any workman not employed by the Trustees shall be under the supervision and control of the Trustees or person authorized by them, who shall have power to regulate his hours of labour, to see that his work is completed satisfactorily and with despatch, and to remove him summarily from the Cemetery upon any cause of offence.

26. That no person in the Cemetery or its approaches 26. That no person in the Cemetery or its approaches shall commit any nuisance, or trespass, or be guilty of any breach of decorum, or cut, pluck, gather, or take out of the Cemetery any flower, plant, shrub, or tree, or any part thereof, or do any injury whatsoever thereto, or to any grass plot, border railing, fence, or any other erection or road therein, or remove or interfere in any way with anything laid, built, or placed on or in any grave or burving place.

with anything laid, built, or placed on or in any grave or burying place.

27. That no person shall promote, or advertise, or carry on within the Cemetery, or its approaches, any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars or cards or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever.

28. That the Secretary shall, subject to the Trustees, exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the Cemetery, and to the carrying out and enforcement of these Rules, and subject to the provisions of the Cemeteries Act, the direction of such person shall in all such matters, and for all purposes, be presumed to be and to have been the direction of the Trustees.

29. That any person committing any breach of any of these Rules or Regulations, or of any other Rules. Regulations, or By-laws, lawfully made under the authority of any Act relating to Cemeteries, shall be thereupon forthwith removable from the Cemetery by the Trustees,

Secretary, or Sexton, and shall be treated as a trespasser, and may be proceeded against accordingly in addition to any other proceedings or penalties to which such person may be subject.

30. The Trustees reserve to themselves the power to decorate graves from time to time, when desired by the owners so to do, and when the owners do not desire the Trustees to carry out such work, they may either do it themselves or employ any person licensed by the Trustees to do such necessary work, but no trees or shrubs shall be planted on any grave without the permission of the Trustees. #### SHIRE OF SWAN HILL.

#### By-Law No. 26.

A By-Law of the Shire of Swan Hill made under section 107 of the Local Government Act 1903, for the enforcement of certain penalties in the case of wandering cattle and for other purposes.

I N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1903, the President and Councillors of the Shire of Swan Hill order as follows:—.

1. If any cattle are found without any person having charge of them-

(a) In any street, or
(b) Upon any land (not being a common) which is not enclosed or fenced with some sufficient fence within the meaning of the Fences Act 1890, or any amendment thereof, and the openings (if any) in which fence are not secured and barred with gates or other fastenings of equivalent closeness and strength with the fence,

the proper officer of the Council may seize such cattle and impound them or place them at some neighbouring place of custody.

2. The owner of such cattle shall forfeit and pay a penalty of a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings for every head of such cattle, and any justice, if such owner be not known, upon proof of the issue of a summons in the usual form addressed to such owner as "owner" only without otherwise naming or describing him, such cattle and the p'ace of seizure being duly described therein, and of the publication of such summons in some newspaper commonly circulating in the neighbourhood, may after the expiration of twenty-four hours from such publication proceed with respect to such owner not appearing as if personal service of a summons stating his name had been effected, or if such owner appear then as in other cases, and the justice may order the cattle to be sold and the money arising from the sale, after deducting the said penalty and the costs awarded and the reasonable expenses, to be estimated and assessed by the justice, of seizing, keeping, and selling the said cattle, shall be paid if demanded within one month to the owner of the cattle, and if not so demanded then to the municipal fund; and if the said money is not sufficient for all the purposes aforesaid the amount whereby the same falls short, or if no such sale be ordered, the whole of the said amount may be recovered from the said owner if and when known in like manner as other penalties and sums adjudged or ordered to be paid by justices are to be recovered.

3. It shall not be lawful to break in any horse or other 3. It shall not be lawful to break in any horse or other animal in any street whether public or private or in any public place save such public places as from time to time may be appointed by some regulation of the Council in that behalf, which regulation the Council are hereby authorized to make, or by locking the wheels of any cart or other vehicle or otherwise to test or try any horse or other animal so as to obstruct or injure any street or public place; and any person offending against this section shall forfeit and pay a penalty of a sum not exceeding Five pounds.
