ACT OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the State of Victoria, and Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the said State and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of the said State, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Two hundred and eighteen thousand nine hundred and forty-eight pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and eight and One thousand nine hundred and nine."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria, at Melbourne, this twenty-eighth day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and nine, and in the ninth year of His Majesty's reign.

UNIVERSITY PRACTISING SCHOOL.

Applicants must be graduates of a University, and must furnish satisfactory evidence of capacity for the work of a secondary school and of the study of modern methods of teaching subjects usually included in the curriculum of a secondary school, and, in the case of the Principal, of the study of methods of organizing a secondary school. Evidence of ability to lecture to students and to supervise the practical training of students for the Diploma of Education in the University of Melbourne must also be furnished.

The subjects to be taught are—(1) Latin and Greek, (2) French and German, (3) English and History, (4) Mathematics, (5) Elementary Science (Physics and Chemistry), Geography; but it is not implied that the subjects of any one group shall necessarily be taught by the same teacher. Applicants should therefore name those subjects which they are best qualified to teach.

Applicants must state the date of their birth.

In addition to the salaries set forth, teachers in the Practising School may, if their qualifications are deemed satisfactory, be appointed Masters or Mistresses of Method by the University at an additional salary in the case of the Principal of £50, and in the case of the Assistants of £30. In this capacity they would be required to supervise and report upon the practical training of students for the Diploma of Education who are attending the Practising School and to deliver such short courses of lectures on the method of teaching special subjects as may be determined by the Faculty of Arts. The tenure of Masters and Mistresses of Method will be an annual one.

PROTECTION OF NATIVE GAME OF ALL KINDS IN A CERTAIN AREA IN THE PARISH OF NEPEAN.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the State of Victoria, and Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the said State and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I THE Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of section 14 of the *Game Act 1896* (60 Vict. No. 1463), do by this my Proclamation direct that the area hereunder described shall be a locality in which from the first day of January to the thirty-first day of December (both days inclusive) in each year it shall be unlawful for any person to kill or destroy any native game set forth in the Third Schedule to the *Game Act 1896*.

Area above referred to:—

Comprising one thousand four hundred acres, more or less, in the county of Mornington, parish of Nepean, formerly known as the Sanatorium reserve, and now utilized for Defence, Quarantine, and other purposes: Commencing at the north-west angle of allotment 151; bounded thence by a line bearing N. 80 deg. 52 min. W. three chains fifty links, more or less, to a fence; thence by that fence bearing north about 14 deg. 30 min. E. twenty chains seventy-five links, more or less, to Port Phillip Bay; thence by that Bay and Bass Straits bearing westerly, southerly, south-easterly to a point bearing S. 6 deg. W. from the south-west angle of allotment 152; and thence by a line and the western boundaries of allotments 152 and 151 bearing N. 6 deg. E. eighty-three chains, more or less, to the point of commencement. The bearings are from the true meridian.

REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE HEATHCOTE UNITED TOWN AND GOLD-FIELDS COMMON.

IN pursuance of the Regulations made by the Governor in Council, on the 8th of January, 1902, the Council of the Shire of McIvor, as managers of the Heathcote Common, having drafted the following Regulations for the management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Lands and Works and approval by the Governor in Council in lieu of the Regulations heretofore in force in respect of such Common:—

REGULATIONS.

1. In these Regulations the words "large cattle" shall mean any cows, heifers, oxen, steers, horses, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, and mules, and the words "small cattle" shall mean sheep and goats.

2. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licences, or carriers' licences, and farmers residing within five miles from the Common may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on the Common one additional head of large cattle or the equivalent in small cattle for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

3. The fees for depasturing stock on the Common shall in all cases be paid to the herdsman at the time of registration or branding, and shall be as follow:—For every horse, Eight shillings per annum; for every head of other large cattle, Four shillings per annum; for every goat, Two shillings per annum; for every head of other small cattle, Two shillings and sixpence per annum; for every horse depastured on the Common for not more than two days in each week, Five shillings per annum.

4. In the event of stock duly registered to depasture on the Common being impounded, the Herdsman shall, as soon as he is aware thereof, notify the owners of such stock.

5. The Pounds to which the foregoing Regulation shall apply are the Heathcote Pound and the Tooborac Pound.

6. No person shall remove registered stock from the Common without the consent, in writing, of the managers or the herdsman.

7. No bull or entire horse shall be allowed to depasture on the Common without the permission of the managers.

8. The managers of the Common shall appoint certain times and places for registering and branding stock, and shall give due notice thereof, and the managers or herdsman shall attend at such times and places for the purposes aforesaid. All persons desirous of depasturing stock upon the Common shall be in attendance therewith at the times and places appointed for the purposes of giving a full and correct description of such stock and assisting to brand the same, and shall pay the prescribed fees for such stock before the same are registered and branded with the Common brand.

9. Whenever the managers have reason to believe that any animal on the Common is affected with any contagious disease, the owner of such animal shall within six (6) hours after receiving notice, in writing, to that effect from the managers or herdsman remove such animal from the Common, and in case of neglect or refusal to so remove such animal, the managers shall be at liberty to order its immediate destruction and burial (if necessary) at the expense of the owner thereof; and the managers shall be at liberty to refuse registration of any other stock of such owner until he shall have paid the expenses. No compensation shall be allowed for the destruction of any diseased animal.

10. No dead animal shall be allowed to remain on the Common, and if a carcase be not removed after six (6) hours' notice has been given to the owner thereof, the managers shall be at liberty to cause such carcase to be removed and buried (if necessary) at the expense of the owner thereof, and to refuse the registration of any other stock of such owner until the expenses so incurred has been paid.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.
