## REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS, VICTORIA.

1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the *Government Gazette*.

(b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

## PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, including English, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have taken the degree of Bachelor in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys :—

*Form of Certificate for presentation to the Board of Examiners.*

I, A.B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C.D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as , in the practice of land surveying, for the period of , viz., from to , or has served under articles or other similar agreement for a period of four years (three of which have been in the field), and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys.

[Here describe the survey work on which C.D. was engaged.]

NOTE.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Regulations.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature or an irregular road.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

9. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

## SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects :—

*Mathematics.*

(a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

*Computation.*

- (b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

*Principles and Practice of Surveying.*

- (c) Detail of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, and underground surveying, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting by co-ordinates and from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Act, writing descriptions of boundaries.

(Candidates may be required to effect surveys under supervision.)

*Engineering Surveys.*

- (d) Levelling and contouring; grading; setting-out, and measurement of earthworks, including practical tests.

*Use of instruments.*

- (e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, tachometer, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer, and steel band.

*Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.*

- (f) Determination (including practical tests) of time, latitude, and azimuth; the use of ephemerides; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.

*Drawing.*

- (g) Plan-drawing, drawing of sections and contours, compilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

*Miscellaneous.*

- (h) Elementary physics, elementary geology, elementary forestry.

[The scope of the examination in elementary physics will be that covered by "Balfour Stewart's Elementary Physics," Fourth Edition, omitting chapters 8, 10, and 11, and the scope of the examination in elementary geology will be that covered by "Geikie's Class-book of Geology," Fourth Edition.]

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having passed the matriculation or senior examination at a University, or of having completed a course of the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers. Candidates holding diplomas from recognised public technical schools may be exempted from working out papers in physics and geology, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

*CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.*

12. A candidate qualifying and passing the examination held under those regulations shall be entitled to a certificate that he is qualified for the position of a land surveyor in Victoria.

13. A surveyor applying to the Board for a certificate of competency without examination on the grounds of his holding a licence and certificate entitling him to practise in any of the other Australian States or in the Dominion of New Zealand, shall produce such licence and certificate of competency from the Board of the State or Dominion in which he is licensed or authorized to survey, together with satisfactory evidence as to character; provided that, should such certificate have been issued upon examination held prior to September, 1895, he shall further produce a written recommendation or a certificate, dated not more than twelve months previously, from such Board; provided also, that any surveyor prevented by absence from the State or Dominion in which he obtained his licence and certificate from obtaining the recommendation of the Board of that State or Dominion, shall be entitled to a certificate on passing such examination under these regulations as the Board may require. Each application shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

14. The Board may grant a certificate of competency or a letter of recommendation to any surveyor holding a Victorian certificate dated prior to September, 1895, and desiring to be registered in another State or the Dominion of New Zealand, either without examination or on such *prima facie* examination as in the opinion of the Board may be necessary. Application for such certificate shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

*REGISTRATION OF ARTICLES OF APPRENTICESHIP.*

15. Articles of indenture or other similar agreement for the tuition of surveying by a qualified surveyor under which apprentices or pupils are serving at the date upon which these Regulations shall commence and take effect, shall be forwarded to the secretary for registration within six months of such date. And all such articles or agreements made thereafter shall be forwarded to the secretary for registration within three months of the date of commencement of service thereunder. Applications for registration may be accompanied by evidence of the

apprentice or pupil having passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination in English, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto. Transfers of articles or agreements shall be registered within three months of such transfers.

16. On and after March, 1913 (except as hereinafter provided), no candidate shall be eligible for examination unless he shall have passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause; provided that, subject to his passing a special examination prescribed by the Board which shall include English, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, a candidate who has not passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause may be admitted to examination if—

- (a) His articles of apprenticeship or other similar agreement were executed prior to the date upon which these Regulations shall commence and take effect; or  
(b) He failed at an examination held prior to March, 1913; or  
(c) He produces certificates of six years' satisfactory field service.

*LICENCES TO SURVEY.*

17. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 1s.), the declaration as prescribed by the *Land Surveyors Act 1895*, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF MR. L. SLUTZKIN, 104-6 FLINDERS-LANE, MELBOURNE,

for a period of eight weeks from the 2nd August, 1910, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than eighty females or more than three boys under the age of sixteen years for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said eighty females and three boys under the age of sixteen years shall not be employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours beyond the ordinary working hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That every boy under the age of sixteen years and every female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which he or she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That every boy under the age of sixteen years and every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening he or she works overtime.
4. That none of such females or boys shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

4. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate.

## TRAMWAYS IN THE SHIRE OF ALEXANDRA.

*At an Executive Council held at the Law Courts,  
Melbourne, the fifth day of August, 1910.*

### PRESENT:

His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for  
His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.

Mr. Murray | Mr. Graham.

WHEREAS by the *Tramways Act* 1890, it is provided that tramways may be constructed in any municipal district (except the Municipal Districts of Fitzroy, Collingwood, Prahran, Richmond, South Melbourne, Hotham, St. Kilda, Brunswick, Kew, Hawthorn, and Sandridge) when authorized by an Order in Council made in that behalf, upon the application of the Council of the Municipality, in compliance with the provisions of the said Act and of the Rules and Regulations to be from time to time made by the Governor in Council: And whereas the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Alexandra has made an application under the common seal of the said municipality in accordance with the said Act and of the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder for an Order by the Governor in Council authorizing the construction of a Tramway in the municipal district of the municipality of the said Shire of Alexandra:

And whereas the Governor in Council, being satisfied that the requirements of the said Act and of the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder have been duly complied with by the said Council of the said municipality, and that notice of the intention of the said Council to make the said application, in which notice the routes proposed to be followed are described, and persons objecting to the same were called on to lodge their objections within the time required by the Regulations, has been duly published as required by the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council in pursuance of the said Act in that behalf, and being satisfied also that it is expedient and proper that the said application should be granted, has determined to grant the same, subject to the restrictions and conditions hereinafter contained: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor in Council, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, doth for the purpose aforesaid make the Order following (that is to say):—

That the Shire of Alexandra shall be and is hereby authorized to construct a Tramway in the municipal district of the Shire of Alexandra.

### ROUTE.

Commencing at a point in allotment 27D, parish of Alexandra, county of Anglesey, said point being two chains westerly from south-east corner of land acquired for Alexandra Railway Station; thence easterly by a one chain road through subdivision of allotment 27D and south by the one chain road on east of allotment 27D to the south-west corner of allotment 25A; thence easterly by three chain road to north-east corner of allotment 24A; thence southerly by present one chain road and a one chain road to be acquired through allotments 22, 21, 19A, 20B, and allotment A to the main road from Alexandra to Thornton; thence easterly along said Alexandra to Thornton road one and a half to three chains wide through parishes of Eildon and Thornton to most easterly corner of allotment 34A, parish of Thornton; thence southerly by road one and a half and two chains wide to the north-west corner of allotment 5, section 8, parish of Taggerty; thence easterly by present one chain road and a new one chain road to be acquired through allotments 1, 9, 15, 11, 24, 13, and 14, section 8, to the terminus on east side of road between allotments 14 and 21, section 8, parish of Taggerty. Tramway to cross Goulburn and Rubicon Rivers on the present bridges.

### GAUGE.

That the gauge of such tramway shall be two (2) feet, and that the said tramway shall be constructed in the manner set out and described in the working plans numbered from 1 to 8 inclusive, now deposited in the Public Works Department, and which plans are indorsed with a memorandum of the Minister of Public Works identifying the said plans so deposited as the plans referred to in this Order, and which plans are to be deemed to be incorporated in this Order, and to be deemed as much part of the same as if they were set out in detail in this Order.

### MOTIVE POWER.

That the motive power shall be steam or electricity, and that the Council may use horses for the first three (3) months from the date of commencement of running trucks on the said tramway, and at any reasonable time during a breakdown of the motive power, but such time shall not exceed six months.

## MAXIMUM SPEED.

That the maximum speed of the progression of the cars upon the said tramway shall be fifteen (15) miles in the hour.

## TIME OF COMPLETION.

That the approximate time required to construct the tramway is twelve months from the date of the approval of the Order authorizing the construction of the tramway.

## NATURE OF TRAFFIC.

That such tramway shall be used for the carriage of timber, goods, and produce.

## NECESSARY PRECAUTIONS FOR THE SAFETY OF THE PUBLIC TO BE OBSERVED.

That every precaution necessary to secure the safety of passengers passing along the roads upon the route of such tramway shall be taken and ordered by the said Council of the Shire of Alexandra, and that a siding with a steep inverted grade and stop block shall be formed by the Council at a convenient place near the 11 mile, where a train having got beyond control would be automatically shunted, and brought to a standstill.

## TOLLS AND CHARGES.

That the rates to be charged upon the said tramway for the carriage of timber, goods, and produce are as follows:—

For any timber—not more than 5d. per ton per mile.  
For all goods and produce—6d. per ton per mile.  
Consignments of less than one ton and more than 5½ cwt. shall be charged as a ton, and mileage less than 6 miles as 6 miles.

Which minima shall apply to all timber, goods, and produce other than, as follow:—

## CONDITIONS AS REQUIRED BY THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS.

That in event of a railway being constructed hereafter by the Victorian Railways Commissioners, the Council shall, at their own expense, remove such portions of the tramway to be constructed under this Order as may be considered necessary, upon receiving six (6) months' notice to that effect from the Board of Land and Works or the Victorian Railways Commissioners.

## GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL TO BE SOLE JUDGE OF BREACH OF ORDER.

That the Governor in Council shall be sole judge of the compliance with, or of the breach of, any of the requirements contained in this Order, and for the purpose of enabling the Governor in Council to arrive at a just decision, an inquiry into the facts of each case shall be conducted in the manner provided in clause 25 of the Regulations contained in the Second Schedule of the said Act, before an officer to be appointed in that behalf by the Governor in Council, as provided in the Regulations in the said Schedule.

If, upon the report to the Governor in Council by the referee made under the said clause 25 of the Regulations in the Second Schedule of the said Act, the Governor in Council shall, as sole judge, determine that there has been any failure of or compliance with, or that any breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order has occurred, by way either of commission or omission, then the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall cease and determine, or shall be suspended, as the Governor in Council shall direct, and in the case of the Governor in Council ordering a suspension only of such powers, then the Governor in Council shall in his adjudication state for what period such suspension shall take effect.

If in such adjudication the Governor in Council shall determine that the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall wholly cease and determine, then the Council of the said municipality of the Shire of Alexandra shall forthwith proceed to restore the road along which the said route is laid out to its condition previous to the construction of such tramway, unless the Governor in Council otherwise order.

That in the event of the Council of the said municipality finding it necessary to provide work of a more substantial

## PROHIBITION OF TRANSFER OF POTATOES FROM CERTAIN PORTIONS OF VICTORIA INTO ANY OTHER PORTION.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the State of Victoria, and Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the said State and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 3, sub-section 2, of the *Vegetation Diseases Act 1896* (59 Vict. No. 1432), the Governor in Council, by proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, may either absolutely or subject to any regulations prohibit the bringing into any portion of Victoria from any other portion of Victoria specified in such proclamation of any tree, plant, or vegetable which is in the opinion of the Governor in Council likely to spread any disease or insect in Victoria, and may at any time alter or revoke any such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my proclamation order "that except subject to regulations which the Governor in Council may make, on and after the date of this Proclamation no potatoes shall be brought from those portions of Victoria contained within the boundaries of the Parishes of Barwon Downs and Yaugher, in the County of Polwarth, to any other portion of Victoria."

9. That where improvements are authorized under section 189 of the *Land Act* 1901 the licensee shall notify, on completion, that such improvements have been made, otherwise the work will not be recognised.

1. The children's playground shall be opened daily from 9.30 a.m. till sunset, except on Sundays and such other days as may from time to time be specially indicated by the Council.

2. Any person found within the children's playground except during such hours it is open to the public shall be guilty of a breach of this By-law.

3. Although the children's playground is provided for the use of children only, parents and attendants shall be at liberty to be present to watch over them.

4. No person above the age of twelve (12) years shall be allowed to use any of the swings or other appliances erected in the children's playground. Such swings or other appliances shall not be used by the same child or children for a longer period than five (5) minutes at any one time if any other children are waiting to use them.

5. No children shall use any of the swings or other appliances in the children's playground except in the ordinary way.

6. No cricket or football shall be played in the children's playground.

7. All paper, fruit, peel, or other litter shall be placed in the bins provided by the Council for the purpose.

8. All persons in the children's playground shall obey the directions of any Council employé in charge thereof.

9. The Council shall not be responsible for any accident arising from the use of any of the swings or other appliances in the children's playground.

10. Any police constable, officer, or employé of the Council shall have the right (in addition to any other penalty under this By-law) to remove or exclude from the children's playground any person who commits a breach of this By-law, or who wilfully damages any of the swings or other appliances or any property in the children's playground.

11. Any person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for such offence to a penalty not exceeding £5 and not less than Five shillings.



# **BY-LAWS OF THE OVENS DISTRICT HOSPITAL (INCORPORATED).**

1. *Name.*—The name of the institution is The Ovens District Hospital (Incorporated).

2. *Seal.*—The following shall be the device of the common seal of the Hospital:—



3. *Custody of Seal.*—The common seal of the Corporation shall be kept at the Hospital in a box having two different locks; one key shall be kept by the Treasurer, and the other by some officer appointed by the Board of Management for that purpose.

4. *Affixing of Seal.*—The common seal shall not be affixed to any deed, instrument, or writing except by order of the Board of Management at a meeting at which four members at least are present at the time of making such order. The affixing shall be witnessed by any two of the following persons:—President, a Vice-President, Treasurer, Secretary.

## **OBJECTS.**

5. The objects of the Institution are to afford gratuitous medical and surgical aid to sick persons in destitute circumstances and to others unable to pay the ordinary fees for medical attendance, nursing, &c., but who will contribute towards the cost of their treatment, &c., on such terms of payment as shall be determined by the Board of Management.

## **CONSTITUTION.**

6. The supreme control of the Hospital is vested in the contributors thereto.

## **CONTRIBUTORS.**

7. *Qualifications and Privileges of Annual Contributors.*—*Annual Governor—Life Subscriber—Life Governor—Benefactor.*—A contributor of £1 yearly shall be an annual contributor, entitled to one vote at all meetings, and to recommend two in-patients and two out-patients every year. A contributor of £5 shall be an annual governor, entitled to one vote at all meetings, and to recommend three in-patients and three out-patients every year. A contributor of £10 in one amount, and every person raising in one year the same sum, shall be a life subscriber, entitled to one vote at all meetings, and to recommend four in-patients and four out-patients every year. A contributor of £20 in one amount, and every person raising in one year such sum shall be a life governor, entitled to two votes at all meetings, and to recommend five in-patients and five out-patients every year. A contributor of £50 or upwards in one amount or the executor first named under any will paying to the Institution a bequest of the same amount or upwards shall be a benefactor, entitled to three votes at all meetings and to recommend six in-patients and six out-patients every year.

8. *Contributions of Corporations, Church Congregations, and Firms.*—Any public or corporate body, church congregation, firm, or partnership, or committee which shall pay to the Hospital any or either of the amounts specified in By-law 7 shall be authorized to nominate some person who shall be entitled to all the privileges attached thereto.

9. *Honorary Life Governor.*—Any person who has conferred some signal benefit upon the Hospital, irrespective of contribution, may be elected by the Board of Management an honorary life governor, with all the privileges attached thereto.

10. *Contributions Paid in Advance—Privileges to be Suspended.*—Every yearly contribution shall be paid in advance, and every first yearly payment shall be calculated from the date of such payment, but shall not entitle the contributor to a vote at any meeting within three months from the date of such payment. The privileges of annual contributors shall be suspended until all arrears are paid; also in the case of salaried officers, pupils, or patients of the Hospital.

## **MANAGEMENT.**

11. *Board of Management.*—The business of the Institution shall be intrusted to a Board of Management, consisting of nine members elected by ballot from contributors of at least £1 yearly. The nine members elected from the contributors shall retain office for three years, three retiring by rotation each year, but shall be eligible

for re-election. All candidates for election shall be nominated in writing by six governors or contributors, such nomination together with the nominee's written consent to act if elected, to be delivered to the Secretary not less than seven clear days before the date of annual meeting and advertised once in a local paper. Presidents of shires or mayors of boroughs making an annual municipal grant to the funds of the Hospital shall be *ex officio* members of the Board of Management and are eligible to attend and vote at all meetings of the Board of Management.

12. *President, Vice-President, and Treasurer.*—The Board of Management shall elect from among themselves a President, two Vice-Presidents, and Treasurer, who shall hold office for one year.

13. *When Office shall become Vacant.*—If any member of the Board shall die, or resign by letter under his hand addressed to the chairman of the Board, or become insolvent, or compound with his creditors, or be convicted of any treason, felony, or misdemeanour, or be absent for four consecutive meetings from the Board, his office shall become vacant; and the remaining members of the Board may declare his office vacant; and temporarily appoint thereto some contributor to such Institution until the next annual meeting for the election of the Board, when the person thus temporarily appointed shall retire as one of those who, by the provisions of the Hospitals and Charities Act, are required to go out of office.

14. *Board of Management—When to meet.*—The Board of Management shall meet monthly on the second Tuesday in each calendar month at the Hospital, and at such other times as they shall from time to time appoint, four to form a quorum.

15. *Special Meetings.*—It shall be competent, at any time, for the Board of Management, of which at least six members shall be present, or for nine or more contributors, by writing under their hand, to require the President, or in his absence one of the Vice-Presidents or Secretary, to summon a special meeting of contributors. The occasion for calling such a meeting shall be stated in the requisition, and no other business shall be transacted at such special meeting except that for which it was summoned. Seven days' notice shall be given of every such meeting, with the objects for which it was called, by advertisement in one or more local newspapers. Ten to form a quorum.

16. *In event of Quorum not being present.*—Should a quorum not be present within twenty minutes of the time appointed for holding any meeting of contributors or of the Board of Management, the meeting shall stand adjourned until the same hour in the following week, and if a quorum be not then present the meeting shall lapse.

17. *Board of Management—Their Power and Duties.*—The Board of Management shall direct the general business of the Hospital; shall frame rules for its internal management, and for the direction of the officers of the institution (the same not being repugnant to the By-laws), shall have power to enter into contracts for supplies and to purchase articles required for the use of the Hospital, to direct payment to be made thereof, and to appoint and discharge all paid officers and servants of the institution. They shall frame Regulations for the admission or discharge of all patients, whether paying or otherwise.

18. *House Committee—Duties.*—The Board of Management shall elect from among themselves a House Committee, consisting of a Vice-President and other members who shall report to the Board of Management at their monthly meetings on the general condition of the Hospital and such other matters as they may think of importance. They shall audit all accounts before presentation to the Board of Management for payment. They shall appoint from among themselves one member as a visitor, who shall inspect the Hospital at least twice in a month and report to the next House Committee meeting.

19. *Patients' Committee—Duties.*—The Board of Management shall likewise elect, from among themselves, a Patients' Committee, consisting of a Vice-President and other members, who shall attend at the Hospital to fix the assessments, if any, to be paid by any patient as per By-law 24. They shall visit all the wards at least twice a month, at irregular intervals; shall see that the patients are properly cared for and investigate any complaints preferred by them. They shall present a detailed report to the Board of Management (for confirmation at monthly meetings) of patients admitted and discharged, stating the assessments made, and communicating any matter of interest affecting patients.

20. *Annual Report.*—The Board of Management shall present a Yearly General Report of the affairs of the Hospital at the general meeting (ten to form a quorum) to be held in the month of July in each year. Such report to be left for inspection at the Hospital for one week prior to the annual meeting.

21. *Accounts to be Audited.*—The accounts of the charity shall be audited quarterly and be presented by the Board with their yearly report.

22. *Members pecuniarily interested.*—No member of the Board shall be present at the discussion of, nor record his vote upon, any matter in which he is pecuniarily interested. No member of the Board shall either directly or indirectly be a contractor for the supply of any goods to the Hospital or for the performance of any work for the Hospital.

23. *Accidents, &c.*—Accidents, and such cases of decided emergency as cannot be delayed, shall be received at any time.

24. *Patients able to Pay.*—Patients able to pay for medical or surgical treatment may be admitted on the recommendation of a contributor, such patient having set forth upon the usual admission form the full extent of his or her means, and the Patients' Committee shall at their ordinary meeting fix the amount they recommended that the patient shall be charged while under treatment.

25. *In-patients.*—Destitute persons shall be admitted as in-patients, free of charge, on producing the recommendation of a contributor, and making the usual declaration.

26. *Out-patients.*—Persons unable to pay for medicines and medical attendance (or for either), but not requiring admission to the house, shall be treated as out-patients on producing the recommendation of a contributor.

27. *Persons not Admissible.*—No pregnant female, for the purpose of confinement; no person insane, or suffering from delirium tremens; no person whose case shall be considered by the medical officers to be incurable unless for temporary relief; nor any one whose disease (in the opinion of the Board) ought not to come within the operation of the charity, shall be admitted into the house; and no person who, in the opinion of the medical officers, might receive equal benefit as an out-patient.

28. *Ministers of Religion.*—Ministers of religion shall have access to sick persons of their respective denominations at all times convenient for the work of the wards, but not when the medical officers are also in attendance in the wards. In times of emergency the matron shall notify the clergyman that his services are required.

#### PRESIDENT.

29. *Duties.*—The President shall have the general supervision of the external business of the Hospital, and shall sign, on behalf of the Board, all documents of importance.
