PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his preferation.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature or an irregular road.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plandrawing, except paper.

9. If the forogoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

(a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

(b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved

Principles and Practice of Surveying.

(c) Detail of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, and under-ground surveying, setting out of areas, redetermina-tion of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting by co-ordinates and from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Act, writing descriptions of boundaries.

(Candidates may be required to effect surveys under supervision.)

Engineering Surveys.

(d) Levelling and contouring; grading; setting-out, and measurement of earthworks, including practical tests.

Use of instruments.

(e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, tacheometer, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer, and steel band.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

(f) Determination (including practical tests) of time, latitude, and azimuth; the use of ephemerides; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic

(g) Plan-drawing, drawing of sections and contours, compila-tion of plans, projection of maps and charts.

Miscellaneous.

(h) Elementary physics, elementary geology, elementary

[The scope of the examination in elementary physics will be that covered by "Balfour Stewart's Elementary Physics," Fourth Edition, omitting chapters 8, 10, and 11, and the scope of the examination in elementary geology will be that covered by "Geikie's Class-book of Geology," Fourth Edition.]

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having passed the matriculation or senior examination at a University, or of having completed a course of the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algobra, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers. Candidates holding diplomas from recognised public technical set onls may be exempted from working out papers in physics and geology, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

- 12. A candidate qualifying and passing the examination held under these regulations shall be entitled to a certificate that he is qualified for the position of a land surveyor in Victoria.
- 13. A surveyor applying to the Board for a certificate of competency without examination on the grounds of his holding a licence and certificate entitling him to practise in any of the other Australian States or in the Dominion of New Zealand, shall produce such licence and certificate of competency from the Board of the State or Dominion in which he is licensed or authorized to survey, together with satisfactory evidence as to character; provided that, should such certificate have been issued upon examination held prior to September, 1895, he shall further produce a written recommendation or a certificate, dated not more than twelve months previously, from such Board of the State or Dominion in which he obtained his licence and certificate from obtaining the recommendation of the Board of the State or Dominion, shall be entitled to a certificate on passing such examination under these regulations as the Board may require. All previous By-laws and Regulations relating to the subject-matter herein shall be and the same are hereby revoked, but not so as to relieve, discharge, or absolve any person from liability to pay any rate made in accordance with the provisions of the said By-laws or Regulations for payment of which rate such persons shall have become liable prior to or at the date of this By-law coming into operation; nor to abrogate or diminish the power of the said Commission to recover and enforce payment of any such rate; nor to annul or stay any proceedings taken or business initiated as in conformity with the provisions of the said By-laws or Regulations prior to the date of this By-law coming into operation, but the same respectively may be continued and carried to completion.
- 2. The following rates are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of all lands and tenements within the respective divisions of the Waterworks District of the Carrum Waterworks Trust, as the same are respectively set out and described in the said Order in Council, bearing date the 31st May, 1910, and published in the Government Gazette of 8th June, 1910, that is to say:

That such tramway shall be used for the carriage of timber, goods, and produce.

NECESSARY PRECAUTIONS FOR THE SAFETY OF THE PUBLIC TO BE OBSERVED.

That every precaution necessary to secure the safety of passengers passing along the roads upon the route of such tramway shall be taken and ordered by the said Council of the Shire of Alexandra, and that a siding with a steep inverted grade and stop block shall be formed by the Council at a convenient place near the 11 mile, where a train having got beyond control would be automatically shunted, and brought to a standstill.

CONDITIONS AS REQUIRED BY THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS.

No. 1432), the Governor in Council, by proclamation in the Government Gazette, may either absolutely or subject to any regulations prohibit the bringing into any portion of Victoria from any other portion of Victoria specified in such proclamation of any tree, plant, or vegetable which is in the opinion of the Governor in Council likely to spread any disease or insect in Victoria, and may at any time alter or revoke any such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my proclamation order "that except subject to regulations which the Governor in Council may make, on and after the date of this Proclamation no potatoes shall be brought from those portions of Victoria contained within the boundaries of the Parishes of Barwon Downs and Yaugher, in the County of Polwarth, to any other portion of Victoria."

1. The children's playground shall be opened doily

1. The children's playground shall be opened daily from 9.30 a.m. till sunset, except on Sundays and such other days as may from time to time be specially indicated by the Council.

2. Any person found within the children's playground except during such hours it is open to the public shall be guilty of a breach of this By-law.

3. Although the children's playground is provided for the use of children only, parents and attendants shall be at liberty to be present to watch over them.

4. No person above the age of twelve (12) years shall be allowed to use any of the swings or other appliances erected in the children's playground. Such swings or other appliances shall not be used by the same child or children for a longer period than five (5) minutes at any one time if any other children are waiting to use them.

5. No children shall use any of the swings or other appliances in the children's playground except in the ordinary way.

6. No cricket or football shall be played in the children's playground.

7. All paper, fruit, peel, or other litter shall be placed in the bins provided by the Council for the purpose.

8. All persons in the children's playground shall obey the directions of any Council employé in charge thereof.

9. The Council shall not be responsible for any accident arising from the use of any of the swings or other appliances in the children's playground.

arising from the use of any of the swings or other appliances in the children's playground.

10. Any police constable, officer, or employé of the Council shall have the right (in addition to any other penalty under this By-law) to remove or exclude from the children's playground any person who commits a breach of this By-law, or who wilfully damages any of the swings or other appliances or any property in the children's playground.

11. Any person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for such offence to a penalty not exceeding £5 and not less than Five shillings.
