PROCLAMATION

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of the said State, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

“An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Nine hundred and seventy-six thousand eight hundred and forty-nine pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and ten and One thousand nine hundred and eleven.”

NOTICE UNDER VOTING BY POST ACT 1900.

SOUTHERN PROVINCE.

AN Election of a Member of the Legislative Council is about to be held in the above-mentioned Province and any Elector thereof who appears from the rolls to reside in such Province and who resides at least five miles from the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or who has reason to believe that on the polling day he will not be within five miles of the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or that on account of ill-health or infirmity he will be prevented from voting personally thereat, who desires to vote through the post office at such Election may, on posting an application to the Returning Officer, obtain a Postal Ballot-paper enabling him to vote through the post at such Election.

Caution.—Any person wilfully making a false statement in an application is liable on conviction to two years' imprisonment.

SHIRE OF LOWAN.—BY-LAW No. 17.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act* 1890 and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Lowan, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, for the purposes of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say :—

1. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.
2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the Township of Nhill.
4. The ordinary system of pans for night-soil is hereby abolished, and instead thereof every closet shall be furnished with a double-pan service, to be provided by the Council.

5. The Council may, upon the recommendation of the Health Officer and the Inspector of Nuisances, exempt any premises within the Township of Nhill from the operation of this By-law.

6. No closet door or trap shall abut open upon any street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding 20 feet in width.

7. The occupier of any premises in which there is a closet or privy shall cause the space under the seat of each closet or privy on such premises to be prepared, and shall permit the same to be used for the double-pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause the closet or privy to be kept in a fit state for such service.

8. Every closet within the Township of Nhill shall consist of a suitable privy building constructed with proper openings and flues to provide due ventilation. The door of such closet shall be at no point less than three inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and be provided with requisite means for the application of any earth or deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be so constructed and placed as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan and emptying and cleansing same.

9. No occupier or person shall use such closet pan for depositing any house or yard rubbish or any other material in (except for deodorizing) other than night-soil, or shall damage such pan and its lids in any manner whatsoever.

10. Stringent supervision shall be exercised by the Shire Council over all premises, which may be inspected by the Shire Council or its officers from time to time, or any person duly authorized by the Council.

11. The occupier aforesaid or other person having the control or management of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, saw-dust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan in such closet or privy to be immediately on deposit thereof covered with a quantity of deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

12. The Council shall at least once a week cause the pan in use to be closed with a lid and removed with its contents from the premises between the hours as the Council may direct, and the other pan to be left in its place.

13. Before leaving any pan in a closet or privy the Council shall cause the same to be thoroughly cleansed, disinfected, and tar-painted inside, or treated by some equally efficient means.

14. The occupier aforesaid or other person shall not contract for the removal of night-soil from such premises except in accordance with this By-law.

15. The Council shall have power in lieu of making a rate to make a charge on each occupier for the pans supplied; and for the removal of night-soil and the other work herein directed, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

16. If any person or the Council commit a breach of this By-law he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and not less than Five shillings, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and not less than Five shillings, for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

FORM OF INDENTURE PRESCRIBED BY
CARPENTERS BOARD.

THIS indenture made the _____ day of _____ 19____ between _____ (hereinafter called the said apprentice) of the first part; the _____ of the said apprentice of the second part; and _____ (hereinafter called the said master; for himself his executors administrators and assigns) of _____ in the _____ carrying on the process trade or business of a carpenter and joiner of the third part.

Witnesseth that the said apprentice by and with the consent of the said _____ testified by his being a party to and executing these presents doth put and bind himself apprentice with and to the said master his executors administrators and assigns to serve him as an apprentice from the date of these presents until the full end and term of _____ years to be fully complete and ended to learn the process trade or business of a carpenter and joiner aforesaid.

And they the said apprentice and _____ covenant with the said master that he the said apprentice shall and will during the said term (unless the master shall remove his business from _____ to some place beyond the radius of _____ miles from his present place of business in which case the apprentice may if he so elect claim to have his indenture assigned to some other master within the radius or if there be none such to be released from these presents) well and faithfully serve the said master as an apprentice in the process trade or business of a carpenter and joiner aforesaid and his lawful commands willingly obey and shall also willingly obey the lawful orders and commands of such of the representatives of the said master as he the said apprentice shall be placed under in the said business or as the said master shall specify or require and shall not do or commit nor suffer to be done or committed any waste damage or other injury to the property or goods of the said master or any firm or company of which he may be a member or lend them to any person without the consent of the said master and shall not unlawfully absent himself from the service of the said master during business hours and shall not by word or action induce other apprentices to disobedience.

In consideration whereof the said master doth hereby covenant with the said _____ and also with the said apprentice that he the said master will take and receive the said apprentice as his apprentice during the said term and to the best of his power knowledge and ability teach and instruct or cause to be taught and instructed the said apprentice in the process trade or business aforesaid of a carpenter and joiner and in all things incident or relating thereto and will pay to the said apprentice (during such time as he shall actually perform his said services) during the said term wages at the rate following (that is to say) :-

and will also pay to the said apprentice such further rate or rates for overtime worked as may be fixed by the determination of the Carpenters Board. Provided always and it is hereby agreed that the said apprentice shall not be paid for any time he shall be absent from his said duties through his own wilful default and neglect or through illness or through absenting himself from his said master's service without leave or licence and also provided that the said apprentice shall not be entitled to a higher rate of pay until he has actually worked for a period of 12 months at the next preceding rate. In computing the period of 12 months all time worked as overtime shall be allowed as a set-off against any absence during the said period.

Provided also and it is hereby further agreed that if the said apprentice shall at any time during the said term wilfully disobey the lawful and reasonable commands of the said master or without the leave or the licence of the said master shall absent himself from the service of the said master during business hours as fixed by the determination of the said Special Board or shall fail to work such reasonable overtime as the exigencies of the business may require and the law permits or shall habitually neglect his duties or fail to perform the same or shall otherwise grossly misconduct himself it shall be

lawful for the said master to discharge the said apprentice on obtaining the consent thereto of any Justice of the Peace if not previously arranged by mutual consent but nothing in this proviso shall be taken to prevent resort being had in the case of any difference arising between the said master and the said apprentice to the provisions of section 14 of the *Master and Apprentice Act* 1890 or any statutory modification of such section.

Provided also and it is hereby further agreed and declared that if at any time during the said term the said master shall die or cease to carry on the business aforesaid in all its branches as now carried on by him either altogether or within a radius of _____ miles from his present place of business at

then in such case the said master or his executors administrators or assigns or one of them will within one month thereafter find and provide some other master or masters carrying on the business aforesaid in all its branches within such radius if any there be or if there be none such if the apprentice so require to some master carrying on business beyond that radius and will assign and transfer at their own expense and cost the said apprentice to such master or masters upon and subject to the same or the like conditions and stipulations as are hereinbefore provided.

Provided always that in the event of the said master from any cause whatever being unable to find work for the said apprentice he may transfer such apprentice (with the consent of the Chief Inspector of Factories) for a period not exceeding three months to some other master or masters carrying on the business of a carpenter and joiner within a reasonable distance of the original master's place of business such original master being held responsible for the due performance of all obligations imposed by this indenture.

The said master shall provide all moulding planes such as hollows and rounds, beads, plough, sash fillister, &c., necessary to enable the said apprentice, during the term of his indenture, to perform his work.

These presents shall be handed over to the said apprentice on the completion of the term of service herein with a certificate of the apprentice's due service indorsed thereon.

And for the true performance of all and every of the said covenants and agreements each of the said parties bindeth himself to the other by these presents.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION,
AND MANAGEMENT OF THE SORRENTO PUBLIC PARK.

WE, William J. Croad, Ralph Marsden, J. J. Hiskens, and James Wright, a majority of the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Sorrento Public Park, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*.

REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall be permitted to enter or to remain in the Park who offends against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
2. No person shall be allowed to cut, stick bills upon, write upon or otherwise disfigure, or injure the gates, fences, seats, or buildings in the Park.
3. No person shall in any way injure the trees or shrubs, whether native or exotic, throw stones, commit any nuisance, leave any bottles, orange peel, paper, cast-off clothing, or other litter in the Park, or light any fire therein.
4. No person shall erect any dwelling, booth, tent, or other structure in the Park without the consent in writing of the Committee of Management.
5. No person shall put any horse, cattle, sheep, or goat into the Park, or take any horses therein without the consent in writing of the Committee of Management.
6. No association, club, or company of persons shall use the Park for a picnic without the consent in writing of the Committee of Management.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown Lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

FARM ALLOTMENTS AVAILABLE FOR APPLICATION UNDER CONDITIONAL PURCHASE LEASE
AT SWAN HILL.

THE several allotments included in the Schedule hereunder are declared available as Farm Allotments. Applications must be made on the prescribed forms and lodged with the Secretary, Closer Settlement Branch, Lands Department, accompanied by the deposit, as shown in Schedule hereunder, for the most valuable allotment applied for. The deposit includes registration fee of 5s. and lease fee of £1.

Conditional Purchase Lease.

The leases issued to successful applicants may be for such a term of years, not exceeding 31½, as may be agreed upon between the lessee and the Board.

An applicant may apply for more than one allotment, but will only be required to lodge one deposit, being the amount chargeable on the most valuable allotment applied for.

Only one allotment can be granted to any one person.

No conditional purchase lease of a farm allotment can be granted to any person who is already the holder of land of the value of £2,500 (township land excepted), or who would thereby become the holder of land exceeding such value.

Improvements to the value of at least two instalments of the purchase money must be effected on each farm allotment before the end of the first year from the date of the lease, and 10 per cent. of the purchase money before the end of the third year, and a further 10 per cent. before the end of the sixth year.

The lessee must reside on the allotment. (Personal residence by a wife, or any child not less than eighteen years of age of lessee, may be considered personal residence by the lessee, with the approval of the Board.)

The lessee cannot transfer, assign, mortgage, or sublet the whole or any part of his allotment within the first six years of the lease.

The Crown grant may be issued to the lessee at the end of any half-year after the first twelve years have expired, on payment of the balance of purchase money.

The amount of deposit (less £1 5s.) will be deducted from the capital value and the half-yearly instalments calculated on the balance of purchase money.

Payments in advance may be made at any time at the option of the lessee, and proportionate reduction of interest secured thereby.

The balance of purchase money, with interest at 4½ per cent., must be paid by 63 or a lesser number of half-yearly instalments, calculated according to any of the tables under Division 3 of Part I. of the *Savings Banks Act 1890 Amendment Act 1896*, the first of such instalments being payable six months after the date of the lease. Each instalment will include interest upon the balance of the purchase money remaining unpaid.
