All non-competing boats must clear off the course when the alarm bells ring.

No permit shall be given to any motor boat which it is intended shall ply for hire or carry passengers for profit or gain by day.

No permit shall be given for boats burning coal, coke, or firewood.

Permit shall not be transferable by holder or in respect of motor boats.

Permit shall not be transferable by holder or in respect of motor boats.

Acceptance of permit shall be a guarantee that its holder and the boat it is issued for will observe the Regulations, whether general or special.

All boats must give way for racing boats going up stream to the start of the course.

After sunset, motor boats are directed to go slow, and to move in the centre of the river, and in the course set apart for racing in the day-time.

On Henley Day the length of oars used by any boat, other than racing boats, between Punt-road bridge and Prince's-bridge, shall not exceed 12 feet.

Motor boats are requested to get to their moorings, if possible, before the first race starts at a quarter-past One p.m., or to wait until the first interval in the programme; but the officers controlling the course may allow motor boats to proceed to their moorings if interference with racing will not be caused.

CARRIAGE ON BOARD SHIP OF BI-SULPHIDE OF CARBON, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS CARBON OF BI-SULPHURET OR DISULPHIDE OF CARBON,

THE following extract from a memorandum (1907) issued by the Board of Trade, relative to the carriage of dangerous goods in ships, is published for the information of all whom it may concern.

BI-SULPHIDE OF CARBON.

BI-SULPHIDE OF CARBON.

BI-SULPHIDE of Carbon, or Carbon Bi-sulphuret, is "Dangerous Goods" within the meaning of section 446 of the Merchant Shipping Act 1894,* and should therefore be marked as required by that section.

It is a colourless, heavy, mobile, volatile liquid, which evaporates very quickly. It produces a pressure in any closed vessel containing it. It easily passes through the smallest opening, and it is very difficult to keep the drums tight in which it is stored.

It is not liable to spontaneous combustion, but both the liquid and its vapour take fire at very low temperatures, the liquid at rather a lower temperature than the vapour. The vapour has a tendency to travel, and if it finds its way to any surface sufficiently warm to ignite it, the flame will flash back and ignite the liquid. This is known

to have occurred when the liquid was at a distance of 20 feet from the warm surface. The mere striking together of two pieces of iron within the inflammable atmosphere may cause ignition.

It has a very powerful and penetrating odour, which in small quantities resembles that of foul vegetable matter. Bi-sulphide of carbon should be carried in strongly made and perfectly tight drums of not more than ten gallons capacity each. The drums should be satisfactorily tested by hydraulic pressure to at least 40 lbs. per square inch before being used, and a space of at least 10 per cent. should be left in each to allow for expansion of the liquid. Drums of the kind employed by the Government of India for the shipment of ether are recommended for this purpose.

liquid. Drums of the kind employed by the Government of India for the shipment of ether are recommended for this purpose.

The drums should be packed in strong wooden cases (which should be perforated), with not more than two drums in each case, each drum being in a separate compartment of the case.

It should be carried as deck cargo only, the utmost care being taken to protect it from the rays of the sun, or lights, or sparks; sail cloth (not black tarpaulin) is suggested as a covering. It should be stowed apart from all other goods, whether dangerous or not, and kept at a distance from all steam pipes, funnels, or other heated objects, and from all living quarters of the vessel, and smoking in its vicinity should be strictly prohibited.

The cases containing the drums should be examined at frequent intervals (at least twice in 24 hours), during daylight, to ascertain if there is any escape, and if any leakage is detected, even by the presence of the odour above described in the vicinity of the packages, they should be immediately thrown overboard, and it is important that the person making these examinations should know that leakages sufficiently large to be very dangerous may exist without its being possible to see anything in the nature of moisture on the outside of the drums to indicate their presence.—(M.21242-99.)

Prahran Mechanics' Institute Act 1899. RULES AND REGULATIONS.

THE Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, has, by an Order made on the 11th day of October, 1910, under the provisions of section 5 of the Prahran Mechanics' Institute Act 1809 [63 Vict. No. 1617], approved of the Rules and Regulations hereunder set forth, that is to say:—

PRAHRAN MECHANICS' INSTITUTION AND CIRCULATING LIBRARY INCORPORATED.

(Constituted under Act 1617, 27th October, 1899.)

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

Section 1.-Name and General Constitution of the Society.

1. The Prahran Mechanics' Institution and Circulating Library incorporated (hereinafter called the Institute), which was founded in 1854, was incorporated by the Prahran Mechanics' Institute Act 1899 on the 27th day of

October, 1899.

2. The Institute shall consist of all persons who, for the time being, shall have been duly admitted as either special, ordinary, life, or honorary members, and who shall have otherwise have fully complied with the rules and regulations of the Institute for the time being in force.

3. Every application for membership shall be received subject to approval by the committee and to the rules and regulations in force at the time.

4. By virtue of the said Act the Institute shall be governed by a committee of nine, viz. —One councillor only from each of the four wards of the city of Prahran, who shall be elected by the council of the said city; four members of the Institute, who shall be elected by the members thereof; and the mayor of the said city for the time being, who shall carry out all the duties as chairman.

5. All subordinate appointments shall be made, regulated, and terminated by and at the discretion of the committee.

mittee.

6. The votes of members shall be taken by show of hands or by ballot if demanded, and the chairman of a general or committee meeting shall, in that capacity, in every case of equal division, have the customary additional casting vote.

Section 2 .- Objects of the Institute.

7. The objects of the Institute shall be to provide a thoroughly good circulating library with a well supplied news and reading room, and 8. To organize and carry on educational classes, scientific or other clubs, lectures, and any other practically instructive or recreative combinations or arrangements that may be deemed expedient.

Section 3.—Admission of Members and Subscriptions.

9. The committee may admit any person as a member at any time, the appropriate subscription having been paid in advance on the following scale:—ros. per year, 5s. per

in advance on the following scale:—10s. per year, 5s. per half-year, 3s. per quarter.

10. All subscriptions are due in advance, and if any subscriber be in arrear to the extent of one month he or she shall be debarred from all rights until same be paid.

11. If any person shall contribute five guineas or upwards to the resources of the Institute in one donation or payment, the committee may enrol such person as an ordinary member for any term not exceeding thirteen years.

12. Members of other mechanics' institutions situated not less than 25 miles from Melbourne may be admitted as visitors for reasonable short periods without charge, if temporarily residing in Prahran, on introduction by a member and on leaving names and addresses in the visitors' book.

13. The committee may admit honorary members for such periods as they may think fit when conducive, in their opinion, to the well-being of the Institute.

Section 4.—Powers of Members.

section 4.—rowers of exempers.

14. Every financial member of not less than six months' standing shall be entitled to one vote at general meetings of the Institute, provided that such subscription has been fully paid and that it be not in arrear.

15. Members may introduce non-resident friends to the reading room upon entering the name of the introducer and the visitor in the visitors' book.

Section 5 .- General Meetings.

16. The annual general meeting of the members of the Institute shall be held in January, seven days' notice of the day and hour of meeting being given by circular or

advertisement.

17. Special general meetings may be convened by the secretary in the same manner as ordinary general meetings shall be, whenever five members of the committee or four-teen members of the Institute shall sign a requisition

stating the objects, and shall be held within fourteen days from the date of requisition, three days' notice at least heing given to members. No questions shall be entertained at special meetings but those specified in the requisi-

- 18. The following shall be the order of business observed at annual meetings :-
 - (a) The secretary shall read the minutes of the last ordinary general meeting and of any subsequent special general meetings.

 (b) He shall read all alterations or amendments, if

any, made by the committee in the rules and regulations during the preceding year.

- (d) The meeting shall consider any resolutions that may be duly brought forward.
 (e) The election of officers and committee.

19. One-twelfth of the number of members on the roll, but not less than five, shall be deemed a quorum at general meetings.

Section 6 .- Election by Members of Office-bearers.

- 20. Four ordinary members of committee shall be elected for one year at annual meeting, but hold office until their successors are appointed.
 21. Retiring members of committee shall be eligible for
- re-election.

22. There shall also be elected at the annual meeting a 22. Here shall also be elected at the annual meeting a treasurer and two auditors, who shall hold office for one year and be eligible for re-election.

23. None but financial members of the Institute of at least three months' standing shall be elected to fill or hold

least three months' standing shall be elected to fill or hold any honorary office.

24. Any extraordinary vacancy occurring in any office of the Institute other than a vacancy in the committee may be filled up by the committee until the next general meeting. Any vacancy in the committee shall be filled up as provided by the said Act.

Section 7 .- Committee Meetings.

25. Any member of the committee elected by the members who shall have been absent from four consecutive committee meetings shall be considered to have vacated his office unless a satisfactory reason be shown to the com-

office unless a satisfactor, mittee.

26. Three members shall constitute an ordinary quorum of committee, and may proceed to business, and their acts shall be deemed in any and all subsequent proceedings to have been fully concurred in by every absent member of committee, and should any question arise respecting their proceedings the votes of all the non-attending members shall always be counted in support of the acts of those who were in attendance to transact the business of the Institute.

Institute.

27.. The committee shall meet on the first Thursday in every month, but special meetings may be called by the secretary, the president, or any three members of committee, at any time. A circular stating the object of such meeting shall be sent to each member of the committee by the secretary, three clear days at the least prior to the date of holding the same, and no other business shall be transacted than that in the circular.

Section 8 .- Powers and Duties of Committee.

Section 8.—Powers and Duties of Committee.

28. The committee shall have the custody, care, and superintendence of all the property of the Institute, the administration of its funds, the appointment, control, and dismissal of all salaried officers and employés. All rules and regulations shall be binding on members.

29. The committee shall cause fair and accurate minutes of their proceedings to be kept, shall appoint sub-committees when necessary for the despatch of business, and shall transact generally the business of the Institute.

30. The committee shall appoint a secretary and such other salaried officers as may be necessary for the proper working of the Institute.

other salaried officers as may be necessary for the proper working of the Institute.

31. The committee may expel any member for misconduct, the expelled having the right of appeal to a general meeting, on giving fourteen days' notice after date of expulsion, in writing, to the secretary, the decision of such meeting to be final.

32. The committee shall have power to sell or exchange duplicate and other works and all other movable property which they may consider unnecessary to be retained by the Institute, the proceeds to be placed to the credit of the funds of the Institute.

33. The committee shall have power to let any part of the premises and land for the purpose of augmenting the revenue of the Institute; and the secretary for the time being shall be authorized to sign all necessary agreements for such letting on behalf of the committee, the terms of such letting to be arranged at a meeting of the committee.

Section 9.-Financial Regulations.

34. Printed receipts shall be given by the secretary in the name of the Institute for all moneys received on its

: 35. A cash-book and ledger shall be kept, in which all pecuniary transactions of the Institute shall be promptly entered in full detail and duly classified in appropriate accounts.

36. When the cash in hand amounts to £5 or upwards shall at once be paid to credit of the Institute at the bank.

37. Every payment on account of the Institute shall be made by cheque signed by the president and the secretary and one member of the financial committee after approval by the committee.

; 38. The cash-book, receipt-book, and bank-pass book of the Institute shall be examined once a month; and the cash-book shall be laid before every quarterly meeting, balanced to date.

Section 10 .- Duties of Secretary.

39. Full records of the affairs of the Institute shall be written up by, or under the personal direction of, the secretary, including (1) a list of members, showing the amount of each subscription, when paid, and to what date; (2) a complete catalogue of all books, periodicals, papers, &c., belonging to the Institute; (3) registers of all books, &c., taken out and returned to the library; (4) the minute-book, cash-book, and ledger of the Institute, with the visitors' ibook, and any others the committee may specify.

40. The secretary shall take minutes of all general and committee meetings; receive accruing funds, and give receipts for the same; shall conduct correspondence; manage the library reading room, and generally be in personal charge of the premises, with the books and all other property and matters therein or pertaining thereto, and retain office during the pleasure of the committee. 39. Any member writing upon or otherwise wilfully or carelessly defacing, mutilating, or destroying any book, map, illustration, paper, or apparatus, shall pay a fine equal in the judgment of the committee to at least three times the cost of repairing the mischief done, but not less than Five shillings, and shall be liable to immediate expulsion on the perpetration of any similar offence.

44. If a book be lost, written upon, or otherwise damaged, the member in whose possession it may be at the discretion of the committee.

45. Any member lending a book to any person not being

an inmate of his own house shall pay a fine of Five shillings.

46. No book, periodical, newspaper, or other publication shall be removed from the Institute until it has been duly entered to the debit of the borrowing member, and should any member effect any such removal he shall be liable to pay a fine not exceeding double the value of the property removed, or to expulsion, as the committee may determine.

47. A precise period shall be prescribed by the committee during which every circulated publication may be retained by a member, and a fine of a Penny a day shall be incurred if the term so fixed be exceeded.

48. All fines must be paid to the secretary within one

48. All fines must be paid to the secretary within one month after being demanded, and if after the lapse of two months such fines remain unpaid the name shall be erased from the members' roll, should the committee so deter-

mine.

50. Silence must be maintained in the reading room, and no person shall smoke or partake of refreshment therein.

Section 12.—Interpretation of Rules.

51. In the event of any doubt or difficulty arising as to the meaning of these rules and regulations the committee shall have power finally to decide the same.

52. The rules and regulations for the time being of the Institute may be altered or amended by the committee.

CONDITIONS OF LEASE.

SHIRE OF RUTHERGLEN.

REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE CHILTERN WEST COMMON.

In putsuance of the regulations relating to commons, imade by the Governor in Council on the 8th January, 1902, the Council of the Shire of Rutherglen, as managers of the Chiltern West Common, having drafted the following regulations for the management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Wörks and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the regulations hitherto in force in respect of such Common:

Regulations.

1. In the construction, and for the purpose of these regulations; the words "large cattle" shall mean cows, heifers, oxen, steers, horses, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, and mules; and the words "small cattle" shall mean sheep and goats.

- 2. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licences, or carriers' licences, and farmers, residing within the shire of Rutherglen, may respectively depasture thereon four heatl of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cutivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on the Common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.
- 3. The fees for depasturing stock on the Common shall be as follow, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the first day of April and the first day of October in every year:—
 - For every horse; 6s. per annum; for every head of or every horse; 6s. per annum; for every head of other large cattle, 4s. per annum; for every head of small cattle, 1s. 4d. per annum. Cattle weaned from their mothers or the bucket, and not more than 12 months old, depasturing on the Common, half rates. Progeny (under nine months old) of stock legally depasturing on the Common, free, provided always that such progeny of stock shall be registered by the Herdsman.
- No person shall depasture on the Common stock of which he is not the bond fide owner.
- 5. Sheep shall be depastured on such portion only of the Common as the managers may see Common as the managers may set apart for the purpose.
- 6. No bull shall be allowed on the Common without the permission, in writing, of the managers.
- 7. In the event of stock duly registered to depasture on the Common being impounded, the Herdsman shall, as soon as he is aware thereof, notify the owner of such

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any Justice of the Peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding \pounds 20 (twenty pounds) for each offence.
