That such occupier or person shall not use nor permit or suffer to be used by any person on such premises a closet-pan for depositing any material (except for dedodorizing) other than night-soil, or shall damage or permit or suffer to be damaged by any other person in such premises any such pans or lids in any manner what-
- 12. Any such occupier or person shall not empty any night-soil other than shall have been deposited on his said premises, and no person save such as shall be authorized by the council of the said borough for the removal of night-soil shall remove same except in cases of exemption.
- 13. That stringent supervision shall be exercised by the council of the said borough over all premises affected by this By-law, and such premises may be inspected by the council of the said borough or its officers from time to time or by any other person duly authorized by the said council.
- 14. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, on conviction, forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds for every breach thereof, or not exceeding Five pounds for every day during which such breach shall be committed or continued; but the justices before whom any such penalty is sought to be recovered may order the whole or part only (not being less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR RESERVOIR, STORM WATER CHANNEL, AND PUBLIC PARK IN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF EAGLEHAWK, AND KNOWN AS "CANTERBURY PARK."

W HEREAS by the Crown grant issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Eaglehawk and their successors in respect of Canterbury Park, it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted and the buildings for the time being thereon shall be maintained and used as and for a Reservoir, Storm Water Channel, and Public Park and offices and conveniences constant described beautiful under and in accordance with such regula-Channel, and Public Park and offices and conveniences connected therewith under and in accordance with such regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Governor Administrator of the Governorment for the time being of the State of Victoria, with the consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in the meantime under and in accordance with such Rules, Orders, By-laws, and Regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Eaglehawk: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Councillor, and Burgesses of the Borough of Eaglehawk (hereinafter called the Council) do hereby make in respect of the said Canterbury Park (hereinafter throughout called the Park), the regulations following for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein:

REGULATIONS.

I. No person shall enter or remain in the Park who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

2. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Park, nor shall fires be lighted therein without the permission, in writing, of the Council first obtained.

3. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or

3. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, or cut names on the fences, gates, trees, or seats, or stick bills thereon or roll or throw stones in the Park.

4. No person shall put or allow to wander into the Park any cattle, sleep, or pigs.

5. In addition to any other penalty hereby provided, the owner of any cattle, sheep, or pigs found within the Park shall be liable to such compensation as may be recovered before any lustice for any damage done.

before any Justice for any damage done.
6. All dogs and goats and poultry found within the Park shall be destroyed, and the owner shall make compensation, to be recovered before any Justice, for any

damage done.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Park, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing; of the Council first obtained.

8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Park, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees, flowers, grass, or

shrubs.

o. No person shall pluck any of the flowers or shrubs, or remove any of the tables, or disturb, damage, or destroy any property or thing in the Park.

10. No person shall carry firearms in the Park, or shoot at, snare, or destroy any wild fowl in the Park.

11. No person shall bathe in the Park.

12. No person shall bring into the Park any vehicle, nor shall ride or drive any bicycle, motor car, or motor cycle in the Park without the permission of the Council.

13. All vehicles, bicycles, motor cars, and motor cycles authorized to enter the Park shall proceed in the direction set out in such permission. and at a walking pace

tion set out in such permission, and at a walking pace

tion set out in such permission, and at a waiking pace only.

14. Such plants, seeds, or cuttings as are commonly purchasable at nurseries in Victoria shall not be supplied from the Park to any person unless in exchange or for public institutions or for benevolent purposes.

15. Children under the age of ten years, not being under the control of some competent person not less than sixteen years of age, shall be removed from the Park.

16. No person shall hawk or offer for sale in the Park any goods or articles of any description without the permission, in writing, of the Council.

17. No person shall temporarily occupy any site within the Park or enjoy any special privilege, nor shall any band be allowed to play therein without the permission, in writing, of the Council in every case.

18. Cricket, football, running, jumping, or other athletic sports, games, or pastimes, shall not be played, nor allowed to take place in the Park without the permission, in writing, of the Council first obtained.

19. No person shall convey into the Park or place upon the reservoir therein any boat in respect of which a licence has not been obtained.

20. No stakes or bosts of any kind shall be driven into

has not been obtained.

20. No stakes or posts of any kind shall be driven into the bed of the reservoir in the Park, except where necessary for pier or jetty purposes, without the permission, in writing, of the Council first obtained.

21. On any Sunday no boating contests shall take place in the Park, and no person shall appear in boating costume within the Park on that day.

22. No person under the age of fourteen years shall be permitted to enter or use any boat in the Park unless accompanied by some competent adult person.

23. The Council may licence boats to be used for hire in the Park, and all persons desirous of obtaining a licence for a boat shall before making application submit such boat for the inspection of the officer of the Council appointed for that purpose.

24. Every person to whom a boat licence is granted shall provide an efficient life buoy to carry in each boat so licensed when in use, and every boat club shall provide not less than two such buoys for the use of such

25. All boat houses shall be erected between the carriage

25. All boat houses shall be erected between the carriage drive in the Park and the reservoir therein.
26. All applications for boat house sites and also for permission to erect a pier or jetty shall be accompanied with plans and particulars for the inspection and approval of the Council, and when any boat house, pier, or jetty shall have been erected it shall be kept in a proper and efficient state of repair to the satisfaction of the Council. 27. The owner of every boat used for hire in the Park

32. No person shall use in the Park any weir, net, implement, device, or contrivance fixed to the soil in any way for the purpose of taking fish.
