NOTICE UNDER VOTING BY POST ACT 1900.

ELECTORAL DISTRICT OF BRUNSWICK.

AN Election of a Member of the Legislative Assembly is about to be held in the above-mentioned Electoral District, and any Elector thereof who appears from the rolls to reside in such District, and who resides at least five miles from the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or who has reason to believe that on the polling day he will not be within five miles of the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or that on account of ill-health or infirmity he will be prevented from voting personally thereat, who desires to vote through the post office at such Election, may, on posting

an application to the Returning Officer, obtain a Postal Ballot-paper enabling him to vote through the post at such Election.

Such application shall be as nearly as possible in the following form:—

"I hereby apply for a Postal Ballot-paper for the forthcoming election of the Legislative Assembly, and I declare that [here state upon which of the above-mentioned grounds the applicant claims a Postal Ballot-paper].

Printed forms of application may be obtained at any post office, or the application may be in writing.

If applicant is the holder of an elector's right, such right must be attached to application.

No postage is payable thereon.

Any Elector who intends to vote through the post must apply at once, as no Postal Ballot-paper will be supplied unless the Returning Officer receives application therefor sufficiently early to admit of Postal Ballot-paper being sent to and returned by such Elector so as to reach the Returning Officer before closing of Poll.

Caution.—Any person wilfully making a false statement in an application is liable on conviction to two years' imprisonment.

Voting by Post Act 1900.

NOTICE.

The following persons have been appointed officers within the meaning of the *Voting by Post Act 1900* to witness the signature of any elector who desires to vote by means of the Post Office:—Justices of the Peace, Councillors of any City, Town, Borough, or Shire, Municipal Clerks, Clerks of Courts, Officers in Charge of Police Stations, and Head Masters of State Schools throughout Victoria.

Every Officer in charge of a Police Station within the State of Victoria has been appointed an Officer to witness the signature of any Elector who votes by post and is too ill or infirm to go to a post office.

If any such elector informs such Officer, in writing, that he has received a Postal Ballot-paper, and for the above-named reason requests him to witness his signature and post the paper, the Officer will visit him for the purpose.

Coal Mines Regulation Act 1909.

REGULATIONS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the first day of March, 1910.

PRESENT :

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.

Mr. Murray
Mr. Brown

Mr. McKenzie.

WHEREAS by the *Coal Mines Regulation Act 1909* (9 Edw. VII. No. 2240) it is amongst other things provided that the Governor in Council may make regulations generally for carrying the said Act into execution : Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say :—

VICTORIA.

REGULATIONS UNDER THE COAL MINES REGULATION ACT 1909,
No. 2240, DIVISION 14—MINERS' ACCIDENTS RELIEF.

Regulations for the Appointment of Members of Committee.

1. (a) Any two or more persons employed in or about any mine may, by a written notice in the form of the Schedule I., convene a meeting of the persons employed in or about such mine for the purpose of appointing members of the Committee for such mine. Such notice shall be signed by the conveners of the meeting, and shall be exhibited in a conspicuous and frequented place in connexion with the mine for a period of not less than seven days prior to the date proposed for the meeting.

(b) The persons present at any meeting convened as aforesaid may appoint a Chairman and Secretary for such meeting, and shall then appoint three of the persons employed in or about such mine to be members of the Committee for such mine from the date of their appointment until the 31st day of December following : Provided, however, that until their successors have been duly appointed, in accordance with these Regulations, any such Committee shall remain in office and may exercise the powers conferred by the Act.

(c) When any member of a Committee dies, resigns, or becomes incapable of acting as such member, his successor shall be appointed at a meeting convened and held as provided in Regulation No. 1 of these Regulations, and such successor shall, when appointed, hold office for the residue of the term for which his predecessor was appointed.

(d) The names of the members of any Committee appointed in accordance with these Regulations and of any persons appointed to fill any vacancy in such Committee shall be notified in writing to the Secretary to the Board, and such notification, duly signed by the Chairman and Secretary of the meeting at which such members were appointed or by the Chairman and Secretary of the meeting making any appointment to fill a vacancy, shall be taken as conclusive evidence of the appointment of the members of such Committee.

When Payments to be made by Owners, &c.

2. The owner or manager of a mine shall, within three days after each pay-day, pay to the local Treasurer on behalf of the Committee for such mine the total sum then deducted by him from the wages of the persons employed in or about the mine ; and the local Treasurer shall give to the owner or manager a receipt for the moneys so paid.

Returns by Owner or Manager.

3. The owner or manager of a mine shall, within three days after each pay-day, furnish to the local Secretary a return in duplicate in the form of Schedule II.

Where no Committee is appointed.

4. Where no Committee is appointed, the owner or manager of any mine, subject to the provisions of the Act, shall, within three days after each pay-day, remit to the Secretary to the Board the sums deducted in pursuance of section 76 of the Act, together with a return in form of Schedule I. Such Secretary shall deposit such sums to the credit of the fund in such bank as may be selected by the Board for that purpose.

Moneys paid to Committees—How dealt with.

5. The moneys received by the local Treasurer on behalf of the Committee for a mine shall only be disbursed by such Treasurer when so authorized by the said Committee in accordance with the provisions of the Act and of these Regulations.

Accounts of Committee—How kept.

6. The Committee for a mine shall cause the various items in relation to the moneys paid to and expended by it to be regularly entered in a cash-book in the form of Schedule III. supplied by the Board.

Such book shall, at all reasonable times, be open to inspection by the Secretary to the Board, or any person duly authorized in that behalf by the Minister ; and every such person may take such extracts herefrom as he may require.

Payments by Committee to Fund.

7. Moneys payable by a Committee into the fund shall be remitted, in the most convenient way, not later than one week after the meeting of the Committee, to the Secretary to the Board, and shall immediately on receipt by the Secretary be deposited by him to the credit of the fund in such bank as may be selected by the Board for that purpose.

Such remittance shall be accompanied by—

- (a) A return in the form of Schedule IV.;
- (b) The owner's or manager's return of deductions; and
- (c) All applications for allowances dealt with by the Committee and duly indorsed.

Non-payment by Committee to Fund.

8. Upon report being made to the Board of the failure of any Committee to pay within the period prescribed any money in its hands not required for payment of allowances, the Board shall report the fact to the Minister.

When Deductions from Wages insufficient, Payment from Fund.

9. In the event of the deductions made from wages and paid to the Committee for a mine being insufficient to meet the payment of allowances granted, such Committee shall direct its Chairman and Secretary to make application to the Board for the payment out of the fund of such sum as shall be necessary for the payment of such allowances. Such application shall be in the form of Schedule V.

Payment from Fund to Committees.

10. The Secretary to the Board, before paying to any Committee from the fund any money in compliance with the provisions of section 75 (a) of the Act, shall satisfy himself that such money is actually required for the payment of allowances granted by such Committee; and for this purpose may require the said Committee to furnish the Board with such information as he may deem necessary.

11. Moneys payable out of the funds shall be paid by the Secretary on the authority of the Board; and, where payable to a Committee, shall be paid to the local Treasurer on behalf of the Committee, and such payment shall be notified to the local Secretary.

Fund—How operated on.

12. The fund shall be operated on only by cheques signed by the Chairman or one other member of the Board, and countersigned by the Secretary, and then only when duly authorized by the Board in accordance with the provisions of the said Act and of these Regulations.

Joint Committees.

13. In section 77 and for the purposes of the Miners' Accidents Relief Fund "mine" shall include—

- (a) A mine that has at least twelve persons employed underground.
- (b) Several mines where two persons at least are employed in or about each mine and in the aggregate at least twelve persons are employed underground.
- (c) Two or more such mines in which at least twelve persons are employed underground, as set out in (a) or (b).

Constitution of Joint Committee.

14. Where the Minister is satisfied that a majority of those present at a meeting, convened as prescribed for each of two or more mines, of the persons employed in or about the same desire that a joint Committee be appointed for such mines the Minister shall so notify in the *Gazette*, and thereupon a joint Committee for such mines shall be constituted, consisting of—

- (a) an inspector of mines appointed by the Minister;
- (b) two persons in respect of each mine as in regulation 13 from among those employed in or about such mine and appointed for the prescribed period by the persons so employed; and
- (c) one person in respect of each mine as in regulation 13 appointed by the owner or owners of such mine or a representative thereof.

Such joint Committee shall, with respect to the said mines and the owners thereof, and the persons employed in or about the same, have the same powers and duties as a Committee has under the Act with respect to a single mine and the owner thereof and the persons employed in or about the same.

The Secretary to the Board shall send to the Chairman and Secretary of each such meeting a copy of the *Gazette* containing a notification of the Minister.

Joint Committees—Proposal to appoint.

15. Any two or more persons employed in or about a mine may, by a written notice in the form of Schedule VI., convene a meeting of the persons employed in or about such mine to consider the advisableness of constituting a joint Committee for the said mine and such other mines as the notice may indicate.

Such notice shall be signed by the conveners of the meeting, and shall be exhibited in a conspicuous and frequented place in connexion with the mine for a period of not less than seven days prior to the date proposed for the meeting.

16. The decision of any meeting held in accordance with this Regulation shall be notified by document in the form of Schedule VII., forwarded to the Secretary to the Board for transmission to the Minister.

Dissolution of Joint Committees.

17. Any two or more persons employed in or about any mine represented upon a joint Committee may, by a notice in writing duly signed by them, convene a meeting of such persons to consider the advisableness of the dissolution of such joint Committee. Such notice shall state the place and the day and hour of the meeting, and shall be exhibited in a conspicuous and frequented place in connexion with the mine for a period of not less than seven days prior to the date proposed for the meeting. The decision of the majority present at such meeting shall be sent to the Secretary to the Board, signed by the Chairman and Secretary of the meeting, for transmission to the Minister.

Should it be decided that such joint Committee shall be dissolved, the Minister may so notify in the *Gazette*, and such Committee shall thereupon be dissolved.

Other joint or separate Committees may at any time thereafter be constituted in the prescribed manner.

Notice of Accident to Committee.

18. Where in or about any mine, whether above or below ground, loss of life or any personal injury to any person employed in or about such mine occurs, by reason of any accident whatever, the person meeting with such accident, or some person acting in his behalf, shall notify the manager, under-manager, or other person in charge at such mine of the occurrence of such accident within 24 hours next after the accident takes place; and shall also notify the Secretary or other officer of the Committee for the said mine within 48 hours next after the accident takes place.

The notice shall be in the form of Schedule VIII., and shall be in duplicate.

Form of Applications for Allowances.

19. (1) Every application for an allowance under the Act shall be made to the Committee for the mine at which the accident happened, under the hand of the person claiming the allowance, as soon as possible after the date of the accident, and shall state—

- (a) Name in full of the deceased or person disabled.
- (b) Age of such person.
- (c) Name and description of mine at which accident happened.
- (d) Date of accident.
- (e) How the person was employed when accident happened.
- (f) Nature of accident.
- (g) Result of accident.
- (h) Whether married or single.

And in the case of a fatal accident shall further state—

- (i) Age of wife.
- (j) Name and age of each child under fourteen.
- (k) Date and time of death.
- (l) When such person was unmarried or a widower—names, relationship, and ages of those dependent on him.

(2) Every such application shall be accompanied by—

- (a) A certificate, signed by the manager or some other responsible official of the mine, that the deceased or the person disabled was at the time of the accident employed in or about such mine, and that the accident occurred in or about the working of such mine; and
- (b) A certificate, signed by a legally qualified medical practitioner or the local coroner, that the disablement or death was caused primarily by the accident referred to. In the case of disablement the nature and effects thereof shall be stated in such certificate.

Provided that, where the circumstances appear to warrant such a course, the Minister may dispense with a medical certificate in cases of disablement.

(3) Every application shall contain full and accurate particulars, and shall, in the case of death, be in the form of Schedule IX., and in the case of disablement be in the form of Schedule VIII.

Proof required before Payment of Allowance.

20. Before any allowance is granted, or any payment is made by any Committee, where death has resulted from the accident, such Committee shall satisfy itself that the application for such allowance was made in the form and contains the particulars prescribed by these Regulations, and shall require satisfactory proof to be given—

(a) Where the deceased was married—

- (1) If the deceased left a widow, of the marriage, and of the identity of such widow.
- (2) If the deceased left a child or children, of their identity, and of the age of each child.
- (3) If the deceased left a child or children, and a widow, but the widow subsequently died; or if the deceased left a child or children, but no widow: of the death of the widow, or that the deceased did not leave a widow, as the case may be, and the person claiming is the guardian, or has the care of the child or children.

(b) Where the deceased was unmarried—

- (1) If the deceased left a father, that he was at the time of his son's death dependent upon the deceased for support, and of his identity.

- (2) If the deceased left a mother, that she is a widow, and that she was at the time of his death dependent on deceased for support, and of her identity; that such widow had at the time of his death children, and of their ages, and of their identity.
- (3) If the father and mother of deceased be dead, or be not entitled to an allowance; that the deceased left a sister or sisters, that she or they are unmarried, and was or were at the time of his death dependent on deceased for support, and of their identity; that the sister or sisters had a child or children, and of their ages and identity.

Allowance granted to be indorsed upon Application.

21. As soon as an application for allowance has been dealt with by a Committee for the mine, there shall be indorsed upon such application, in the place provided for the purpose, full and accurate particulars of the—

- (a) Amount of allowance or allowances granted.
- (b) Name of person to whom granted, and in what capacity.
- (c) Date from which payment is to commence.

And such indorsement shall be signed and dated by the Chairman of the Committee.

Continuation of Relief.

22. Before making a second or succeeding payment of an allowance to any person claiming to be entitled to the same, the Committee may, if considered necessary, demand satisfactory evidence that the applicant is entitled to a continuance of the relief prescribed by the Acts.

Beneficiaries resuming Work.

23. When a person who has been in receipt of an allowance, by reason of disablement, is able to resume work, he shall, in writing, notify the Secretary of the Committee of the fact. Such notice may be given to the Secretary direct, or left at the office of the mine, addressed to him. Any person who resumes work without furnishing the notice herein prescribed shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

Board—Period of Appointment; Powers and Duties; Fees and Expenses.

24. The period of appointment of the Board shall be during the pleasure of the Governor in Council. The Board shall have the powers and duties set out in section 73 of the Act, and prescribed by the regulations. The fees to be paid to members shall be—Chairman Three pounds and other members Two pounds each for each day of meeting respectively, and necessary travelling expenses. The Chairman shall for such attendances at the Department as may be required for administrative purposes (being not less than one in each week) be paid in addition a sum of three pounds per week.

Committee's Expenses.

25. For the purpose of remunerating its officers and of paying local expenses under the Act and the Regulations not otherwise provided for, each Committee or joint Committee shall be paid from the fund an amount equal to five per centum on the moneys received by it in pursuance of section 76 of the Act, but not being greater than £25 nor less than £2 10s. per annum.

The first payment after the commencement of this Act shall be made on the moneys so received by the Committee from the date of its appointment, subsequent payments shall be made on the moneys so received after the date of the last receipts on which payment was made.

The payments to Committees for such expenses shall be made quarterly, and shall be paid direct to the Committees by the Board.

Payments—How ascertained, &c.

26. As soon as practicable after the termination of each quarter the Secretary of the Board shall, from the returns furnished from time to time by the several Committees, make a return showing the amounts of money received since the preceding return by the several Committees, in pursuance of section 76 of the Act, and showing the sums to which the several Committees are entitled for expenses. The Secretary to the Board shall forward to the Treasurer of such Committees cheques for the amounts payable to such Committee under these Regulations, and shall advise the Secretary of each Committee of such payment: Provided that where the returns furnished by any Committee are incomplete, the amount payable under the Regulations may be withheld pending the completion of such returns.

Owner's Payments under Section 74 and Returns to be made.

27. The owner of a mine shall make the payments prescribed by section 74 of the Act not later than thirty days after the termination of each quarter, by bank draft or post-office order made payable to the Secretary to the Board; and shall at the same time furnish the said Secretary with a return in the form of Schedule X., showing the sums deducted from the wages for each period of the quarter.

The fine imposed by section 82 of the Act shall also be paid by bank draft or post-office order to such Secretary.

The said Secretary shall give to the owner a receipt for any moneys so paid.

Non-payment of Moneys under Sections 74 and 82.

28. Upon report being made to the Board of the failure of any owner to pay within the period prescribed any moneys which he is liable to pay, under sections 74 or 82 of the Act to the fund, the Board shall cause proceedings to be instituted for the recovery of the same:

Accounts to be kept by Board.

29. The Board shall cause the various items of receipt and expenditure in connexion with the fund to be duly entered in a book or books in the form of Schedule XI.

The Board shall keep in a ledger—

- (a) A separate account of all moneys received from and paid to each Committee; such account shall be in the form of Schedule XII.
- (b) An "Investment Account," showing the investment of moneys of the fund.
- (c) Any other accounts that the Board may deem it necessary to keep.

The Board shall also keep an Entry Register in the form of Schedule XIII.

Proclamations to be observed.

30. A copy of any Regulation made under the Act shall be supplied to each Committee and to the Board by the Minister, and such Regulations shall be observed by such Committees and Board.

State Contribution.

31. Within thirty days after the termination of each quarter the Secretary to the Board shall notify to the Minister of the amount of the total payments then made by owners under section 74 of the Act, and shall apply for the payment to the funds out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund in terms of section 74 (b) of the Act.

Should any payment by an owner be made after the time prescribed the said Secretary shall forthwith notify the Minister of the amount, and apply for the payment to the fund of an equal amount out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund.

Proceedings of Board.

32. Proceedings at Board meetings shall be regulated as follows:—

1. The Board shall meet at the Department of Mines at such times as the Minister may require.
2. Any three members of the Board shall form a quorum.
3. The Board shall keep minutes of its proceedings.
4. The order of business at a Board meeting, after the confirmation of minutes, shall be as follows:—

The reading and consideration of the correspondence.

The consideration of any question of which notice shall have been given.

The consideration of any statements of accounts or reports prepared by the Secretary.

Such other business as may be brought forward.

5. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose one of their number to act temporarily as Chairman of the Board.

Proceedings of Committee.

33. The following directions and provisions shall have effect with respect to every Committee:—

1. The Committee shall meet as soon as convenient, but not later than one week after each pay-day, and at such other times as may be deemed necessary.
2. Any three members of the Committee shall form a quorum.
3. The Committee shall keep minutes of its proceedings, and such minutes shall show in detail all allowances granted at any meeting.
4. The Committee shall, from time to time, appoint some one of their number to be Chairman.
5. The Committee may appoint a Secretary and a Treasurer from their own number. The person so appointed to act as Secretary or Treasurer, as the case may be, shall hold office until his successor is appointed.
6. The order of business at a meeting of the Committee after the confirmation of the minutes shall be as follows:—

The reading and consideration of the correspondence; and the reports and statements of the Secretary and Treasurer.

The consideration of applications for allowances.

The consideration of all questions of which notice has been given.

Such other business as may be brought forward.

Procedure at Board and Committee Meetings.

34. The following additional directions and provisions shall have effect with respect to the Board and every Committee:—

1. Whenever at any appointed time of meeting, or at any time during a meeting, there is not a quorum present, the names of those members then present shall be recorded in the minute-book.
2. The reading of the minutes of any preceding meeting not previously confirmed shall form the first business at each meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereupon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; and upon their being confirmed, or amended and confirmed, as the case may be, they shall be signed by the Chairman of the meeting.
3. When a motion has been proposed and the debate thereon (if any) concluded, a question shall be proposed by the Chairman, and it shall be resolved in the affirmative or negative by the majority of voices "Aye" or "No."

4. In case of an equality of votes at any meeting, the Chairman for the time being of such meeting shall have a second or casting vote.
5. When any amendment has been made, the main question, as amended, shall be put, but when any amendments proposed have not been carried, the question shall be put as originally proposed.
6. The Chairman having put a question to the vote, shall state whether in his opinion the "Ayes" or "Noes" have it; and unless his opinion be acquiesced in by the minority the question shall be resolved by show of hands. Every member present when the question is so put shall vote, and the vote so given by each member shall be recorded in the minutes.
7. No member shall be entitled to vote on any question in which he has any direct pecuniary interest; and no member shall be entitled to vote in any show of hands unless he was present when the question was put.
8. If the number of votes has been inaccurately reported, the Chairman shall inform the meeting of the same, and shall cause the records to be corrected.
9. Any member rising to a point of order shall be allowed simply to direct attention to the point complained of, and submit it to the decision of the Chairman.
10. Every member desiring to speak shall rise in his place and address the Chairman, and if two or more members rise to speak the Chairman shall call upon the member who, in his opinion, rose first. If the Chairman's opinion be not concurred in by the meeting a notice may be made that a certain member (naming him) be now heard.

Officers of Board.—Appointment, Salaries, Expenses.

35. The officers of the Board shall be appointed by the Governor in Council; and the salaries of such officers and, except where otherwise provided, the expense of carrying out the provisions of the Act shall be paid out of moneys appropriated by Parliament for that purpose.

Duties of Officers.—Secretary to Board.

36. The Secretary to the Board shall—
1. Conduct the correspondence of the Board under the direction of the Chairman.
 2. Summon the meetings of the Board in accordance with these Regulations.
 3. Keep the minutes of the proceedings of the Board.
 4. Prepare and submit to the Board for adoption and transmission to the Minister in January of each year a report of the business transacted during the last preceding year; and such report shall contain such statistical tables, observations, explanations, and suggestions as to the Board may appear desirable.
 5. Keep the accounts of the Board in accordance with the requirements of these Regulations, and submit a statement of accounts and produce the books at each meeting of the Board.
 6. Report to the Board all payments made from the fund to the Committee.
 7. Make up the accounts for submission to and adoption by the Board.
 8. Be responsible for all moneys paid into his hands on account of the fund, and duly account for the same from time to time.
 9. Make such investments as the Board may authorize, and in such manner as it may direct.
 10. See that proper receipts are given and taken for all moneys received or paid by him.
 11. Be responsible for the safe custody of the account and other books of the Board, and any documents and papers affecting its interests; and of any minute and cash books received from Committees.
 12. Give security in the sum of £500.
 13. Make requisition (on the forms provided) to the Secretary for Mines for any furniture, books, stationery, and printing required by the Board.
 14. Forward each year to each Committee twelve copies of the Board's accounts after the same have been laid before Parliament.
 15. Forward a copy of every Proclamation published under the Act to each Committee.
 16. Report to the Board the non-payment of moneys by owners or Committees.

Local Secretary.

37. The Secretary to a Committee (termed in these Regulations the "Local Secretary") shall—
1. Conduct the correspondence of the Committee under the direction of the Chairman.
 2. Summon the meetings of the Committee in accordance with these Regulations.
 3. Keep the minutes of the proceedings of the Committee in accordance with these Regulations.
 4. Be responsible for the safe custody of the minute-book, and any documents and papers affecting the interests of the Committee, and forward to the Secretary to the Board the minute and cash books within six months after the same have ceased to be used for entries therein.
 5. Make requisition (on the forms provided) to the Secretary to the Board for any books and stationery required by the Committee.
 6. Act under the control and superintendence of the Committee.
 7. Report all appointments to and all vacancies on the Committee to the Secretary to the Board.

Local Treasurer.

38. The Treasurer to a Committee (herein termed the "Local Treasurer") shall—
1. Keep the accounts of the Committee in accordance with the requirements of these Regulations.
 2. Be responsible for all moneys paid into his hands on behalf of his Committee, and duly account for the same from time to time.

3. Produce the account-books at each meeting, and at any other time when required by a member of the Committee, or for the purposes of audit, or when necessary under these Regulations.
4. Prepare the copy of the cash-book required by these Regulations to be furnished to the Board, for submission to and certification by the Chairman.
5. Pay all allowances granted by the Committee, and obtain proper acquittances for such payments in the form prescribed by the Regulations.
6. Be responsible for the safe custody of the cash-book of the Committee until it is no longer required for making entries therein, when he shall hand it to the Secretary.
7. Report the non-payment of moneys by any owner or manager.
8. The Board may direct that the accounts of any Committee shall be conducted by means of an account current with any conveniently situated bank. Where such direction is given all moneys paid to a Committee by the owner or manager of a mine, or by the Board, shall be deposited to the credit of such Committee with such bank, and all amounts payable by such Committee shall be paid by cheques drawn upon such bank, and signed by two officers of such Committee.

Returns, for Employés' Information.

39. The Committee of a mine shall, after every ordinary meeting of such Committee, cause a return to be prepared in the form of Schedule XIV., showing—

1. The aggregate amount deducted from wages and paid to the Committee, under section 76 of the Act, for the pay period immediately preceding the meeting of the Committee;
2. The amounts voted by such Committee in payment of allowances, as prescribed;
3. The names of the persons to whom such allowances were voted; and
4. The amount unexpended and forwarded to the Board.

The correctness of such return shall be certified to by the officers of the Committee.

The Committee shall, within three days after the meeting, cause such return to be posted in a conspicuous place at or near the entrance to the mine, for the information of employés of the mine.

Breach—Penalty.

40. If any person contravenes or fails to comply with any of the foregoing Regulations, or makes any return, statement, or certificate, which is to his knowledge false in any particular, he shall be guilty of a breach of such Regulations, and shall be liable for each such breach to a penalty not exceeding £5.

- (ii.) if the father and mother of the deceased are dead, or are not entitled to an allowance, a weekly sum of Eight shillings, payable to the sister or sisters of the deceased (sharing equally) while such sister or any of such sisters is or are alive and unmarried, if, in the opinion of the Committee she or they were at the time of his death dependent on the deceased for support;

- (iii.) a weekly sum of Two shillings and sixpence for each child of the mother of the deceased, or of the sister or sisters of the deceased, payable to the mother or to the sister or sisters, as the case may be, until such child attains the age of fourteen years, if, in the opinion of the Committee, such mother or such sister or sisters was or were at the time of his death dependent on the deceased for support;
