# DETERMINATION OF CARRIAGE BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons, or classes of persons, employed either inside or outside a factory or work-room in the process, trade, or business connected with or incidental to the manufacturing, making, or repairing of—(a) Carriages, carts, and other vehicles other than perambulators), or any part or parts thereof, such as the ironwork or bodies, hoods, cushions, springs, axles, wheels, tyres, rims, hubs, or spokes; (b) Motor car bodies, or any part or parts thereof, such as the hoods or cushions, has made the following Determination, namely:—

#### ADULT PERSONS.-WAGES.

1. That the lowest prices or rates of payment payable to the following classes of persons employed either inside or outside a factory or work-room in the process, trade, or business connected with or incidental to the manufacturing, making, or repairing of—(a) Carriages, carts, and other vehicles (other than perambulators), or any part or parts thereof, such as the ironwork or bodies, hoods, cushions, springs, axles, wheels, tyres, rims, hubs, or spokes; (b) Motor car bodies, or any part or parts thereof, such as the hoods or cushions, shall be—

That the lowest prices or rates of payment payable to apprentices employed either inside or outside a factory or work-room in the process, trade, or business connected with or incidental to the manufacturing, making, or repairing of—(a) Carriages, carts, and other vehicles (other than perambulators), or any part or parts thereof, such as the ironwork or bodies, hoods, cushions, springs, axles, wheels, tyres, rims, hubs, or spokes: (b) Motor car bodies, or any part or parts thereof, such as the hoods or cushions, shall be the following:—

That the lowest prices or rates of payment payable to improvers employed either inside or outside a factory or work-room in the process, trade, or business connected with or incidental to the manufacturing, making, or repairing of—(a) Carriages, carts, and other vehicles (other than perambulators), or any part or parts thereof, such as the ironwork or bodies, hoods, cushions, springs, axles, wheels, tyres, rims, hubs, or spokes; (b) Motor car bodies, or any part or parts thereof, such as the hoods or cushions, shall be the following:—

# IMPROVERS.—NUMBER.

4. That the number of improvers who may be employed within any factory or work-room or shop or place in which the process, trade, or business connected with or incidental to the manufacturing, making, or repairing of—(a) Carriages, carts, and other vehicles (other than perambulators), or any part

or parts thereof, such as the ironwork or bodies, hoods, cushions, springs, axles, wheels, tyres, rims, hubs, or spokes; (b) Motor car bodies, or any part or parts thereof, such as the hoods or cushions, is carried on shall be as follows:—

IMPROVERS OTHER THAN IMPROVERS AT SPRING MAKING AND SPRING FITTING AND AXLE MAKING.

One improver to every four persons, or fraction thereof, receiving not less than 52s. per week of 48 hours.

#### IMPROVERS AT SPRING MAKING AND SPRING FITTING.

One improver to one person or two persons receiving not less than 56s. per week of 48 hours, and thereafter one improver to every additional two persons receiving not less than 56s. per week of 48 hours.

#### IMPROVERS AT AXLE MAKING.

One improver to one person or two persons receiving not less than 52s. per week of 48 hours, and thereafter one improver to every additional two persons receiving not less than 52s. per week of 48 hours.

#### JUVENILE WORKERS.

5. (1) That the lowest prices or rates of payment payable to juvenile workers, other than juvenile workers engaged in spring making and spring fitting, or in wheel making, or in axle making, shall be—

A juvenile worker to whom the last-mentioned prices or rates are to be paid is a person other than an apprentice or improver, under 21 years of age, engaged in any one or more of the following classes of work:—Priming, filling up, rubbing down, grinding paint, sandpapering, cleaning paint pots, washing down vehicles, taking off and putting on wheels, cleaning plated work, washering wheels, screwing up bolts, and clips, cutting wedges, stripping old work, cleaning and oiling machinery, blowing bellows, striking, drilling and screwing, assisting vyceman, cleaning old ironwork, smudging springs, bending tyres, heating tyre furnace, assisting at putting on tyres, running messages, teasing hair and fibre, cleaning and oiling upleather work, or cleaning up shop.

- (2) Juvenile workers engaged in spring making and spring fitting.—The lowest prices or rates of payment payable to juvenile workers engaged in spring making and spring fitting shall be as follows:—
  - (a) Juvenile workers, meaning persons other than apprentices or improvers, under 21 years of age engaged in striking, steam and cushion hammer driving, screwing up bolts and clips, stripping old springs, putting springs together or taking same asunder, cleaning and oiling springs and machinery, blowing bellows, drilling and screwing, assisting vyceman, cleaning old ironwork, smudging springs, operating tyre rolling machines, heating and attending spring furnaces, pinching in springs and racking steel assisting stokers, running messages, or cleaning up shop—

(4) Juvenile workers engaged in wheel making.—The lowest prices or rates of payment payable to juvenile workers, meaning thereby persons other than apprentices or improvers, under 21 years of age, engaged in sandpapering, taking off and putting on wheels, cleaning plated work, washering wheels, screwing up bolts and clips, stripping old work, cleaning and oiling machinery, blowing bellows, striking, drilling and screwing, assisting vycemen, cleaning old ironwork, smudging springs, bending tyres, heating tyre furnaces, assisting at putting on tyres, running messages, teasing hair, fibre, &c., cleaning and oiling up leather work, packing and unpacking material, or cleaning up shop, shall be—

#### OVERTIME.

7. That 48 hours shall be the maximum number of hours per week for which the lowest prices or rates fixed by this Determination to be paid to any person or persons, or classes of persons, shall be payable. Any employé shall be paid at the rate of time and a quarter for any time for which he works in excess of the said maximum number of hours per week.

# HOLIDAYS.—SPECIAL RATES FOR.

- 8. That the price or rate of payment payable to any person or persons, or classes of persons, employed in the process, trade, or business connected with or incidental to the manufacturing, making, or repairing of—(a) Carriages, carts, and other vehicles (other than perambulators), or any part or parts thereof, such as the ironwork or bodies, hoods, cushions, springs, axles, wheels, tyres, rims, hubs, or spokes; (b) Motor car bodies, or any part or parts thereof, such as the hoods or cushions—for all work done on Sunday, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, and Eight Hours' Day shall be double the minimum price or rate fixed by this Determination for such person or persons or classes of persons.
  - 9. That the above Determination shall come into force on and after the 2nd day of April, 1910.
