

QUARTERLY STATISTICAL ABSTRACT
TO 31ST DECEMBER, 1909.

QUARTERLY STATISTICAL ABSTRACT, 31ST DECEMBER, 1909.

Population.—The estimated population on 30th September, 1909, was 1,289,140—648,718 males, 640,422 females; on 31st December, 1909, it was 1,297,557—654,099 males, 643,458 females—thus showing an increase of 8,417 persons. The natural increase during the quarter was 4,174, and the excess of immigration was 4,243. Tasmania gained from this State 1,732 persons, and New Zealand 351. New South Wales lost to Victoria 2,422 persons, the United Kingdom 1,067, Queensland 831, and South Australia 307.

Vital Statistics of the State.—Compared with the previous quarter, the births decreased by 560 in the quarter under review, and the deaths by 317, but the marriages increased by 34; the decrease in the excess of births over deaths was 243. Of the total number of deaths (3,543), 277 were due to phthisis, and 86 to other tubercular diseases; 266 to cancer; 14 to typhoid fever; and 18 to diphtheria and croup.

Vital Statistics of Melbourne, &c.—The births during the year numbered, 13,418. This includes 140 cases of twins, 3 cases of triplets, and 1,266 illegitimate births. The deaths numbered 6,928, and the excess of births over deaths was 6,490. The deaths from diphtheria numbered 48; from typhoid fever 48; and from tubercular diseases 694, as against 52, 61, and 768 respectively in 1908. The total deaths in Melbourne were 6,928, of which 1,126 were under twelve months of age. In Ballarat, of 781 deaths, 125 were of infants; in Bendigo, of 791 deaths, 131 were of infants; and in Geelong, of 359 deaths, 59 were of infants. In Melbourne and Suburbs the deaths of infants under 1 year of age were 8.4 per cent. of the births—a rate higher than that of the whole State, viz., 7.1. In the four towns mentioned there were 3,125 deaths of people aged 65 years and upwards—or 35 per cent. of the total.

State Revenue and Expenditure.—The total revenue for the quarter was £2,060,840—an increase of £37,565 on the corresponding quarter of the previous year—the principal sources being Railways £1,173,350, Probate Duty £104,030, Stamp Duty £53,942, and Balance of Commonwealth Revenue £411,623. The total expenditure was £2,130,632, an increase of £204,166 on that of the corresponding quarter of 1908.

Commonwealth Revenue and Expenditure in Account with the State of Victoria.—The total Commonwealth Revenue credited to this State was £974,984, as against £881,927 in the corresponding period of 1908, being an increase of £93,057 for the quarter under review. The principal sources were import duties on Stimulants and Narcotics, £189,799; Agricultural Products and Groceries, £68,838; Apparel and Textiles, £91,953; and on Metals and Machinery, £57,085. From excise, Spirits yielded £17,731; Beer, £58,479; Tobacco, £44,725; and Sugar, £68,889. The total expenditure on transferred services was £201,692 (Defence, £79,714; Postmaster-General, £204,372; Trade and Customs, £17,606) and "new" expenditure, £228,033—a total of £529,725, as against £462,845 in the corresponding quarter of 1908—an increase of £66,880.

Railways.—Compared with the corresponding quarter of the preceding year, the revenue increased by £90,636; the expenditure by £16,474; train miles run by 103,961; the tonnage of goods and live stock by 112,263; and passengers carried by 1,282,591.

Victorian Banking Returns.—On the 31st December the total liabilities of the banks were £40,899,719 and the assets £43,950,648, as against £37,809,065 and £43,412,998 on the 31st December, 1903. The reserves amounted to £6,440,770; paid-up capital to £13,615,937. The ratio of coin and bullion to liabilities was 20.76 per cent.

Savings Banks.—On the 31st December the amount at credit of the 545,130 depositors was £14,471,566. During the quarter 21,565 accounts were opened, and 15,897 were closed; the deposits during the quarter were £2,930,097 and the withdrawals £2,663,347.

Gold Yield.—The total yield of gold up to the end of December, 1909, is 71,379,888 ounces.

Imports and Exports.—The total value of imports into Victoria during the year 1909 was £28,243,235, of which £11,734,270 were from the other States of Australia. The total exports during the same period were valued at £29,905,695, of which £12,045,261 were exported to Australian States. The exports of Australian produce were valued at £26,623,908.

Exports of Frozen, Preserved, and Perishable Products.—For the final quarter in 1909, the total value of these exports oversea through Government Cool Stores was £1,331,455, of which £1,296,735 went to the United Kingdom, £11,159 to South Africa, and £23,561 to Eastern and other ports. The principal exports were butter, valued at £963,701; mutton and lamb, £359,609; and beef, £3,895.
