12. The publication of a notice in the *Government Gazette*, purporting to declare that the Governor or Administrator, with the advice aforesaid, has forfeited this licence, shall be conclusive evidence that the licence is forfeited.

13. The ring barking of the timber upon the land by the licensee is forbidden, and he shall not be entitled to destroy or cut and take away any such timber.

14. Free access to water shall be kept open at all times for travelling and other stock and for persons desiring to take water for domestic purposes.

15. The licensee shall destroy all thistles on the land, and on the half width of the adjoining roads, and shall be responsible for the destruction of thistles under the *Thistle Act* 1890 in like manner as holders of freehold lands.

16. The licensee shall keep the land free from vermin, and, should he fail to do so, the licence shall be liable to forfeiture.

17. This licence is issued subject to the right of saw-millers to graze on this area such horses and bullocks as are actually used in connexion with their licensed operations on this land.

18. In the event of the area being damaged by fire, the licence may be forfeited unless the licensee satisfy the Minister that neither he, directly or indirectly, nor his workmen or servants were in any way responsible therefor.

Special Conditions.

REGULATION NO. 21.—STREET HAWKERS.

A Regulation of the City of Brunswick, numbered 21, made by Special Order under the provisions of the *Local Government Act* 1903, for the purpose of fixing the amounts of tolls and dues payable by all persons who hawk Market Commodities, Produce, Provisions, Edibles, &c., in certain specified portions of the City of Brunswick.

IN pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1903, and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the Municipality of the City of Brunswick doth hereby order and direct that the following tolls and dues shall be demanded, received, and had by the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Brunswick from all persons hawking Market Commodities, Produce, Provisions, Edibles, &c., in the streets, ways, or places specified as follows:—

For every cart with vegetables, foliage, ferns, flowers, saplings, milk, honey, honeycomb, fruit, fish, ice cream, or any class of butchers' meat or small goods:—1s. per day, 3s. per week, 8s. per month, 20s. per quarter.

For every wheelbarrow with vegetables, foliage, ferns, flowers, saplings, milk, honey, honeycomb, fruit, fish, ice cream, or any class of butchers' meat or small goods:—6d. per day, 2s. per week, 6s. per month, 15s. per quarter.

For every handbasket with vegetables, foliage, ferns, flowers, saplings, milk, honey, honeycomb, fruit, fish, ice cream, or any class of butchers' meat or small goods:—3d. per day, 1s. per week, 2s. per month, 8s. per quarter.

Provided always that the scale of dues payable by hawkers who are local ratepayers be reduced by one-half in every respect.

Hawkers' dues under this Regulation shall be payable throughout the City of Brunswick, except in the streets or portion of streets contained in the following Schedule, viz. :—

SCHEDULE OF STREETS IN WHICH HAWKING IS NOT ALLOWED.

Sydney-road, from Park-street to Moreland-road.
Lygon-street, from Park-street to Albion-street.
All cross streets off Sydney-road within 40 feet of east and west side of Sydney-road.
All cross streets off that portion of Lygon-street above referred to within 40 feet from the east and west side of the said portion of Lygon-street.

The Regulation dealing with hawkers appearing in the minutes of ordinary meeting of the Council, held on 22nd September, 1902, folio 276, starting at the word "For every cart with vegetables, &c., &c.," and continuing on folio 277, and terminating with the words "The payment of such dues, unless they actually use the market," be rescinded, and be inoperative on and after the 1st day of May, 1910, and from that date Regulation No. 21 be in force in lieu of same.
