## IN THE COURT OF INDUSTRIAL APPEALS.

In the MATTER of the FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACTS and in the MATTER of the DETERMINATION dated the 3rd day of November, 1909, of the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons wheresoever employed in the business of a Hairdresser, or Barber, or Wig Maker, or other workers of hair.

Tuesday, the 24th day of May, 1910.

THIS APPEAL, coming on for hearing before this Court on the 23rd and 24th days of May instant: Upon reading the Notice of Appeal herein dated the 16th day of November, 1909, and upon hearing what was alleged in support of and in opposition to the said Appeal, this Court doth order and determine that the determination of the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons wheresover employed in the business of a Hairdresser, or Barber, or Wig Maker, or other Workers of Hair, dated the 3rd day of November, 1909, be amended by striking out paragraph 4 (a), and substituting therefor:—

One improver for the first employé engaged in Chair Work for not less than six months, and receiving not less than the minimum wage; and one additional improver for each additional four employés employed in Chair Work for not less than six months, and receiving not less than the minimum wage.

This Determination to come into force on the 1st day of July, 1910.
