

## QUARTERLY STATISTICAL ABSTRACT, 31ST MARCH, 1910.

*Population.*—The estimated population on the 31st December, 1909, was 1,297,557—654,099 males, 643,458 females; on the 31st March, 1910, it was 1,302,934—656,675 males, 646,259 females—thus showing an increase of 5,377 persons. The natural increase during the quarter was 3,929, and the excess of immigration was 1,448. New South Wales gained from this State 1,507 persons, South Africa 112, and New Zealand 51. Tasmania lost 2,518 persons, the United Kingdom 391, and Western Australia 72.

*Vital Statistics of the State.*—Compared with the previous quarter, the marriages increased by 289 in the quarter under review, the births by 32, and the deaths by 277, which gave a decrease in the excess of births over deaths of 245. Of the total number of deaths (3,820), 274 were due to phthisis, and 62 to other tubercular diseases; 256 to cancer; 57 to typhoid fever; and 16 to diphtheria and croup.

*Vital Statistics of Melbourne, &c.*—The births during the quarter numbered 3,323. This includes one case of triplets, 43 cases of twins, and 281 illegitimate births. The deaths numbered 1,783, and the excess of births over deaths was 1,540. The deaths from diphtheria and croup numbered 9, from typhoid fever 19, and from tubercular diseases 167, as against 4, 22, and 140 respectively in the corresponding quarter of the previous year. The total deaths in Melbourne were 1,783, of whom 435 were under twelve months of age. In Ballarat, of 233 deaths, 57 were of infants; in Bendigo, of 193 deaths, 48 were of infants, and in Geelong, of 103 deaths, 20 were of infants. In Melbourne and Suburbs the deaths of infants under 1 year of age were 13.1 per cent. of the births—a rate higher than that of the whole State, viz., 11.4. In the four towns mentioned there were 714 deaths of people aged 65 years and upwards—or 31 per cent. of the total.

*State Revenue and Expenditure.*—The total revenue for the quarter was £2,199,736—a decrease of £109,003 on the corresponding quarter of the previous year—the principal sources being Railways £1,270,767, and Balance of Commonwealth Revenue £485,873. The total expenditure was £1,842,283, a decrease of £197,989 on that of the corresponding quarter of 1909.

*Commonwealth Revenue and Expenditure in Account with the State of Victoria.*—The total Commonwealth Revenue credited to this State was £1,045,363, as against £1,034,432 in the corresponding period of 1909, being an increase of £10,931 for the quarter under review. The principal sources were import duties on Stimulants and Narcotics, £171,425; Agricultural Products and Groceries, £48,496; Apparel and Textiles, £203,695; and on Metals and Machinery, £55,210. From excise, Spirits yielded £17,725; Beer, £55,558; Tobacco, £40,201; and Sugar, £70,388. The total expenditure on transferred services was £335,246 (Defence, £119,325; Postmaster-General, £197,466; Trade and Customs, £17,449), and "new" expenditure, £244,343—a total of £579,589, as against £396,501 in the corresponding quarter of 1909—an increase of £183,088.

*Railways.*—Compared with the corresponding quarter of the preceding year, the revenue increased by £71,415, the expenditure by £65,218, train miles run by 49,305, passengers carried by 1,606,910, and the tonnage of goods and live stock by 19,074.

*Victorian Banking Returns.*—On the 31st March the total liabilities of the banks were £43,210,094 and the assets £43,256,603, as against £39,844,947 and £42,839,525 on the 31st March, 1909. The reserves amounted to £6,740,004; paid-up capital to £13,616,069. The ratio of coin and bullion to liabilities was 19.18 per cent.

*Savings Banks.*—On the 31st March the amount at credit of the 552,404 depositors was £14,776,588. During the quarter 24,339 accounts were opened, and 17,065 were closed; the deposits made were £2,945,127, and the withdrawals £2,647,325.

*Gold Yield.*—The total yield of gold up to the end of March, 1910, is 71,529,658 ounces.

*Imports and Exports.*—The total value of imports into Victoria during the quarter under review was £6,799,351, of which £1,985,472 were from the other States of Australia. The total exports during the same period were valued at £8,843,455, of which £2,932,692 were exported to Australian States. The exports of Australian produce were valued at £7,943,701.

*Exports of Frozen, Preserved, and Perishable Products.*—For the first quarter in 1910, the total value of these exports oversea through Cool Stores was £699,405, of which £641,570 went to the United Kingdom, £15,786 to South Africa, and £42,049 to Eastern and other ports. The principal exports were—Butter, valued at £467,892; Mutton and Lamb, £152,775; Fruit, £55,013; and Beef, £13,207.
