WHEREAS by section 95 of the *Water Act 1905* it is enacted that where in any Order in Council, whether made before or after the passing of the said Act, it has not been provided that the Commissioners of any Waterworks Trust are to be elected by the ratepayers, the Governor in Council, upon a petition of a majority of the ratepayers, may, if he thinks fit, declare that the Commissioners shall, from a date to be named in such Order, cease to be such Commissioners, and shall, from such day, be succeeded by Commissioners elected by the ratepayers:

And whereas it is further provided by the aforesaid section 95 that the Governor in Council may, by the same or any subsequent Order, direct that any number of Commissioners stated in such Order shall, within a time specified in such Order, and thereafter from time to time, be elected in such manner as may be prescribed by Regulations made by the Governor in Council:

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the 23rd day of November, 1885, a Waterworks Trust, known as the Upper Macedon Waterworks Trust, was duly constituted, and it has been ordered and provided that the Councillors for the Macedon Riding of the Shire of Gisborne and two other persons should be the Commissioners of the said Trust:

And whereas a petition has been signed by a majority of the ratepayers within the Waterworks District of the said Waterworks Trust praying that the Municipal Councillors for the Macedon Riding of the Shire of Gisborne and the two other persons appointed Commissioners of the said Trust shall cease to hold office as such Commissioners, and that they be succeeded by Commissioners to be elected by the ratepayers within the Waterworks District of the said Trust:

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by the provisions of the said *Water Act 1905*, doth hereby declare that the persons holding office as Commissioners of the said Upper Macedon Waterworks Trust, by virtue of their office as Municipal Councillors for the Macedon Riding of the Shire of Gisborne, and the two other persons appointed Commissioners of the said Trust, shall, after the fifth day

of August, 1910, cease to hold office as such Commissioners accordingly, and shall, after such day, be succeeded by five Commissioners to be elected for such Trust on the sixth day of August, 1910, in the manner prescribed by regulations made for that purpose and also for the purpose of conducting subsequent elections.

And the Honorable George Graham, His Majesty's Minister of Water Supply for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

*Mines Act 1904.*REGULATIONS FOR GRANTING CERTIFICATES  
TO MINING MANAGERS, ETC.

WHEREAS by the *Mines Act 1904* (4 Edw. VII. No. 1961) it is amongst other things provided that the Board of Examiners for mining managers shall hold examinations, and that the subjects of such examinations, the fees chargeable therefor, and the mode in which they are to be conducted, may be prescribed by Regulations made and published pursuant to sections 77 and 78 of the Principal Act (*Mines Act 1890*): Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the provisions of the *Mines Act 1904* and the *Coal Mines Regulation Act 1909*, doth hereby cancel the Regulations made by Order in Council of the 1st August, 1905, and doth substitute the following Regulations therefor, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS FOR GRANTING CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY TO MINING MANAGERS OF LOBE AND ALLUVIAL MINES, UNDERGROUND FOREMEN, BATTERY MANAGERS, CYANIDE WORKS MANAGERS, AND CHLORINATION WORKS MANAGERS BY THE BOARD OF EXAMINERS FOR MINING MANAGERS.

1. Examinations will be conducted by the Board at such time and place as may from time to time be notified by the secretary in the *Government Gazette* and in a newspaper published or circulated in the locality, and candidates will be examined according to priority of receipt of notice as required by clause 2. Each candidate will be duly notified of the time and place of the examination.

2. Any person desiring to present himself for examination shall notify the Secretary for Mines, Melbourne, on an application form, which may be obtained from the secretary to the Board, such notice to be given not less than twenty-one clear days prior to the date of the examination. The notice shall be accompanied by the fee prescribed in Regulation 5a or 5b, as the case may be. This fee shall admit to one examination only.

3. Should the applicant pass the prescribed examination, the deposit shall in each instance go towards payment of the fee for certificate. In the event, however, of the failure of the candidate to pass the examination, such amount shall be forfeited to the consolidated revenue.

4. No certificate shall be issued until full payment of the additional fee required by Regulation 5c or 5d, as the case may be, shall have been made to the Secretary for Mines.

5. The fees to be paid by an applicant for a certificate shall be as follows:—

6. No person shall be eligible for a certificate under these Regulations unless he has attained the age specified in the following schedule:—

(a) For a first class certificate as mining manager	25
(b) For a second class certificate as mining manager	23
(c) For a certificate as underground foreman	21
(d) For a certificate as battery manager	21
(e) For a certificate as cyanide works manager	20
(f) For a certificate as chlorination works manager	20

7. If a candidate shall fail to pass the examination prescribed, he shall not again present himself until a period of not less than three months shall have elapsed from the date of his last examination.

8. The examinations may be conducted partly by means of written papers, and partly *viva voce*.

9. Every candidate for a certificate shall produce evidence satisfactory to the Board that he has had experience as follows:—

- (a) For a first class certificate as mining manager: five years' practical mining experience.
- (b) For a second class certificate as mining manager: three years' practical mining experience.
- (c) For a certificate as underground foreman: two years' practical mining experience.
- (d) For a certificate as battery manager: one year in charge of works, or under a competent manager.
- (e) For a certificate as cyanide works manager: one year in charge of works, or under a competent manager.
- (f) For a certificate as chlorination works manager: one year in charge of works, or under a competent manager.

10. Every candidate shall produce to the Board testimonials in proof of the nature and extent of his practical experience, sobriety, and general good character, and stating that he is not subject to any mental or bodily infirmity likely to interfere with the efficient discharge of his duties, such testimonials to be signed by his previous employers, and in the case of a registered company, by the legal manager and chairman of directors of the company.

11. No candidate for any certificate shall be entitled to be examined by the Board unless he produces evidence to comply with Regulation 9.

12. The Board shall grant a certificate of competency to any person who has complied with Regulations 6, 9, and 10, and who shall produce to the Board a certificate of having passed the requisite examinations from and under the seal of any school of mines or educational institution whose curriculum, training, and subjects for and mode of examination are approved of by the said Board, and every such certificate shall state that it is issued on the certificate of a school of mines or educational institution approved by the Board, and also the name of such school or institution.

13. Every candidate for a certificate shall, upon presenting himself before the Board for examination, make a statutory declaration that the testimonials he produces are genuine and true and correct in every particular; such declaration, together with copies of the testimonials produced, to be retained by the Board. The original testimonials must be produced as well as copies, but the originals will be returned after perusal.

14. If in any case the Board does not deem as satisfactory the evidence submitted by any candidate as required by Regulations 9 and 10, they shall refuse to allow such candidate to present himself for examination, but this will not disqualify him from again making application to the Board in connexion with any subsequent examination.

15. If a candidate attempt to obtain a certificate by means of false testimonials, he shall forfeit his application fee, and shall not be allowed to again present himself for examination until a period of two years has elapsed from the date of his last appearance before the Board.

16. Every holder of a certificate as second class mining manager or underground foreman under these Regulations must produce such to the Board previous to his being examined for a higher certificate, and in the event of the latter being granted, the certificate he holds shall be surrendered and delivered up to the Board.

17. Whenever any person proves to the satisfaction of the Board of Examiners that he has, without fault on his part, lost or been deprived of any certificate previously granted to him under these Regulations, such Board shall, upon payment of the fee specified in Regulation 5e, cause a copy of the certificate to which the applicant appears to be entitled to be made out and certified to, by the secretary to the Board, and delivered to the applicant, and any copy so made and certified to, as aforesaid, shall have the effect of the original certificate. The fee herein referred to shall be paid to the Secretary for Mines in cash or post-office order, and shall by him be paid into the consolidated revenue.

18. Any person holding a certificate under these Regulations, and who is charged with any offence or misconduct likely to be detrimental to the efficient discharge of his duties, may render himself liable to have his certificate suspended or cancelled by the Board.

19. The Board will issue first and second class mining managers' certificates for lode and alluvial mines, and certificates for underground foremen, battery managers, cyanide works managers, and chlorination works managers.

## 20. MINING MANAGERS.—1ST CLASS.

Candidates for examination for a first class certificate as mining manager must pass in all the following subjects under the heading of Group "A," and also in all the subjects of one at least of Groups "B" and "C," depending upon the certificate applied for and the nature of the practical experience. The details specified are intended to serve merely as a guide to candidates:—

### Group "A."—General.

**Arithmetic.**—Elementary rules, and simple mensuration.  
**Surveying.**—Knowledge of surface and underground surveying; adjustment and use of level, compass, and theodolite; making of mine plans; and measurement of ore bodies.

**Mining.**—(a) The laying out and construction of shafts, chambers, levels, winzes, and other underground workings. The methods of timbering or otherwise supporting the workings, and of filling old workings. The tapping of water under pressure. (b) The drainage of mines and construction of underground dams. The construction and use of safety cages, detaching hooks, apparatus for preventing overwinding, and other safety appliances. The strength of ropes, chains, timber, and other materials.

**Blasting.**—and the nature, properties, and uses of explosives.

**Ventilation.**—Theory and practice of the various methods of ventilation; construction of airways and the effect of friction. The nature and composition of explosive and dangerous gases.

**Machinery.**—The principles of action, methods of inspection and testing, and the care of winding and pumping machinery, condensing and non-condensing; air compressors and boilers; electrical appliances.

**Surface Work.**—Erection of mining plant; and the laying out and construction of tramways, water races and flumes; and generally all subjects connected with surface works.

**Mining Geology.**—Methods of testing useful minerals. General principles of geology. Knowledge of the more common country rocks. Modes of occurrence of lodes, beds, lenses, and other mineral deposits. Location of shafts. Effects of faults.

**Bookkeeping.**—Mine accounts and cost sheets.

**Mining Law.**—A knowledge of the regulations under the Mines Acts.

**First Aid.**—A knowledge of the principles and practice of "First aid."

### Group "B."—Lode Mines.

Lode mine workings. Sampling of lodes and ore products. Principles of ore dressing. Construction, erection, use, and care of appliances for crushing and concentrating.

### Group "C."—Alluvial Mines.

Alluvial mine workings. Construction, erection, use, and care of pumping, puddling, sluicing, and other appliances. Hydraulic sluicing.

## 21. MINING MANAGERS.—2ND CLASS.

Candidates for examination for a second class certificate as mining manager must pass in the following subjects under the heading of Group "A":—Arithmetic, surveying, ventilation, blasting, mining (a) and (b), mining law, and "First aid."

### 22. UNDERGROUND FOREMEN.

Candidates for examination for a certificate as underground foreman must pass in the following subjects under the heading of Group "A":—Arithmetic, blasting, mining (a), simple ventilation, mining law, and "First aid."

### 23. BATTERY MANAGERS.

Candidates for examination for a certificate as battery manager must pass in the following subjects:—Mineral composition of ores, sampling of ore products, construction, adjustment, use, and care of appliances for crushing and concentrating, amalgamating, care and treatment of copper plates, cleaning up, retorting, and smelting.

### 24. CYANIDE WORKS MANAGERS.

Candidates for examination for a certificate as cyanide works manager must pass in the principles and practice of the process; sampling; assaying; design, erection, and working of plant.

### 25. CHLORINATION WORKS MANAGERS.

Candidates for examination for a certificate as chlorination works manager must pass in the principles and practice of the process; sampling; assaying; design, erection, and working of plant.

And the Honorable Peter McBride, His Majesty's Minister of Mines for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

UPPER MACEDON WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATIONS FOR THE ELECTION OF COMMISSIONERS.

WHEREAS by Division 3 of Part III. of the *Water Act 1905* the Governor in Council is empowered to make regulations for the election of Commissioners of Waterworks Trusts: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth for the purposes aforesaid make the following regulations for the election of Commissioners of the Upper Macedon Waterworks Trust.

1. Interpretation of terms.—In these regulations "the Trust" or "the said Trust" shall mean the Upper Macedon Waterworks Trust. "Minister" shall mean the Minister of Water Supply.

2. Period for which Commissioners shall hold office.—The period for which the Commissioners shall hold office shall be three years, and shall date on and from the date of election.

3. Extraordinary vacancies, how filled.—Should any vacancy in the office of Commissioner be occasioned by death, disqualification, or any other cause whatever, the same shall be filled up by election under these regulations, within one month after the vacancy has occurred, and the person elected to fill such vacancy shall hold the office of Commissioner during the unexpired portion of the term of office of the Commissioner whose seat shall have become vacant.

4. Date of first and subsequent Election of Commissioners.—The first election of Commissioners under these regulations shall be held on the 6th day of August, 1910, and the ordinary election of Commissioners shall be held on the 6th day of August in each succeeding triennial year. Provided that whenever such date shall fall upon a Sunday or any day set apart as a public holiday such election shall be held upon the day next following.

5. Voters' List to be prepared.—For the purposes of the first election of Commissioners a voters' list shall be prepared in like manner to that provided by section 96 of the *Water Act 1905* in so far as circumstances will admit, on or before the 5th day of July, 1910, by the Secretary to the Trust, certified by him as correct, and such list shall be the list of voters for the said election of Commissioners, and shall remain in force, and shall be used at any subsequent election of Commissioners that may be held prior to a fresh voters' list being made out as hereinafter provided.

6. Voters' List to be prepared annually.—Before the last day of February in each year a voters' list shall be made out in the manner prescribed by section 96 of the *Water Act 1905*, which shall, upon approval of the Commissioners under the common seal of the Trust, be the list of voters for the election of Commissioners for the twelve months next ensuing.

7. Form of Voters' List.—First Schedule.—Such voters' list shall be in the form in the First Schedule hereto, and shall contain, in regular numerical sequence and alphabetical order of surname, the christian name or names, surname, and address (so far as these may be known) of every ratepayer within that portion of the municipal district of the Shire of Gisborne included within the district of the Waterworks Trust.

In making out such list of voters, if the property in respect of which any ratepayer is entitled to vote is only in part within the Waterworks district, then the number of votes of such ratepayer in respect of such property shall be reduced in the proportion which such part bears to the whole property of such ratepayer rated in the municipal district.

8. Minister may appoint returning officer for first election.—Chairman of Trust to be returning officer at subsequent elections.—For the purpose of the first election herein mentioned the Minister shall appoint some fit and proper person to be returning officer; but for every subsequent election (whether ordinary or extraordinary) the Chairman of the Trust holding office as such on the day immediately preceding the date of election shall be the returning officer; but if at the time of any election the office of Chairman of the Trust should become vacant the Commissioners of the Trust may, by resolution, appoint one of

their number to be returning officer; and the returning officer may appoint a deputy to assist him or to act in his room at any election, and such deputy may do all things which the returning officer is hereby authorized or required to do.

9. Notice of Election.—Nomination of Candidates.—Second Schedule.—Fourteen clear days before any election of Commissioners under these regulations, the returning officer shall give public notice of such election by advertisement inserted in some newspaper generally circulating in the Upper Macedon township, and by such notice shall require all candidates at such election to be nominated at some place within the said township to be named in such notice in manner hereinafter mentioned, between the hours of Ten o'clock in the forenoon and Four o'clock in the afternoon, on some day before a day (hereinafter called the day of nomination) not less than four nor more than seven days after the time of giving such notice, and named therein, and any person desirous of becoming a candidate shall, before Four o'clock in the afternoon of the day next preceding the nomination day, cause to be delivered at the place aforesaid to the returning officer a nomination paper, in the form of the Second Schedule, or to the like effect, stating therein both his christian and surname, together with the other particulars required in and by the said Schedule; and such nomination paper shall be signed by not less than three persons duly qualified to vote at such elections, as well as by the candidate. And no person who shall not have been so nominated shall, within the provisions of these regulations, be deemed to be a candidate at any election of Commissioners.

10. Qualifications of Commissioners.—No person shall be eligible for election as a Commissioner unless he is liable to be rated under the *Water Act 1905* in respect of property within the district of the Trust.

11. Where Number of Candidates does not exceed Number of Commissioners to be elected.—If, at the expiration of the time limited as hereinbefore provided for the nomination of candidates, the number of persons who have become candidates as aforesaid does not exceed the number of Commissioners to be elected, the returning officer shall then declare such candidates to be duly elected, and they shall be deemed to be then duly elected accordingly.

12. Where Number of Candidates exceeds the Number of Commissioners to be elected.—Third Schedule.—Notice of Poll.—Hours of Polling.—If, at the expiration of the time limited for the nomination of candidates, the number of candidates exceeds the number of Commissioners to be elected, then the returning officer shall forthwith cause the ballot-papers to be printed, with the christian names and surnames of all the candidates in full in the form of the Third Schedule hereto, and shall also give public notice by advertisement in some newspaper circulating in the Upper Macedon township, stating the names of the persons so nominated, and that a poll will be taken for the election of such Commissioners upon a day named in such notice, at such place within the said township as the returning officer shall in and by such notice appoint; and such poll shall take place accordingly, and shall commence at Eight o'clock in the forenoon, and close at Seven o'clock in the afternoon.

13. Retirement of Candidates before Polling Day.—If, at any election, after a poll shall have been appointed as aforesaid, any candidate for such election, and two of the persons having signed the paper nominating him as aforesaid, are desirous that he should retire from such candidature, such candidate and the persons aforesaid may sign and deliver to the returning officer, not later than four clear days before the day of polling, a notice in the form of the Fourth Schedule hereto, stating that such candidate so retires; and the said candidate or his agent shall thereupon publish in some newspaper generally circulating in the Upper Macedon township a copy of such notice, and the returning officer, on sufficient proof of such publication aforesaid, if the number of candidates is by such retirement reduced to the number of persons to be elected at such election shall, on the day appointed for the election, declare the remaining candidates duly elected; and, if the said number is not so reduced, shall omit the name of the person so retiring from the ballot-papers to be used at the said election, and, if such papers are already printed, shall erase such name therefrom; and such person shall not be capable of being elected at such election.

14. Polling booth may be hired.—At such election the returning officer shall provide a suitable place for taking a poll, and may, if necessary, cause to be hired and used as a polling booth any room which he may deem to be suitable at the place appointed for taking the poll, and may divide such room into compartments as to him may seem most convenient.

15. Returning Officer to preside at Polling Booth.—The returning officer or his deputy shall preside at the polling booth for taking the poll.

## CONDITIONS OF LEASE.

For Business Sites.

1. The term shall be twenty-one (21) years (the maximum allowed under the Act), commencing at the expiry of one (1) calendar month from the date of sale, but parliamentary authority will be sought for an extension of the term to 33 years, and if such be granted no increased rental will be charged.

2. The rent shall be payable quarterly in advance.

3. #### REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES IN THE TOWNSHIP OF PORT CAMPBELL, KNOWN AS THE MURRAY RESERVE.

**W**E, Arthur Robertson, William James McKean, Robert Brown, Thomas Dibbs, John Hennessy, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 24th August, 1909, as a site for Public purposes in the township of Port Campbell, known as the Murray Reserve, having framed the following Regulations for care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*:—

#### REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted or rubbish deposited therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over fences or gates, or stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the Reserve.
5. No person shall put into the Reserve any cattle, goats, sheep, or pigs without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord without the authority in writing of the Committee of Management.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent in writing of the Committee of Management.
8. No person except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown Lands or constable does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

TENDERS will be received until Eleven o'clock a.m. on Friday, 24th June, 1910, from persons willing to undertake Funerals of Destitute Persons at the Necropolis (Springvale) and The New Melbourne General Cemetery, Fawkner, and Removals of Dead Bodies to the Melbourne Morgue, as required by the several Departments of the Government, from 1st July, 1910, to 30th June, 1913, in the Melbourne district, which includes the following police sub-districts:—Melbourne City, Bourke-street west, Little Bourke-street, East Melbourne, West Melbourne, Albert Park, Alphington, Armadale, Ascot Vale, Auburn, Balclutha, Brunswick, Brunswick East, Brunswick West, Burnley, Camberwell, Carlton, Carlton North, Clifton Hill, Coburg, Collingwood, Essendon, Essendon North, Fitzroy, Malvern, North Fitzroy, Flemington, Hawthorn, Hawthorn West, Hotham Hill, Kensington, Kew, Middle Park, Montague, Northcote, North Melbourne, Port Melbourne, Port Melbourne North, Prahran, Prince's Hill, Richmond, South Richmond, Royal Park, St. Kilda, East St. Kilda, St. Kilda West, St. Kilda-road, South Yarra, South Melbourne, South Wharf, Toorak, and Windsor.

Burials of deceased persons from sub-districts north of the Yarra, with the exception of those buried in the Morgue, will take place at The New Melbourne General Cemetery, Fawkner, and those from sub-districts south of the Yarra, including burial from the Morgue, at the Springvale Necropolis respectively.

Tenders, which must be upon the printed form, will be received for either funerals or removals, but if both services be included in one tender it may, if advisable, be accepted for one service only.

For funerals separate prices must be stated for adults, for children above five years under fourteen years of age, and for children under five years of age including still-born—one sum is to be stated for each, including internment, conveyance, Railway charges, and all other charges what-ever, except ministers' fees. For removals separate prices must be stated for adults and children under seven years of age.

Tenders are advised to attach to their tenders lists of their business branches, specifying telephonic connexions, as accessibility and means of prompt communication will be considered in accepting the tenders.

Tenders must state the prices in words as well as in figures, without alterations or erasures.

Tenders must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit in bank notes, or a bank draft payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board for £5 for burials and £5 for removals (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application. ## CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The services are to be performed upon an order signed by a member of the Police Force. Under 31 Victoria No. 310, section 9, cemetery fees are not payable in the cases of paupers buried upon an order signed by a Justice, and in such cases the contractor's account for the burial will be correspondingly reduced.

2. No claim will be allowed under this contract for any burial respecting which the contractor receives or arranges for any payment whatever from the relatives or friends of the deceased; but in the event of friends or relatives desiring to have the deceased buried in private ground, while awaiting themselves of the Government funeral, they must, in such case, pay all the cemetery charges.

3. The funerals are to be of the most economical description consistent with propriety. A plain hearse for an adult, and a covered, plain, suitable four-wheeled vehicle for a child under five years of age, to be provided.

4. The body shall be taken direct to the necropolis, or to the cemetery as the case may be, and no more than one body shall be carried in the hearse or vehicle at a time. No body shall be retained on the premises of the Contractor. Any infringement of this condition will subject the Contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £10, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount shall be deducted as in clause 15.

5. Coffins for funerals must be waterproof and sufficiently long, deep, wide, and substantial to bear the corpse and permit it to lie extended at full length, and must be made of 1-in. white pine timber covered with black cloth, and fastened down with screws, and pitched in the seams to prevent leakage. The Contractor shall provide 2 inches of sawdust for the bottom of the coffin; a small block of wood to keep the head of the deceased in position, and sufficient white calico to cover the body. Coffins to be properly lowered into the graves, and the graves filled up again.

6. In cases of burials of bodies which are, in the opinion of the Department ordering the burial, of a distinctively offensive character, such as of persons drowned and long in the water, or such

as are in a state of putrefaction from any other cause, or persons who have died from an infectious disease, such bodies shall, on certification of the officer ordering the burial that such precaution is necessary, be placed for burial in zinc lined coffins, hermetically sealed by soldering the lids of same, such coffins to be provided by the Contractor, of timber 1 inch in thickness.

7. Bodies of deceased persons, with the exception of those provided for under clause 2, must be conveyed to the New Melbourne General Cemetery, Fawkner, for burial should the death of such person take place in any sub-district north of the Yarra, excepting bodies buried from the Morgue, and to the Springvale Necropolis should the death take place in any sub-district south of the Yarra, including burials of bodies from the Morgue.

8. The graves to be dug of the proper depth, and in conformity with the Necropolis and Cemetery Regulations.

9. In the event of the contractor failing to attend punctually to any order, the work will be otherwise performed, and the extra expense incurred, if any, will be charged to the contractor. Should any circumstance, however, make it necessary in any particular case that an immediate removal to the Morgue be effected, the hiring of another vehicle for the purpose will not be an infringement of the contract.

10. When burials or removals are required to take place on Sunday, or, in the case of any lunatic asylum, burials on the same day as the inquest, no delay must take place in complying therewith, and any additional fees charged by the necropolis or cemetery authorities in the case of burials will be repaid to the contractor.

11. The attendance of a minister of the denomination named in the order for the burial must, if practicable, be provided. If for any burial such minister is not available the burial service is to be conducted by the resident chaplain deputed by the denomination, and in cases where no such deputy is appointed by the denomination, or where the religious denomination of the deceased is unknown, the services are to be performed by the resident chaplains alternately, and the contractor must inform the Police of the hour when the funeral service will take place, so that the friends of the deceased may attend at the cemetery if they wish. Such order to be produced at the cemetery when the contractor gives the order for interment. The contractor must pay the minister's fee for reading the burial service should it be claimed, and he will be reimbursed, on producing the minister's receipt, which must specify that the burial service was duly and properly performed at the time of the burial, and that he received the fee for so doing. Should the burial service not be performed at the time of the burial no reimbursement will be allowed. The receipt must also specify the name, age, and denomination of deceased, the name and denomination of the minister who performed the burial service, and the hour when the service was performed.

12. Bodies to be removed to the Morgue shall be placed before removal in shell coffins, zinc lined and watertight, securely closed, and shall be conveyed in suitable covered four-wheeled vehicles.

13. Every practicable precaution must be taken in order to prevent offensiveness from decomposition, but in no case of removal must any disinfectant be used without the authority of the medical officer performing the post-mortem examination.

14. The account is to be rendered monthly to the officer ordering the service for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne. The charge for the minister's fee should be included in the account for the funeral.

15. A refusal to execute orders, impropriety, neglect, or delay in conducting the funerals or removals will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, impropriety, neglect, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any part of the security money.

16. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited, and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

## CITY OF MELBOURNE.

Regulations made by the Council of the City of Melbourne, in pursuance of the provisions of the *Meat Supervision Act 1900*, prescribing the mode of dressing certain carcasses.

WHEREAS the municipal district of the City of Melbourne forms part of the Metropolitan Meat Area constituted under the provisions of the *Meat Supervision Act 1900*, and whereas the Council of the said City is by the said Act empowered, with the approval of the Board of Public Health, to make Regulations, *inter alia*, prescribing the mode of dressing carcasses of animals. Now the Council of the City of Melbourne, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by the said Act, make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

No carcass (other than the carcasses of lambs), whether intended for human consumption or not, shall within the City of Melbourne be dressed or caulked or allowed to be dressed in the manner or by the method known as back-setting; nor shall any caul fat be attached to any such carcass or otherwise used in the dressing thereof.

The head shall not be cut off or detached from the carcass of any lamb until such lamb or such carcass has been inspected by the Meat Inspector at the Abattoirs where such carcass is being dressed, and passed by him as lamb.

For the purpose of these regulations, the presence of any permanent teeth in any carcass shall be sufficient evidence that such carcass is not the carcass of a lamb.

Every person offending against any of these Regulations shall be liable, upon conviction thereof, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.
