FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF MESSRS. W. J. AND F. BARNES (PACKING HONEY AND FOODS), 174 ALBERT-STREET, EAST, MELBOURNE,

for a period of eight weeks from the 5th July, 1911, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than five females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said five females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours beyond the ordinary working hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That every female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

COLAC WATERWORKS TRUST.—BY-LAW No. 2.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Colac Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which Trust has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the following By-law for such Urban District:—

1. Each house or tenement must be supplied by a separate service from the Trust's main, and if so required by the Trust the whole service shall be subjected to a test pressure of 200 lbs. to the square inch after it has been laid. The portions of the service-pipe laid along or across any public street, lane, or right-of-way, or where it may be exposed to wheel traffic, shall be laid not less than 9 inches below the surface. All trenches cut for the purpose of laying service-pipes in streets, lanes, or right-of-ways must be properly filled in and made good to the satisfaction of the Trust and Municipal Council and their officers.

2. Connexions with the Trust's mains must (except where otherwise directed) be made with proper stop-cock ferrules, to which for iron services a length of not less than 3 feet of lead pipe must be attached. One service-pipe only for domestic supply to each tenement will be permitted, and for houses rated at Twenty pounds per annum and under, the bore of such service-pipe must not exceed ½ inch, and for houses rated over Twenty pounds per annum, the size of such service-pipe must not exceed ¾ inch, unless permission for a larger service shall have been received in writing from the Trust, and the supply be taken through a meter.

3. The maximum tapping that will be allowed (except by special permit from the Trust) for each size of main is as follows:—

For 3-in. and 4-in. pipes, ¾-in. tapping.
For 5-in., 6-in., 7-in., 8-in., 9-in., and 10-in. pipes, 1-in. tapping.

4. Lead piping of the following weights:—

and galvanized-iron piping of approved quality only will be allowed for external and internal services. All such piping must have a bursting pressure of not less than 600 lbs. per square inch, and, if required, shall be tested to 300 lbs. per square inch.

5. No person shall use any tap, stop-cock, bib-cock, ball-cock, valve, closet cistern, service box, waste-not regulator, bath tap, or valve, or other fitting in connexion with a supply of water of the Trust which is not of the best quality, and approved by the Trust.

6. No person shall use any stop or bib-cocks which are not screw-down high-pressure cocks made of hard brass or gun metal, and in every respect of best quality and workmanship, and approved by the Trust.

7. All connexions between lead and iron pipes must be made with brass union couplings.

8. All joints connecting lead pipes must be "wiped" joints, and in no case will "bolt" or "copper bit" joints be allowed on water service-pipes, either in the interior or on the exterior of any building or tenement, on pain of cancellation of the licence of the plumber, who, by himself or his workmen, shall break these Regulations.

9. A high-pressure screw-down stop-cock, properly secured and covered with an approved cast-iron tap, shall be fixed on each water-service between the main and the building line.

10. All cocks and fittings must have a bursting pressure of not less than 600 lbs. per square inch, and, if required, shall be tested to 300 lbs. per square inch.

11. No bath shall be allowed which has a holding capacity when full of more than 100 gallons, except with the special permission of the Trust. Overflow pipes to baths will not be permitted except where the supply is by measure.

12. Any person, whether licensed as hereafter set out or not, who shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice from the Trust of the offence has been given.
13. No person shall use any cistern or tank that is not provided with an equilibrium ball valve, and the overflow pipe laid and fixed in a suitable manner, open to inspection, and in a position approved by the Trust.
14. No person shall construct or use any urinal or water-closet fitting not approved by the Trust, nor unless the same be supplied with water from the service pertaining to a tenement through a proper closet cistern or service box fitted with approved waste-preventing apparatus. No person shall fix or use any service-pipe which communicates directly or indirectly with the basin or trap, or otherwise than with the cistern of a urinal or water closet. Urinals shall be provided with a two-gallon, and closets with three-gallon cisterns.
15. All baths, sinks, lavatory and other basins, closets, and urinals served from the Trust's mains must be of approved sanitary construction, and mounted to the satisfaction of the Trust.
16. Upon any person giving notice of his desire to lay a pipe to connect with and tap the pipes of the Trust, he shall be informed on behalf of the Trust whether it is or is not desired that such tapping should be made by an officer of the Trust, and if it be so desired, such person shall not tap any such pipe, but shall provide for and be at the cost of all labour and material necessary for such connexion, and for the restoration of the ground to the satisfaction of the local authority, and be liable for the consequences of failure in so doing, and shall pay in advance to the Trust the expense of such tapping, including the stop-cock and ferrule as follows, viz.:—For $\frac{1}{2}$ -in. pipe, Seven shillings and sixpence; $\frac{3}{4}$ -in. pipe, Ten shillings; 1-in. pipe, Fifteen shillings.
17. Any person, whether licensed as hereafter set out or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of some officer of the Trust, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipes to communicate with the pipe of the Trust of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Trust, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.
18. Any person, whether licensed as hereafter set out or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Trust, without giving two days' notice to the Trust of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust, without the permission in writing of the Trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine, the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
19. No extension of private services will be allowed except by consent of the Trust.
20. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier (if any), and, if none, the owner, shall, upon receiving notice that his service-pipe requires repairing, immediately proceed to repair the same, and he shall be responsible for any loss of water or other damage which shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, and in default be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after receipt of such notice; and the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected.
21. No person shall use a hose attached to any tap or pipe used for the purpose of supplying the water of the Trust to any houses or premises for watering any garden, laying dust, or for any other purpose whatsoever, unless where a meter is fixed and the water supplied by measure; and any person offending against this section shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.
22. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by a duly authorized officer of the Trust, and each meter must be capable of registering at least 1,000,000 gallons, and each $\frac{1}{2}$ -in., $\frac{3}{4}$ -in., and 1-in. meter must be capable of registering any flow not less than 10, 15, and 20 gallons per hour respectively, and each meter must be fixed with approved lead connexions above ground in a conveniently accessible position and properly protected.
23. If any meter in use cease registering, or be reported by a duly authorized officer of the Trust as out of repair or registering inaccurately, the Trust will estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order, and until it is repaired and refixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter or during the corresponding period of the previous year, or the Trust may insert a check-meter on the service-pipe and charge upon estimates from the registering thereof.
24. The Trust will, if it so think fit, but not otherwise, let for hire water meters, the rent for which shall be at the rate per annum of—
- For $\frac{1}{2}$ inch, Six shillings;
For $\frac{3}{4}$ inch, Six shillings;
For 1 inch, Eight shillings,
- which rent shall be exclusive of and in addition to the amount or rate chargeable for the recorded consumption of water, and shall be due and must be paid half-yearly in advance, on the first day of the months of January and July in each year, the first payment to date and be made as from the commencement of the then current half-year; and the occupier of the premises shall, at his own cost, cause such meter to be fixed and kept in proper repair, and when required on behalf of the Trust so to do, shall cause such meter to be removed to the office of the Trust to be tested, and when it shall have been so tested shall cause it, or such other meter as may be furnished to him in lieu of it, to be replaced at his own cost, and shall be in like manner responsible for the same. Any person so hiring a meter from the Trust who shall leave the premises on which such meter shall be fixed, without having previously given, in writing, at least six days' notice to the Trust of his intention to leave the premises, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
25. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.
26. Any person receiving water from the Trust who, without the written permission of the Trust, shall take or carry away such water from the premises, or allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
27. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust who shall take or carry away water from the premises of any other person so supplied, or from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
28. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Trust, or any service-pipe, rock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
29. Each licence shall be for the period ending on the 31st December next ensuing after the issue thereof, but may be renewed by the Trust at its discretion from time to time in each case to the following 31st December. The Trust shall have power at any time to cancel a licence in the event of the holder thereof performing his work in an unsatisfactory manner, or committing any breach of the Water Acts or of this By-law, and in such matters the Trust shall be sole judge. For each original licence the licensee shall pay to the Trust a fee of One pound, and for each renewal Five shillings.
30. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust the person applying for the same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber, and that he is thoroughly conversant with the provisions of the By-laws of the Trust relating to Water Supply with the "Water Acts," so far as they apply to town supplies. The Trust may, if it so sees fit, refuse to grant such licence.
31. Each licensed plumber must report to the Trust Secretary the completion of any new work, extensions, or repair in connexion with any service within twenty-four hours of effecting the same.
32. No person other than an employé of the Municipal Council shall, without the written permission of the Trust, water streets or thoroughfares by means of hydrants and

hose attached to fire plugs. Any person offending against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

33. The water supply of all public parks and gardens shall be exclusively under the control and direction of the officers of the Trust, and any person not duly authorized who shall turn on the water or otherwise interfere with such water supply, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

34. For every offence against any provision of this By-law for which a penalty is not hereinbefore specially prescribed, the offender shall, upon conviction, be liable to and shall pay any sum not exceeding Five pounds.

35. In every case in which it is necessary to obtain the consent of the Trust before doing any act, or commencing any work, such consent must be asked for by notice in writing, addressed to the Secretary of the Trust, and delivered at his office, of such length as is mentioned in the Act or in this By-law, and in no case less than two days prior to the time proposed for the doing of such act or the commencement of such work, and such notice must state clearly the act proposed to be done or work to be commenced; and such act shall not be done or work be commenced save upon the Trust's consent in writing, and then only subject to and in accordance with such directions or conditions as shall be therein specified. Such consent may be given by and under the hand of the Chairman of the Trust, the Secretary, or the Engineer, who, severally, shall be competent to give the Trust's consent, and on behalf of the Trust to prescribe any directions or conditions attaching thereto, and subject to and in accordance with which only such consent shall be deemed to have been given. The giver of every such consent shall notify the same to the next following meeting of the Trust for confirmation.

36. In the construction of this By-law the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a Corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the meaning which in the Water Acts is assigned to any word shall be the meaning of the same word where occurring in this By-law, unless inconsistent with the subject-matter or context.

37. No prosecution shall be commenced in connexion with any violation or infringement of this By-law except by the specific direction of the Trust, conveyed by a motion or of the Chairman, such direction in the latter case being in writing.

COLAC WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING BY-LAW FOR 1911.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Colac Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by such Acts, make the following By-law, viz. :—

BY-LAW No. 3.

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1911 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said Urban District :—

1. For every house and tenement of £13 annual municipal value and under, the sum of One pound sterling.

2. For every house and tenement of £14 annual municipal value and upwards, an amount of £7 10s. per cent. per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.

3. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land unsupplied with water from the works of the Trust of Six pounds annual municipal value and under, the sum of Ten shillings (10s.) sterling.

4. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land unsupplied with water from the works of the Trust of Seven pounds annual municipal value and upwards, an amount of £7 10s. per cent. per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.

5. Private water-troughs will be charged for at the rate of 20s. per annum where the valuation of the property on which such trough is situated does not exceed £20. Such trough charge of 20s. will mean to include the rate of valuation. Where the valuation of the property exceeds £20 the trough to be exempt from rating purposes, except where, in the opinion of the Trust, a meter shall be necessary.

6. Water supplied to cricket, tennis, or bowling clubs, and to Government Departments, mechanics' institutes, churches, show grounds, cattle-yards, and similar properties shall be charged for by measurement at Sixpence per 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than 40,000 gallons per annum.

7. For water supplied from stand-pipe or hydrant there shall be a charge for every 200 gallons or under of the sum of Sixpence.

8. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings there shall be a charge of Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or, if there be no contract, then upon the value or of the amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, or plastering.

9. Except as hereinbefore otherwise provided the minimum quantity of water to be charged for where water is supplied by the Trust by measurement shall be the quantity which, at One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons, equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, and for such minimum quantity of water there shall be a charge of One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons; and for water in excess of such minimum there shall be a charge of Sixpence per thousand gallons, or such price as may be specially agreed upon.

10. Water supplied to market gardens shall be charged for by measurement only.

11. The fee to be paid for a plumber's licence shall be £1: renewals, 5s.

12. Provided that where persons within the Waterworks Trust District desire to have the service-pipe of the Trust extended to their properties, and are willing to pay the cost of such extension, the Trust shall have power to make a special agreement with them regarding the payment of water supplied so as to cover their outlay.

That the before-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July in each year, excepting the charge for water supplied by measure, which shall be paid quarterly.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Colac Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

In the construction of this By-law the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the Colac Waterworks Trust.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF OXLEY, KNOWN AS THE OXLEY PICNIC RESERVE.

THE Council of the Shire of Oxley, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 8th April, 1889, as a site for Public Recreation, in the parish of Oxley, known as the Oxley Picnic Reserve, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein; and also for the collection

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling (1s.) may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers, or the tree-guards, fences, or buildings in the Reserve, or light any fires therein, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut pines on the fences, tree-guards, trees, or seats in the Reserve.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle or sheep without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. No person shall erect in the Reserve any dwelling, or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
7. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein that may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
8. No person shall play or practice cricket or football or any other game, or engage in any sport in the Reserve on Sunday.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown Lands or any constable does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

BOROUGH OF HORSHAM, STATE OF VICTORIA.
BY-LAW NO. 18.

A By-law of the Borough of Horsham, made under section 635 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered eighteen, for regulating the market-place and the buildings, stalls, pens, and standings therein, and for preventing nuisances or obstructions therein and in the immediate approaches thereto, and for fixing the days and the hours during each day in which the market shall be held, and for licensing yards and premises for the sale of cattle within the municipal district, and for fixing (subject to the limitation mentioned in the said Act) the dues to be paid for such licences.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Horsham order as follows:—

1. In the construction and for the purpose of this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires—

"Cattle Market" means and includes the market, yards, buildings, sheep dip, and pens situated upon allotments fifty-seven, fifty-eight, fifty-nine, sixty-eight, sixty-nine, and seventy, sixty-five and parts of allotments sixty-four and sixty-six in the borough and parish of Horsham, county of Borung, to be hereafter known as the "Borough Corporation Sale Yards."

"Council" means and includes the Council of the Borough of Horsham.

"Inspector" means and includes the officer appointed by the Council of the Borough of Horsham to act as Inspector of the Borough Corporation Sale Yards and to act as collector of stallages, rents, tolls, and dues.

"Cattle" shall include horses, mares, fillies, foals, geldings, bulls, bullocks, cows, heifers, steers, calves, asses, mules, sheep, ewes, wethers, rams, lambs, goats, and swine.

"Fat Cattle" shall mean cattle fit for slaughtering for human consumption.

"Store Cattle" shall mean cattle not so fit.

I.—DUTIES OF INSPECTOR.

2. The Inspector's duties shall be as follows:—

(a) To see that this By-law and the provisions of all Acts and regulations relating to markets are duly observed.

(b) To demand and receive all market stallages, rents, tolls, dues, and dipping fees.

(c) To allot the principal and drafting yards to the use of the parties bringing stock to the cattle market for sale in such manner as in each particular case may seem to such Inspector to be most convenient.

(d) To allot the sheep dip, draining, and other yards to the use of persons bringing sheep to such cattle market for the purposes of dipping, and to supervise such dipping, and to collect the charges for such dipping.

(e) To preserve order and cleanliness within such cattle market, and to summarily eject therefrom any person creating a disturbance or using any profane, indecent, or obscene language, or being guilty of indecent conduct therein.

II.—MARKET, WHEN OPEN.

3. The cattle market, hereinafter referred to as the "Market," shall be open for the reception and delivery of cattle for the conducting of special stock sales, and for the dipping of sheep on every day except Saturday, Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday from sunrise to sunset.

4. The said market shall be open for the sale of cattle on every Friday from sunrise to sunset, and no cattle shall be received at the said market after the hour of Twelve o'clock noon except horses and swine, which must be in the market not later than Two o'clock in the afternoon. Provided, nevertheless, that should any cattle arrive in Horsham by train on any sale day such cattle may be admitted after Twelve o'clock noon if notice in writing of such intended arrival shall have been previously given to the Inspector.

III.—ORDER OF SALES.

5. On every market day the sales of sheep and lambs shall be commenced not later than One o'clock in the afternoon. The sales of other cattle shall follow, and all such sales shall be conducted in the order following:—

First—Fat sheep and fat lambs.

Second—Store sheep and store lambs.

Third—Fat cattle.

Fourth—Store cattle.

Fifth—Horses.

Sixth—Pigs.

6. The owner of stock intended to be brought to the market for sale on a Friday, or his agent, shall notify in writing the number of such stock to the Inspector before Four o'clock p.m. on the preceding Thursday, and shall be responsible for the dues payable in respect of the number of stock so notified.

7. All owners of stock intended for sale, or their agents, desiring to have the privilege of drawing lots for priority of sale shall notify in writing the number of such stock to the Inspector by Four o'clock p.m. on the preceding Thursday, and shall be responsible for the dues payable in respect of the number of stock so notified. Provided always that if from accident or some other good and sufficient cause a delay should arise in bringing any stock to market the Inspector shall have the power to forego payment of such dues.

8. Stock for sale shall be offered in the order of the drawing, and the offering of all stock drawn for shall precede the offering of stock not drawn for.

9. All owners or agents or their deputies on every sale day shall not later than the hour of Ten o'clock in the forenoon, in the presence of the Inspector at the market, draw lots for priority of order of selling such cattle of which the Inspector shall have been notified in terms of clause seven hereof; such drawings shall take place in the order set out in clause five hereof.

10. The Inspector shall at the hour appointed for the commencement of the auction sale publicly give out at the market the order of auction sales.

11. The auctioneer or salesman first entitled to sell shall sell or otherwise dispose of fat sheep and fat lambs for a period of not longer than three minutes for each pen, and he shall not exceed fifteen minutes from the time when he shall be entitled to start such sales before finishing the same. At the expiration of such fifteen minutes or earlier, if the salesman first in order shall have earlier concluded his sale of fat sheep or fat lambs, the salesman next in order of priority shall proceed to sell upon the like conditions as those hereinbefore mentioned with regard to the salesman first entitled to sell, and so on until all the salesmen entitled to sell shall, according to their right of priority, have disposed of the fat sheep or fat lambs in respect of which they may respectively have given to the said Inspector notice of their desire to have the privilege of drawing lots for priority of sale. The first salesman shall be entitled to summon his customers ten minutes before the time appointed for commencing the sale, each succeeding salesman shall commence to sell as soon as the salesman immediately preceding him shall have concluded his sale, or if the preceding salesman shall not have concluded his sale at the expiration of fifteen minutes from the time at which he was entitled to commence such sale, then at the expiration of such fifteen minutes. Should any auctioneer or salesman not be able to complete his sale in the time allowed to him by this clause the stock remaining unsold shall not be sold by him at auction until the completion of all other auction sales of fat sheep and fat lambs listed in the drawing for priority on that day, but he shall forthwith thereafter in the order of such priority of drawing for lots be entitled to continue the sale by auction of the remainder of the fat sheep and fat lambs listed by him for such drawing.

12. At the conclusion of such auction of fat sheep and fat lambs listed for such drawing the salesman first named in the order of auction sales announced by the Inspector of fat sheep and fat lambs not so listed for priority of drawing, shall be entitled to offer for sale such fat sheep and fat lambs entered by him or his principal for sale in the said market, but subject to the same conditions as hereinbefore set out, and thereafter such other salesman in the order named until the submitting to auction of all fat sheep and fat lambs listed for sale as aforesaid in the said market on that day shall be completed.

13. In all cases time limits under this By-law shall be fixed by the Inspector.

14. After the time limited for the disposal of fat sheep and fat lambs by the auctioneer or salesman last entitled to sell shall have expired the sale of store sheep and other cattle shall be proceeded with in the order named in clause five hereof upon the like conditions as are hereinbefore prescribed with regard to the sale of fat sheep and fat lambs, except that the limit of time allowed to each auctioneer or salesman in selling or disposing of the various cattle shall be as follows:—

Store sheep not to exceed three minutes per pen, or a total of twenty-five minutes in all.

Fat cattle not to exceed ten minutes in all.

Store cattle not to exceed three minutes per pen, or twenty minutes in all.

Horses, mares, fillies, foals, geldings, and colts, not to exceed twenty minutes in all.

Pigs and cattle not otherwise enumerated, not to exceed twenty minutes in all.

15. Any auctioneer or salesman who shall have sold his lots before the expiration of the time limit shall at once give place to the person next entitled to sell, who shall forthwith proceed to offer his lots.

16. Any owner or agent withdrawing his fat sheep or fat lambs from auction sales, or not being present by his auctioneer punctually to commence his auction sale, shall not be allowed to sell by auction until the remaining auction sales of fat sheep or fat lambs shall be completed. A corresponding rotation shall be observed with regard to any other cattle to be auctioned.

17. Each agent shall hand to the Inspector prior to starting the sale a list in writing showing the number of fat sheep and fat lambs penned by him for sale by auction that day.

18. No store stock shall be offered for sale in the fat stock sales, and the Inspector shall have full power to decide whether stock is to be offered in fat or store class. His decision shall be final.

IV.—ALL CATTLE AT RISK OF OWNER OR AGENT.

19. All cattle brought to the market and or placed in the yards or pens thereof by the owner of such cattle or by his agent, shall be at the sole risk of such owner or agent, and neither the Council nor any employé of the Council shall in any circumstances incur any liability or responsibility in connexion therewith.

V.—REMOVING OR RELEASING STOCK.

20. All cattle brought to the market shall be placed in pens. No person shall release any cattle from the market or remove the same from one part thereof to another without the authority of the Inspector. In case of any dispute arising as to overcrowding of pens or as to priority of occupancy the Inspector shall have authority to decide such disputes, and the disputants shall be bound by his decision. The Inspector shall have authority to remove or order to be removed cattle from one pen to another, and any orders he may give in that respect shall be promptly carried out.

21. No cattle which have been placed in any auctioneers' hands for sale shall be permitted to leave the market without the production of a pass from the auctioneers in whose hands they were placed for sale.

22. Horses and fat and dairy cattle for sale by auction shall be paraded in the ring in front of the rostrum in the said market, unless in exceptional cases by permission of the Inspector.

23. All cattle not removed from the said market by the hour of Nine o'clock in the afternoon of the day upon which any sale shall have been held in the said market shall be removed by the Inspector at the expense and risk of the owner of any such cattle.

VI.—OFFENCES AND PENALTIES.

24. No person shall sell or offer for sale by auction any cattle in the market before the opening or after the closing of the market. Penalty: Forty shillings.

25. No auctioneer or salesman shall continue to sell cattle or offer cattle for sale after the expiry of the time allowed as provided by this By-law. Penalty: Forty shillings. Provided: that the Inspector shall give notice of such expiry by the ringing of a bell or otherwise.

26. No person shall (1) obstruct the Inspector of the said market in the execution of his duty; or (2) wilfully break down or damage any of the gates, fences, buildings, or appurtenances of the said market; or (3) cause any disturbance therein; or (4) use any obscene or indecent or offensive language, or be guilty of any indecent conduct within the said market or upon the approaches thereto. Penalty: Five pounds.

VII.—LICENCES FOR YARDS FOR SALE OF CATTLE.

27. Every person desirous of having his yard or premises licensed for the sale of cattle must deliver to the Town Clerk an application in writing for such licence, containing an accurate description of such yard and premises. Such person shall deposit with such application the sum of Ten pounds.

28. The fee for every such licence shall be Ten pounds per annum. All licences shall expire on the thirty-first day of December in each year.

29. The Council shall have power to grant or refuse any such licence. If it be refused the said sum of Ten pounds will be returned to the applicant. If it be granted such sum will be retained in payment of the fee for such licence.

30. Every such licence shall be in the following form or to the like effect:—
