1. Every person hereafter appointed a member of the Police Force of Victoria shall, as a condition precedent to his appointment, satisfy the Chief Commissioner that he has effected a policy or policies on his life in a life assurance company carrying on business in the State of Victoria, and shall undertake to lodge such policy or policies within fourteen days thereafter. Such policy or policies shall provide for the payment to the person assured on his attaining the age of 55 years, or to his legal personal representatives within three (3) months from the date of his death, if the person assured should die under the age set forth in such policy or policies, of a sum or sums of money at least equal in the aggregate to the amount of the maximum annual current rate of pay provided for his rank or grade; provided that in lieu of the payment of the sum or sums of money on such person attaining the said prescribed age, such policy or policies may provide for an annuity or annuities payable to the person assured, quarterly during the remainder of his life, after he attains the said prescribed age, but the angregate at least equal to one-tenth of the said maximum annual salary.

PUBLIC PARKS, GARDENS, AND OTHER RESERVES.

Regulations in connexion with the dote of Five thousand pounds (£5,000) for fencing and improving Public Parks, Gardens, and other Reserves under the control of Borough Councils, Trustees, Committees of Management,

A SUM of Three thousand five hundred pounds shall be distributed in such manner and on such terms conditions as the Minister of Lands shall approve, and the remainder (£1,500) shall be dealt with as follows are

- I. A sum not exceeding Five shillings may be paid to the treasurer of the managing body of any public park garden, or other reserve having a claim on the vote for every One pound expended by such body on fencing, preparation of land and planting, forming of roads and paths, and such other works as the Minister of Lands may approve, in such park, garden, or other reserve, between 1st January, 1910, and 31st December, 1910, out of the funds locally contributed, provided such claim be received by the Secretary for Lands on or before the 1st day of May, 1911. Every statement of particulars of claim on the vote must be made in Form A, and be accompanied by a declaration in the Form B.
- 2. The term "locally contributed" shall mean and include all moneys voted by the managing body of any public park, garden, or other reserve from its own funds for the fencing and planting of such park, garden, or other reserve, also all moneys voluntarily contributed for the same purpose, between the 1st January, 1910, and 31st December, 1910; but it shall not mean or include any sums advanced by any bank, nor any subsidy paid by Government between the above-mentioned dates, nor the balance of any subsidy paid by Government at any period prior to the 1st January, 1910.
- 3. The subsidy or the balance thereof last paid to the managing body of any public park, garden, or other reserve shall be deducted from the return of expenditure for the year 1909 (vide Form A), and a sum equal to one-fourth of the balance then remaining, if made of local contributions as above interpreted, shall be paid as subsidy; provided that if the claims are in excess of the sum of One thousand five hundred pounds they shall be reduced for rath. be reduced pro rata.
- 4. In every case in which a claim is sent in an officer of the Department may be instructed to make an inspection of the books kept by the managing body, and of the vouchers for the several items of expenditure; and if such inspection be refused the claim shall be disallowed.
- 5. The foregoing shall not apply to parks, gardens, and other reserves within the limits of the City of Melbourne (except the Royal Park), or to the Edinburgh Gardens, Fitzny, or to the Darling Gardens, Collingwood, or to Albert Park, South Melbourne and St. Kilda, or to the Richmond Park and Barkly Gardens, Richmond, or to the Botanical Gardens, Geelong.

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS.

- r. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.
- 2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board-
 - (a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the Government Gasette.
 - (b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of zr years.

- 4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to
- 5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.
- (b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.
- (c) Or shall have taken the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor
- 6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake

Note.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Regulations.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature of an irregular road.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

- 8. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.
- 9. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

Mathematics.

(a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

(b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practice of Surveying.

(c) Detail of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, and underground surveying, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting by co-ordinates and from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Act, writing descriptions of boundaries.

(Candidates may be required to effect surveys under supervision.)

Engineering Surveys.

(d) Levelling and contouring; grading, setting-out, and measurement of earthworks, including practical tests.

Use of Instruments.

(e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, tacheometer, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer, and steel

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

(f) Determination (including practical tests) of time, latitude, and azimuth; the use of ephemerides; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.

Drawing.

(g) Plan-drawing, drawing of sections and contours, compilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

Miscellaneous.

(h) Elementary physics, elementary geology, elementary forestry.

[The scope of the examination in elementary physics will be that covered by "Balfour Stewart's Elementary Physics," Fourth Edition, omitting chapters 8, 76, and 11, and the scope of the examination in elementary geology will be that covered by "Geikie's Class-book of Geology," Fourth Edition.]

Geology," Fourth Edition.]

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having passed the matriculation or senior examination at a University, or of having completed a course of the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers. Candidates holding certificates or diplomas from any University recognised by an Australasian University or from recognised by the Australasian University or from recognised public technical schools may be exempted from working out papers in physics and geology, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate qualifying and passing the examination held under these Regulations shall be entitled to a certificate that he is qualified for the position of a land surveyor in Victoria.

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13. A surveyor applying to the Board for a certificate of competency without examination on the grounds of his holding a licence and certificate entitling him to practise in any of the other Australian States or in the Dominion of New Zealand, shall produce such licence or certificate of competency from the Board of the State or Dominion in which he is licensed or authorized to survey, together with satisfactory evidence as to character; provided that, should such licence or certificate have been issued upon examination held prior to September, 1895, or in virtue of a certificate issued prior to September, 1895, he shall further produce a written recommendation or a certificate, dated not more than twelve months previously, from such Board; provided also, that any surveyor prevented by absence from the State or Dominion in which he obtained his licence or certificate from obtaining the recommenda-

absence from the State or Dominion in which is licence or certificate from obtaining the recommenda-tion of the Board of that State or Dominion, may be granted a certificate on passing such examination under these Regulations as the Board may require. Each ap-plication shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s. 14. The Board may grant a certificate of competency or a letter of recommendation to any surveyor holding a Victorian certificate dated prior to September, 1895, and desiring to be registered in another State or the Dominion of New Zealand, either without examination or on such wive voce examination as in the opinion of the Board may be necessary. Application for such certificate shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 28.

REGISTRATION OF ARTICLES OF INDENTURE.

15. Articles of indenture or other similar agreement for the tuition of surveying by a qualified surveyor under which pupils are serving at the date upon which these Regulations shall commence and take effect, shall be forwarded to the Secretary for registration within six months of such date. And all such articles or agreements made thereafter shall be forwarded to the Secretary for registration within three months of the date of commencement of service thereunder. Applications for registration shall be accompanied by evidence of the pupil having passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto. The fee for each registration shall be registered within three months of such transfers.

16. On and after March, 1913 (except as hereinafter

16. On and after March, 1913 (except as hereinafter provided), no candidate shall be eligible for examination unless he shall have passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause; provided that, subject to his passing a special examination prescribed by the Board which shall include English, arithmetic, geometry, and algebra, a candidate who has not passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause may be admitted to examination if—

(a) His articles of indenture or other similar agree-ment were executed prior to the date upon which these Regulations shall commence and take effect; or

(b) He failed at an examination held prior to March,

1913; or
(c) He produces certificates of six years' satisfactory field service.

LICENCES TO SURVEY.

ILICENCES TO SURVEY.

17. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1806, and who is still entitled by practise as a land surveyor in the State of Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1806, or who holds a licence to practise as surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor General prior to 1st January, 1806. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 1s.), the declaration as prescribed by the Land Surveyors Act 1895, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

BORAM BORAM PUBLIC CEMETERY.-RULES AND REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Cemeteries Act 1890, the Trustees for Boram Boram Public Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations, which shall come into force immediately after their publication in the Government Gazette; and from and after such publication all Rules and Regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded: be and are hereby rescinded :-

1. Before any interment shall take place in the said Cometery application for permission shall be made to the secretary for the Trustees a reasonable time previously, when an order on the form or to the effect set out in the Schedu'e hereto annexed, marked B, will be given to the applicant on payment of the charges.

2. All such charges must be paid when the order for interment is given, or before the ground or vault is

- 3. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such Cemetery on a certificate of a minister of religion or other sufficient evidence to the satisfaction of the Trustees that such person was a pauper, or that relations and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.
- 4. If an interment is to be made in any private grave r vault, the consent, in writing, of the proprietor must be left with the order.
- 5. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased, must be stated at the time of giving the order.
- 6. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years of age, when it shall not be less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.
- 7. The Trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person wanting a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same under the direction of the Trustees or whom they may appoint, on payment of the required fees, and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.
- 8. The usual hours of interment will be from Ten a.m. to Five p.m.; the Trustees to have power to depart from these hours in exceptional circumstances.
- g. The funeral must take place punctually at the appointed hour; and the undertaker shall cause the size of the coffin to be supplied to the secretary as early as
- ro. A plan of every monument shall be submitted to the Trustees for approval, when asked for by the secre-
- 11. All vaults, graves, monuments, and fences must be kept in proper repair and condition at the expense of the owner, who must, within three days, remove the refuse of all materials used in their construction and repair. In the event of no representatives being found, the Trustees to have power to remove noxious weeds, dilapidated fences, &c., from graves.
- sc., from graves.

 12. All material required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the Cemetery, and shall be admitted only at the principal entrance; and no vehicle conveying such materials with wheels less than 3 inches broad shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery, nor shall any material be wheeled or carted along any path or road while the surface is soft with rain or otherwise.
 - 13. No catacomb shall be allowed.
- 14. No wooden erection shall be allowed.

 15. The Trustees shall not (unless in very exceptional cases) permit the removal of any corpse from any grave for re-interment in this or any other Cemetery.
- for re-interment in this or any other Cemetery.

 16. Before any such exceptional cases can be dealt with by the Trustees, a written application setting forth the reasons for the proposed removal, and verified by a statutory declaration, shall be produced by the nearest available representative of the deceased, and in the event of such application being granted, the permission of the Minister administering the Coroners Act 1890 or any amendment or substitution thereof, in addition to the permission of the Trustees, shall be obtained. If found necessary, the coffin shall be enclosed in a second and airtight coffin prior to removal.

 17. Every erection shall be placed on proper and sub-
- 17. Every erection shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, and, if required by the Trustees, shall extend to the bottom of the grave. No bath, caen, or other soft stone shall be allowed to be used in any work. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be removed from the Cemetery at once by and at the expense of the person causing the same. Copper cramps only shall be allowed in the erection of tablets or other exposed stonework.

18. No child under the age of ten years shall be admitted into the Cemetery except in charge of a responsible

19. No dogs shall be admitted into the Cemetery, and any found there are liable to be destroyed.

 20. No person in the Cemetery or its approaches shall commit any nuisance, or trespass, or be guilty of any breach of decorum, or cut, pluck, gather, or take out of the Cemetery any flower, plant, shrub, or tree, or any part thereof, or do any injury whatsoever thereto, or to any grass plot, border railing, fence, or any other erection or road therein, or remove or interfere in any way with anything laid, built, or placed on or in any grave or burying-place.

 21. Any person committing any breach of any of these
- 21. Any person committing any breach of any of these Rules or Regulations, or of any other rules, regulations, or by-laws lawfully made under the authority of any Act relating to cemeteries, shall be thereupon forthwith removable from the Cemetery by the Trustees, and shall be treated as a trespasser, and may be proceeded against accordingly, in addition to any other proceedings or penalties to which such persons may be subject.
- 22. A plan of the Cemetery showing the distribution of the land, compartments, situations, and numbers of the graves, and a register of all certificates of rights of burial, shall be kept at the office.
- 23. The ground shall be open to the public from Seven in the morning to sunset.
- 24. The Trustees reserve to themselves the right of making any alterations from time to time in the regulations and charges, subject to the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council.

THE Commissioners of the Broadford Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been duly proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the Water Act 1905, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following By-law:—

1. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of land and tenements situated within the aforesaid Urban District, and liable to be rated, shall pay for the year 1911 in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, such rate to be payable half-yearly, in advance, in equal moieties, on 1st day of January and on the 1st day of January and 1st day of January and on the 1st day of Januar

- (1) On every house and tenement of the annual value of £15 or under, the rate shall be of such percentage according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement during the said year as shall produce the sum of Thirty shillings.
- (2) On every house or tenement above the annual value of £15, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement during the said year, the sum of Two shillings in the £1 of such valuation.

2. The following shall be the charges payable in respect of water supplied by measure:—

- (1) Water supplied by measure:—

 (1) Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling for every One thousand gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon). The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where so supplied shall be Twenty thousand gallons per half-year, or a quantity which, at One shilling per thousand gallons, would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (2) For stand-pipe or hydrant water, for each load of Two hundred and fifty gallons or under, One shilling.
- (3) For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering; or, in the event of there not being any contract, Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount charged or paid for stonework, brickwork, and plastering.

3. All accounts for water supplied under special agreement or by measure shall be paid quarterly, in advance, or as may be agreed upon.

4. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

(d) It may be invested in Stock and credited to the account of the Society on the first day of June and the first day of December in each year, in accordance with Form No. 4 annexed.

5. Application for redemption of portion or the whole of the Stock held by any Friendly Society shall be made in the Form No. 5 annexed.

6. When portion or the whole of the Stock held by any Friendly Society is redeemed, the Treasurer of Victoria shall notify the Secretary of the Society that such redemption has been made, on the Form No. 6 annexed.

INTERPRETATION.

In the construction and for the purposes of the following clauses of this By-law, unless the context otherwise

Cattle" means and includes any horse, mare, gelding, colt, filly, bull, cow, ox, steer, heifer, ram, ewe, sheep, lamb, ass, mule, goat, pig or other quadruped of similar or larger dimensions.

"Council" means and includes the Council of the

Borough of St. Arnaud.

"Engine" means and includes any traction engine, locomotive engine, or roller impelled by steam or elec-

Footpath" means and includes every public footpath or footway and every public way or passage for pedestrians only, and every footpath, footway, and way or passage for pedestrians only, under the control of the

"Portico" means and includes every awning, portico, porch, verandah, shed, shade, or covering upon or across any public footway for the purpose of shade or shelter, together with the supports other than the building against which it shall be of such portico.
"Street" means and includes aware and include aware and and aware and a

"Street" means and includes every public street, public road, and public highway, and every carriage-way not being a public highway either accessible to the public from a public highway or forming a common access to lands or premises separately occupied in the Borough of

St. Arnaud.

"Vehicle" means and includes any coach, carriage, buggy, waggon, van, car, gig, cab, or other conveyance drawn by a horse, horses, or any other beast of burthen.

STREETS AND FOOTPATHS.

STREETS AND FOOTPATHS.

Writing or Advertising, &r.—No person shall write, paint, print, stencil, place or affix any letter, figure, device, poster, sign, or advertisement upon any footpath, street, or upon any building, fence, or other property vested in the municipality, or under the control and management of the Council thereof, and no person shall authorize any person so to do.

Orange Peel, &r.—No person shall throw, place, or leave upon any street or footpath any orange peel, banana peel, refuse, food, fruit, or vegetable matter.

Water, &r., flowing on Footpath.—No occupier of premises shall cause, permit, or suffer any matter (other than rain water in time of rain) to flow from such premises on to any footpath.

rain water in time of rain) to flow from such premises on to any footpath.

Musical Instruments, &c.c.—No person shall sound or play upon any musical or noisy instrument in or on any street or footpath within fifty yards of any dwelling-house after being requested to desist by any constable or by any inmate of such house personally or by his or her servant; but this provision shall not apply to any person forming one of a band licensed by the Council as a musical band.

Driver of Vehicle taking up or setting down Passengers.

—The driver of any vehicle shall give way, if he conveniently can, to any other vehicle during the taking up or setting down of any person into or from such other making.

or setting down of any person into or from such other vehicle.

Stopping on near side.—The driver of any vehicle shall not stop the same for the purpose of taking up or setting down any passenger at any part of the street except as near as can be to the left or near side thereof.

Interfering with Competing Vehicles.—No driver of any vehicle shall drive the same so as to immediately and closely precede or follow and intentionally conform to the progress of any other vehicle in competition against or to the annoyance of any other person.

Hours for Sweeping, &c.—Retween the hours of eight o'clock in the morning and six o'clock in the evening, no person, other than a workman employed in street cleaning on behalf of the Council, shall cause interruption or annoyance to any passenger or passengers along a street or footpath by sweeping or discharging dust upon or across any street or footpath.

Closing Traffic.—Whenever, for the prevention of accident or the maintenance of order, it shall, in the opinion of the Mayor, or in his absence or in case of studden emergency, of the Town Clerk or the officer in charge of the borough police, become necessary to close any street, footpath, or public place against traffic of vehicles or persons, or both, it shall be lawful for the Mayor, or in his absence, or in case of studden emergency, for the Town Clerk or officer in charge of the borough police, by writing, to declare such street, footpath, or public place closed against traffic

of vehicles or persons, or both, for such time as may be therein limited or specified, and the drivers of vehicles and all persons contemplated by such declaration shall, when so required by any member of the Police Force, obey and conform to such declaration by abstaining from going or travelling on or by withdrawing and removing from the street, footpath, or public place mentioned therein. And the drivers of all vehicles which may be in any street or place mentioned in such declaration shall, when so required, remove their horses and vehicles thence, and if desiring to remain in the vicinity, shall proceed to any other street or public place indicated by any member of the Police Force for that purpose, and there arrange and order their vehicles in manner directed by such member.

Driver to comply with Directions, &c...Whenever any number of vehicles exceeding ten shall be assembled and waiting at any one place, the driver of every vehicle shall, as to the placing and order thereof, comply with the directions given by any member of the Police Force.

Bearing Surface of Wheels, &c...No person shall ride, drive, draw, or propel on or across any street, road, or highway any vehicle, machine, or engine, having upon any of its wheels any bars, spikes, or other projections, or with wheels the bearing surfaces of which do not form a complete circle in the direction of travel of the vehicle, machine, or engine. machine, or engine.

Drawing Stedges, &c..-No person shall draw or trail any sledge, timber, or other heavy material upon any footway or carriage-way without the previous consent, in writing, of the Council, nor unless the conditions set forth in such consent, or given by the Council's officer, either verbally or in writing, shall have been complied with.

Driving across Intersections.—No person shall drive any vehicle or ride any horse at a pace exceeding four miles an hour across the intersections of any of the streets within the borough.

Cattle, &c., on made Footpaths—Injuries to Footpaths.—Every person who rides, drives or leads any cattle, or permits or suffers any cattle to be ridden or driven, or who drives or wheels any vehicles upon, along, or across any footpaths or channel made or formed, or partly made or formed, of tar, asphalt, or other similar material except at some crossing made for the purpose of obtaining access to land abutting on such footpath, or who injures or interferes with such footpath by making holes therein, or by placing gravel, garden refuse, or other material thereon, shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds (£5), and shall also pay to the Council such sum, not exceeding Five pounds (£5), by way of compensation for damage done by him to such footpath as the Justices adjudicating upon the information or complaint shall order.

Lamp.—Every person who drives an engine on or across any street during the hours between sunset and sunrise shall carry a lighted lamp attached to the engine, which lamp shall be so constructed and placed as to exhibit a light in the direction in which the engine is proceeding, and such lamp shall be so lighted and kept lighted as to afford adequate means of showing the approach and position of such engine.

Side of Road to be Taken—Sounding Bell.—Every person who drives an engine on or across any street shall so far as is practicable keep the same upon the near or left-hand side of the street, and whenever he shall be about to overtake with such engine any vehicle or any horse or other heast of burden proceeding along the street, he shall, within a distance of at least ten yards before reaching such vehicle, horse, or other beast of burden, by sounding a bell, give audible and sufficient warning of the approach of his engine.

Side to Past.—Every person driving an engine on or across any street, who overtakes and passes any vehicle or engine, shall, when passing, keep such engine to the right or off side of such vehicle or other engine.

Stopping where Animal Frightened.—In every case where a person driving an engine on or across a street meets or overtakes any vehicle or any horse or other beast of burden, and where the animal drawing such vehicle or such horse or other beast of burden on such meeting or overtaking becomes restive or alarmed, or ceases to be under the due control of the person for the time being in charge of such vehicle, horse, or other beast of burden, the person driving such engine shall stop the engine as speedily as possible, and shall so remain as long as may be reasonably necessary and render any assistance necessary.
