### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir John Michael Fleetwood Fuller, Baronet, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to revoke the permanent reservation of certain Land in the Parish of Cocoroc and for other purposes."

"An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Four hundred and seventy-nine thousand eight hundred and forty-six pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and ten and One thousand nine hundred and eleven."

## REGULATIONS.

1. A candidate must give notice, in writing, not less than three weeks prior to the date of an examination, of his intention to present himself thereat. He must also forward to the Board satisfactory documentary evidence that he has complied with Regulations 2 and 3 following, and on his application being approved by the Board, must pay the prescribed fee of £2 2s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or into a Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board, Office of Mines, Melbourne.

2. A candidate must produce a certificate of competency, issued by the Board of Examiners for the Survey Branch of the Department of Crown Lands and Survey of Victoria, or a certificate of competency or diploma issued by one of the Federated Surveyors Board of Australia and New Zealand.

3. He must also show to the satisfaction of the Board—

(a) That he has served during not less than four months under some authorized mining surveyor, in obtaining practical experience in the conduct of underground surveys; or, that he has been engaged for not less than twelve months in the conduct of such surveys.

(b) That he has acquired a knowledge of the methods and appliances used in mining operations.

4. A candidate whose application has been approved as having complied with the foregoing will be examined, and will be required to pass in each of the four following subjects:—

(a) *Mining Surveying*.—Connexion and reduction of bearings to datum of surface survey; survey of vertical and inclined shafts, drives, and workings; survey of mineral veins and lodes, leads, and drifts.

(b) *Practical Mining*.—Construction of shafts, chambers, and tunnels in rock and drift; timbering, drainage, and ventilation of mines; general principles of the strength of timber in framings; constructions in rough carpentry; construction and management of pumping, winding, and other mining machinery.

(c) *Hydraulic Engineering*.—Measurement and estimation of water in natural and artificial channels; estimation of sources of water supply; dimensions and discharge of pipes and channels; construction of reservoir embankments, weirs, and aqueducts.

(d) *Geology*.—Lithological structure of the principal rock formations as they occur in Victoria; modes of occurrence of gold and other valuable minerals.

5. Candidates who have obtained the certificate of the Board of Examiners for Engineers of Water Supply in Victoria will be exempt from the examination required by sub-clause (c) of Regulation 4. Candidates who have taken a degree in Mining Engineering in the University of Melbourne, or in some University whose degrees in Engineering are recognised by that University, and whose Engineering graduates are admitted by it *ad eundem gradum*, or who have taken a like degree in Civil Engineering and have passed the University examination in Mining Surveying and Practical Mining, will be exempt from the whole of the examinations prescribed by Regulation 4.

6. Examinations are held half-yearly in April and October.

## REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS.

1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

- (a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the *Government Gazette*.
- (b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

## PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have taken the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys:—

*Form of Certificate for presentation to the Board of Examiners.*

"I, A.B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C.D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as \_\_\_\_\_, in the practice of land surveying, for the period of \_\_\_\_\_, viz., from \_\_\_\_\_ to \_\_\_\_\_, or has served under articles or other similar agreement for a period of \_\_\_\_\_ years (\_\_\_\_\_ of which have been in the field), and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys.

NOTE.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Regulations.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature of an irregular road.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

9. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

## SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

*Mathematics.*

- (a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

*Computation.*

- (b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

*Principles and Practice of Surveying.*

- (c) Detail of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, and underground surveying, setting out of areas, re-determination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting by co-ordinates and from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Act, writing descriptions of boundaries.

(Candidates may be required to effect surveys under supervision.)

*Engineering Surveys.*

- (d) Levelling and contouring; grading, setting-out, and measurement of earthworks, including practical tests.

*Use of Instruments.*

- (e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, tachometer, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer, and steel band.

*Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.*

- (f) Determination (including practical tests) of time, latitude, and azimuth; the use of ephemerides, elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.

*Drawing.*

- (g) Plan-drawing, drawing of sections and contours, compilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

*Miscellaneous.*

- (h) Elementary physics, elementary geology, elementary forestry.

[The scope of the examination in elementary physics will be that covered by "Balfour Stewart's Elementary Physics," Fourth Edition, omitting chapters 8, 10, and 11, and the scope of the examination in elementary geology will be that covered by "Geikie's Class-book of Geology," Fourth Edition.]

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having passed the matriculation or senior examination at a University, or of having completed a course of the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers. Candidates holding certificates or diplomas from any University recognised by an Australasian University or from recognised public technical schools may be exempted from working out papers in physics and geology, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

## CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate qualifying and passing the examination held under these Regulations shall be entitled to a certificate that he is qualified for the position of a land surveyor in Victoria.

13. A surveyor applying to the Board for a certificate of competency without examination on the grounds of his holding a licence and certificate entitling him to practise in any of the other Australian States or in the Dominion of New Zealand, shall produce such licence or certificate of competency from the Board of the State or Dominion in which he is licensed or authorized to survey, together with satisfactory

evidence as to character; provided that, should such licence or certificate have been issued upon examination held prior to September, 1895, or in virtue of a certificate issued prior to September, 1895, he shall further produce a written recommendation or a certificate, dated not more than twelve months previously, from such Board; provided also, that any surveyor prevented by absence from the State or Dominion in which he obtained his licence or certificate from obtaining the recommendation of the Board of that State or Dominion, may be granted a certificate on passing such examination under these Regulations as the Board may require. Each application shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

14. The Board may grant a certificate of competency or a letter of recommendation to any surveyor holding a Victorian certificate dated prior to September, 1895, and desiring to be registered in another State or the Dominion of New Zealand, either without examination or on such *viva voce* examination as in the opinion of the Board may be necessary. Application for such certificate shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

#### REGISTRATION OF ARTICLES OF INDENTURE.

15. Articles of indenture or other similar agreement for the tuition of surveying by a qualified surveyor under which pupils are serving at the date upon which these Regulations shall commence and take effect, shall be forwarded to the Secretary for registration within six months of such date. And all such articles or agreements made thereafter shall be forwarded to the Secretary for registration within three months of the date of commencement of service thereunder. Applications for registration shall be accompanied by evidence of the pupil having passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto. The fee for each registration shall be Five shillings. Transfers of articles or agreements shall be registered within three months of such transfers.

16. On and after March, 1913 (except as hereinafter provided), no candidate shall be eligible for examination unless he shall have passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause; provided that, subject to his passing a special examination prescribed by the Board which shall include English, arithmetic, geometry, and algebra, a candidate who has not passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause may be admitted to examination if—

- (a) His articles of indenture or other similar agreement were executed prior to the date upon which these Regulations shall commence and take effect; or
- (b) He failed at an examination held prior to March, 1913; or
- (c) He produces certificates of six years' satisfactory field service.

#### LICENCES TO SURVEY.

17. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 1s.), the declaration as prescribed by the *Land Surveyors Act* 1895, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

## Health Act 1890.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREVENTION OF FIRE  
AND SECURING THE PUBLIC SAFETY AT  
BIOGRAPH AND SIMILAR ENTERTAINMENTS.

THE Board of Public Health of the State of Victoria, by virtue of the powers conferred by section 233 of the Health Act 1890, and of every other power enabling the said Board in this behalf, doth make the following Regulations, with a view to the prevention of fire, and to securing public safety in public buildings and enclosures, that is to say:—

1. When any biograph, photographic lantern, or similar projecting appliance, involving the use of lengthy films, is used in any public building or enclosure, the whole of the light-producing apparatus thereof shall be constructed of non-inflammable material, and shall be so arranged as to reduce, as far as possible, the risk of occurrence of fire or explosion during the whole time such building or enclosure is in public use.

2. Such apparatus shall be in safe working condition, and, when called on, the person using it shall furnish the owner or occupier of the building with a written statement to that effect, which statement shall be shown on demand to any officer of the Board, or of the local Municipal Council, or of the Fire Brigade.

Notwithstanding the production of such statement, should such apparatus be at any time found, when operated inside any public building, to be in an unsafe working condition, its further use is hereby prohibited.

The person manipulating such apparatus shall, when required, produce approved written credentials that he possesses the necessary experience and skill fitting him to operate such apparatus.

3. The apparatus shall, where practicable, be placed in a room fire-isolated from the auditorium. When any such apparatus is placed inside the auditorium, it shall be enclosed in a suitable cabin, the whole of which, including the floor, shall be constructed of fire-resisting material, and have internal dimensions not less than 5 feet by 6 feet by 7 feet in height. The door giving access to this cabin shall open outwards and be self-closing, and, of the three openings which are necessary in the front wall of the cabin, the centre one shall not in size exceed 8 inches wide and 15 inches high, and the opening on each side thereof shall not exceed 8 inches square. A flap or screen to cover all these openings shall be fitted and shall be actuated both from the inside and from the outside of the cabin. In the lower part of the door of the cabin there shall be provided an opening 12 inches by 8 inches in size, and a similar opening shall be provided in the roof, each such opening being covered with fire-resisting interwoven wire netting of 81 meshes to the inch.

4. The cabin shall be firmly secured in position in a space securely railed off from the public by a suitable barrier firmly fixed in position and absolutely clear of doorways, aisles, passages, and other public exits. Such barrier shall completely enclose the space in which the cabin is placed, and be at least 2 feet distant from the latter, and all material and appliances required in connexion with the aforesaid apparatus shall, during the whole time the building is open to the public, be kept strictly within such barrier. No unnecessary combustible material shall be placed or kept within the barrier, and all combustible material shall, as far as practicable, be rendered non-inflammable, or shall be wholly enclosed in fire-proof receptacles.

5. The table or stand on which the apparatus is placed inside the cabin shall be securely fixed to the floor of the latter, and the top of the table shall be covered with fire-proof material.

6. Films liable to be ignited by heat rays from the lantern light shall be effectually protected from such ignition by an incombustible shutter on such apparatus which will, in the event of any accident to the machine or stoppage of the film, effectually cut off and protect the film from the heating influence of the light, and such shutter shall only be raised when the film is in motion for the purpose of projection.

7. The film passing through the lantern shall be wound either mechanically or by hand from one spool to another spool as fast as it emerges from the lantern front, leaving only the shortest possible portion exposed to the light. When a non-inflammable film is not used the containing frame or discs of spools, bobbins, and reels must in all cases be formed of incombustible materials, and they, as also the whole length of film other than the portion exposed to the rays from the lens, shall be entirely enclosed in boxes or cases made of incombustible material, each box or case being provided with an apparatus which will effectually prevent the ignition of the film contained therein. Such films when not actually in use on the lantern shall be kept wholly enclosed in incombustible cases or boxes. Not more than one spool of film per apparatus in actual use for projection purposes shall be exposed at one and the same time, and that only under the immediately personal superintendence of the operator of the apparatus.

Rooms where films are stored or where films are wound from one spool to another, if inside or connected with the main building, shall be of fire-resisting construction or be completely lined with fire-resisting material.

8. The electric arc light shall wherever possible be used as the illuminant for projection purposes, and shall be in accordance with the general rules of the Electrical authorities of the State of Victoria, and shall be subject to the approval of the Government Electric Inspector. Engines and dynamos must be absolutely fire-isolated from the building, and all leads overhead must be at least 8 feet above the floor of the building, otherwise they must be enclosed in steel tubing. A double pole switch shall be installed inside operating cabinet, within reach of the operator when the apparatus is in use. Where fuses of biograph circuit are some distance from the position of the apparatus, fuses shall be installed inside the cabin. The aforesaid switch and fuses shall be on a marble or other suitable approved base. Portable incandescent lamps shall not be used inside the cabin aforesaid.

Under no circumstances will the production or use of highly compressed or liquified acetylene be permitted.

9. If oxy-hydrogen light be used, the hydrogen and oxygen must be stored in tested cylinders of steel, or the oxygen in a metal tank having an effective water seal, and all such stores of gas shall be placed in situations inaccessible to the public. The lighting of the hydrogen flame in the lantern shall be effected only by means of an electric lighter. No naked gas or oil flame and no matches shall be used in the enclosure in which the apparatus aforesaid is placed. A miner's safety lamp may be used if necessary.

Smoking of pipes, cigars, cigarettes, &c., by operators or by any person near such apparatus, films, cylinders, or tanks is hereby prohibited.

10. Fire-extinguishing appliances, and a sufficient supply of water for fire extinction, shall be provided in any building or enclosure where any such apparatus is used, to the satisfaction of the Board, Fire Brigade, or the local Municipal Council. Also an approved portable chemical fire-extinguisher, and two pieces of woollen blanket, each 3 feet by 3 feet, shall be placed inside the cabin referred to in Regulation No. 3, for use only in case of fire. Safety or auxiliary lights in the form of vegetable or animal oil or candle lamps shall be placed over every exit and escape door from the building. Such lamps shall be kept lighted during the whole time the public are in such building.

N.B.—Any person who fails to comply with any of the foregoing Regulations, or is guilty of any neglect or disobedience thereof, is, by section 326 of the *Health Act* 1890, thereby guilty of an offence against that Act, and is liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds and to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Twenty shillings for each day during which such offence is continued, besides any cost or expenses which may be incurred in remedying his default.

#### CITY OF SOUTH MELBOURNE.—BY-LAW No. 166.

A By-law of the City of South Melbourne, made under section 35 of the *Health Act* 1890, and numbered 166, for the prevention of nuisance from the transport of offal, blood, or other offensive matter through the city.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act* 1890, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution, the Council of the City of South Melbourne, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens thereof, hereby make the following By-law, being By-law No. 166 of the said city:—

1. No person having the charge of any vehicle shall carry in or upon any such vehicle in any of the streets of this city, any offal, blood, or other offensive matter (including manure) unless the same is completely covered by a tarpaulin or other suitable waterproof covering.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of South Melbourne.

3. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10 nor less than 5s.

## Water Acts.

## PROPOSED KOONDROOK WATERWORKS DISTRICT.

PURSUANT to the provisions of the Water Acts, I hereby declare that the lands included in the area defined hereunder, and shown on a plan lodged in the office of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, Melbourne, ought to be constituted a Waterworks District.

The area hereinbefore referred to is defined as follows:—

**Portion I.**—Commencing at the north-east angle of allotment 30, section E, township of Koondrook, parish of Murrabit; thence westerly by the northern boundary of that allotment to a one chain road; thence southerly and south-easterly by that road to the northern angle of allotment 59; thence south-westerly by the west boundary of that allotment and by a line to the township boundary; thence south-easterly by that boundary to a point bearing south 7 degrees west from a point in the southern boundary of allotment 22A, section E, distant three hundred and forty-six links and eight-tenths from the south-eastern angle thereof; thence by a line bearing north 7 degrees east to the north-eastern boundary of the same allotment; thence north-westerly by a line to the west angle of allotment 22; thence north-westerly and north-easterly by the south-western and north-western boundaries of that allotment and a line in continuation of the last mentioned boundary to the Murray River; thence north-westerly by that river to a point easterly of the northern boundary of allotment 30, section E; thence westerly to the north-east angle of that allotment to the point of commencement.

**Portion II.**—Commencing at the east angle of allotment 23, section E, township of Koondrook; thence south-westerly by the south-eastern boundary of this allotment to a point therein bearing north 19 deg. 35 min. west from a point in the north-western boundary of allotment 22 aforesaid distant two hundred and sixty-five links and five-tenths from the western angle thereof; thence by lines bearing respectively S. 19 deg. 35 min. E. seven hundred and forty-seven links and six-tenths, S. 7 degrees W. eighty links and two-tenths to a point in the south-west boundary of allotment 21; thence south-easterly by a line to the south-east angle of allotment 22A; thence southerly to a point in the boundary of the township of Koondrook in line with the south-east boundary of allotment 21; thence north-easterly by a line, the said south-east boundary, and a line in continuation thereof to the Murray River; thence by that river north-westerly to a point in line with the south-eastern boundary of allotment 23; and thence by a line south-westerly to the east angle of allotment 23 to the point of commencement.

**Portion III.**—Commencing at the north-west angle of allotment 63, section E, township of Koondrook; thence easterly by the northern boundaries of allotments 63 and 64 to a road at the north-east angle of the latter; thence southerly by that road to the north-east angle of allotment 65; thence easterly to the west boundary of allotment 1, section 15A; thence southerly by a one chain road to the north-west angle of allotment 1, section 16; thence south-easterly by a road to the north-west angle of allotment 9; thence southerly to the north angle of allotment 4, section 20; thence south-easterly by a road to the north-east angle of allotment 5; thence south-westerly by a road to the south-west angle of allotment 10, section 6; thence easterly by a road to its intersection with a three chain road; thence south-westerly by the latter road to a point in line with the southern boundary of allotment 4, section 3; thence easterly by a line across the road, the southern boundary of allotment 4, section 3, and a line to the Gunbower Creek; thence northerly and north-westerly by the Gunbower Creek and the Murray River to a point in line with the south-east boundary of allotment 20, section E; thence by a line bearing south 47 deg. 44 min. west to a Water reserve; thence south-westerly, southerly, and westerly by the eastern and southern boundaries of that reserve to a point in line with the north-west boundary of allotment 10B, section E; thence westerly by a line and that boundary to the north-west angle of that allotment; thence southerly by the township boundary to the north-west angle of allotment 63, the point of commencement.

The scheme of works proposed for such district includes a pumping station at the Murray River, supply main, storage tank, and pipe reticulation in the said proposed Waterworks District.

The estimated cost of such works is £2,500.

By His Excellency Sir John Michael Fleetwood Fuller, Baronet, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1903* (3 Edw. VII. No. 1893) it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Municipality of the Borough of Newtown and Chilwell has requested that the lands hereinafter mentioned, which have been reserved, used, or acquired by the said Council for the purpose of making streets within the said Borough, be so declared public highways: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this notice declare the lands reserved, used, or acquired for the streets hereinafter named and described, and situate within the Borough aforesaid, to be Public Highways within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

## ALLOTMENTS AT TONGALA AVAILABLE FOR APPLICATION UNDER CONDITIONAL PURCHASE LEASE.

THE several allotments included in the Schedule hereunder are declared available as Farm Allotments and Agricultural Labourers' Allotments to be taken up on Conditional Purchase Lease. Applications must be made on the prescribed forms, and forwarded, on or before Monday, 21st August, 1911, to the Secretary, Closer Settlement Branch, Lands Department, accompanied by the deposit, as shown in Schedule hereunder, for the most valuable allotment applied for. The deposit includes registration fee of 5s. and lease fee of £1.

## Conditional Purchase Lease.

The leases issued to successful applicants may be for such a term of years, not exceeding 31½, as may be agreed upon between the lessee and the Board.

An applicant may apply for more than one allotment, but will only be required to lodge one deposit, being the amount chargeable on the most valuable allotment applied for.

Only one allotment can be granted to any one person.

No conditional purchase lease of a Farm Allotment can be granted to any person who is already the holder of land of the value of £2,500 (township land excepted), or who would thereby become the holder of land exceeding such value.

Improvements to the value of at least two instalments of the purchase money must be effected on each farm allotment before the end of the first year from the date of the lease, and 10 per cent. of the purchase money before the end of the third year, and a further 10 per cent. before the end of the sixth year.

The lessee must reside on the allotment. (Personal residence by a wife, or any child not less than eighteen years of age of lessee, may be considered personal residence by the lessee, with the approval of the Board.)

The amount of deposit (less £1 5s.) will be deducted from the capital value, and the half-yearly instalments calculated on the balance of purchase money.

Payments in advance may be made at any time at the option of the lessee, and proportionate reduction of interest secured thereby.

The balance of purchase money, with interest at 4½ per cent., must be paid by 63 or a lesser number of half-yearly instalments, calculated according to any of the tables under Division 3 of Part I. of the *Savings Banks Act 1890 Amendment Act 1896*, the first of such instalments being payable six months after the date of the lease. Each instalment will include interest upon the balance of the purchase money remaining unpaid.

Advances of money to assist in effecting improvements may be granted by the Board, such advances to be repaid in half-yearly instalments extending over fifteen years, bearing interest at 5 per cent. The half-yearly payment will be at the rate of £4 15s. 7d. for every £100 advanced.

## MALLEE LANDS AVAILABLE FOR SELECTION AS AGRICULTURAL ALLOTMENTS.

#### SHIRE OF SWAN HILL.

By-LAW NO. 28.

A By-law of the Shire of Swan Hill made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1903*, for applying Part V. of the Thirteenth Schedule of the Act to the whole of the Shire of Swan Hill and within the township of Swan Hill for regulating and restraining the erection of buildings, erections, hoardings, tents, marquees, and fences.

Regulating the height, thickness, construction, or materials of party walls of buildings adjoining each other; of external walls of buildings, and of chimneys and the materials for and made for enclosing same.

Appointing fees, not in any case exceeding the sum of Two pounds, which may be charged and received on account of the Municipal Fund by the proper officer of the Council for any inspection, superintendence, or other service made or performed by him under this By-law.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Swan Hill order as follows:—

1. That Part V. of the Thirteenth Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1903* shall apply to and have operation within the Shire of Swan Hill.

2. That the following regulations shall apply to and have effect within the township of Swan Hill.

3. The following buildings and works shall be exempt from the operation of this By-law:—

All buildings on land the property of and vested in the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Swan Hill.

All temporary offices used by builders and contractors.

All buildings the property of the Government of the State of Victoria or the Commonwealth of Australia.

#### Wooden, &c., Buildings.

4. Subject to Clause A hereof, and subject to the limitations and conditions hereinafter contained, buildings may be newly erected or constructed of wood or iron, or if already built may be added to in wood or iron, on land abutting on any street of the township of Swan Hill, provided that—

(a) The external side walls shall be distant from the boundaries of the land on which they stand at least 3 feet, and shall not exceed in height 15 feet.

(b) Stables or sheds, the external walls and roofs of which are covered with iron, may be built flush with the boundaries of the land on which they stand; if more than 10 feet distant from any building and more than 20 feet from the street.

(c) No tent or marquee or similar structure used for purposes of amusement or for meetings shall be erected at a less distance than 18 feet from any dwelling house.

(d) Two or more dwelling houses may not be erected on one block of land belonging to the same owner; unless detached from each other by at least 10 feet, or separated by a wall of brick or stone at least 8½ inches in thickness and carried up at least 15 inches above the roof or gutter and projecting at least 1 inch beyond the face of woodwork.

(e) The external walls of such wooden buildings shall be covered with sound weatherboards or galvanized corrugated iron or other approved material.

5. Notwithstanding anything contained in this By-law (except clause 2), no building or erection, the external walls of which are of other materials than stone, brick, or approved concrete, shall be erected or constructed within 40 feet of the building lines of Campbell-street between the north boundary of Rutherford-street and the south boundary of Pritchard-street; McCallum-street, from Beveridge to Curlew streets, and McCrae-street, from Beveridge to Curlew streets, provided that where there is a wooden or iron building in existence at the time of confirmation of this By-law, such building may be added to from time to time in wood or iron, provided, however, that such addition shall be distant at least 20 feet from the building line of the street.

#### Walls of whatever kind other than Wooden Walls.

6. Every wall of whatever kind must be built upon a constructed footing, based on solid ground or on other sufficient foundation approved by the Engineer, and not less than 18 inches deep.

(A) Every footing must be built of brick, stone, or approved concrete so as to produce solid ground.

(n) The footing of every wall must be at least 6 inches wider than the wall standing thereon.

(c) The foundation of every wall carrying the ground floor plates shall be at least 6 inches above the ground line, except in the case of shops erected flush with the building line of any street.

(d) Every wall shall have a sufficient damp course above the surface of the ground of approved material throughout its whole length.

7. Where the external wall of any building is erected on the boundary of the land on which the same stands, or where the overhanging eaves or gutters of such building would be within 2 feet of such boundary, then the external wall of such building shall be carried up to form a parapet 15 inches at least in height above the roof or above the highest part of any flat or gutter.

8. Every party wall shall be carried up for a height of 15 inches above the roof or 15 inches above the highest part of any flat or gutter, and shall be of a thickness equal to that of such wall in the topmost story, with a minimum of 8½ inches.

9. Every bressumer must have a bearing in the direction of its length of at least 6 inches at each end upon a sufficient pier of brick or stone, the ends of such bressumer, if of wood, shall not be placed nearer to the centre of the party wall than 1½ inches. Bressumers must bear upon a template of stone or iron.

10. If it be intended to permanently divide any building into two or more distinct parts, then every wall for that purpose must be built as a party wall to the underside of roof.

11. Where the lowermost rooms or cellars in any building (being rooms of which the surface of the floor is more than 4 feet below the level of the nearest footpath, street, or lane) cannot be otherwise lighted, the same may be lighted by means of apertures or areas extending under the footways. Such apertures shall be enclosed by solid concrete or brickwork and covered with a solid immovable iron frame with glass tubes or prisms level with surface of footway. No such area or grating shall extend from the building line more than 2 feet, nor shall they be more than 4 feet in length, except as otherwise permitted by the Council.

12. Every person who erects a new building shall so construct every room in the lowermost story that there shall be, for the purpose of ventilation, between the underside of every joist and the upper side of the ground surface, a clear space of at least 3 inches in every part, and shall cause such space to be thoroughly ventilated by means of suitable and sufficient air bricks or some other efficient means so arranged as to cause a through current of air to pass beneath the flooring.

13. Every habitable room shall be at least 9 feet in height from floor to ceiling.

14. Every habitable room shall have one or more windows, a clear superficial area of at least one-tenth of the floor space of the room, and opening into the external air free from any obstruction to light. A room having no external light may be lighted through the roof by a dormer window with a total clear superficial area to one-twelfth at least of the floor area.

15. Every chimney or chimney stack must be constructed of brick, stone, or concrete. The jambs of every chimney shall not be less than 8½ inches wide on each side of such opening. Chimneys to be plastered or pargetted on the inside, and no smoke flue to be less than 9 inches internal diameter. No timber shall be placed over any opening for supporting the breast of any chimney, but there must be an arch of brick over the opening of each chimney. All flat or cambered arches to have an iron bar under and built into abutments. No timber work shall be laid in any wall nearer any smoke flue than 4½ inches. Hearths to be laid and bedded wholly on brick or stone at least 4 inches thick.

16. The external part of any roof, flat, or gutter to be covered with slates, tiles, lead, galvanized corrugated iron, or other incombustible approved material.

17. Roofs, flats, gutters, balconies, verandahs, and shop fronts shall be so arranged and constructed, and so supplied with gutters and pipes, as to prevent water therefrom dropping or running over any public way; all such pipes, &c., to be made of metal, and shall be carried under the footways into the street channel, where a street channel is provided for that purpose.

18. No person shall erect, or cause to be erected, any portico or verandah over the footway of any street without consent of the Council, and such portico or verandah shall be of the shape, dimensions, and materials as adopted and approved by the Council, but the lowest part of the frieze or rail shall in no case be less than 8 ft. 6 in. above the level of the outer edge of the footway.

19. No person shall erect or fix under any verandah over a footway in any street any signboard, hanging lamp, gas-pipe, or other similar fixture unless the lowest part of same is of a height not less than 8 feet above the level of the footway over which it is placed, unless a written permit from the Council is first obtained.

20. No person shall erect or construct any hoarding, signboard, or similar erection for advertising purposes on the building line of any street within a distance from such building line equal to the greatest height of such hoarding, &c., without the consent of the Council.

21. No person shall erect any tent, marquee, or similar structure for purposes of amusement or entertainment on any vacant land without first having obtained the consent of the Council or its responsible officer.

22. In streets in which at the site of any proposed crossing there is a kerb of stone or wood along the outer edge of the footway, the crossing, so far as the footway extends, shall be so constructed as specified by the Engineer, and shall, with respect to the channel, be so laid and constructed so as not to raise or obstruct the same, or any part thereof, and shall be constructed in accordance with the plans and specifications adopted by the Council therefor. No person shall construct a crossing without obtaining written consent of the Council.

23. No closet or urinal shall be erected, or remain in front of any building, without written consent of the Council; in front of any building facing a street, or a less distance than 10 feet from any street. But closets may be built abutting on any lane of less than a width of 16 feet. All closets must be constructed in a manner approved by the Engineer.

24. All fences are to be kept in a good state of repair and to the approval of the Engineer, and no gates thereon shall open over any footpath.

25. All new buildings or additions or existing buildings shall be constructed of good sound material of their respective kinds, and of dimensions proportioned to the stress to which the same may be subjected in accordance with the best trade usages.

26. All terms, building and otherwise, such as "approved," "party wall," "bressumer," &c., shall be taken to mean as hereinafter defined:—

"Approved" means approved by the Engineer.

"Area" applied to a building means the superficies of a horizontal section thereof, made at the point of its greatest surface, inclusive of the external walls and of such portions of the party walls as belong to the building.

"Bressumer" means a beam of reinforced concrete, or a wrought-iron or steel girder which carries a wall.

"Builder" means the master builder or other person employed to execute any work, or if there is no master builder or other person so employed, then the owner of the building or other person for whom or by whose orders such work is to be done.

"Building" means any structure capable of affording protection or shelter, either roofed, or intended, or adapted to be roofed, and whether enclosed by walls or not; but does not include any greenhouse, aviary, fence, or other similar building or erection.

"Cement concrete" means an approved mixture of high-grade Portland cement, clean sharp sand, and aggregates consisting of fragments or particles of hard stone or gravel thoroughly clean and entirely free from combustible matter and from volcanic scoriae, furnace slag, coke, breeze, or any material containing any trace of sulphur.

"External wall" means an outer wall or vertical enclosure of any building not being a party wall.

"Foundation" applied to a wall having footings means the solid ground or artificially-formed support on which the footings of the wall rest.

"Ground floor" means the story of the building to which there is an entrance from the outside on or near the level of the ground, and where there are two such stories, then the higher of the two: Provided that no story of which the upper surface of the floor is more than 6 feet below the level of the adjoining pavement shall be deemed to be the ground-story.

"Hoarding" includes any erection or structure erected, built, or constructed, or used for the purpose of writing, printing, painting, pasting, or posting thereon notices, advertisements, placards, or other printed, painted, or written matter, or any erection or structure being of a height greater than 6 feet measured from the level of the adjoining street to the highest point of such erection or structure upon which notices, advertisements, placards, or other printed, painted, or written matter are printed, written, painted, pasted, or posted, but does not include a hoarding erected in a street for the purpose of carrying on building operations only or dwelling house or shop, or any fence 7 feet or under in height.

"New building" includes—

(a) Any building erected or commenced to be erected after the date of this By-law coming into force; and

(b) Any building which for more than half its cubical content has been taken down or destroyed by fire, tempest, or otherwise, and is re-erected or commenced to be re-erected wholly or partially on the same site; and

(c) Any building or erection removed or transported wholly or in sections into the municipal district, or from one part of the municipal district to another part of the same after the date of this By-law coming into force.

"Party wall" means a wall built to be used as a separation of two or more buildings, or a wall forming part of a building built upon the dividing line between adjoining premises for their common use.

"Prescribed" means prescribed by this By-law.

27. No person shall commence any buildings, any addition, or alteration without delivering at the Engineer's office a written notice thereof within seven clear days before commencing, and producing, if required by the Engineer, plans and specifications of such building, additions, or alterations, such plans to be subject to the final approval of the Council.

28. List of fees payable under this By-law, which must be paid on notification to the Council, as mentioned in clause 27:—

29. Where any building is partly or wholly erected, built, or constructed contrary to the provisions of this By-law—

(a) The Council may give to the owner or builder notice in writing to bring such building into conformity with the said provisions, or requiring the pulling down or removal of such building, &c.

(b) If default is made in complying with such notice, and notwithstanding the imposition or recovery of any penalty, it shall be lawful for the Council, through its Engineer, to enter on such building, and, with a sufficient number of workmen, to demolish and pull down the said building, or any part thereof, and remove the material thereof to some convenient place, and if the Council, in their discretion, think fit, may sell same.

(c) All expenses incurred by the Council or Engineer in demolishing the said building, or any part thereof, or of removing the materials and selling same, and doing such other acts as aforesaid, and all fees or penalties due by the owner or builder thereof, may be deducted and retained by the Council out of the proceeds of such sale.

(d) The Council shall pay over any surplus arising from such sale on application being made by the person entitled thereto.
