THE following letter from the King was received by the Secretary of State for the Home Department on the 29th June, 1911:—

Buckingham Palace,
29th June, 1911.

TO MY PEOPLE,

Now that the Coronation and its attendant ceremonies are over, I desire to assure the people of the British Empire of my grateful sense that their hearts have been with me through it all. I felt this in the beautiful and impressive Service in the Abbey—the most solemn experience of my life—and scarcely less in the stirring scenes of the succeeding days, when my people have signified their recognition and their heartfelt welcome of me as their Sovereign. For this has been apparent, not only in the loyal enthusiasm shown in our passage to and from Westminster and in the Progresses which we have

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made in different districts of London, but also in the thousands of messages of goodwill which have come to me across the seas from every part of the Empire. Such affectionate demonstrations have profoundly touched me, and have filled me afresh with faith and confidence. Believing that this generous and outspoken sympathy with the Queen and myself is, under God, our surest source of strength, I am encouraged to go forward with renewed hope. Whatever perplexities and difficulties may lie before me and my people, we shall all unite in facing them resolutely, calmly, and with public spirit, confident that, under Divine guidance, the ultimate outcome will be to the common good.

Health Act 1890.

SHIRE OF BUNGAREE.

By-LAW NO. 3.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890* and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Bungaree, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the portion of the Western Riding of the Shire of Bungaree, in the area set out in clause 12 hereto; but it shall cease to apply to any portion or portions of the said area that may from time to time be exempted from its operation by special order of the Council.

4. The occupier of any premises on which there is a closet or privy shall cause the space under the seat of each closet or privy on such premises to be prepared, and shall permit the same to be used, for the double-pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause the closet or privy to be kept in a fit state for such service.

No person shall construct, or cause to be constructed, any privy, except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than three inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and shall be provided with a suitable pan or other movable receptacle for night-soil, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan, and contents thereof, and emptying and cleansing the same. All earth closets shall have clear and ample ventilation overhead, and shall have impervious middensteads, constructed of brick in cement, or cement concrete, or of like non-absorbent material, finished off with a smooth even surface of cement mortar, with a converging fall of half-an-inch to the foot to the pan door, fitted with guides to

insure correct position for pan at all times, and at such a level as to be at least three inches above the surrounding ground level, and as to insure the top of pan being not more than 1½ inches below the underside of seat, and shall have a hinged flap on seat. No person shall remove from premises occupied by him any night-soil except by means of a sanitary cart.

5. The Council shall cause every closet or privy to be supplied and kept supplied with two pans for the reception of night-soil, and a lid to closely fit the same, and shall cause one or other of such pans to be kept under the seat aforesaid.

6. The occupier aforesaid or other person having the control or management of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan in such closet or privy to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

7. The Council shall at least once a week cause the pan in use to be closed with a lid, and removed with its contents from the premises in the day-time, and the other pan to be left in its place.

8. Before leaving any pan in a closet or privy the Council shall cause the same to be cleansed by superheated steam and tar-painted inside or by some equally efficient means.

9. The occupier aforesaid or other person shall not contract for the removal of night-soil from such premises except in accordance with this By-law.

10. The Council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate, to make a charge on each occupier for the pans supplied, and for the removal of night-soil and the other work herein directed, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

11. If any person or the Council commit a breach of this By-law, he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

12. Sanitary area referred to in clause 3 shall be as follows:—

Commencing at the south-west angle of allotment 4 of section 16, township of Ballarat North; thence north-westerly by the Ballarat to Creswick main road to a point thereon 20 chains north-west of Norman-street; thence east by a line to north-east angle of allotment 3 of section F, parish of Ballarat; thence north by Doveton-street to north-east angle of allotment 3 of section G, parish of Ballarat; thence easterly by northern boundary of the Ballarat General Cemetery to the north-east angle thereof; thence south to the south-east angle of the said Cemetery; thence east by the north boundary of Norman-street to the east boundary of the township of Ballarat North; thence south by the said east boundary to Gregory-street; thence west by Gregory-street to the commencing point.

PORTLAND MUNICIPAL COMMON.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons, made by the Governor in Council on the 8th day of January, 1902, the managers of the Portland Municipal Common, having drafted the following amendments of the Regulations for management thereof, submit such amendments for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval of the Governor in Council:—

AMENDMENTS OF REGULATIONS.

The following shall be read in lieu of Regulation 7:—

“Every animal placed upon the Common shall bear a metal tag having thereupon a distinctive number, attached to it by means of a metal chain, which tag shall be supplied by the managers upon registration being effected, and until such tag is returned to the managers, the animal originally bearing such tag shall be deemed to be depasturing upon the Common, and the owner thereof shall be liable for the agistment fees therefor.”

The following shall be read in lieu of Regulation 3:—

“The fees for depasturing stock on the Common during the hours between 6 a.m. and 5 p.m. during the months of April, May, June, July, August, and September, and to 7 p.m. during the other months of the year, shall be as follow, and shall be payable in advance during the first week in January, April, July, and October in each and every year, that is to say:—

For every horse, One pound per annum, if paid for in advance in one sum, but if paid quarterly, the sum of Five shillings per quarter for each quarter of the year excepting that commencing upon the 1st October, in which quarter the charge shall be Ten shillings.

For every head of other large cattle, Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum, if paid for in advance in one sum, but if paid quarterly, the sum of Three shillings per quarter for each quarter of the year excepting that commencing upon the 1st October, in which quarter the charge shall be Six shillings.

Foals and calves at foot are allowed to run free up to six months old.

No stock under the age of two years shall be allowed upon the Common, excepting on such portion thereof as the managers may set apart for the purpose, after the 1st of April, 1912.

For sheep, at the rate of Four shillings per head per annum.

For every goat, the sum of One shilling per annum.”

3. In the absence of any specific means of measurement the quantity of water supplied shall be ascertained by accounting a watering as being a volume of water one-half foot in depth over any area watered, and for the purposes of this By-law a watering shall mean the application of water to land for the purpose of irrigation, and a watering shall be and is hereby deemed to be a volume of water one-half foot in depth over any area watered.

4. The charge for the supply of water for irrigation of lands shall be—

During the period from the 1st day of October in every year (beginning with the year 1911) to the 30th day of April in each succeeding year, Three shillings for each and every acre foot of water supplied.

During the period from the 1st day of May to the 30th day of September in every year (beginning with the year 1912), Two shillings for each and every acre foot of water supplied.

5. An acre foot of water shall be and is hereby deemed to be such quantity of water as would cover an area of one acre to a depth of one foot.

6. Applications for the supply of water for irrigation shall be made in writing to the Water Bailiff in charge of that portion of the district in which the land to be irrigated is situated, or to such other officer as may be authorized by the Commission to receive applications.

7. Charges for water supplied for irrigation under this By-law shall be payable at the office of the Commission, at Pyramid Hill, fourteen days after the date such water is supplied.

8. Such person or persons as the Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said charges.

9. All persons taking water from the works of the Commission shall take delivery thereof through their respective outlets at such times, in such order, and in such manner as the Commission may direct.

10. The outlets for the delivery of water shall be opened only by the Water Bailiffs of the district, or such other officers as may be authorized by the Commission.

In the absence of any specific means of measurement the quantity of water supplied shall be ascertained by accounting a watering as being a volume of water one-half foot in depth over any area watered, and for the purposes of this By-law or any By-law making an irrigation charge a watering shall mean the application of water to land for the purpose of irrigation, and a watering shall be and is hereby deemed to be a volume of water one-half foot in depth over any area watered.

4. The charge for the supply of water for irrigation of lands to which water rights have been apportioned during the period from the 1st day of October in every year (beginning with the year 1911) to the 30th day of April in each succeeding year, shall be as set out in the By-law making the irrigation charge for such period; and if a supply is obtained in excess of any water rights apportioned to any lands during such period the charge for such excess shall be at the same rate of payment per unit of volume as that imposed in respect of the water apportioned to the lands as rights.

The charge for the supply of water for irrigation of lands other than those to which water rights have been apportioned during the period from the 1st day of October in every year (beginning with the year 1911) to the 30th day of April in each succeeding year, shall be as agreed upon between the Commission and the persons requiring water.

During the period from the 1st day of May to the 31st day of May in every year (beginning with the year 1912), Five shillings for each and every acre foot of water supplied.

During the year from the 1st day of August to the 30th day of September in every year (beginning with the year 1912), Two shillings for each and every acre foot of water supplied.

7. An acre foot of water shall be, and is for the purposes of this and any By-law making an irrigation charge, deemed to be such quantity of water as would cover an area of one acre to a depth of one foot.

8. Applications for the supply of water for irrigation shall be made in writing to the Water Bailiff in charge of that portion of the district in which the land to be irrigated is situated, or to such other officer as may be authorized by the Commission to receive applications.

9. Charges for water supplied for irrigation other than water supplied under a water right shall be payable at the office of the Commission, at Tatura, fourteen days after the date such water is supplied.

10. Such person or persons as the Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said charges.

11. All persons taking water from the works of the Commission shall take delivery thereof through their respective outlets at such times, in such order, and in such manner as the Commission may direct.

That the area included within the boundaries defined in the Schedule hereto shall be, and the same is, hereby constituted an Irrigation and Water Supply District (and as on and from the date hereof such area shall be deemed to be so constituted).

1. That the boundaries of such district shall be those set out and described in the aforesaid Schedule.

2. That the name of such district shall be Bamawm Irrigation and Water Supply District.

3. The scheme of local works proposed for such district includes a main channel from Waranga Reservoir for the supply of this and other districts, and a system of distributary channels and appurtenant works.

4. The estimated cost of such works, including portion of the cost of main channel, is £65,000, whereof £250 represents liability to be transferred from the existing Campaspe Irrigation and Water Supply District.

5. The quantity of water assigned to such district is one hundred and twenty (120) cubic feet per second.

The source of supply is to be the Goulburn River by way of the Goulburn-Waranga Main Channel, the Waranga Reservoir, and the Waranga-Mallee Main Channel.

The season at which such supply is to be received is to embrace the whole year.

By His Excellency Sir John Michael Fleetwood Fuller, Baronet, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Land Act* 1901 (1 Edw. VII. No. 1749) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, and, after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette*, diminish, alter, or abolish any common, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and that nothing therein contained shall prevent the exercise of the powers conferred by the said Part of the said Act with respect to the leasing or licensing of any land comprised in any common: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby diminish the Common hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE
CLUNES UNITED MUNICIPAL AND GOLD-
FIELD COMMON.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons, made by the Governor in Council on the 8th day of January, 1902, the Managers of the Clunes United Municipal and Gold-field Common, having drafted the following substituted and additional Regulations for the management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council:—

REGULATIONS.

9. In lieu of Regulation 9 of the Regulations approved by the Governor in Council on 19th June, 1906, the fees for depasturing stock on the Common shall be as follows, and shall be payable annually, in advance, on the first day of June in every year:—

For the first four head of progeny over six (6) months and under twelve (12) months of age of stock legally depasturing on the Common, Two shillings (2s.) per head per annum; and for every additional head, Three shillings (3s.) per head per annum. For every horse, mare, gelding, colt, filly, ass, or mule, Twelve shillings (12s.) per head per annum. For the first four head of other large cattle, Four shillings (4s.) per head per annum; and for every additional head, Six shillings (6s.) per head per annum. The progeny under six months of age of stock legally depasturing on the Common, free.

20. Every person entitled to commonage shall, before depasturing any stock on the Common, give to the Herdsman a true and correct description of such stock and their brands and other distinctive marks, and shall obtain from the Herdsman a certificate of having done so, and shall at the same time obtain a badge and chain from the Herdsman (both of which shall be the absolute property of the Managers) for any number of stock he wishes to depasture. He shall then be responsible and liable to be charged for that number from the time the Herdsman delivers the badge or badges to him to the date of delivery of same back to the Herdsman. No person shall use other than registered badges in connexion with stock legally depasturing on the Common. Should the badge or badges aforesaid be from any cause removed from the stock they must be at once replaced at the expense of the person depasturing (and shall be supplied by the Herdsman at

a cost of One shilling each); and any person who shall place, or allow to be placed, a chain and badge on any stock without the authority of the Herdsman shall be liable to be prosecuted.

Every person offending against the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any Justice of the Peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for each offence.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVES FOR SHOW YARDS IN THE TOWNSHIP OF SHEPPARTON, KNOWN AS "THE SHEPPARTON SHOW GROUND."

WHEREAS by section 200 of the *Land Act 1901*, it is enacted that where under the provisions of any Act relating to Crown lands the Governor in Council has reserved from sale permanently any Crown lands for any public purpose whatsoever, or for any of the purposes specified in section 10 of such Act, and has vested such land in trustees or jointly in the Board of Land and Works and trustees, it shall be lawful for the trustees of any such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council, to make rules and regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in sub-section (1) of section 200, *Land Act 1901*: And whereas Crown grants have issued in respect of the reserves for Show Yards in the township of Shepparton, known as and hereinafter designated "The Shepparton Show Ground." Now therefore the trustees of The Shepparton Show Ground do hereby make the following Regulations in respect thereof:—

REGULATIONS.

I. Except when a show or parade, or any sports meeting, gathering, or entertainment is being held thereon, no person shall bring any live stock, or vehicle, machinery, or other goods or chattels on any part of The Shepparton Show Ground without the consent, in writing, of the trustees, or of some person duly authorized in that behalf by the trustees.

II. No person shall exercise or train any horse or pony on The Shepparton Show Ground, or any part thereof, without the consent, in writing, of the trustees.

III. No person shall in any way damage, deface, or destroy any fence, building, or erection, or any property of any kind, or any exhibit on The Shepparton Show Ground, or enter upon or damage any experimental plot therein, or damage, deface, or destroy any tree, flower, or shrub, or other vegetation in The Shepparton Show Ground.

IV. No person shall without the consent, in writing, of the trustees, or of some person duly authorized by them, distribute or assist in distributing any bill, placard, or notice in The Shepparton Show Ground, or post or stick, or assist in posting or sticking, any bill, placard, poster, or notice upon any fence, wall, building, property, or premises on The Shepparton Show Ground.

V. Except on the occasion of the annual show of The Shepparton Agricultural Society, no person shall without the consent, in writing, of the trustees, or of some person duly authorized by them, enter upon any part of The Shepparton Show Ground, or any building, shed, or premises thereon.

VI. No person shall without the consent, in writing, of the trustees, or of some person duly authorized, in writing, by them, light any fire on any part of The Shepparton Show Ground, or in any building, shed, or premises thereon.

VII. No person shall without the consent, in writing, of the trustees, or of some person duly authorized, in writing, by them, enter or remain within any building, shed, tent, or other premises on The Shepparton Show Ground, or in or upon any part thereof, after 7.30 o'clock in the evening.

VIII. No person shall on The Shepparton Show Ground, or in any building, shed, tent, stand, or other erection thereon—

- (1) Assault any other person.
- (2) Use any profane, indecent, or obscene language, or any threatening, abusive, or insulting words.
- (3) Be drunk and disorderly.
- (4) Behave riotously or indecently, or otherwise misbehave or misconduct himself or herself.

IX. No person shall bring into The Shepparton Show Ground any dog unless led by a chain or cord.

X. Unless otherwise authorized under these Regulations no person shall enter The Shepparton Show Ground unless he shall have a ticket duly authorizing him so to do.

XI. The maximum scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to The Shepparton Show Ground, on such days (not exceeding twelve (12) in any one year) as The Shepparton Show Ground may be set apart for shows, shall be as follows:—

For the admission of each person not under the age of 12 years, such sum as the trustees may determine, not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.).

For the admission of each child over the age of six (6) years and under the age of twelve (12) years such sum as the trustees may determine, not exceeding One shilling and threepence (1s. 3d.).

For the admission of each horse, such sum as the trustees may determine, not exceeding Twenty shillings (20s.).

For the admission of each vehicle, such sum as the trustees may determine, not exceeding Twenty shillings (20s.), and such further sum as the trustees may determine, not exceeding the sum of Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) may be charged and taken for the admission of each person to each raised stand or platform on The Shepparton Show Ground.

Every person paying the prescribed sum for admission shall be supplied with a ticket of admission.

Provided always that members of The Shepparton Agricultural Society and females shall be admitted free of charge on production of tickets issued by the said Society, and that the trustees may exempt any other person wholly or partially from the payment of all or any of such tolls, entrance fees, or other charges.

XII. Every person to whom a ticket has been issued authorizing such person to enter upon any part of The Shepparton Show Ground shall, upon demand, produce such ticket to any gatekeeper, servant, or other person having authority from the trustees to demand production of tickets. Every person other than a member of The Shepparton Agricultural Society who has received a ticket under the last preceding Regulation shall, if required, surrender such ticket to any gatekeeper, servant, or other person duly authorized to demand the surrender of tickets.

XIII. No person except the judge or judges, stewards, and officials appointed by the committee of The Shepparton Agricultural Society to act in the particular class then exhibiting, exhibitors, and authorized attendants, and such persons as may be authorized by the trustees, shall enter the judge's box, the show ring, judging ring, or any other place where exhibits are being judged in The Shepparton Show Ground.

XIV. No person shall enter the committee room, stewards' room, or office of The Shepparton Agricultural Society, or the approaches thereto respectively, on The Shepparton Show Ground except the committee, stewards, and officials of the said Society and those authorized by such committee or stewards.

XV. No person other than members of The Shepparton Agricultural Society shall bring any horse or vehicle into that portion of The Shepparton Show Ground reserved for members.

XVI. No person shall erect any stall, stand, tent, or structure on The Shepparton Show Ground, or sell or expose for sale therein any live stock or goods or chattels, or bring any stall, stand, tent, structure, machinery, cart, carriage, barrow, or other vehicle upon any part of The Shepparton Show Ground which has not been set apart for the purpose.

XVII. No person who has been convicted in a court of law of larceny, or of an attempt to commit larceny, or of obtaining money by false pretences, or of an attempt to obtain money by false pretences, or who is a reputed thief, pickpocket, balancer, or welscher, shall enter or remain on any part of The Shepparton Show Ground.

XVIII. Any person who in the opinion of the trustees has been guilty of disorderly conduct, or has been disqualified as an exhibitor, may be warned off The Shepparton Show Ground, or any part thereof, by any person duly authorized by the trustees in that behalf.

XIX. No person shall remain on The Shepparton Show Ground, or on any part thereof, after having been warned off such land or part under the last preceding Regulation.

XX. Every person offending against any of these Regulations may be removed from the said land, and such removal shall not exempt such offender from any penalty to which he or she would otherwise be liable for such offence.

Every person offending against any of these Regulations shall, on conviction before any Justice, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who so offends and who, after having been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or officer or servant of the trustees, or by any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such

bailiff of Crown lands or officer or servant, or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

1. No tender will necessarily be accepted.

3. Tenders must be at a price per ton, irrespective of the species of wattle, and the bark must be weighed at the weighbridge named in each case, or at a weighbridge approved by the officer in charge and at the expense of the licensee. Duplicate weighbridge tickets must be provided, and, if so directed by him, the bark must be weighed in the presence of the officer in charge.
4. Royalty must be paid in two instalments, the first payment covering all bark removed by 2nd December, 1911, and the second payment covering all bark removed by 28th February, 1912, by which latter date all work must cease, and all bark, stripped or otherwise, remaining on the area after that date shall be the property of the Crown.
5. No tree shall be felled or stripped on any beauty spot, picnic ground, or on any portion of any area which the officer in charge points out as not to be operated upon, and no particular tree, specially marked by him to remain standing, shall be felled or stripped, wherever situated.
6. No tree shall be felled so as to fall into any water-course, or so as to obstruct any road or track.
7. No tree of less than 5 inches diameter at a height of 2 feet from the ground shall be stripped when of the black or feather-leaved variety, or less than 2½ inches in diameter at a height of 2 feet from the ground, when of the broad-leaved species, unless otherwise stated herein, and wherever a size limit is mentioned it shall be at a height of 2 feet from the ground. Notwithstanding this, trees of any diameter may be stripped with the express permission of the officer in charge, if diseased, or for other, in his opinion, valid reason.

By-LAW No. 131.

Hoardings.

A By-law of the City of Prahran, made under section 198 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered one hundred and thirty-one for the purpose of—

- Regulating and restraining the erection and construction of erections or hoardings.
- Requiring the pulling down and removal of erections or hoardings.
- Authorizing the Council to pull down and remove erections or hoardings erected or constructed contrary to any such By-law, or not pulled down or removed as required by or under any such By-law, and to sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such erections or hoardings, and in paying into the Municipal Fund any fees or penalties due to the owner thereof.
- Appointing fees which may be charged and received by the Council for any act done or to be done by any of its officers under such regulations, and for any permit or licence to be issued by the Council.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of Prahran order as follows:—

1. *Erection of Hoardings, Signboards, &c.—Plan and Specification.—Lowest part of Hoarding.*—No person shall erect, build, or construct, or alter or add to, or cause to be erected, built, or constructed, or altered or added to, any hoarding or erection for advertising purposes on the building line of any street or road, or within a distance from such building line equal to the greatest height of such hoarding or erection measured from the level of the adjoining footpath, without first obtaining the consent of the Council or City Surveyor, and unless such hoarding or erection is erected, built, or constructed, altered or added to, in accordance with a plan and specification prepared by such person and previously approved by the City Surveyor. The lowest part of such hoarding other than the main supports thereof shall not (without the consent of the Council or the City Surveyor) be nearer than three feet to the footpath or the ground adjoining, whichever is the higher.

2. *Material to be Approved.*—The material of which such hoarding or erection is to be built or constructed, or with which it is to be altered or added to, shall be such as may be approved by the City Surveyor, having due regard to the height, position, and site of such hoarding or erection.

3. *Hoardings, &c., Erected contrary to By-law.*—*Notice.—Powers of Council.*—If any person erects, builds, alters, adds to, constructs, or fixes, or causes to be erected, built, altered, added to, constructed, or fixed, any hoarding or erection for advertising purposes contrary to the provisions of this By-law, it shall be lawful for the Council or City Surveyor to serve on the owner or occupier of the premises to which the same is affixed a notice to pull down and remove such hoarding or erection by giving such notice to such owner or occupier, or by affixing such notice on the hoarding or erection; and in the event of such owner or occupier thereof refusing or neglecting to pull down and remove such hoarding or erection for seven days from and after the service of such notice it shall be lawful for the Council to pull down and remove, or cause to be pulled down or removed, any hoarding or erection constructed, erected, altered, added to, or fixed contrary to this By-law; and the Council may recover from such owner or occupier the cost of so doing in any court of competent jurisdiction, and in addition may sell the materials thereof and apply the proceeds of such sale in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such hoarding or erection and in paying any fees and penalties due by such owner or occupier.

4. *Dangerous Hoardings.*—*Notice.*—If the City Surveyor shall certify, in writing, that any hoarding or erection is in such a state as to be dangerous to public or private safety the owner of such hoarding or erection, upon receiving notice from the Council requiring him to pull down or remove the said hoarding or erection, shall pull down or remove such hoarding or erection within the time limited by such notice, not being less than three days from the service thereof.

5. *Powers of Council.*—In default of compliance with any such notice to pull down or remove any hoarding or erection the Council may, immediately on the expiration of the time therein limited, pull down or remove such hoarding or erection, and may sell any of the materials thereof and apply the proceeds of such sale in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down, removing, and selling such hoarding, erection, or materials, and in paying into the Municipal Fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.

6. *Fee.*—The fee of Two pounds shall be payable by the owner of any property for any certificate, permit, or licence to be issued by the Council under this By-law.

7. *Operation of By-law.*—This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

SHIRE OF MANSFIELD.

A By-law of the Shire of Mansfield, made under sections 197 and 498 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 15, for regulating the conditions under which "cattle" may be driven on to any street or road for purpose of grazing there with the Council's consent.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Mansfield order as follows:—

BY-LAW NO. 15.

1. That any ratepayer shall be entitled to and may apply to register a number not exceeding twenty head of bomed cattle or six head of horses in each of the quarters provided in clause 7 hereof.

2. Application to be registered shall be in the form in the Schedule hereunder, supplied by the Council, and shall be signed by the applicant, and the applicant shall make a declaration as to the *bona fides* of his ownership of the animals sought to be registered.

3. Such form shall specify (*inter alia*) the particulars and descriptions and brands or apparent brands and marks, age, and sex of the stock desired to be registered, and the roads or reserves and ridings on which the applicant desires to graze such stock.

4. Such form of application shall be submitted to the Council for approval.

5. If the Council approve the application it shall issue a permit or licence in the form to be approved by the Council to the applicant.

6. The charges or fees subject to increase or decrease by a resolution of the Council from time to time for grazing shall be:—

- (a) For each horse above the age of six months, Five shillings per quarter.
 (b) For each head of cattle above the age of six months, Three shillings per quarter.

7. Such charges or fees shall be payable quarterly in advance to the herdsman of the Council, and the quarters shall begin on the first days of the months of January, April, July, and October in each year.

8. Fees payable under permits to register granted during the currency of a quarter shall be apportioned according to the unexpired term of that quarter.

9. Any person entering stock during the currency of any quarter shall pay for the unexpired portion of the quarter, but not less than one month's fee shall in that case be accepted.

10. That the Council shall have a discretion as to the number of cattle or horses which each applicant shall be entitled to register under clause 1 hereof, or to graze upon such roads, streets, or reserves from time to time; and the Council may regulate the increase or diminish the numbers to be grazed in any quarter.

11. That no person shall be permitted to graze any sheep, entire horse, or bull on any street, road, or reserve in the Shire of Mansfield, and any such animals found upon any road, street, or reserve will be impounded by the Council's herdsman, as will also any sheep, cattle, or horses found grazing upon any such road, street, or reserve without the Council's registered permit under this By-law.

12. That no permit will be granted to graze stock within the town boundaries of Mansfield.

13. The Council shall not be responsible or liable for any loss by theft or death, or for any injury or damage to or straying of any cattle or horse grazing under the aforesaid permit, nor for the supply of a sufficiency of grass or water, and the permit or licence to graze shall be applied for and obtained strictly upon these conditions.

14. Each animal for which application is made to register shall be the *bona fide* property of the applicant, and the applicant shall make a statutory declaration to that effect.

15. Calves and foals under six months of age, the progeny of the registered cows or mares, may run with their mothers free of charge up to that limit of age.

16. Nothing in this By-law shall prevent the operation of section 17 of the *Police Offences Act* 1890, nor shall the Council be responsible or accountable in any way to the owner of an animal for any penalty incurred by such owner under such section, or for the impounding of any animal by the owner or occupier of property abutting upon street or road or by any other person.

17. If the tag has, previous to the passing of this By-law, been issued by the Council to any applicant, such tag must be returned or its loss satisfactorily accounted for as a condition precedent to the registration of any animal by such applicant.

18. A registered owner of animals shall acquaint the herdsman of the fact of the sale or death or removal or withdrawal of any registered animal, and, in case of sale, of the name and address of the purchaser.

19. The Council shall have the power to terminate the permission to graze any animal of the applicant at the end of any current quarter, or earlier if reported by the herdsman to be suffering from any form of complaint or disease, or if a nuisance, breaking or getting through fences, or if feed or water become scarce or insufficient.

MELBOURNE HOSPITAL.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following By-laws adopted by the Committee of Management of the Melbourne Hospital were confirmed at a Special Meeting of Contributors to the Institution, held at the Melbourne Hospital, Lonsdale-street, Melbourne, on Tuesday, 5th September, 1911:—

THE MEDICAL STAFF.

46. There shall be five physicians and five surgeons having charge of in-patients and five physicians and five surgeons having charge of out-patients, and the following medical officers in charge of special departments, namely:—

—An ophthalmologist, a medical officer for diseases of the ear, nose, and throat; a dermatologist and a gynaecologist; also the following specialists, namely:—A pathologist, a senior assistant pathologist, an anaesthetist, and a skiagraphist. Provided that the Committee may, respectively, by an absolute majority, increase the number of either physicians or surgeons to out-patients to a number not exceeding seven, and the number of either physicians or surgeons to in-patients to a number not exceeding six.

47. The medical staff of the Hospital shall consist of four parts:—

- (1) The consulting physicians and the consulting surgeons.
- (2) The physicians and the surgeons.
- (3) The medical officers in charge of special departments, that is to say:—The ophthalmologist; the medical officer for diseases of the ear, nose, and throat; the dermatologist; the gynaecologist; and
- (4) The following specialists, that is to say:—the pathologist, the senior assistant pathologist, the anaesthetist, and the skiagraphist.

48. No person shall be eligible for appointment to the office of physician or surgeon, or medical officer in charge of a special department, who holds office on the medical staff of any other hospital recognised as a clinical school; and no person shall continue to hold any of the said offices after accepting office on the medical staff of any other hospital recognised as a clinical school.

49. Every physician and every surgeon and every medical officer in charge of a special department and every aforesaid specialist hereafter elected shall, subject to the by-laws and rules now or hereafter in force, hold office for five years from the date of his election, and no longer, but shall be eligible for re-election. Provided that when the Committee shall have increased the number of physicians and surgeons to in-patients to twelve the word "five" shall be replaced by the word "six" in this by-law, and the by-law shall thereupon read accordingly.

51A. The term of office of at least one physician to in-patients and of one surgeon to in-patients, and of one physician to out-patients and of one surgeon to out-patients, shall expire in each year; but the number of physicians or of surgeons retiring in any year shall be decided by the Committee. The Committee shall take action as it may think fit by extension of the term of office of any physicians and any surgeons or by appointing any new physician to in-patients or any new surgeon to in-patients, or any new physician to out-patients or any new surgeon to out-patients, for a shorter term, in order to bring such annual retirement into operation, and to keep it in operation, provided that no physician or surgeon now holding office shall, for this purpose, be called upon to retire until the expiry of the term for which he has already been elected by the governors. A meeting of the Advisory Board shall be convened for a date as early as possible after the time so appointed, and all applications so received shall be submitted to the Advisory Board for report thereon to the Committee.

59A. Prior to any appointment of a *locum tenens* for any physician to out-patients, or surgeon to out-patients, or any medical officer in charge of a special department, or any said specialist, for any period exceeding two calendar months, the Committee shall give public notice by advertisement in some daily newspaper published in Melbourne that such vacancy has occurred, and shall fix therein a time not less than seven clear days from the date of such notice within which candidates shall lodge at the hospital with the officer appointed for the purpose notice of candidature, and evidence of qualifications and attainments, and the Committee shall fill the vacancy after report from the Advisory Board.

61A. There shall also be the following honorary medical officers:—

- (1) One or more assistant pathologists, of whom one may be appointed director of the histological laboratory, one may be appointed director of the bacteriological laboratory, and one may be appointed director of the chemical laboratory.
- (2) Two or more junior assistant pathologists.
- (3) Assistant anaesthetists.
- (4) Two or more medical electricians.
- (5) One or more assistant medical skiagraphists.
- (6) One or more clinical assistants to each physician to out-patients, and one or more clinical assistants to each surgeon to out-patients.

There shall also be

- (7) An honorary dentist.
- (8) Honorary masseurs and honorary masseuses with assistants.

The honorary medical officers under this by-law shall be registered medical practitioners under the *Medical Act* 1890. The honorary dentist shall be a registered dentist under the *Dental Act*. All officers under this by-law shall

be appointed, and may be re-appointed, and may be removed from office, by the Committee, after report from the Advisory Board. The assistant pathologists shall hold office for the same term of years as the physicians and surgeons, and shall be eligible for re-appointment. The junior assistant pathologists shall hold office for one year, and shall be eligible for re-appointment. The remaining officers under this by-law shall hold office for two years, and shall be eligible for re-appointment. No officers under this by-law shall hold office after attaining the age of sixty.
