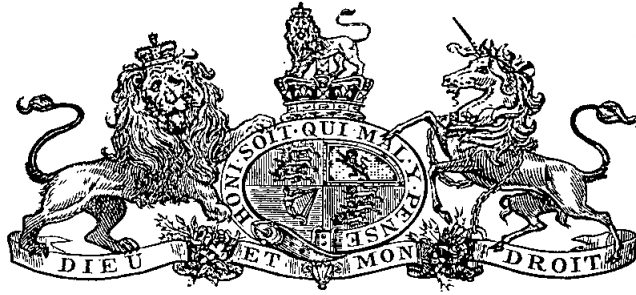

QUARTERLY STATISTICAL ABSTRACT
TO 30TH JUNE, 1911.

QUARTERLY STATISTICAL ABSTRACT, 30TH JUNE, 1911.

Population.—The estimated population on the 31st March, 1911, was 1,314,770; on 30th June, 1911, it was 1,319,544—thus showing an increase of 4,774 persons. The natural increase in the population was 4,506, and the excess of recorded immigration was 268. New South Wales gained from this State 1,195 persons, Queensland 806, South Australia 298, and Western Australia 352, whereas this State gained from Tasmania 2,679 persons, from New Zealand 726, and from the United Kingdom 724 persons.

Vital Statistics of the State.—The marriages—3,034—were 423 more, the births—8,280—were 88 more, the deaths—3,774—were 81 more, and the excess of births over deaths was greater by 7 than in the corresponding quarter of the previous year. Of the total number of deaths, 285 were due to phthisis, and 70 to other tubercular diseases; 291 to cancer; 32 to typhoid fever; and 76 to diphtheria and croup.

Vital Statistics of Melbourne, &c.—The births during the quarter numbered 3,568. This includes two cases of triplets, 39 cases of twins, and 326 illegitimate births. The deaths numbered 1,864, and the excess of births over deaths was 1,704. The deaths from diphtheria and croup numbered 37, from typhoid fever 14, and from tubercular diseases 178, as against 23, 26, and 156 respectively in the corresponding quarter of the previous year. The total deaths in Melbourne were 1,864, of whom 287 were under twelve months of age. In Ballarat, of 163 deaths, 18 were of infants; in Bendigo, of 190 deaths, 28 were of infants; and in Geelong, of 106 deaths, 14 were of infants. In the four towns mentioned there were 816 deaths of people aged 65 years and upwards—or 35 per cent. of the total.

Railways.—Compared with the corresponding quarter of the preceding year, the revenue increased by £169,057, the expenditure by £58,522, train miles run by 351,201, passengers carried by 2,930,725, and the tonnage of goods and live stock by 178,231.

Victorian Banking Returns.—On the 30th June the total liabilities of the banks were £47,648,572, and the assets £47,773,462, as against £43,090,890 and £43,830,890 on the 30th June, 1910. The reserves amounted to £7,436,434, and paid-up capital to £14,029,889. The ratio of coin, bullion, and notes to liabilities was 19·85 per cent.

Savings Banks.—On the 30th June the amount at credit of the 595,424 depositors was £17,272,699. During the quarter 26,640 accounts were opened, and 18,000 were closed; the deposits made were £3,372,746, and the withdrawals £3,028,791.

Gold Yield.—The total yield of gold up to the end of June, 1911, is 72,252,283 ounces.

Imports and Exports.—The total value of oversea imports into Victoria during the quarter under review was £4,632,850, and the total oversea exports during the same period were valued at £2,635,440, as compared with £3,941,964 and £2,111,398 respectively in the corresponding quarter of the previous year.

Exports of Frozen, Preserved, and Perishable Products.—For the second quarter in 1911, the total value of these exports oversea through Cool Stores was £473,732, of which £377,429 went to the United Kingdom, £51,201 to South Africa, and £42,102 to Eastern and other ports. The principal exports were—Butter, valued at £375,394; Mutton and Lamb, £20,507; and Fruit, £54,216.
