

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

BY-LAW No. 213.*

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred in that behalf under the provisions of the Railways Acts, do hereby make the following By-law, and do hereby repeal so much of the provisions of all previous By-laws as conflicts therewith :-

CHARGES AND CONDITIONS IN RESPECT OF THE STORAGE OF GOODS AT MELBOURNE.

- (1) Any Goods discharged from vessels at the Williamstown and Port Melbourne Railway Piers respectively, and conveyed thence by rail to Melbourne may, at the convenience of the Commissioners, be allowed seven days' free storage at Melbourne beyond the date on which the conveyance to that place of each consignment is completed, and a charge at the rate of is. per ton shall be imposed it the Goods remain on hand for a further period of seven working days or part thereof, and for any subsequent period the charge shall be at the rate of 1s. per ton per day, provided that no charge for storage shall be imposed in respect of Inter-State consignments if such consignments be re-exported within two days of the date of the clearance of the vessel from which they were received.
- (2) (a) Except as prescribed in clause (1) hereof, any Goods unloaded at Melhourne shall be allowed free storage on the day of discharging, and may, at the convenience of the Commissioners, be allowed free storage for the further time specified hereunder, viz. :-

For Potatoes and Onions ... 2 working days. For any other Goods, including Wool, Grain, and Chaff l working day.

- (b) If any Goods specified in sub-clause (a) hereof be not removed within the due time, storage charges shall thereafter be imposed as follows until the Goods are removed from the railway premises:-
 - In respect of Grain, Chaff, Potatoes, and Onions, the storage charges per ton or part thereof, during the months of January, February, and March, shall be 1s. for the first day, 9d for the second day, and 6d for each succeeding day; and during the months from April to December, both inclusive, 6d. per week; or, at the option of the Commissioners, the charges prescribed in respect of the months of January, February, and March may be imposed in respect of any or all of the months from April to December, both inclusive.

In respect of Wool, the storage charge shall be 1d. per bale per day.

In respect of Any Other Goods, the storage charges shall be as prescribed hereunder, viz. :-

During the Months of-	Not exceeding 2 cwt.	Over 2 cwt. and not exceeding 5 cwt.	Over 5 cwt. and not exceeding 10 cwt.	Over 10 cwt., per ton or part thereof.

or at the option of the Commissioners, the charges specified in respect of the months of January, February, and March may be imposed in respect of any or all of the months from April to December, both inclusive.

Any portion of a day or a week, as the case may he, shall be charged for as one day or one week respectively,

(3) Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, if it be inconvenient to store any Goods upon the premises of the Commissioners after the expiration of the period of free storage, the Consignee or Owner may be required to remove the Goods from the railway premises, or the Goods may be removed by the Commissioners for storage in a warehouse to be nominated by the Consignee or Owner, and, when so required by the Melbourne Goods Superintendent or other authorized officer of the Commissioners, the Consignee or Owner shall remove the goods from the premises of the Commissioners, or shall nominate in writing to such officer a store or stores to which the overtime goods may be carted, which store or stores shall not be situated at a greater distance than 9 miles from the Melbourne General Post Office, and the Consignee shall pay such charges as may be in force in connexion with, or incidental to, the removal of the Goods to the nominated store or stores, as the case may be, and in connexion with, or incidental to, the storage of the Goods thereat; provided that if the Consignee or Owner, when so required by the Melbourne Goods Superintendent or other authorized officer of the Commissioners, fail to remove the Goods, or to nominate a store or stores to which the Goods may be removed he shall pay to the Commissioners a storage charge in respect of the Goods at the rate of 1s. per ton per day, or, at the option of the Commissioners, the ordinary storage charges for the time being in force during such time as his failure to remove the goods or to nominate a store or stores, to which the Goods may be removed, shall continue.

(4) The provisions of this By-law shall have effect on and from the first day of November, One thousand nine hundred and eleven.

Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the Trustees therefor, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B), which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right on obtain

ing the permission of the Trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet,

or other erection therein.

5. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the Trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written appropriate the Trustees.

6. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths has been delivered to the Secretary (gatekeeper or sexton).

7. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.

at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.

8. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least six inches thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

9. The hours for burials shall be—On week days, September to April inclusive, 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.; May to August inclusive, 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.; May to August inclusive, 10 a.m. to 70 Sundays throughout the year from 8 to 10 a.m., or from 2 to 5 p.m.

10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

11. The Trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person having paid the fee for a private grave and requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the Trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

12. No private grave shall be re-opened or any interment permitted therein without the consent in writing of the person entitled to give the same.

13. No person employed by the Trustees shall accept

ment permitted therein without the consent in writing of the person entitled to give the same.

13. No person employed by the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the

Trustèes.

14. The Cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from Seven a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.

15. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the Cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the Trustees.

16. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the Cemetery.

17. No dogs shall be allowed in the Cemetery.

5. The Trust reserve the right of putting on a meter and supplying water by measure.

For the right to use a hose for watering ornamental plots or gardens not exceeding one square chain, Tenshillings shall be charged, and Eight shillings for every additional chain, such right not to be exercised between the hours of Nine p.m. and Six a.m. Any person who transgresses this provision, or wastes or misuses the water of the Trust, or interferes with any property vested in or controlled by the Trust, shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

7. For a temporary supply during the erection of a building or repairs, One pound per cent. shall be charged on the cost of the brickwork, stonework, and plastering; or the Trust may cause a meter to be fixed and a charge made by measure; or a special agreement may be made for the supply.

- 13. All public water troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting taps to prevent overflow; such taps to be approved by the secretary for the time being of the
- 14. It shall be unlawful for any person to have an over-low waste pipe from any private bath.
- 15. The Trust may by notice, in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier using water for other than domestic purposes solely that the water supplied is to be charged by measure, and may by such notice require such owner or occupier to provide a meter within fourteen days after the receipt of such notice; and thereupon such owner or occupier shall, within the time specified, at his own expense, provide a meter.
- 16. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined and approved, and a certificate from the Board of Works or other authorized person be produced for the inspection of the secretary of the Trust for the time being that such meter is in proper order.
- 17. Every person, requiring to remove or alter the posi-tion of any meter shall give six days' notice, in writing, to that effect to the Trust, and a regulation of the quan-tity of water used shall be taken before such removal or alteration is made.
- 18. If any person who has provided any meter fail to give the notice required of any repairs required for such meter he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

If any person refuse or delay to have such meter properly repaired and put in correct working order after having been required by any officer of the Trust so to do the Trust may shut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the service pipe or otherwise, until such meter shall have been properly repaired and certified by some officer of the Trust as being in proper working order.

Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, or who shall use or allow the water to be used in an unauthorized manner, or who is in arrears with the payment of his water rate, the Trust may, after one hour's notice, cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person either by cutting the pipes by or through which the water is supplied or by any other means that are available, and may cease to supply such premises with water so long as the Trust may think fit.
- 21. It shall be lawful for any person appointed by the 21. It shall be lawful for any person appointed by the Trust for such purpose to request permission from any owner or occupier to make an inspection of the water service to ascertain if water is being allowed to un to waste, and, if such occupier or owner refuse permission for such inspection, the Trust may, if it think fit, refuse to supply such premises with water; and such refusal on their part will in no way relieve the owner or occupier from payment of any rate or rates as may be levied on such prospector.
- 22. If the person appointed for such inspection shall ascertain that any owner or occupier is allowing water to waste by reason of leaky taps or otherwise; he shall be empowered to authorize the repair of such taps or pipes and to notify such owner or occupier that the waste of water must at once cease.

23. No person shall affix any service pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter or repair or in any way interfere with any pipe of the Trust or any service pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust until he shall have obtained from the Trust permission to execute such works, and such permission shall be at and during the pleasure of the Trust, who may at any time cancel such permission

24. Any person, whether licensed or permitted as aforesaid or not, who shall require to affix any service pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or to make any repairs to pipes under the control of the Trust, shall give notice to the Secretary of his intention so to do.

25. All connexions from the Trust mains to property shall be made at the expense of the owner or occupier of the property to be supplied, and all repairs or renewals shall, when necessary, be made by the owner or occupier, and such pipes shall at all times be under the control of the Trust.

26. All connexions, pipes, and fittings shall be of the best quality, and approved by the Secretary and Chairman

The service pipes from the main being the property of the owner or occupier of the tenements supplied by such service pipes, the occupier (if any), and, if none, the owner, shall, upon receiving notice that his service pipe requires repairing, immediately proceed to repair the same, and he shall be responsible for any loss of water or other damage which shall be caused by reason of such service pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, and the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises in any way it may seem fit until such repairs have been effected.

A system of three-course rotation to be followed (i.e., the 10 acres under beet in any one year shall not be put under beet again until the third year following) unless remission of this condition be approved by the Agricultural Department, and the whole resulting crop of manufacturable beet shall be supplied to the Maffra Factory, which will pay for same at a rate per ton of topped clean roots delivered at the factory, such rate to be determined by the Factory Manager from year to year during the ten years or until this condition is remitted, which may be done at any time by the Board.

Allotmo its 9, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 23, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, 34, 35, 33, 59, and 60 in the Parish of Wurruk Wurruk, will, however, not be subject to the foregoing conditions. Allotments 51, 52, 53, 54, 55, 56, 58 Parish of Wurruk Wurruk and allotments 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 Purish of Denison will be subject to the beet culture condition with a minimum area of 4 acre instead of 19 as set forth previously.

MALLEE LANDS AVAILABLE FOR SELECTION AS SELECTION PURCHASE ALLOTMENTS.

THE land is situated from 6 to 12 miles east and south-east of the Ouyen railway station.

Applications (with uncancelled Victorian duty stamp of 5s., or postal note for same amount, affixed) must be made on the usual form, and delivered or forwarded by post to any Local Land Office, or to the Secretary for Lands, Melbourne, on or before Wednesday, 13th December, 1911.

That substantial and permanent improvements shall be made on the land, if in the first class, to the value of 3s, 4d, per acre before the end of the second year from the date of the lease, another 3s, 4d, per acre before the end of each year of the third and fourth years, and the balance of 10s, per acre before the end of the sixth year of the lease.
