LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.

TRIENNIAL GENERAL RENEWAL OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS. Important Notice to Electors.

I T is hereby notified that all persons who are holders of electors' rights issued before or on the 1st December, 1910, must, not later than the 1st December next, obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names retained upon the new General Electoral Lists, which will be made up forthwith after that date.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from such Lists.

The old right must in every case be delivered up to the Registrar, but the renewed right will be equally available for any election that may take place before the coming into force of the new rolls in February, 1912.

Intending applicants for electors' rights are cautioned to apply carly to the Registrar. If application be postponed until the last day allowed for the purpose, the Registrar may be unable to issue rights to all applicants, and those to whom rights are not issued will not be enrolled, and will lose their title to vote.

No person whose name is on, or entitled to be on, any roll of ratepaying electors for any division of a province may obtain an elector's right for such province.

Persons of foreign birth who desire to obtain electors' rights must, if not already naturalized, obtain letters of naturalization, without which they are not qualified.

Each applicant for an elector's right for the Legislative Council should provide himself with a Sixpenny duty stamp necessary for payment for the right.

WARRACKNABEAL WATERWORKS TRUST.— RATING BY LAW FOR YEAR 1912.

THE Commissioners of the Warracknabeal Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1905, make the following By-law for the year 1912:—

The following are the rates which the occupiers or owners of land and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes by the Warracknabeal Waterworks Trust, that is to say, in regard to houses or tenements fronting any street in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which houses or tenements if not on such street are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes:—

- r. For every allotment of land, whether occupied or otherwise, where water is not being used, and of less than Ten pounds sterling annual municipal value, the sum of Two shillings in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation.
- 2. For every house or tenement of Sixteen pounds or under municipal value, a rate of One pound shall be paid.
- 3. For every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Sixteen pounds per annum the sum of One shilling and threepence in the pound shall be paid on the annual value of such property.
- on the annual value of such property.

 4. For all tenements in the said district situate otherwise than on streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within one-quarter of a mile from any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the above-mentioned rate; and where such tenements are more than one-quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half-a-mile, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rate.
- 5. Such owners of tenements as are supplied with water by meter shall pay at the rate of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons up to the quantity they would be entitled to receive according to their assessment, and at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons for anything over that quantity.
- 6. Such occupiers or owners of tenements not within the Trust area, and who have agreed with the Trust to be supplied with water by meter, shall pay at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.
- 7. Such occupiers or owners of gardens, steam-engines, or stock, who are supplied from the Trust reservoir with water shall, if the Commissioners of the Trust think fit, pay an extra rate beyond that which they are already paying (if any) if; in the opinion of the Trust, such occupiers or owners are not paying a just proportionate rate for the water they are using. Such occupiers or owners to be notified in writing of such charge.
- 8. Such rates are hereby made payable half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1912. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

ALEXANDRA WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1912.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Alexandra Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Act 1905, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following By-law:—

The following are the rates which the occupiers of owners of lands and tenements within the Urban District of the Alexandra Waterworks Trust, where such lands and tenements front streets wherein the pipes of the Trust have been laid, shall pay for water supplied by the said Trust:—

For every house, tenement, or allotment of the annual value of Thirteen pounds or over, according to the municipal valuation, an amount of One shilling and ninepence in the pound of such valuation.

For every house, tenement, or allotment under Thirteen pounds sterling annual valuation, according to the municipal valuation, an amount of One pound five shillings sterling per annum.

For all tenements in the said district situate otherwise than on streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half the above-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the above-mentioned rates.

The charge for water supplied shall be as follows:-

- (a) For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Fifteen shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steamboiler.
- (b) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), One shilling for every 1,000 gallons.

The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be:—

- (a) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (b) If for other than domestic purposes solely, 30,000 gallons per half-year.

For water supplied to the Government Departments, police stations, churches, Court House, Post Office, State School, Show Grounds, Cricket Ground, Bowling Green, Shire Hall, and similar properties, shall be charged by measurement or special agreement.

. For water supplied to livery and carriers' stables by the Trust, the charge shall be Five shillings per annum for each stall or loose-box.

In open sheds used for stabling, each space of five feet shall be charged as a stall.

The before-mentioned rates and charges are made for the year 1912. Such rates shall be payable by equal moieties, half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July of such year, and such charges shall be payable half-yearly on the first day of July and the thirty-first day of December of such year.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Alexandra Waterworks Trust may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and collect the said rates and charges.

Between the hours of Ten o'clock a.m. and midnight the rate of speed within the limits herein defined or in the reserve shall not exceed three miles per hour.

Racehorses may be exercised on the foreshore, under the direction of trainers, between the hours of sunrise and Ten o'clock a.m.

ALLOTMENTS IN THE COHUNA ESTATE AVAILABLE FOR APPLICATION UNDER CONDITIONAL PURCHASE LEASE.

THE several allotments included in the Schedule hereunder are declared available as Farm and Agricultural Labourers' Allotments to be taken up on Conditional Purchase Lease. Applications must be made on the prescribed forms, and forwarded to the Secretary, Closer Settlement Branch, Lands Department, on or before Wednesday, 6th December, 1911, accompanied by the deposit for the most valuable allotment applied for, as shown in Schedule hereunder. The deposit includes registration fee of 5s. and lease fee of £1. All applications so lodged with be deemed to have been simultaneously made.

Conditional Purchase Lease.

The leases issued to successful applicants may be for such a term of years, not exceeding 311, as may be agreed upon between the lessee and the Board.

An applicant may apply for more than one allotment, but will only be required to lodge one deposit, being the amount chargeable on the most valuable allotment applied for.

Only one allotment can be granted to any one person.

No conditional purchase lease of a farm allotment can be granted to any person who is already the holder of land of the value of £2,500 (township land excepted), or who would thereby become the holder of land exceeding such value.

Improvements to the value of at least two instalments of the purchase money must be effected on each farm allotment before the end of the first year from the date of the lease, and 10 per cent. of the purchase money before the end of the third year, and a further 10 per cent. before the end of the sixth year.

The Crown grant may be issued to the lessee at the end of any half-year after the first twelve years have expired, on payment of the balance of purchase money.

The amount of deposit (less £1 5s.) will be deducted from the capital value, and the half-yearly instalments calculated on the balance of purchase money.

Payments in advance may be made at any time at the option of the lessee, and proportionate reduction of interest secured thereby.

The balance of purchase money, with interest at 41 per cent., must be paid by 63 or a lesser number of half-yearly instalments, calculated according to any of the tables under Division 3 of Part I. of the Savings Banks Act 1890 Amendment Act 1896, the first of such instalments being payable six months after the date of the lease. Each instalment will include interest upon the balance of the purchase money remaining unpaid.

Advances of money to assist in effecting improvements may be granted by the Board, such advances to be repaid in half-yearly instalments extending over fifteen years, bearing interest at 5 per cent. The half-yearly payment will be at the rate of £4 15s. 7d. for every £100 advanced.

MALLEE LANDS AVAILABLE FOR SELECTION AS SELECTION PURCHASE ALLOTMENTS.

THE land is situated from 6 to 12 miles east and south-cast of the Ouyen railway station.

Applications (with uncancelled Victorian duty stamp of 5s., or postal note for same amount, affixed) must be made on the usual form, and delivered or forwarded by post to any Local Land Office, or to the Secretary for Lands, Melbourne, on or before Wednesday, 13th December, 1911.

Not more than one allotment can be included in any application, but any number of applications may be lodged, with the prescribed fee in each case.

Applicants will be hereafter notified as to the date and place of hearing of their applications by Local Land Board.

The land will be granted under selection purchase lease, and at the end of six years, if the residence, cultivation, improvement, and all other conditions have been complied with, the lease will be indorsed under the seal of the Board of Land and Works to the effect that such conditions have been complied with, and at any time within the remaining period of 34 years a Crown Grant will be issued on payment of the full amount of the purchase money.

The survey fee must be paid within 28-days of demand, and will range from $\mathfrak{L}9$ to $\mathfrak{L}11$ per allotment.

The lease will be subject to the following conditions:-

That substantial and permanent improvements shall be made on the land, if in the first class, to the value of 3s. 4d. per acre before the end of the second year from the date of the lease, another 3s. 4d. per acre before the end of each year of the third and fourth years, and the balance of 10s. per acre before the end of the sixth year of the lease. If in the second class, improvements to the value of 2s. 6d. per acre must be made during the like periods, and the balance of 7s. 6d. per acre before the end of the sixth year of the lease. If in the third class, improvements to the value of 5s. per acre must be made on the land before the end of the third year from the date of the lease, and the balance of 5s. per acre before the end of the sixth year of the lease.

No person who already holds or has previously selected the area of Mallee land allowed by classification will be eligible to apply.

The total area of Mallee land which may be selected is 640 acres if in the first class, or 1,000 acres if in the second class, or 1,280 acres if in the third class. Any further area (limited as by the next succeeding paragraph) can be obtained only by purchase from other persons.

That a special condition shall be inserted in the lease and the Crown grant, providing that the land referred to therein shall at all times be maintained and used for the purpose of residence or agriculture and grazing, and that no person will be permitted to subsequently acquire or hold, or have an interest in, more than 1,000 acres, if the land be in the first class, or more than 1,600 acres, if the land be in any other class.
