LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.

TRIENNIAL GENERAL RENEWAL OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

Important Notice to Electors.

IT is hereby notified that all persons who are holders of electors' rights issued before or on the 1st December, 1910, must, not later than the 1st December next, obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names retained upon the new General Electoral Lists, which will be made up forthwith after that date.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from such Lists.

The old right must in every case be delivered up to the Registrar, but the renewed right will be equally available for any election that may take place before the coming into force of the new rolls in February, 1912.

Intending applicants for electors' rights are cautioned to apply early to the Registrar. If application be postponed until the last day allowed for the purpose, the Registrar may be unable to issue rights to all applicants, and those to whom rights are not issued will not be enrolled, and will lose their title to vote.

No person whose name is on, or entitled to be on, any roll of ratepaying electors for any division of a province may obtain an elector's right for such province.

Persons of foreign birth who desire to obtain electors' rights must, if not already naturalized, obtain letters of naturalization, without which they are not qualified.

Each applicant for an elector's right for the Legislative Council should provide himself with a Sixpenny duty stamp necessary for payment for the right.

WARRACKNABEAL WATERWORKS TRUST.— RATING BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1912.

THE Commissioners of the Warracknabeal Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, make the following By-law for the year 1912:—

The following are the rates which the occupiers or owners of land and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes by the Warracknabeal Waterworks Trust, that is to say, in regard to houses or tenements fronting any street in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which houses or tenements if not on such street are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes:—

1. For every allotment of land, whether occupied or otherwise, where water is not being used, and of less than Ten pounds sterling annual municipal value, the sum of Two shillings in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation.

2. For every house or tenement of Sixteen pounds or under municipal value, a rate of One pound shall be paid.

3. For every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Sixteen pounds per annum the sum of One shilling and threepence in the pound shall be paid on the annual value of such property.

4. For all tenements in the said district situate otherwise than on streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within one-quarter of a mile from any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the above-mentioned rate; and where such tenements are more than one-quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half-a-mile, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rate.

5. Such owners of tenements as are supplied with water by meter shall pay at the rate of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons up to the quantity they would be entitled to receive according to their assessment, and at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons for anything over that quantity.

6. Such occupiers or owners of tenements not within the Trust area, and who have agreed with the Trust to be supplied with water by meter, shall pay at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

7. Such occupiers or owners of gardens, steam-engines, or stock, who are supplied from the Trust reservoir with water shall, if the Commissioners of the Trust think fit, pay an extra rate beyond that which they are already paying (if any) if, in the opinion of the Trust, such occupiers or owners are not paying a just proportionate rate for the water they are using. Such occupiers or owners, to be notified in writing of such charge.

8. Such rates are hereby made payable half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1912. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

ALEXANDRA WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1912.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Alexandra Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1905*, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following By-law:—

The following are the rates which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Urban District of the Alexandra Waterworks Trust, where such lands and tenements front streets wherein the pipes of the Trust have been laid, shall pay for water supplied by the said Trust:—

For every house, tenement, or allotment of the annual value of Thirteen pounds or over, according to the municipal valuation, an amount of One shilling and ninepence in the pound of such valuation.

For every house, tenement, or allotment under Thirteen pounds sterling annual valuation, according to the municipal valuation, an amount of One pound five shillings sterling per annum.

For all tenements in the said district situate otherwise than on streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half the above-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the above-mentioned rates.

The charge for water supplied shall be as follows:—

(a) For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Fifteen shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam-boiler.

(b) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), One shilling for every 1,000 gallons.

The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be:—

(a) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(b) If for other than domestic purposes solely, 30,000 gallons per half-year.

For water supplied to the Government Departments, police stations, churches, Court House, Post Office, State School, Show Grounds, Cricket Ground, Bowling Green, Shire Hall, and similar properties, shall be charged by measurement or special agreement.

For water supplied to livery and carriers' stables by the Trust, the charge shall be Five shillings per annum for each stall or loose-box.

In open sheds used for stabling, each space of five feet shall be charged as a stall.

The before-mentioned rates and charges are made for the year 1912. Such rates shall be payable by equal moieties, half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July of such year, and such charges shall be payable half-yearly on the first day of July and the thirty-first day of December of such year.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Alexandra Waterworks Trust may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and collect the said rates and charges.

All water-troughs to be fitted with approved self-acting ball taps to prevent overflow.

In respect of properties the annual municipal value of which is less than Fifteen pounds (£15) upon which are houses or tenements used wholly or partly as dwellings the rate to be paid shall in each case be of such percentage, according to the municipal valuation thereof, as shall produce the sum of One pound ten shillings (£1 10s.).
3. A rate of Ten shillings (10s.) on each allotment or piece of land vacant or not built upon.
4. For every water trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, the sum of Two pounds (£2).
5. For water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust, Two shillings and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum charged shall not be less than the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure (and except in cases where the Trust has made special arrangements).
6. A minimum of Ten shillings (10s.) and a maximum of Two pounds (£2) for every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year.
7. Such rates and charges are hereby made payable yearly in advance, on the first day of January, 1912.
8. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint are hereby authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

In respect of properties the annual municipal value of which is less than Fifteen pounds (£15) upon which are houses or tenements used wholly or partly as dwellings the rate to be paid shall in each case be of such percentage, according to the municipal valuation thereof, as shall produce the sum of One pound ten shillings (£1 10s.).
3. A rate of Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) on each allotment of land vacant or not built upon in sections 33 and 35 having a frontage to Beck-street.
4. A rate of Five shillings (5s.) each on every other allotment or piece of land vacant or not built upon.
5. For every water trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust the sum of Two pounds (£2).

6. For water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust, Two shillings and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum charged shall not be less than the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure (and except in cases where the Trust has made special arrangements).

7. A minimum of Ten shillings (10s.), and a maximum of Two pounds (£2) for every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year.

8. Such rates and charges are hereby made payable yearly in advance on the first day of January, 1912.

9. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint, are hereby authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

THE Commissioners of the Elmore Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1905*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the By-law following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers and owners of land and tenements shall pay for the year 1912 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Water Supply District:—

- (1) Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments of the annual municipal value of Sixteen pounds (£16) and under, the sum of One pound (£1) shall be paid.
- (2) Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments of the annual municipal value of Seventeen pounds (£17) and upwards, a rate of One shilling and threepence (1s. 3d.) in the pound (£1) shall be paid.
- (3) The rate to be paid in respect to vacant lands shall be One shilling and threepence (1s. 3d.) in the pound (£1), according to the municipal valuation, providing that in no case shall a rate of less than Twelve shillings and sixpence (12s. 6d.) be paid.
- (4) For water supplied to public troughs a charge of Two pounds (£2) shall be made, provided that no person shall be charged for more than one trough.
- (5) Any water supplied to troughs other than public troughs must be paid for by meter or by special agreement at such rates, upon such terms, and subject to such conditions as the Trust and the persons requiring such supply may agree to adopt.
- (6) For water supplied by meter, a charge of One shilling (1s.) per one thousand (1,000) gallons shall be made, excepting water supplied for factory purposes only, in which case a charge of Sixpence (6d.) per one thousand (1,000) gallons shall be made, provided that no person shall pay a less amount than that based on One shilling and threepence (1s. 3d.) in the pound (£1) on the municipal valuation, or less than the minimum rate. Any quantity used over the foregoing amounts will be charged in excess.
- (7) The foregoing rates are made payable in equal moieties, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1912.

Payments for supplies to troughs and by meter shall be made in advance, or as may be demanded by the Trust.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

**AVOCA TOWNSHIP WATERWORKS TRUST.—
BY-LAW RELATING TO RATES AND CHARGES,
No. 3.**

THE Avoca Township Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Acts (and whose Water District has for the purposes of the said Acts been proclaimed an Urban District), make the By-law following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1912 in respect of water supplied by the Trust (that is to say):—

- (A) On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, a rate of Two shillings for each pound sterling on the amount of the municipal value thereof; but the minimum amount to be paid shall be One pound ten shillings sterling.
- (B) Unoccupied lands where no water is laid on shall be charged Ten pounds per centum on the amount of the municipal valuation.
- (C) Private water-troughs shall be charged at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each, except when the Trust shall order a meter to be used, in which case the minimum quantity of water to be charged for half-yearly shall be 10,000 gallons.
- (D) For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or otherwise provided for in this By-law, the rate shall be Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons.
- (E) Water for gas engines shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each engine, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (F) For steam-boilers, the rate shall be Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horsepower of each boiler, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (G) On buildings in course of erection, where water is required for building purposes, the charge shall be Five shillings per 1,000 gallons, and the contractor, owner, or occupier of such premises shall provide and fix the water-meter and all necessary fittings for same, otherwise the contractor, owners, or occupiers of such premises may, by special agreement with the Trust, pay a minimum charge of Ten shillings per centum on the total cost of the work for stone buildings, or Two shillings and sixpence per cent. for wooden buildings, when a meter will not be required to be provided, or they may, by special agreement with the Trust, pay the cost of the labour of laying and removing the necessary pipes, fittings, and a meter, and the hire of a meter at the rate of Ten shillings per annum, with a minimum charge of Five shillings, and for water at the rate of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons. Payments in either case to be made in advance.
- (H) Supplies of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate as the Trust shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken or used.
- (I) In the event of any dispute as to which sub-section applies to any particular case, the Trust shall have power to decide or to make a special charge.
- (J) For water supplied to public gardens, parks, and show grounds, the charge shall be Ninepence per 1,000 gallons, and the supply must be taken through a meter.
- (K) A minimum rate of Ten shillings sterling and a maximum rate of Four pounds sterling, as the Commissioners may determine, shall be charged every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year, in addition to the assessed rate payable for the premises upon which such hose is used.
- (L) For all tenements in the said district situate otherwise than on streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, the rate shall be one-half; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half-a-mile thereof, shall be one-quarter of the amount which would be payable if such tenement were supplied with the water from the service-pipes.

ROCHESTER WATERWORKS TRUST.

By-law of the Rochester Waterworks Trust for determining, making, and levying rates and charges payable in respect of the supply of water within the Urban District of the said Trust, and for preventing the undue waste of water.

THE Rochester Waterworks Trust, pursuant to and by virtue of the provisions of the *Water Act 1905* and of every other power enabling the said Trust in this behalf, doth hereby make the following By-laws, that is to say:—

No. 1. The following rates and charges are those which all occupiers or owners of lands and tenements situated within the Urban District of the Rochester Waterworks Trust shall pay in respect of the supply of water by the said Trust for the year 1912:—

- (a) For every house or tenement of Twelve pounds annual municipal valuation and under, a rate of One pound two shillings and sixpence sterling per annum.
- (b) For every house or tenement of more than Twelve pounds and not exceeding Twenty pounds annual municipal valuation, a rate of One pound five shillings sterling per annum.
- (c) For every house or tenement of more than Twenty pounds and not exceeding Twenty-four pounds annual municipal valuation, a rate of One pound ten shillings sterling per annum.
- (d) For every house or tenement of the annual municipal valuation of Twenty-five pounds and upwards, an annual rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound sterling on the amount of such valuation.
- (e) For each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District before mentioned separately from any building, a rate of Ten shillings in the pound sterling on the amount of the annual municipal valuation of the same.
- (f) A minimum rate of One pound sterling and a maximum rate of Four pounds sterling, as the Commissioners may determine, shall be charged every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year, in addition to the rate on the annual municipal valuation.
- (g) For every trough or other receptacle used for watering horses or other stock, a rate of One pound sterling per annum. Provided that for any such trough or receptacle situated on or immediately outside land rated together with any house or tenement as hereinbefore mentioned, a rate of Ten shillings per annum only will be charged.
- (h) The charge for water supplied by meter shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons up to the maximum quantity covered by the rate payable in respect of the property in connexion with which the meter is affixed, and Sixpence per 1,000 gallons for all water used in excess of such quantity.

No. 2. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable in equal moieties half-yearly, in advance, on 1st day of January, 1912, and 1st day of July, 1912.

No. 3. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates and charges.

7. For water supplied by the Trust by measure (other than stand-pipe or hydrant water), except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, a charge of One shilling for every thousand gallons.
8. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by measurement (other than hydrant or stand-pipe water) shall be—

- (1) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, a quantity for which the charge of One shilling per thousand gallons would be equal to the assessed rate which would be payable for the house or tenement so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
 - (2) If solely for other than domestic purposes, Thirty thousand gallons per half-year.
9. The above-mentioned rates and charges (except for stand-pipe or hydrant water) shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1912.
10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Yea Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

1. For determining the rates to be paid for the several lands and tenements to be supplied otherwise than by measure with water for domestic use.

2. For making and levying such rate—

(I.) For every house or tenement situate in any street or road where pipes have been laid for the supply of water thereto, such house or tenement being used either wholly or partially as a domicile, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling upon the municipal valuation for the time being of such house or tenement shall be paid, provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to any tenement shall not be less than the sum of Twenty shillings per annum, except in the case of land on which there is no building.

(II.) For every occupied or unoccupied allotment or vacant lot situate in any street or road where pipes have been laid, the rate to be paid shall be One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling, according to the municipal valuation of each allotment; provided that in no case shall a less rate than Ten shillings each be payable, except where the municipal valuation is less than Three pounds each, in which case the said rate shall not be less than Seven shillings and sixpence.

(III.) For all lands and tenements situated otherwise than in the streets or roads in which pipes are laid down, and which are within a quarter of a mile of a standpipe of the Trust, there shall be paid one-half of the above rates; and for all such lands and tenements being over a quarter of a mile but within half-a-mile from such stand-pipe, one-quarter of the full rate shall be paid.

SHIRE OF TUNGAMAH WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING BY-LAW FOR 1912 IN THE URBAN DISTRICT OF TUNGAMAH.

BY-LAW No. 56.

THE following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of land and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1912 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District of Tungamah, as such district has been proclaimed and defined:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds or under, the sum of One pound.

2. For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of Twenty-five pounds, and not less than Ten pounds, a rate of Two shillings in the pound of such value.

3. For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of One hundred pounds, and not less than Twenty-five pounds, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound of such value; provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Two pounds ten shillings per annum.

4. For every house or tenement of a value exceeding the annual municipal value of One hundred pounds, a rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound of such value, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Seven pounds ten shillings per annum.

5. For every allotment or piece of land vacant or not built upon, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the annual municipal value of such land, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Ten shillings.

6. For every water-trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, the amount of Two pounds per annum.

7. For water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust, Two shillings and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons. Provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure (and except in cases where the Trust has made special agreements).

8. A minimum of Ten shillings, and a maximum of Two pounds, to every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year.

9. Such rates and charges are hereby made payable yearly, in advance, on the first day of January, 1912.

10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

No person shall, recklessly or negligently, or at a speed or in a manner dangerous to the public, drive, ride, lead, or bathe any horse in the sea or on that portion of the foreshore from any point two hundred yards west of the intake pipe of the Warrnambool Town Council's baths to any point two hundred yards north of the viaduct jetty of the Warrnambool Breakwater. Between the hours of Ten o'clock a.m. and midnight the rate of speed within the limits herein defined or in the reserve shall not exceed three miles per hour.

Racehorses may be exercised on the foreshore, under the direction of trainers, between the hours of sunrise and Ten o'clock a.m.
