## QUARTERLY STATISTICAL ABSTRACT, 30TH SEPTEMBER, 1911.

*Population.*—The estimated population on 30th June, 1911, was 1,320,095; on 30th September, 1911, it was 1,326,540—thus showing an increase of 6,445 persons. The natural increase in the population was 4,431, and the excess of recorded immigration was 2,014. New South Wales gained from this State 600 persons, South Africa 279, and Queensland 233, whereas this State gained from the United Kingdom 1,897 persons, from Tasmania 1,413 persons, and from New Zealand 477 persons.

*Vital Statistics of the State.*—The marriages—2,651—were 360 more, the births—8,563—were 499 more, the deaths—4,132—were 471 more, and the excess of births over deaths was greater by 28 than in the corresponding quarter of the previous year. Of the total number of deaths, 293 were due to phthisis, and 61 to other tubercular diseases; 256 to cancer; 8 to typhoid fever; and 68 to diphtheria and croup.

*Vital Statistics of Melbourne, &c.*—The births during the quarter numbered 3,747. This includes 31 cases of twins, and 362 illegitimate births. The deaths numbered 2,086, and the excess of births over deaths was 1,661. The deaths from diphtheria and croup numbered 32, from typhoid fever 2, and from tubercular diseases 210 as against 17, 2, and 187 respectively in the corresponding quarter of the previous year. The total deaths in Melbourne were 2,086, of whom 264 were under twelve months of age. In Ballarat, of 188 deaths, 21 were of infants; in Bendigo, of 170 deaths, 13 were of infants; and in Geelong, of 102 deaths, 7 were of infants. In the four towns mentioned there were 1,041 deaths of people aged 65 years and upwards—or 41 per cent. of the total.

*State Revenue and Expenditure.*—The total revenue for the quarter was £2,056,385; which represents an increase of £94,836 on that for the corresponding quarter of the previous year. The principal items of revenue were—Railways, £1,176,272; and Probate Duty, £86,089. The total expenditure was £1,875,965, a decrease of £12,520 on that for the corresponding quarter of 1910.

*Railways.*—Compared with the corresponding quarter of the preceding year, the revenue increased by £189,716, the expenditure by £87,573, train miles run by 356,381, passengers carried by 2,634,081, and the tonnage of goods and live stock by 254,815.

*Victorian Banking Returns.*—On the 30th September the total liabilities of the banks were £47,245,076, and the assets £48,452,778, as against £43,114,096 and £45,484,558, on the 30th September, 1910. The reserves amounted to £7,518,166, and paid-up capital to £14,116,069. The ratio of coin, bullion, and notes to liabilities was 18·44 per cent.

*Savings Banks.*—On the 30th September the amount at credit of the 608,584 depositors was £17,692,485. During the quarter 33,639 accounts were opened, and 20,479 were closed; the deposits made were £3,960,163, and the withdrawals £3,542,159.

*Gold Yield.*—The total yield of gold up to the end of September, 1911, is 72,392,935 ounces.

*Imports and Exports.*—The total value of oversea imports into Victoria during the quarter under review was £5,962,775, and the total oversea exports during the same period were valued at £2,989,586, as compared with £5,523,801 and £2,254,452 respectively in the corresponding quarter of the previous year.

*Exports of Frozen, Preserved, and Perishable Products.*—For the third quarter in 1911, the total value of these exports oversea through Cool Stores was £389,986, of which £331,172 went to the United Kingdom, £26,151 to South Africa, and £32,663 to Eastern and other ports. The principal exports were—Butter, valued at £241,160; Mutton and Lamb, £94,991; and Rabbits and Hares, £37,891.
