PUPIL SURVEYORS AND DRAUGHTSMEN, SURVEY BRANCH.

APPLICATIONS will be received, addressed to the Secretary for Lands, up to 10th January, 1912, from candidates desirous of being appointed as Pupil Surveyors and Draughtsmen in connexion with this Department.

CONDITIONS.

An applicant for appointment must not be more than twenty years or less than sixteen years of age. He will be required to produce a medical certificate to the effect that he is of sound constitution, and not affected with any physical infirmity which would interfere with the proper exercise of his profession.

QUALIFICATIONS.

He must have passed the Matriculation Examination (including Algebra, Euclid, and Arithmetic) in the Melbourne or other recognised University, or—

Passed such other recognised examination, or produce such certificates from the Education Department, or other authority, as will satisfy the Surveyor-General as to his competency in the three subjects named, and as to his general educational proficiency.

He shall also with such certificates submit a specimen of his plan drawing.

COMPETITIVE EXAMINATION.

Having duly complied with the foregoing requirements, he will undergo a competitive examination in trigonometrical computation, plotting and plan drawing, when the competitors to whom shall be awarded a sufficient number of points by the Examiners will be recommended for appointment, subject to the regulations of the Department as to probation.

PROBATION.

Accepted candidates approved by the Minister shall enter the office as probationers for a period of one month without pay; and at the end of that time if reported by the Surveyor-General to have displayed aptitude for the work, may be appointed as pupils, and will be subject to the General Regulations for the Public Service as far as they are applicable.

TERM OF SERVICE.

The pupil's service in the Department shall be for a term of four years, the first two of which will be served in the office, where he will be engaged in drawing and computing. He will then (if thought necessary) be examined in trigonometry, including computation of areas and reduction or traverse surveys, also plotting from field book and plan drawing. If his progress up to this time be not deemed satisfactory, he will be liable to be dispensed with; but, if satisfactory, he will be placed under a departmental surveyor for two years for field practice.

Afterwards he will have the privilege of attending for two months at the Melbourne Observatory, where he will be instructed in such branches of practical astronomy as are necessary for the duties he may be called on to perform as a qualified surveyor.

He will be allowed to present himself at the next ensuing or subsequent examination for land surveyors for the purpose of obtaining the certificate of the Surveyors Board as to his qualifications.

REMUNERATION.

He will receive the following remuneration during the term of his pupilage:—1st year, £40; 2nd year, £52; 3rd year, £65; 4th year, £80.

SUBJECT TO REGULATIONS.

During the whole term of his pupilage and service in the Department he shall be subject to the Regulations for the Public Service of Victoria as far as they are applicable.

BONDS REQUIRED.

Each successful candidate for appointment as pupil surveyor and draughtsman will be required to find two approved sureties, who shall enter into bonds for £150 each for the faithful performance of his duties, and to provide for his remaining in the service of the Department for a further term of two years, if required, at a salary not less than £160 per annum.

THE MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN BOARD OF WORKS.

NOTICE is hereby given that, after the publication of this advertisement in four consecutive, ordinary numbers of the *Government Gazette* and in four numbers of one of the daily newspapers published in the metropolis, The Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works will proceed to compulsorily take (unless the same is in the meantime acquired by the Board from the owner or owners or other persons interested by mutual agreement) the land mentioned and described below.

RULES, REGULATIONS, AND SCALE OF FEES OF
THE TARWIN PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE TARWIN PUBLIC CEMETERY.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the Trustees of the Tarwin Public Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.

2. The office of the Trust shall be open daily (Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted) from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.

3. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.

4. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the Trustees therefor, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B), which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right on obtaining the permission of the Trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

5. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the Trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the Trustees.

6. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths has been delivered to the Secretary (gatekeeper or sexton):

7. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least twelve working hours before the time fixed for the burial.

8. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least six inches thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

9. The hours for burials shall be—On week days, September to April inclusive, 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.; May to August inclusive, 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. On Sundays throughout the year from 8 to 10 a.m., or from 2 to 5 p.m.

10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

11. The Trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person having paid the fee for a private grave and requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the Trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

12. No private grave shall be re-opened or any interment permitted therein without the consent in writing of the person entitled to give the same.

13. No person employed by the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the Trustees.

14. The Cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from Seven a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.

15. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the Cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the Trustees.

16. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the Cemetery.

17. No dogs shall be allowed in the Cemetery.

Tenders for supply of forage to more than five separate stations in any one district must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit of 10s. for each and every station over and above five, except in the case of the Melbourne District, the preliminary deposit for which shall be £25 with each tender, irrespective of the number of stations tendered for, and for the State Plantation at Wail, the preliminary deposit for which shall be £10, in bank notes, or a bank draft payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the necessary bond within a reasonable time after the acceptance is notified.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to hold contracts for Government supplies for a period of two years.

The price must include delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

For police stations, excepting the depot and institutions other than police, the successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for the sum of £5 per horse per station, and for the depot and other institutions a bond based on one-quarter of The total amount of the tender accepted, such bonds to be entered into within a reasonable time after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts where the sum stated in the bond is £50 and upwards, and one surety where the sum stated is under £50.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheaten or oat, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, white or Algerian (Victorian grown), of the best description, full kernel, clean, and free from wild oats or other objectionable seeds; bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oat hay of the best quality. As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

2. The quantities stated in the schedule are only approximate, and the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned. Should new telegraph stations be formed or additional horses be required at any station, the contractor will be required to supply the extra forage. Unless otherwise specified in the tender form the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station, should the additional number of permanent horses exceed two.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depot may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, and also forage for any extra horses that may be at any time stabled at the depot for police purposes, at the same rates. The contract for the supply of forage to the Military Barracks may be terminated by three months' notice being given by the Secretary to the Tender Board to the contractor of such determination.

4. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

5. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

6. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.

7. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue to either party by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, but he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 4.

8. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the State for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.

9. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

10. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, and in the event of his failing to carry on his contract he will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure. In the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

11. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as broken, infringed, or vitiated by the purchase by any Department of forage grown at any Government establishment.

SHIRE OF BRAYBROOK.

BY-LAW No. 26.

A By-law of the Shire of Braybrook, made under section 198 of the *Local Government Act* 1903, and numbered 26, for:—

- (a) Regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings, erections, or hoardings.
- (b) Requiring the pulling down and removal of buildings, erections, or hoardings.
- (c) Authorizing the Council to pull down and remove buildings, erections, or hoardings erected or constructed contrary to any such By-law, or not pulled down or removed as required by or under any such By-law, and to sell the materials, and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such buildings, erections, or hoardings, and in paying into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.
- (d) Appointing fees which may be charged and received by the Council for any act done or to be done by any of its officers under such regulations, and for any permit or licence to be issued by the Council.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1903, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Braybrook order as follows:—

1. No person shall commence the erection of any building until he shall lodge with the Shire Engineer a plan and specification of the same showing the exact site upon which it is intended to erect such building, and the manner in, and the materials of which it is proposed to erect the same, and until the Shire Engineer shall, in writing, approve of such plan and specification; and no person shall erect any such building except in accordance with the plan and specification so approved.

2. No person shall commence to erect any hoarding for advertising or other similar purposes until he shall have lodged with the Shire Engineer a complete plan and specification, showing the exact site upon which it is intended to erect such hoarding, and the manner in, and the materials of, which it is proposed to construct the same, and, until the Shire Engineer shall, in writing, approve of such plan and specification, with such modifications or additions thereto as in his opinion are necessary in the interests of public safety; and no person shall erect such hoarding, except in accordance with the plan and specification so approved.

3. No person in the construction of the internal or external walls, roofs, floors, ceilings, or any part of any building to be erected, shall use any material which, in the opinion of the Shire Engineer, shall be unsound.

4. No person shall, without the written consent of the Council of the said shire, place or erect on any land within the portion of the said shire to which this By-law is made applicable, any building or portion of a building which has been removed from without the shire, or from another part of the same. Nothing herein contained shall prevent the alteration of the position of any building within the boundary of the land in the same possession in which it stands, provided that such alteration is carried out in strict conformity with the general provisions of any building regulations of the said shire.

5. If the Shire Engineer shall certify, in writing, that any building is in such a dilapidated, ruinous, or insanitary state as to be dangerous to public health or safety, or that any hoarding is in such a state as to be dangerous to public safety, the owner of such building, erection, or hoarding, upon receiving notice from the Council requiring him to pull down or remove such building, erection, or hoarding, shall pull down or remove such building, erection, or hoarding within the time limited by such notice, not being less than three days from the service thereof.

6. In default of compliance with any such notice to pull down or remove any building, erection, or hoarding, the Council may, immediately on the expiration of the time limited therein, pull down or remove such building, erection, or hoarding, and may sell any of the materials thereof and apply the proceeds of such sale in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down, removing, and selling such building, erection, or hoarding, or materials, and shall pay into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.

7. The internal walls of all wooden buildings shall be properly framed with studs and plates and covered with lath and plaster, tongued and grooved wood, steel plates, or any other similar lining which has been approved of by the Engineer. The outside walls shall be similarly framed with sufficient studs and plates and covered with sound new boards or materials approved by the Engineer. The Engineer shall be the sole judge as to the necessary sizes of studs and plates, but no studs or plates shall be of less thickness than $\frac{1}{2}$ inch.

8. The following fees shall be payable for the several services hereunder set forth, and such fees shall be payable to the Shire Secretary before the performance of any act for which such fee is payable:—

10. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Railway and River Ridings of the shire of Braybrook.

SHIRE OF TAMBO.—BY-LAW No. 14.

A By-law of the Shire of Tambo, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered "fourteen" for prohibiting and regulating the depasturing of stock within certain boundaries of the Shire of Tambo, for the suppression of nuisances and for maintaining the good order and government of the municipality.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Tambo order as follows:—

1. That the provisions regarding the impounding of stock contained in section 497 of the *Local Government Act 1903* be enforced, and that all stock found depasturing or wandering at large upon any road in the Shire of Tambo be impounded.

2. That the above order be carried out under the following Rules and Regulations, that is to say:—That all resident ratepayers of the said shire, and occupiers of land fronting the said roads, shall be exempt from such impoundings of ten head of cattle or five head of horses, and that in the case of public carriers the number so exempted to be a team of horses or bullocks in actual use.

3. That a condition precedent to such exemption be a payment to the Council of the Shire of Tambo, quarterly in advance, at the rate of 3s. per quarter for every head of such cattle and 6s. per quarter for every head of horses so exempted, half such payment to be a remuneration, for the officers appointed by this Council as persons in charge of such horses and cattle, and hereinafter called the herdsman.

4. When the above fee is paid to the herdsman he shall register such head of horses and cattle in a book to be kept for the purpose, as exempt from the operation of this By-law, and in the case of cattle shall place a chain and numbered tag on the same in token of such exemption, and shall give to the person so registering a receipt for the money paid, which shall be entered in a book to be kept for that purpose, and for the information and use of the Council.

5. The Council will not be responsible or liable for any loss by theft or death, or for any injury or damage to, or straying of, any cattle or horses grazing under the aforesaid permit, nor for the supply of a sufficiency of grass and water, and the permit or licence to graze will be applied for and obtained strictly under these conditions.

6. Each animal for which application is made to register shall be the *bona fide* property of the applicant, and the applicant shall make a declaration to that effect, in the form of the Schedule attached hereto.

7. Calves and foals under six months of age, the progeny of registered cows or mares, may run with their mothers, free of charge, up to that limit of age.

8. No entire horse or bull shall be exempted without the special consent of the Council.

9. A muster of all stock so registered shall take place on a day of which due notice shall be given by an advertisement, at the close of every half-yearly period, and the owners requiring exemption for the ensuing quarter are required to present their stock for registration at such musters. Stock may be registered during any period between musters on payment of the full quarter's fee.

10. The herdsman shall keep an entry of all cattle impounded by him, and present a return of same to the Council every six months on a day preceding the half-yearly muster and registration, together with the books in which such entries are made.

11. The Council or the herdsman will not be responsible for any damage arising from the impounding of such exempted stock by any person owning lands adjoining or abutting on such roads, or owning land on any situation whatever.

12. No pigs, goats, or sheep are to be allowed to wander or to depasture on such roads, and all travelling stock must move thereover at the rate of 2 miles in each hour, and in the case of sheep, at the rate of not less than 6 miles in each day, between sunset and sunrise.

13. No person shall be allowed to remove from the herdsman's charge any stock registered as above without giving due notice of same beforehand, upon receipt of which the owner so removing same will be entitled, without further charge, to substitute for each head so removed one other head of stock for the unexpired portion of registration period.

14. The Council shall have the exclusive right to cause all stock suspected of contagious disease to be removed from the streets and roads, and in the event of any registered cattle or horses dying the owner thereof shall cause same to be destroyed on receiving notice, failing which the inspector of nuisance shall cause the same to be destroyed at the owner's risk and expense.

15. While persons retain chain and tag they will be held responsible for registration fee and the charge for hire of tag and chain will be continued while holding same, and on returning the chain and tag the charge made for hire of same will be refunded.

This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the Buchan Riding within a radius of 3 miles from the Buchan Post Office, and in the Bruthen Riding within a radius of 5 miles from Bruthen Post Office, but shall not apply to the following streets, roads, and right-of-ways within the township of Bruthen, viz.:—Main-street, from the north-west corner of allotment 9, to the line known as the western boundary of F. H. O'Reilly's part of allotment 14, township of Bruthen, and bearing N. 29 deg. 41 min. W.; McDougall-street to intersection of Seehusen-avenue; Seehusen-avenue, Church-street, from intersection of Seehusen-avenue, southerly to Main-street; Campbell-street and right-of-ways; Stirling-street and right-of-ways; and Bowie-street.

Violation of the provisions of this By-law shall render the person so offending liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
